But Mr. Simon goes much farther: he has included in this first volume, which deals entirely with Incunabula, a great number of rare books, mostly from his own collection, which nobody would have expected to find in such an anthology, books such as Gutenberg's Bible, the works of Homer and Horace, Chaucer and Gower, Lucan and Juvenal, Ovid and Pliny, Seneca and Cicero, Livy, Virgil and others. And from all such books the author has distilled the wine they contained. He explains what wines were the Yayin, Schechar, Tirosh, Ahsis, Khemer, Khomets, Messech, Shevahrim, of the Bible and what were the wines of Chaucer's Canterbury Tales, the Candye, Claret, Claree, Grenache, Hippocras, Hydromel, Lepe, Malvoisie, Must, Oxymel, Piements, Romaney, Ribolle and Vernage.

This first volume is illustrated with 60 facsimile reproductions of front pages, woodcuts and other examples of early typographic art, all from books in the author's collection.

There are three very useful indexes which will be greatly appreciated by Collectors, Librarians and Booksellers; an alphabetical index of authors' names, a chronological index of dates of publication, and an index of the various Presses.

This edition consists of 250 numbered copies only, offered at the price of  $\pounds_4$  4s.

This volume will be followed shortly by another, comprising the books on the same subject printed after the year 1500 and before the year 1601.
