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
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

- 2 A Dresden Group, finely modelled with four boys at play, holding sheaves of corn, and emblematic of Summer, the scroll base lightly touched with blue, 8in., Marcolini period
- 3 A Ludwigsburg Teapot and Cover, the latter surmounted by a pear, finely painted with a dog and ibex; and another, with apple knop to cover, painted with landscapes and river scenes, both marked

- 4 A Ludwigsburg Vase and Cover, with double handles, modelled in rococo style, and supported on four scroll feet, the panels outlined in mauve and painted with scrolling flowers in natural colours, 8\frac{3}{4}in., marked
- 5 A Meissen oval Dish, painted in the centre with a group of birds and ruins, with finely chased ormolu handles at each end, 17in., marked
- 6 A Hochst Figure of a Boy, dancing, in white coat, pink sash and cream breeches, holding a garland of flowers, and supported on a green rock-work base, 6½in., mark in blue
- 7 A Hochst standing Figure, emblematic of Autumn, partly draped in a crimson cloak, holding a basket of grapes and fruit, and supported on a shaped plinth, 10½in., mark in red
- 8 A Gera Solitaire, painted with oblong panels of landscapes and classical ruins in puce, within gilt borders, comprising:—
 Coffee-Pot, Sucrier and Cover, Coffee Cup and Saucer, and a quatrefoil pierced Plateau (cf. a similar piece in the Grassi Museum, Leipzig, painted in blue), mark G in grey-blue 7
- 9 A FINE HOCHST EWER AND BASIN, the former of helmet shape, with scroll handle and fluted base, finely painted with sprays of flowers, within irregular gilt borders, 8½in.; the Basin of deep oval shape, with fluted sides similarly painted by a master hand, within gilt borders, 15in., both marked in gold, superb quality (cf. Hannover and Rackham, pl. 251, p. 159) 2
- 10 A STRASBURG FAIENCE CHINOISERIE GROUP of two boys, supporting a basket on an oval base, the colouring red, maroon, blue, yellow and green, a charming composition, 9½in. long
