GLASS.

- 1 Nine old Dutch wine glasses, with opaque white twist stems, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, and a goblet, engraved with a portrait, flowers and foliage, on moulded base, 9in. high.
- 2 A set of four Waterford circular salt cellars, cut with faceting.
- 3 A wine glass, the bowl etched with cupids sporting, on faceted stem, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, and two others, with funnel bowls and tear drop stems.
- 4 Twelve wine glasses, with opaque white twist stems.
- 5 A pair of Cork decanters and stoppers, cut with panels of diamond pattern, $9\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, and three rummers, with diamond cut bowls, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 6 A milk jug, cut with diamond pattern, a pair of sweetmeat dishes, with similar cutting, a mustard pot and cover, and five cruet bottles.
- 7 A pair of candlesticks, cut with diamond pattern, and with prismatic pendants, on circular bases, 8in. high.
- 8 An oval basket, cut with running scroll ornament, on diamond shaped base, 8in. high, and a bowl and cover, cut with flowers and trellis pattern, $8\frac{3}{4}$ in. diam.
- 9 A wine glass with funnel bowl, on air twist stem, $6\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, another with moulded bowl, and similar stem, and another.
- 10 Three ale glasses, with air twist and baluster stems.
- 11 A wine glass, with funnel bowl, on plain stem and folded foot, $5\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, two others, with plain stems, and two ditto, with folded feet.
- 12 Five wine glasses, with funnel bowls, on plain stems, 6in. to $6\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 13 A wine glass, with moulded bulbous stem and dome foot, $6\frac{7}{8}$ in. high, and another, with thistle bowl and tear drop stem, on wide foot, 6in. high.
- 14 Two wine glasses, with baluster stems and folded dome feet, $5\frac{1}{2}$ and $6\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, and three wine glasses, with funnel bowls.

- 15 Six wine glasses, with opaque white twist stems, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. to $6\frac{1}{2}$ in. *high*.
- 16 Seven wine glasses, different shapes, with plain stems, and two ale glasses.
- 17 A wine glass, the moulded bowl engraved with a Chinese pagoda, on opaque white twist stem, $5\frac{7}{8}$ in. *high*, three others, with moulded bowls and similar stems, an ale glass, and a wine glass, with ruby and white twist stem.
- 18 Nine ale glasses, engraved with barley and hops, on plain stems, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in. to $6\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*.
- 19 A cordial glass, the funnel bowl engraved with a rose branch, the stem with four knops, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. *high*.
- 20 An engraved wine glass, on plain stem, three others, with faceted stems, and an ale glass, with moulded bowl and faceted stem.
- 21 A large wine glass, engraved with a rose branch and butterflies, on opaque white twist stem and dome foot, $6\frac{1}{4}$ in. *high*, and a pair of rummers, the ogee bowls with engraved borders, $4\frac{1}{4}$ in. *high*.
- 22 A pair of wine glasses, engraved with flower branches, on faceted stems, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*, and five others, with engraved bowls.
- 23 Six wine glasses, engraved with vines, on cut baluster stems, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*, five others, a liqueur glass, and two firing glasses.
- 24 A rummer, engraved with a deer in panel, on dome foot, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. *high*, and three others, engraved with foliage.
- 25 Three plain rummers, with straight sided bowls, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in. *high*, and another, engraved with water lilies, on cut stem, 6in. *high*.
- 26 A pair of sweetmeat glasses, cut with bands of diamond pattern and fluting, on cut baluster stems and square bases, $5\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*.
- 27 An oval dish, cut with a band of foliage, $8\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*, a stand, cut with trellis pattern, on baluster stem and dome foot, 7in. *high*, a pestle and mortar, and a moulded double flask.
- 28 A circular moulded bowl, on stand, 11in. *diam*.
- 29 A Bristol opaque white flask, decorated with waves in red and blue, $8\frac{1}{2}$ in. *high*, a blue glass mug, a ditto miniature bowl, a Nailsea flask, and a pair of vases, with red, white and blue decoration.
- 30 A Bristol opaque white mug, painted with figures fishing, in colours, and with scroll work in lake, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*, another, barrel shape, with nearly similar decoration, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*, and a ditto, painted with a band of flowers, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*.
- 31 A circular bowl, with cut panels and borders, on square base, 6in. *high*, and four others, with flat cut borders.
- 32 A bowl, cut with hobnail pattern, on stand, with circular base, $10\frac{1}{2}$ in. *diam*.
- 33 Another, with similar cutting, on circular foot, $9\frac{3}{4}$ in. *diam*.
- 34 A pair of vases and covers, cut with oval panels, on baluster stems and circular bases, $16\frac{1}{2}$ in. *high*, and two large tazze, with flat cut borders.

