



BROCKET HALL.



ROCKET HALL was the ancient seat of the Brockets, situate on a dry hill in a fair Park, well wooded and greatly timbered, enclosed with a brick wall on the west side of the road for the length of a mile, and beautifully watered by the

river Lea. It came to Thomas Read by the marriage of Mary, the fifth daughter of Sir John Brocket, Kt., who had issue—John, to whom this Seat descended upon the death of his father; he was created Baronet by Patent dated the 16th March, Anno 1541, and was constituted Sheriff of this County, Anno 1555 (extract from Chauncey's History of Hertfordshire).

It is further mentioned by Chauncey, that Sir John Brocket married Helen, daughter and heir of Sir Robert Lytton of Knebworth Place, in this county. It is therefore most interesting to note that the portraits of Sir John and his Wife are included in the sale of the contents of the Hall.

Early in the 18th Century, the property was purchased by Sir Matthew Lamb, whose wife, Catherine Coke, was a descendant of Sir John Coke, Secretary of State to King Charles I, and sole heiress of the Right Hon. Thomas Coke, of Melbourne, Derbyshire. Sir Matthew pulled down the old Manor House and built the present Hall from designs by Mr. James Payne. From Sir Matthew, the estate passed to his eldest son, Peniston Lamb, who was appointed Lord of the Bed-Chamber to H.R.H. the Prince of Wales, afterwards King George IV. A magnificent portrait of the King, when Prince of Wales, standing by his charger, by Sir Joshua Reynolds, which was exhibited in the Royal Academy in 1784 and presented to Peniston by the Prince, hangs in the large Saloon, which is a great feature of the house, and is included in the sale of the Pictures. Peniston Lamb, who was created Baron and after-



wards Viscount Melbourne, was succeeded by his second son, William, second Viscount Melbourne, Prime Minister in 1834, and again from 1835 to 1841. He married Caroline, daughter of the third Earl of Bessborough, but died at Brocket without leaving issue, the estate passing to his sister, Emily, who married Peter, fifth Earl Cowper, and, upon his death, Lord Palmerston. Upon the death of Lady Palmerston, the Brocket property, together with the estates in Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire, passed to her grandson, Francis Thomas de Grey, the seventh Earl Cowper, and upon his death, in 1905, the Melbourne and Brocket Estates were left to his sister, Lady Amabel, wife of Admiral of the Fleet Lord Walter Talbot Kerr, G.C.B., the present owner.

The sale of the Contents of the Hall includes many interesting pictures, besides those of King George IV and Sir John and Lady Brocket already alluded to, amongst which may be mentioned two full-length portraits ascribed to Sir Antonio More, "Collecting the Tithe"; to Peter Brueghel (the Elder), and a portrait by Sir Francis Cotes, R.A., believed to be of the wife of the first Lord Melbourne. There is also an exceedingly fine collection of 18th Century furniture, including several sets of Chippendale and Hepplewhite chairs, William Kent tables, a Tompion long-case clock, a pair of highly important Louis XVI parqueterie commodes signed by M. Carlin, an exceptionally fine Waterford chandelier, a set of eight Waterford lustres, and the extensive library.




