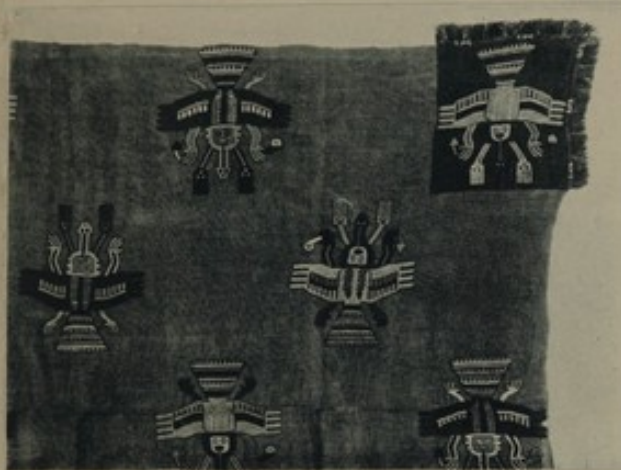

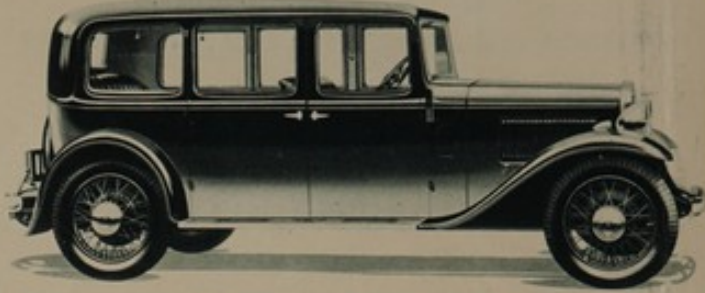

Remarkable Collection of Peruvian Textiles To Be Sold Next Week

Little has been published in this country about the ancient arts of Peru. An important collection to be sold in London next week provides an opportunity to both buyers and students.

WHAT is almost certainly the most important collection of ancient Peruvian textiles ever sold in this country will be put up on October 5 at Puttick and Simpson's. The collection comprises over eighty lots, including a few pieces of pottery and other objects, and not only are many of the panels and garments of unusually large size, but they are also in a very remarkable state of preservation.

The textiles come from Paracas, a peninsula a little to the south of Lima, and not very far from the centre of the Nasca culture. The soil in these hot, dry regions of the coast preserves buried objects like the soil of Egypt, and many fine articles of clothing and other examples of weaving and embroidery have been obtained from graves.

The funerary character of the textiles at Puttick's will be appreciated from the complete set of gold ornaments from a mummy, including pieces to be placed on the forehead, nose and shoulders.

Two miniature pottery figures of female human beings wearing bird-like masks. These were fixed on or in the wrappings of the mummy in the manner of the ushabtiu figures and scarabs of ancient Egypt.

Dating Difficulties

It is extremely difficult to assign any dates to Peruvian antiquities. The absence of written records, the confusion of the various cultures due to trade, conquest, and the mingling of peoples, and the destruction wrought by the Spaniards have prevented until now, and perhaps for always, any very clear idea of the development of the different cultures being formed.

It appears, however, that two principal periods may be fixed, an archaic period somewhere about 2,000 years ago, and the pre-Inca and Inca period, dating from the 12th century to the Spanish conquest (16th century).

The first period is divided by Mr. T. A. Joyce, of the British Museum, and other experts, into a highland culture, called Tiawanaco, after an important site near Lake Tititaca, and two coastal cultures, proto-Chimu, to the north of the modern Lima, and proto-Nasca, to the south. All three probably disappeared about 200 A.D., though a second

Tiawanaco period may perhaps be recognised up to about 800 A.D.

Then followed a period of decadence and foreign invasion, artistic production reviving again about 1100, with the invasion of the highlands by the Incas, and the rise of the Chimu and Nasca cultures on the coast.

Experts in this country are somewhat chary of assigning the earliest dates to textiles. The Victoria and Albert Museum, for example, does not claim to have any earlier than the intermediate period of decadence. It is quite possible, however, that some, at any rate, of the lots at Puttick's may be of the earlier period. This would make them about 2,000 years old.

There is indeed something to be said for

giving an early date for most of these pieces.

In the Inca and pre-Inca periods designs were mostly geometrical. Even where figures are introduced, for example, formal animal and bird shapes, they form part of a geometrical arrangement, and their purpose is pattern and pattern alone.