OBJECTS OF ART.

- 35 An English miniature portrait of a gentleman in gold and enamel locket frame, with hair at the back, *XVIIIth century*.
- 36 A French tassie portrait of Henri IV., octagonal, $2\frac{5}{8}$ in. wide.
- 37 A Louis XVI. ivory needlecase, pierced and carved with a Sacrifice to Love, amatory trophy, etc., and with chased gold borders, $3\frac{1}{4}$ in.
- 38 A blonde tortoiseshell oval snuff-box, with gold piqué star decoration and scroll border, a gold medallion in the centre, *English, XVIIIth century*, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide.
- 39 A Louis XVI. fan, painted with a figure subject, the ivory sticks carved with figures dancing, mounted in a gilt frame, $24\frac{1}{4}$ in. wide.
- 40 A pair of old English glass pictures, Italian river scene and a seascape with burning ship, $12\frac{1}{2}$ in. by $10\frac{1}{2}$ in.
- 41 A Derbyshire spar goblet, of amethyst colour, on baluster stem and circular foot, $9\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 42 A ditto vase, with dome cover, and with baluster stem, on black marble square pedestal, 13in. high.
- 43 Another and cover, on black marble square base, $11\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 44 A Derbyshire spar urn shaped vase and cover, of amethyst colour, and with ormolu stem and foot, on square pedestal and marble base, 13in. high.
- 45 A ditto shallow bowl, with amethyst and brown colouring, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam.
- 46 A circular dish of orange colour, 8in. diam.
- 47 A Derbyshire spar ring stand, and a ditto small bowl.
- 48 A ditto shallow bowl, of amethyst colour, with silver rim, on three paw feet, $7\frac{1}{4}$ in. diam.
- 49 A green jasper cup, on baluster stem and circular foot, 3in. high, and a serpentine marble vase and cover, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 50 A porphyry campana shaped vase, on square base, 14in. high.
- 51 Another, similar, $13\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 52 A Charles II. mirror, the needlework border designed with animals, birds, conventional flowers and foliage, in coloured silks, $17\frac{1}{2}$ in. by 22in.
- 53 A German mantel clock, in ormolu square case, repoussé with figures, buildings and flowers, 26in. high.
- 54 An Empire clock, in ormolu case, chased with conventional scrolls, and surmounted by a female figure playing a harp, 16in. high.
- 55 A pair of Empire candelabra for six lights, surmounted by female figures, the branches terminating with griffins on fluted columns, 35in. high.

- 57 A Wedgwood porcelain wall pocket, printed with figures taking tea, in scroll panel, *W. mark*, 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 58 A pair of white salt glaze wall pockets, modelled with figures of Flora in shaped panels, 12in. high, *from the Sidebotham Collection*, and another, modelled with a mask and foliage scrolls, 10in. high.
- 59 A salt glaze granitic bear jug and cover, 9in. high.
From the Sidebotham Collection.
- 60 A salt glaze tea-pot, modelled in the form of a house, with mask spout, 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, and another, with crests and deep fluted border.
- 61 A ditto tea-pot and cover, modelled with flowers and foliage scrolls, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, and a milk jug and cover, modelled with flower branches in panels, 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 62 A salt glaze tea-pot, modelled with shells, vine branches and butterflies, on three mask and paw feet, 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, and a small ribbed basket, with entwined handle.
- 63 A ditto tea-pot and cover, modelled with birds and flower branches in blue, on three paw feet, 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, and another, with nearly similar decoration, 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 64 A salt glaze mug, painted with flowers, rocks and palisading in the Chinese taste, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, another, smaller, with Chinese flowers and rocks, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, and a milk jug, painted with flowers and bamboo in blue, 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 65 A salt glaze tea-pot and cover, painted with Watteau figures and flowers, rustic handle and spout, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 66 Another and cover, painted with figures, flowering plants and rocks in the Chinese taste, the border with flowers on shagreen ground, 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 67 Another, smaller, painted with a bird on a rock, and with flower branches, 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 68 A ditto heart shaped tea-pot and cover, modelled and painted with panels and borders of vines, 5in. high.

