
He was a Steward or Church Official to seven Archbishops of Cologne, viz: "Philippi de Duna, Hermanni a Weda, Adolphi et Anthonii a Schaweburg, Jois Gebhardi a Mansfelt, Frederici de Weda 210 Sweepelstorf. He married Guitgine Busch of Bruel. On his death in 1573, at the age of 83, his wife and his son Adolphus had this portrait painted. Vide inscription on the back of picture:—