The important pieces in this collection, on the other hand, are richly decorated with figures having some religious or ritual significance. There are several large robes, shawls and other garments decorated with interlaced serpents. These may have been used purely for their artistic value, but in view of the prominent part of the serpent in primitive religions all over the world it is far more likely that they are symbolic.

PROBABLY the most excellent artist among the basses of our age was Edouard de Reszke, who combined in a unique degree a splendour of voice with great range and versatility, and a stage presence and technique which enabled him to excel in a variety of rôles, even in those calling for such widely differing qualities as Sachs in "Die Meistersinger," and Mephisto in "Faust."

The story of the de Reszke brothers is shortly to be published, and should be fascinating reading, as both were men of distinguished personality and sterling quality, apart from their artistic pre-eminence.

Indeed, it is recorded in "The Golden Age of Opera," by Herman Klein, that the impresario, Augustus Harris was in the habit of engaging them without written contracts, so great was his faith in their business integrity. It is the more regrettable, therefore, that the gramophone has so little to say about them.

That the fastidious Jean made some experimental records seems to be beyond doubt—there is evidence of it—though these never saw the light of day; but the genial and more easy-going Edouard permitted three records to be published by the Columbia Company in 1903, namely, Don Juan's Serenade (Tschai-kowsky); Porter Song, "Marta"; and Infelice, "Ernani."

Very few people bought records in those days, or even realised their potential historical value, added to which the reproduction of these early Columbia records on the machines of the period was poor; at any rate, whatever the reason, Edouard's records rank in rarity with the world's rarest postage stamps, though their cash value has never yet been tested.

In the broadcast programme to which I referred in my recent remarks on the records of Suzanne Adams, the public had an opportunity of hearing one of these discs, which received delighted comment from Mr. Herman Klein, the eminent veteran critic.

They have the old-fashioned "announcement," which to-day sounds thrilling, in connection with so distinguished a name; in the case of my own valued copy, this voice was at once recognised by a de Reszke student as belonging to Edouard's major-domo, who was a well-known figure in the de Reszke circle.

Only Four Known

Four specimens of these records can be traced in England, one in U.S.A., and one in Cuba. That there are others at present undiscovered may be taken as certain, so readers of *The Bazaar* should keep a look-out. The records are 10 inch, single-sided; and the labels may be either silver lettering on black, or gold lettering on red; my copy has both—the former superimposed on the latter.

Another bass of almost equal excellence and fame was Pol Plançon, who fortunately took a more liberal view of the possibilities of the gramophone, so that the persevering collector may reasonably hope to unearth a specimen or two of his early recordings.

These belong to that 1902-3 series of London records to which I have previously referred, and which are the hope and despair of every collector. They are known by the raised red label of the Gramophone and Typewriter Co., and include the Mephisto songs from "Faust," the Toreador Song, Vulcan Song, and the once-famous Piff-Paff from "Les

Huguenots"; also some charming light ballads by Bernberg, Chaminade and Godard.

In 1904 the first American recording was added to the English catalogue—Pro Peccatis, in Rossini's "Stabat Mater"; after which, in the following year, and for about three years thereafter, came a number of American (Victor) records, all of interest and merit, both 10 inch and 12 inch. Of these, however, all were solo records except one only, which was of great historical interest, though of doubtful merit—the finale to Faust, in which he was joined by Emma Eames and Dalmores.

The present generation can have little idea how dominating a figure was Plançon on the operatic stage. His marvellously easy and flexible production, the perfect polish, the majestic and rolling tones, and the sable richness of his voice, single him out as a very great artist indeed, while his powers as an actor were of unusual merit.

Covent Garden in the 'nineties seems to us to-day to have been the home of romance; and certainly the possession of two such basses as de Reszke and Plançon was an indication of the golden character of the age.

In the triple bill which was arranged for the Diamond Jubilee operatic gala, Plançon figures in each excerpt, namely, as Hermann in "Tannhäuser," Capulet in "Roméo et Juliette," and St. Bris in "Les Huguenots"; no other artist was so honoured. On this august occasion the third act of Roméo was sung by Melba, the brothers de Reszke, and Plançon—a cast which needs no comment from me.

