The general style of the art is against this, as the statuettes appear to show traces of Hellenistic (Syrian) portrait style, and of Graeco-Roman dress. 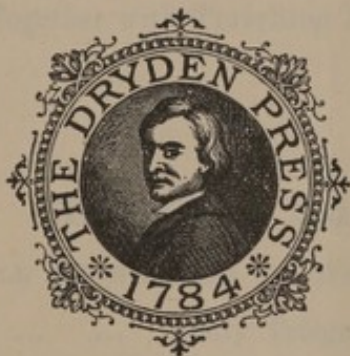
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