- 69 A salt glaze tea-pot and cover, painted with portrait of the King of Prussia and German emblem, in blue panels, with pink scroll and foliage borders, the white ground entirely decorated with husks in brown, rustic handle and spout, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 70 A salt glaze bowl, painted with flowering plants, rocks and fencing in the manner of Chinese, *famille rose*, 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam.

- 71 A Liverpool cream-ware tea-pot and cover, printed portrait of John Wesley, the reverse with inscription, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, and a cylindrical mug, painted with a landscape of a lady, and with flowers in black, inscribed *Phebe Hall*, 1779, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 72 A Lane End cylindrical mug, printed with the "Massacre and Execution of Louis XVI., King of France," by AYNSLEY, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, another, printed with a ship, and with figures of Peace and Plenty in colours, by DAWSON & Co., *Low Ford*, $5\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, and a ditto, with inscription, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 73 A Lane End bowl, printed with landscapes and Watteau figures, the interior with figure subjects in panels, and inscribed "Keep within Compass," etc., by AYNSLEY, $8\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., and another, nearly similar, 7in. diam.
- 74 A jug, printed with Palemon and Lavinia, in red transfer, $6\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, two mugs, modelled with figures on black ground, two others, a beaker and a bowl, with agate decoration.
- 75 A cylindrical mug, decorated in imitation of moss agate, $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, two others, a Leeds barrel shaped mug, green and brown, a ditto beaker, and a spirit flask in the form of a barrel.
- 76 A Whieldon solid agate ware diamond shaped tea-pot and cover, 6in. high, and another, circular, of agate ware, $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 77 An agate ware cylindrical mug, modelled with husk festoons in white, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, a ditto tea-pot and cover, a bowl, with modelled trellis border, and a flask.
- 78 Two Staffordshire plaques, modelled with figures of Flora, in colours, another, with classical figures, two others, modelled with flowers, and a ditto, modelled with a ship in colours.
- 79 A Staffordshire wall pocket, modelled with a female bust, $9\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, a salt glaze small plate, painted with flowers, three modelled leaf dishes, and a strainer.
- 80 A Leeds mottled brown coffee-pot and cover, with decorated borders, $9\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, a small porringer and cover, painted with Chinese river scenes in blue on brown ground, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. diam., and a sauce boat, painted with Chinese landscapes in blue, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 81 A Whieldon tea-pot, modelled with stags, huntsmen and hounds, and with flowers in colours, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, and a cover, and another and cover, modelled with birds, flowers and foliage scrolls, in green and brown, 5in. high.
- 82 An Astbury tea-pot and cover, modelled with vases of flowers, etc., in cream on brown ground, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, and another, modelled with chequer pattern, in cream and brown, $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 83 An Astbury cream ware tea-pot and cover, modelled with vine branches, on three mask and paw feet, the cover with bird top, 4in. high, another and cover, coloured buff and cream, with gilt decoration, on three feet, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, and a cream jug, similar, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.

- 84 A Whieldon milk jug and cover, modelled and gilt with flowers and foliage scrolls on green ground, 5in. high, an octagonal tea caddy, of mottled green, brown and yellow, 5½in. high, and a ditto sauce boat, formed as a dolphin, coloured green and brown, 4¾in. high.
- 85 A Staffordshire mug, modelled with a head of Rodney, and inscribed "Success to Lord Rodney," 4in. high, a sauceboat, with modelled border, 3in. high, a Jackfield tea caddy, modelled with vine branches and a figure of a cow, and a Chinese seated figure of an immortal.
- 86 A seated figure of Cupid, in imitation of bronze, by Wood and CALDWELL, 6¾in. high, and a pair of ditto candlesticks, supported by griffins, 4½in. high.
- 87 Three Elers ware tea-pots and covers, incised with chevron pattern, 3¼in. and 4in. high, an agate ware seated figure of a cat, 4in. high, and another of a monkey, 5in. high.
- 88 A solid agate ware cup, 3in. high, a spirit flask, modelled with masks, a money box, decorated in brown, another, stone ware, and a ditto pistol.
- 89 Three brown glaze bird ornaments, two tygs, a loving cup, and two mugs.
- 90 A slip-ware cradle, painted with scrolls in yellow, inscribed S.B. 1800, 7in. wide.
- 91 Another, modelled with armorials and conventional decoration, 12in. wide.
- 92 A Ralph Wood group, Harmony, a shepherd and shepherdess, with dog and lamb, on rock base, with tree stump, 10¼in. high.
- 93 A ditto figure of Falstaff, on scroll base, modelled with flowers, 10in. high.
- 94 A Ralph Wood figure of St. George and the Dragon, in blue, green and brown, 11½in. high.
- 95 A Whieldon group of two children asleep in an arbour, 3½in. high, and two ditto standing figures of a woman and a girl.
- 96 A Whieldon reclining figure of a lion, 2¾in. high, another with yellow glaze, and two others of dogs.
- 97 A figure of a dog seated on a cushion, 3½in. high, another, of a sheep, a figure of a sphinx and a green glaze small vase, modelled with a mask.
- 98 A Whieldon figure of Flora on octagonal base, 4¼in. high, and another, of a boy bacchanal.
- 99 A Whieldon yellow glaze equestrian figure of the Duke of Wellington, 4¼in. high.
- 100 A Staffordshire figure of a girl, 6in. high, another, Earth, by J. DALE, Burslem, 6¼in. high, a ditto figure of Fire, and two others, of a gardener and wife, by HALL and WALTON.
- 101 A vase, modelled with classical figures in white, on blue ground, by Wood and CALDWELL, 8in. high, a pair of blue and white jasper candlesticks, modelled with figures, etc., 7¾in. high, a Turner cane colour vase, modelled with cupids, supporting laurel festoons, 7in. high, and a ditto jug, 6½in. high.