CLOCKS

Clock by John Bennett (D. C. H.).—Although you do not say so, we take it that this clock is intended for a bracket, or shelf, and is not supplied with a long case. The name of the maker is a guarantee of good workmanship. As the clock is not in going order, why not consult the maker? This would ensure it remaining a true specimen of his work. A restoration fee of about 25/- would render the timepiece worth at least £5 to a private buyer requiring a modern one of good quality. (7720)

Grandfather Clock by J. Mansford of Iminster (Falcon).—We cannot trace Hansford. If we say that your clock was made about 1780 we shall not be far out, for everything in the description points to it being of this date. The calendar dial suggests an eight-day movement, and enables us to estimate the worth of the clock at about £6. (7773)

COINS & MEDALS

Anglesey Mines Halfpenny (H. B.).—There are no fewer than 58 varieties of the Anglesey halfpenny token dated 1788, mostly only to be distinguished by trivial differences in the die or the number of acorns in the wreath. Some are rare, but the selling price of the majority is about 2d. good, 6d. fine, 9d. very fine, 1/- extra fine. (7663)

Three Roman Coins (C. D. P.).—(1) Denarius of Octavianus, struck a.c. 43. Obverse: CAESAR IMP. Bare head of Octavianus, r. Reverse: ANTONIVS IMP. (Marcus Antonius), Winged Caduceus (Cohen 6). Cohen valued this coin at 4 fr. (3/2), but it is worth more now—about 5/- fine, 7/6 extra fine. (2) Sestertius of Julia Mamaea (mother of Severus Alexander, assassinated A.D. 235). Reverse: IVNO AVGVSTAE S. C. Juno seated l. holding a flower and an infant in swaddling clothes (Cohen 53); value 2/- to 2/6. (3) Sestertius of Severus Alexander, struck A.D. 229. Reverse: P.M. TR. P. VIII. COS. III. P.P. S.C. Liberty standing half l., holding cap and transverse sceptre (Cohen 372). Worth about 4/-, very fine but unpatinated (unless it has been burnished). (7730)

Three Coins (R. P. McK.).—(1) Copper penny of Victoria, 1855. With ornamental trident in the hand of Britannia this is valued at 1/- fine, 1/6 very fine, 2/- extra fine; but with plain trident it is rare, valued at 2/- fine, 3/- very fine, 4/6 mint state. (2) The Indian rupee of 1862 is listed 2/6 very fine, so one in mint state might fetch 5/-. (3) The U.S.A. Chicago Exhibition Columbian half-dollar of 1893 is scarce but not rare, so a worn specimen would be difficult to sell. You are entitled to only three valuations for one coupon, but your other coins are not worth much over their face value. (7729)

Two Roman Coins (S. W.).—(1) Fallis of Constantius II (A.D. 337-361). Reverse: FEL. TEMP. REPARATIO. Soldier leaping upon a fallen horseman. Value 1/- to 1/6. (2) Rubbing faint, but the coin appears to be a sestertius of Philippus Senior (A.D. 244-249). If reverse reads SAECVLARE S. C. it was struck to commemorate the Secular Games, A.D. 248. Value about 2/6. (7816)

Two Coins (F. G. D.).—(1) The shilling of William III bears dates from 1695 to 1701, so the date on your coin is probably 1697 (the 7 partly rubbed) for it cannot be 1691 as you read it. The shilling of 1697 is offered at 2/- fine. (2) The Britannia great of William IV, 1834, is worth 1/- when in mint state, but not over 6d. if at all rubbed. His Maundy fourpence is listed 6d. good, 9d. fine, 1/- very fine. (7760)

Halfcrown of George III (E. J. V.).—Your coin is a halfcrown of the first type of George III, 1817. This is offered at 3/6 extra fine, 4/- mint state, but specimens in less than fine state are hardly worth face value. (7759)

Sixpence of George II (P. W.).—The sixpence of 1757 is very common, a provincial dealer listing specimens at 6d. fine, 9d. extra fine. There was a large issue of this date. (7761)

Rubbing of Coin (H. G.).—Your coin, if of copper, is a dolt of Gelderland, Dutch United Provinces, 1765. Value 3d. fine, 6d. very fine. (7815)

Scottish Coin (Castleberg).—Your coin is a 5/- (5d. British) piece of William III, 1699. This is scarce, being listed at 1/- fair, 2/6 good. (7860)

