


CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- FIRST.—The highest bidder to be the buyer; and if any dispute arise between two or more bidders, the lot in dispute shall be immediately put up again and re-sold, or not, as the auctioneer may decide, who is also to regulate the biddings and be the sole arbiter. - THIRD.—The lots are to be taken away and paid for, whether genuine and authentic or not, with all faults and errors of description, the day after the sale; Messrs. FOSTER not being responsible for the correct description, genuineness, or authenticity of any lot.
- FOURTH.—To prevent inaccuracy in delivery and inconvenience in the settlement of the purchases, no lot can be transferred, nor can any lot be removed during the time of sale; each buyer must pay for the whole of his purchases before any lot is removed.
