A Case containing 109 Polished Specimens of Hard Stones, oval, 1in. by 11/16in. each, eighteen of the specimens mounted with precious and semi-precious stones, a good representative collection

Twenty-six miscellaneous rings, some set with stones, two with enamelled bezels

Seven miscellaneous rings, one in silver with medallion bezel and cupids on shoulders of shank; one also in silver, of very early type with pellets in trios; a silvergilt embossed ring, also early, a silver "bague de fiançailles" with symbolic pendants consisting of model keys and padlocks, and three others

Fifteen miscellaneous silver and bronze rings, chiefly Roman and mediæval, one with much worn inscription in Gothic characters

5 Eight miscellaneous silver, silver-gilt and bronze rings, comprising a very interesting merchant's mark ring, with shoulders inlaid in silver, XVth century; a heavy silvergilt seal-ring, with octagonal bezel, XVIIIth century; a so-called marriage ring (two hands supporting a heart), and five others

Sixteen bronze Roman rings of various types; comprising two key rings. a serpent ditto, a pugilist's ring, one set with oval amethyst, and eleven others

Ten bronze and bronze-gilt Roman rings, comprising one with intaglio cut bust of a man, another, with mask of Jupiter in relief, a pugilist's ring, and seven others, all interesting types

Two Enamelled Bronze Rings, Roman, the hoops in each case rounded without and flat within; the enamel on the large circular bezels radiating from the centre in wedgeshaped cloisons, blue, white, yellow, red and black

9 Eight miscellaneous intaglio and cameo rings, comprising a solid silver Roman ring, set with intaglio of seated Mercury, fine; a gold ring, set with cameo head of Christ in steel or iron; three antique paste intaglios in silver settings, etc.

10 Eight miscellaneous rings, chiefly of the XIVth, XVth and XVIth centuries, two with inscriptions: one in bronze with circular cut steel medallion bezel, a Holbein-like portrait head

11 Eleven antique intaglios in stone and paste, in gold, silver and bronze settings; chiefly XVIth, XVIIth and XVIIIth century

- A bronze archer's ring, with vesica shaped bezel and octagonal shank, found at Baynard's Castle, very rare; also a heavy bronze ring chased on the shoulders with helmets, and other war trophies; an antique bronze ring with silver figures of a sleeping Eros in bezel, and one other
- 14 Ten fancy rings in gold, silver and bronze, set with stones and paste; one with bezel supported by enamelled cupids, XVIth century, the rest chiefly of the XVIIth and XVIIIth centuries
- 15 Five gold dress rings, comprising an XVIIIth century gemring with motto, "No treasure like a true friend," a blue and white enamel ditto, and three others; also a silver ring, set with Wedgwood button
- 16 A gold marquise ring, set with diamonds, XVIIIth century : also a silver ditto, set with pearls 2
- 17 Two XVIIth century gold and niello rings; a broad gold ring with pierced work floral design and Glück in Gothic letters; and a beavy silver-gilt ring, a shield supported by dolphins

Two rings, with long octagonal bezels, swivel-mounted, set with miniatures; also a gold memorial ring, with cameo of nymph before a funerary urn, in long oval bezel 3

An XVIIIth century gold and enamel memorial ring, with coffin-shaped bezel, containing miniature skeleton, date (1726), and other particulars on inside of shank; also a gold "poison" ring

20 A GOLD GREEK RING with symbol of Athens on bezel, ΦΙΛΟΜΟΥΣWN engraved inside the shank; also an XVIIIth century gold penannular ring

21 An Early Gold Ring with circular bezel, cut with incuse head of a woman; another, with octagonal bezel, having a figure design in low relief and letters S R in field 2

A XIVth century bronze lyre-shaped brooch, with Gothic inscription, in raised letters, "Pense bien," French, rare, found at the Swan Wharf, Thames Street, in 1867; an XVIIIth century pierced-work silver badge, Irish, the device a harp, crowned, with shamrock, found opposite the Temple, in 1867; and eight bronze and silver-headed pins, Elizabethan, found in Walbrook and elsewhere 10

A silver knitting pin, of the Tudor period, found at York; a silver-gilt four-pronged fork, probably Roman; another, three-pronged, found at Moorfields; a large early spoon, with engraved bowl; a silver spatula-shaped ditto, with ornamental handle, the seal-top prolonged as a knife, and three others

Thirteen miscellaneous Roman objects, comprising a giltbronze crossbow-shaped fibula; a pair of bronze sphinxes; a bronze head of Zeus; a pair of glass-pincers; a griffonhead amulet; etc., etc.

A patera or late kylix of red and black Greek glazed ware, corresponding somewhat to the black "Nolan" ware, $2\frac{1}{4}in$. high, $5\frac{1}{4}in$. diam., Cyprus, rare; also a small earthenware vase, $3\frac{1}{2}in$. high, from Rhodes; and another, with trumpet mouth

A vase in soft white earthenware, with medallion of female figure dancing; also a small two-handled Rhodian vase, decorated with animals, and a one-handled vase, circular lip, from Cyprus

A terra-cotta two-handled vase, with remains of black decoration, 4½in. high; another, 5½in. high, one-handled, with ribbed body, shaped like a jug; also a black glaze vase, one-handled, with globular body, and wide mouthpiece, chipped, 3¾in. high by 2½in. diam.; and an archaic two-handled earthenware vase, with classical figures and conventional designs