Meane Medal (P. S.).—The best way to sell your Meane medal would be to send it to Messrs. Glendinning and Co., 11, Argyle Street, Oxford Circus, to be put up at one of their monthly coin and medal sales. They would get its price upon the open market. Messrs. B. A. Seaby, Ltd., 68, Gt. Portland Street, London, W.1, may be interested in the medal, and we suggest that you write to them. (7858)

Victorian Pieces (J. T. W.).—(1) The sixpence of Queen Victoria, 1873, might fetch 1/- extra fine, but we are puzzled by the stamped 10 you mention, which is possibly some countermark. (2) E medal sold at the Accession of Queen Victoria, 1837. Probably worth 1/- to 1/6. (7857)

CURIOS

Model of Brig (W. T.).—There are two classes of collectors interested in old ship models. The one is concerned solely with the scale-models from which early vessels were built, and the other will buy any good model of early type which does not duplicate a specimen he already possesses. In the latter class we place the American buyer, who seeks any good old model suitable for the decoration of the cabin of his yacht. Your brig, the rigging of which appears to be correctly restored, is worth £8. (7659R)

Lace Bobbins (J. R.).—The address supplied to you is certainly a trifle vague. As we do not know of the "Society" in question we suggest that you send your offer through the firm who recommends such means of disposal, enclosing a stamp for forwarding to the correct address. The alternative is to offer the bobbins to the competition of a suitable sale room. Blotter (H. A. V.).—Stationery pads of this pattern date from about 1850, and were made to lie on the flap of Davenport desks. In these days, when desks must be made to pay their way or go to the lumber room, pads consist of a fold of good blotting paper. As a relic of less strenuous times your blotter is worth 15/-. (7855)

Naval Cutlass (H. E.).—At earliest this was made some 10 years before the battle of Trafalgar. Such weapons are by no means scarce, and as there are very few collectors of them they do not realise more than 8/- to 10/- each. (7812)

Glass Picture (S. W.).—A magnifying glass will enable you to see that this is really a print which has been attached to a glass panel. The process consisted of varnishing the print to the glass, rubbing away most of the paper, and backing the result with patches of colour. The religious character determines the value, which is 18/-. (7755)

Bronze Figure (O. H. J.).—The bronzist in question is not known to us, but of course many thousands of craftsmen worked in this material during the 19th century. Upon inspection we could decide whether you have an ornament made by some mass-production method, or an individual work of art. In any case, the value is not likely to exceed £5, for if the artist had been famous we should have traced some record of him. (7852)

Six Copper Measures (H. R. H.).—Sets of measures of this kind are still in common use in the houses of wine and spirit merchants who rack their own spirits. Most of the sets in use have been in their present place for well over a hundred years, and we feel certain that your shapely set can claim to have been made about 1800. The six are worth £4.10. (7726)

Pipe (J. M.).—We do not agree with your description "clay pipe," for obviously your pipe is a pottery one made in Staffordshire some 150 years ago. If perfect it is to-day worth 30/-. (7660)

Bronze Group (W. G. T.).—The bronze ornaments of commerce cast from models by P. J. Menu are certainly desirable, but as there appears to have been no limit to the number allowed to be placed on the market they are by no means rare. A fair average price for the one in question is £4. (7850)

Frame, etc. (P. B.).—The frame dates from about 1890, and was made to hold photographs. Value 18/-. The stereoscope is of slightly earlier date, but even this does not render it specially valuable, for earlier types are still obtainable. As, however, you have 78 views, of some interest to students of Italian architecture, we reckon its value at £3. (7691)

Three Card Cases (Invicta).—Pique-work of later date than 1840 lacks interest to the collector unless the object decorated by such process is one in use to-day, in which case the form counts for more than the manner in which it is decorated. Card cases are neither early nor fashionable. Very pleasing ones, in ivory or tortoiseshell, sell for a price ranging from 15/- to 25/-. (7861)

FURNITURE

Pair of Oval Mirrors (H. B. C.).—Without inspection we cannot state definitely that these are of later date than 1850, but the probability is that they were made shortly after the Exhibition of 1851. If so the pair is worth £4. If of earlier date they might realise more, but in any case the "plaster" frames prevents the possibility of a value in excess of £8. (7727)

Cabinet (M. R. H.).—This dates from the first half of the 18th century. We are surprised to find that it is made of oak, for walnut is the wood usually associated with such piece, even if the surface only is covered with the better material. In walnut, of nice colour, we should reckon it at £12. In oak at £5. (7692)