- 102 A Wedgwood blue and white jasper pastille burner and cover, modelled with festoons, and supported by three figures of dolphins, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, a pair of ditto beakers, modelled with cupids, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, a WEDGWOOD and BENTLEY pedestal, and a vase, on circular pedestal, modelled with cupids sporting, by STEEL, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.

- 109 Eight English-Delft plates, painted with landscapes, figures and flowers in blue.
- 110 A ditto plate, inscribed G.B.E., 1698, in cartouche, $10\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., a Bristol octagonal dish, painted with flowers in the Chinese taste in blue, 13in. wide, and four small blue and white plates.
- 111 An old Delft cistern, fluted and painted with figures and shells in polychrome, $19\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 112 A Bow double sauceboat, painted with Chinese river scenes, figures and flowers in blue, in panels with modelled foliage borders, and with scroll handles, $8\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide.
- 113 A ditto sauceboat, painted with Chinese river scenes and flowers in blue, in panels with modelled borders, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 114 A Salopian tea-pot and cover, painted with flowers in the Chinese taste in blue, S. mark, $5\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, and another, old Worcester, painted with Chinese river scenes in blue, crescent mark, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 115 A Salopian milk jug and cover, painted with a Chinese river scene, figures and junk, in blue, S. mark, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, and a Caughley tea caddy, painted with groups of flowers and butterflies, C. mark, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, and two old Worcester plates, painted with Chinese decorations, Chinese marks.
- 116 A Bow fluted sauceboat, painted with Chinese river scenes in blue, $8\frac{1}{4}$ in. wide, and another, old Worcester, painted with flowers in the Chinese taste in blue, 8in. wide.

- 117 A Bow small fluted sauceboat, painted with Chinese river scenes in blue, 6in. wide, and a shaped mug, painted with a Chinese figure and flowers, 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 118 A Longton Hall tea-pot, painted with Chinese river scenes and figures in blue, in panels with foliage borders, 5in. high, and a Bow bowl, modelled with conventional flowers, and with blue border, 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diam.
- 119 A Bow saucer dish, painted with flower sprays and insects in blue, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., a shell dish, painted with flowering plants and rocks in the Chinese taste, 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide, and a Plymouth small dish, painted with Chinese buildings in blue, marked.
- 120 Three cups and saucers, painted with Chinese river scenes and flowers, Caughley, Longton Hall, etc., another, Chinese, and an old Worcester shaped spoon tray, painted with willow pattern and gilt.
- 121 An old Worcester tea-pot and cover, painted with flowers in the Imari taste, in panels divided by dark blue and gilt bands, 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 122 A Bristol tea-pot and cover, painted with flower festoons depending from loops in green, Walpole pattern, cross mark No. 15 in blue, 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 123 A ditto fluted small bowl, painted with a group and detached flowers, cross mark No. 12 in blue, 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diam., and another, painted with flowers, cross mark in blue, 4 $\frac{1}{8}$ in. diam.
- 124 A Bristol octagonal dish, painted with an urn and flowers, Dresden mark, 6in. wide, a saucer, painted with flower festoons in green, B. mark, and a cup, painted with flowers, cross mark.
