The Liber Studiorum was designed and carried out by Turner in the early-middle period of his career, its publication ranging from 1807, when he was thirty-two, to 1819, when he was forty-four—these twelve years coinciding pretty nearly with what is generally known as his "second manner" in Art.

In the year of its inception, Turner's position as the first English landscape-painter

of his day was assured, and this series of plates Turner regarded as his magnum

The Liber Studiorum of Turner was designed from the first as a series, not of sketches, but of fully-finished pictures, which were to illustrate his whole range of powers, and to embrace every kind of subject of which he considered himself master. Projected therefore with this aim, the groundwork of every plate was the work of his own hand, and each after-stage entrusted to the best engravers of his day over whom he kept strictest supervision. It is not surprising that the Liber Veritatis was utterly distanced, and that the Liber Studiorum, produced during twelve years of Turner's life in which many of his strongest, although not his most imaginative, pictures appeared, came forth a truly monumental work, taking rank with the highest expressions of his genius.

In his introduction to the work, the Comte A. de Laborde, Secretary of the Société Française, explains that it was "the house of Maggs Brothers of London who had the good fortune to discover one of the leaves, until then unknown, of the famous Book of Hours painted in the fifteenth century by Jean Foucquet for Maître Etienne Chevalier, of which the majority of pages, formerly purchased by the Duc d'Aumale, are the admiration of the visitors to the Condé Museum at Chantilly."

Jean Foucquet was a native of Tours and was "painter and illuminator" to Louis XI. his most celebrated work was the "Book of Hours," in which the miniatures constitute a series of pure chefs d'œuvre, to which we of to-day render the homage of our admiration. We believe that Etienne Chevalier's Livre d'Heures remained in his family until the death of his last descendant in the male line, Nicolas Chevalier, Baron de Crissé, who died in 1630. The erudite Gaiguères, who died in 1715, recognised it as the original book. But a day came towards the dawn of the eighteenth century when the volume fell into the hands of a vandal. He divided up the book, detached each page which was ornamented with miniatures, and threw away the remainder of the book, which may have been destroyed, but whose existence is, at any rate, entirely unknown. In order to make these miniatures appear as independent paintings, the vandal carefully covered some of the words of the text which appeared on the same page as the miniature with ornamental borders cut from other miniatures of a much later period, the eighteenth century.

The author of this book then traces the manner in which the other leaves of the Livre d'Heures were slowly recovered from various countries in Europe. The book has been published by the Société Française for private circulation amongst the members.

The author's previous works on ancient and modern printing in the roman letter are written from what is a comparatively fresh point of view-that of the collector interested rather in the beauty than in the archaeology of books. His studies therefore have drawn attention to many printers whose merits had not hitherto been recognized by those collectors whose appreciation of books is based upon historical considerations. There are many books, rare, and thus valuable enough as examples of this or that printer's development. as examples of this or that printer's development or as exhibiting various biblio-

graphical or typographical minutiae, but which are neither composed in a satisfactory type nor agreeably set on the page.

And although an undeniable interest, not to say fascination, attaches to nearly every member of that class of books known as incunabula, i.e. books published during the fifteenth century, it cannot be gainsaid that very many of the productions of this period are more conspicuous for their archaeological than for their aesthetic interest. A volume of first-class facsimiles selected in accordance with a high typographical standard has not previously been available, therefore collectors and amateurs of books of the fifteenth century will be grateful for Mr. Morison's volume. Limiting himself to the consideration of the German books printed in that century, the author has selected from the uniquely rich and representative British Museum collection, one hundred and fifty-two of the best examples of Gothic composition. These plates exhibit only the finest specimens of that classic Black Letter, unrivalled in its stateliness, with which printing made its début and which was so soon to fall into decline; but there is also included a fine series of examples of transitional Gothic founts. Thus, in addition to pages from the books of Fust and Schoeffer, Koberger, Gunther Zainer and Ratdolt, there is reproduced a number of the less familiar pages by Michael Wenssler of Basel, Hoeltzel of Nuremberg, Schonsperger of Augsburg, Johann Zainer of Ulm, Kollicker of Basel, and others. No fewer than half the plates are in two colours, and while the volume deals only with typography not a few of the pages embody examples of contemporary wood-cut illustration. The facsimiles, many of which will bear decorative initials, are reproduced in the exact size and with the exact margins of the originals. A descriptive catalogue precedes the plates. The volume therefore presents a typographical pageant of unrivalled splendour, and cannot fail to be of considerable interest to artists and typographers, as well as to collectors, amateurs and others.

In all these essays the author breaks new ground: No. 1 appeared in "The Library," June, 1924, but has since been greatly expanded and largely rewritten in the light of new discoveries. It deals with a group of bindings, most of which belonged to Jean Grolier, and brings new evidence to the controversy whether the bulk of the great collector's bindings were of French or Italian workmanship.

No. 2 discusses two little known groups of sixteenth century bindings, and incidentally brings evidence to show that a remarkable binding in the British Museum, hitherto considered to be a modern forgery, is a genuine example of

Renaissance work.

No. 3 is the first detailed and scientific study ever made of the bindings of this mysterious collector. Mr. Hobson has been remarkably successful in tracing the books which composed his library, and the results of his investigations are startling and are likely to modify the whole study of sixteenth century binding.

No. 4 gives an account of an almost forgotten Italian politician who owned some beautiful bindings, now very rare, a list of which is given.

No. 5 proves conclusively that Demetric Canevari never owned the famous bindings

decorated with the medallion of Apollo and Pegasus which for over sixty years have been associated with his name. It suggests who the true owner may have been, discusses when and where they were executed, and relates them to other Italian bindings of the period.

The lists of bindings are a feature of the essays: so far as possible the successive owners of each binding are named, and references given to reproductions where

any exist.