Welsh Dresser (J. M. J.).—This is a good plain dresser, made for use in a farmhouse rather than in a home furnished without much regard to expense. The fact that the bottom portion is not enclosed adds to its simple attractions, and renders it much more readily saleable than a dresser with the lower portion resembling a chest of drawers. It is of the right period, viz., 1700-1750, and if the colour is good is worth £10. (7757)

Stool, etc. (E. W.).—The photograph depicts a stool such as was first made during the second quarter of the 18th century. It is well preserved, but this does not preclude the possibility of its dating from this good period. If right it is worth £30, but if it is a modern copy—such as can be found in most photographers' studios—its maximum value is £5. The chairs are definitely Victorian, and owe nothing to any designer whose memory can claim respect. The joinery is good. Maximum value 35/- the set of four. (7723)

Footstool (S. C.).—The modern home has no place for footstools, and Victorian footstools cannot lay claim to any right to preservation unless they serve some useful purpose. The ones illustrated by the sketches enclosed are worth at most 15/- each. (7854)

Carved Oak Chest-of-Drawers (Mrs. C.).—The only information we have is that this piece is of earlier date than 1633, and is decorated with carving. If by carving moulding is indicated, the chest is a Jacobean one, of a kind made any time during the period 1625-1680. In a nice state, such chest is worth £12. (7754)

GLASS

Two Glasses (C. H. R.).—A sketch must always be poor evidence when one is considering the age of a specimen of glassware, for the old designs are still copied. If your glasses are not clever reproductions they came from Northern Italy early in the 18th century—possibly from Venice. As such they would to-day be worth 15/- each. (7771)

PAINTINGS

Identification of Pictures.—Readers should send a pencil sketch (or, preferably, a photograph) to show the composition of the picture they inquire about, together with the size. Values, however, are chiefly assessed on the quality of the colouring, execution and age, and these points can only be determined on inspection. The fee for the valuation of paintings from examination by our expert is 7/6 each, plus the cost of return carriage.

Two Oil Paintings (H. C.).—Your Venetian scene may be by Bellotto, whose works fetch good prices. We advise inspection. The portrait of a Saint belongs to the Italian school, and is in the manner of Carlo Dolci. Only an inspection can determine whether it is original or a copy. The quality is very good indeed. Cost of cleaning this painting would be about £2. (7822R)

Pen-and-ink Sketch (J. H. K.).—Your pen-and-ink sketch by C. Keene of London is of little value. His period was 1823-91. (7551)

PAINTINGS

Hagar and Ishmael (I. B.).—This subject was painted by several artists of note. The value can only be assessed on inspection, as it largely depends upon the artist, period, etc. (7529)

Moonlight Scene (John).—A genuine Van der Neer painting the size you mention and of good quality would be worth about £100 at least. We suggest inspection. (7653)

Pencil Drawings (J. H. K.).—Modern pencil drawings are of little worth. We cannot trace the artist you mention. (7343)

Temple and Ships (E. V. H.).—Your photograph depicts Chinese scenes. If period is early 19th century the value is about £5 or £4 the pair. (7717)

Horses Grazing (Ipsolonian).—If genuine, value about £20 to £30. (7365)

Two Paintings (H. G. G.).—The values to-day are not more than they were in 1917. In many instances they are less. The prices appear to be quite moderate for the artists you name and the character of the work. We could only give a re-valuation, however, on further inspection. (7655)

The Cheese in Chancery (S. T.).—Your painting is by an English artist, period about mid-Victorian. It is quite well executed and is worth about £5 or £6. On inspection we may be able to suggest the artist. (7750)

Bird's Nest with Eggs (L. A. L.).—Sorry, we cannot suggest the name of artist from the initials you give. (7451)

Horse and Jockey (M. R.).—The painting of a racehorse has a sporting interest, more so if the artist is known. We advise inspection, as you may possess a picture of some value. (7302)

Landscape by R. H. Nibbs (A. L.).—This artist specialised in seascapes, and exhibited over 200 works in various exhibitions. His pictures are to be seen at the Brighton Art Gallery, where they are very much appreciated. (7536)

Landscape (Jim).—Sorry we cannot trace the artist named A. Bute. The nearest is A. Butin, a French artist of the late 19th century. (7549)

Woodland Scene (B. A.).—If genuine and the subject and condition are good your painting by Jas. Stark would be worth about £40 to-day. We cannot trace your other artist, F. Mayer. There was A. Mayer, who painted river scenes. (7756)

Waterway in Venice (A. W. S.).—This subject by A. E. Manley is an attractive one, and should fetch about £10 to £12. (7452)

Three Nude Children (Windsor).—William Stephen Coleman, the London figure artist, exhibited over 30 pictures during 1865-79. Being late his works do not fetch high prices, but should be quite saleable to collectors of modern artists. (7222)

River Scene (A. L.).—A landscape such as you describe would be worth a few pounds to-day. The artist, Edgar Longstaffe, exhibited six works in the R.A. between 1885-89. (7223)

A Painter Dog on Moorland (E. W. P.).—We cannot trace the name Dabby, but suggest it might be J. Danby, a landscape artist who exhibited considerably over 100 pictures, 1842-76. There was another artist, same name and period, but of lesser importance. Your other picture is of little value, as the works of this artist are of small interest. (6736)

Harvest of the Sea (W. C. W.).—Theodore Weber, of London, painted seascapes and exhibited five in the R.A., 1870-75. Your water colour by this artist should be worth about £4 or £5. (7342)

Two Drawings (W. C. C.).—Drawings for publications are generally poor sellers and seldom fetch more than a few shillings. (7218)

The Storm (Mr. F.).—If of good quality and up to his highest standard your painting by John Linnell is worth about £50 to £80. You do not give sufficient particulars of your other paintings to enable us to help you. (7219)

Italian Scene (E. H. G.).—We think your picture may be by Abraham Bosse. If so it is of value. We suggest Special Service inspection. This artist belongs to the 17th century, and was born at Tours, 1638. (6564)

PEWTER

Dishes with Relief Decoration (Constant Reader, J. E.).—These are Flemish and would probably be of greater interest without the decoration, most of which work, depicting these homely scenes, is added for tourist consumption. This type of dish was made from C. 1750 until modern times, and without inspection we could not value them at more than 15/- each. (7718)

Salt (J. H. K.).—This is not pewter but Britannia metal and the initials E.P. indicate that at some time it has been electro plated. Its value is not more than a shilling or two. (7811)

Plates (J. E.).—A rubbing would probably have enabled us to tell you the maker of these, which evidently are English, and since the condition is good, worth about 15/- each, if genuine. (7719)

POTTERY & PORCELAIN

Wall Pockets (Cymro).—These are comparatively modern and of French manufacture. Though of no great value, they are rather artistic as well as useful. "Wall pockets" are now used for spools, the larger ones for letters. Value 7/6 per pair to a private buyer. (7846)

Bust (D. G. P.).—This is made in parian, a fine variety of porcelain so called from its resemblance to the white marble quarried in the Island of Paros. Like all Copeland's productions it has quality, and is therefore distinguished from so many ornaments of the 1860 period. As, however, the model was published in very large quantities, the present-day value is not more than 30/-. (7721R)

Teapot (Kappa).—This is indeed one of the things which we know came from the Continent. The anchor mark, which was used at Chelsea among other places, counts for nothing when found on a vessel so incongruous. It was obviously made for sale in the Isle of Man, as a souvenir, but as it has no decorative value it is worth at most 5/-. Chelsea china is soft-paste, and never without some aesthetic interest. (7788R)

Lustre Jug (B. A.).—It is not easy for us to visualise a "resist" lustre jug of the kind described—the mention of red, green, etc., presenting a difficulty when one considers the process by which such jugs were made. A genuine old lustre jug, of quart size, decorated with a farming scene, is worth £7.10. (7772)

Cup and Saucer, etc. (W. I. N.).—The transfer-printed cup and saucer are of German origin. The mark denotes that they emanated from a factory which did not seem to wear the honours of an older firm, to whom transfer-printing was unknown. Value 7/6. The painted cup and saucer are also comparatively modern, and they, too, came from Germany. Value 4/-. (7725)

Two Tiles (H. B. N.).—These date from about 1840, the mark being one used by Messrs. Wedgwood for inferior wares of that period. Value 3/6 each. (7724)

Coalport Tea Set (D. W.).—The productions of the old Coalport factory were in no respects inferior to those of Rockingham, and your set (made about 1830) is worth, in our opinion, about £15 if in good condition. Look under the sugar basin to make sure that it is not marked. (If marked ask £21.) (7753)

Coalport Sugar and Cream (G. H.).—Though of the best porcelain, these pieces are of little value, say, 5/6 the pair, to anyone who wants them for practical purposes. They are comparatively modern, and might have been made at any time after the year 1875. The numerals 1750 refer to the date when the Coalport works were established and not to date of manufacture. (7770)

Green Leaf (L. W.).—This was not made at the Rockingham works, but at one of the factories in Staffordshire, which registered the design some time subsequent to 1843. We believe we are right in saying that it came from Minton's. In any case, the maximum value is 7/6. (7848)

Harvest Jug (Yellow Jug).—This was probably made at the local works, although similar jugs were distributed early in last century from several of the Staffordshire factories and many of them found their way to Glamorganshire. It is interesting, without having any great monetary value. The maximum price of such jug in a London shop is £2. (7853)

Statuette (J. A. V.).—This is an English piece, made about 1775. We are reluctant to value it without knowing whether it is in porcelain or pottery, the model being found in both materials. If in pottery, it came from one of the Staffordshire works, and is worth £3. (7814)

Two Green Vases (H. M.).—We take it that these are in porcelain and not glass. The absence of a high glaze suggests as much, although, of course, many mid-Victorian glass ornaments had a matt surface. If in parian (a kind of porcelain free from glaze) they are about 80 years old, and are worth 30/- the pair. (7813)

Derby Vase (Odin).—This is a pot-pourri container which has lost its lid. The form belongs to the beginning of the nineteenth century, which is not very early when one considers that the factory was established in 1756. Value 30/-. (7723)

Tea China (D. H.).—As far as we can gather from the description and pattern number, we can only say that it is "Staffordshire," fairly modern, and copied from an old Swansea design. It is impossible to state the actual manufacturer without seeing a specimen, but it may possibly be "Davenport" of Longport, who produced it about 1870. The cups and saucers have no value to a collector, but to a private buyer they are worth 3/- each, or thereabouts. (7751)

Pair of Figures (A. H.).—These are evidently "Bisque" figures, and it is actually impossible to give a satisfactory valuation or date of manufacture without first seeing a specimen. The old Derby Works, and also the "Sevres" factory in France, produced such figures, but the reproductions are numerous, and the greater number of these have practically no value. If your pieces are well modelled and coloured they are worth 15/- the pair for ornamental purposes. (7856)

Ironstone Plaque (L. F. D.).—If this is marked "Ironstone" we are of the opinion that it is early Staffordshire, made in 1825, or thereabouts. The pattern, of course, is world-wide known, and if you are correct in saying diameter, the size is most unusual for English plaques of this kind. If clearly printed, good blue, and sound it would be worth £3, approximately, as a decorative piece. On the other hand, should it be oblong in form and measuring 2 1/2 in. from end to end, the value is no more than 10/-. (7845)

China Dogs (Curios).—These quaint cottage ornaments have been turned out by many potters of the late eighteenth and early in the nineteenth centuries. Unless years are marked with the name of the potter they have no value, from a collector's point of view. Value 15/- the two if well modelled and finished. (7752)

Early Morning Set (E. S. F.).—This is of "Austrian" manufacture and comparatively modern. The mark is that of Vienna (the Austrian shield), and has been used from the year 1774. You give us no hint as to the decoration, but, like scores of similar sets which can be purchased both here and on the Continent, we will be quite safe in saying that it is not lacking in a lavish display of gilding and colouring. A fair price would be 50/- to anyone who cares for it. (7447)

PRINTS

Fishing in a Punt (Tinker).—A small hand-coloured print of anonymous origin, which may interest a "sportsman" at about 7/6. (7690)

Dante and Beatrice (A. M.).—This coloured photograph after H. Holliday is not of any market interest. The larger sized examples are issued at about 5/-; the smaller, 2/6. (7487)

The Hero's Targe (C. A. D.).—A set of prints called "The Trossachs" was published at 21/- each subject. This etching, by David Law, may be worth 5/- as an odd example from that series. Although this engraver did excellent work, his prints, pleasing though they be, are not now of high market appreciation, and ordinary titled impressions do not maintain their original prices. (7588)

William III Crossing the Boyne (Dreadnought).—What is the exact size, without margin, of this coloured print by J. Madden, after B. West? State also date of publication. A book print has no value. (7768)

Plan of "Fralagar" (R. E. M. B.).—If this coloured print bears no names of artist and engraver it may be worth 15/-. If of fair size, as an anonymous production, if any such names show send full details and size. (7686)

The Doctor (J. C.).—You have an American copy of the photograph after Sir Luke Fildes, R.A. It may appeal to a private buyer at 7/6. (7685)

Uncoupling the Hounds, etc. (A. P. F.).—In colours and of fair size this pair of anonymously engraved prints may interest a sporting buyer at 25/-. If plain, 10/-. (7745)

The Empty Chair, Cad's Hill (M. W. W.).—Very many impressions of this woodcut after Sir Luke Fildes were issued by the "London Illustrated News," as a supplement to each paper. There is really no market value for them, but sometimes an American will give 5/- or so for a copy. (7746)

Last Interview of Louis XVI (E. F. G.).—This small book plate by W. Greatbach has no value. "The Banquet Hall at Raglan Castle," by W. Westall, and "Triumph of Marat," have no value. (7769)

London Cries (J. R.).—Genuine examples of these prints after F. Wheatley, R.A. are in demand, especially when found in fine colour and condition. Without seeing at least one of your set we cannot advise you. There are many copies of this set on the market. "Carthage," by T. A. Prior, after Turner, may realise 5/-. (7744)

The Village Festival (F. M. S.).—Your small print by J. Carter, after F. Goodall, R.A., has no value. It has nothing to do with the painting in question. Small landscape etching by S. Ireland, after W. Hogarth, value 2/6. (7843)

Chepstow Castle (D. H. L.).—This small view by A. de Saffren may interest a buyer of topography at 3/6. (7842)

Lady Sefton (Pinto).—To a private buyer of portraits this print by J. Cande, after R. Cosway, R.A., may be worth 7/6. (7805)

O Nannie, Will Thou Gang Wif Me (A. G. R.).—There is no value attached to this print by Lamb Stock, after T. Faed, R.A., neither is there for "Ye Shall Walk," etc. There is no demand for old-fashioned line-engraved subjects. (7837)

Oliver Cromwell (L. A. L.).—This print portrait by F. Bartolozzi, after R. Walker, may appeal to a private buyer at 20/-. The two red prints by Rowlandson—"Venus," after Titian, and "Repose," after Boucher—10/- each, if early and genuine impressions. (7806)

Table Companions (J. J. F.).—Magazine illustrations of no value. (7844)

Jack Sheppard (J. W. S.).—These small etchings by G. Craikshank are not decorative prints, but book-plates. To an old book dealer they may be of some worth. Write to Mr. Spencer, 27, New Oxford Street, W.C.1. (7841)

SILVER

Tureen, etc. (J. T. B.).—The soap tureen appears to be a good example. If in fair condition value £2.10 to £3. If late Victorian period the pair of candelabra should be worth £4. (7308)

Tankard and Spoons (C. V. A.).—The tankard bears the date mark for 1761, but the decoration has been added at a later date. This, of course, detracts from the value, which is now about 6/6 to 7/- per ounce. The value depends on whether the spoons are of the fiddle or old English pattern. The weight—2 1/2 ozs.—indicates that the spoons are large. If this is so ask 2/9 per oz. for them. (7180)

Fruit Stand (J. H. K.).—About 25/- is the value of the fruit stand. (7306)

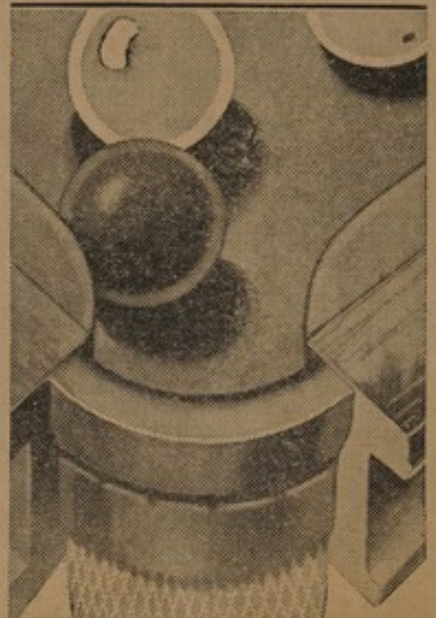
