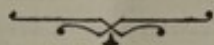


## CONDITIONS OF SALE.

---

- FIRST.—The highest bidder to be the buyer ; and if any dispute arise between two or more bidders, the lot so in dispute shall be immediately put up again and resold, provided the auctioneer cannot decide the said dispute.
- SECOND.—No person to advance less than 1s.; above five pounds, 5s.; and so on in proportion.
- THIRD.—In the case of lots upon which there is a reserve, the auctioneer shall have the right to bid on behalf of the seller.
- FOURTH.—The purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and to pay down 5s. in the pound, or more in part of payment, or the whole of the purchase-money, *if required* ; in default of which the lot or lot so purchased to be immediately put up again and resold.
- FIFTH.—Each lot is guaranteed genuine, but should any lot prove to be a forgery or reprint, or wrongly described in the catalogue, the purchaser is at liberty to take or reject it, provided always that notice of such rejection be made and the lot returned within seven days from date of sale. This guarantee does not apply to collections of stamps, or to mixed lots.
- SIXTH.—To prevent inaccuracy in delivery, and inconvenience in the settlement of the purchases, no lot can on any account be removed during the time of sale, and the remainder of the purchase-money must absolutely be paid on the delivery.
- SEVENTH.—Upon failure of complying with the above conditions, the money deposited in part of payment shall be forfeited ; all lots uncleared within the time aforesaid shall be resold by public or private sale, and the deficiency (if any) attending such re-sale shall be made good by the defaulter at this sale.
- EIGHTH.—If any owner has placed a reserve on any lot, the auctioneers reserve to themselves the right to publish the fact and price at which it is reserved.

## VAUXHALL GARDENS TICKETS.

Tickets of Admission to the Vauxhall Gardens, London.

### FIVE VARIED DESIGNS.

- a. *Obv.* CALLIOPE, the Muse seated ; *rev.* " Mr. John Hinton, 212, 1749."
- b. *Obv.* IOCOSÆ CONVENIUNT LYRÆ, three amorini with lyre, &c. ; *rev.* " Mr. Wood, 63, 1750."
- c. *Obv.* THALIA, the Muse with a mask in her hand ; *rev.* " Mr. Carey, 11."
- d. *Obv.* EUTERPE, the Muse seated, playing a flute ; *rev.* " Mr. R. Frankling, 70."
- e. *Obv.* ERATO, the Muse seated with a lyre, &c. ; a cupid at her feet ; *rev.* " Mr. Sam Lewes, 87."

The tickets are enclosed in an ormolu frame, the door glazed.

Also an engraving, in an ebonised frame, by James Stow, published in 1825, of these silver Tickets, which belonged to G. R. Barrett, a former manager of Vauxhall Gardens, and from which Stow engraved the plate

*\*.\*These Tickets which are in fine condition and of great rarity, were issued at 25/- each, afterwards £2 2s. as subscription passes to the famous Gardens. Each Ticket admitted two persons every week-night during the season of issue. The Gardens—originally known as the New Spring Gardens—were, from about 1712 to 1860, the scene of musical and spectacular entertainments ; not only patronised by the vulgar crowd but such celebrated personages as Dr. Johnson, Goldsmith, Hogarth, Garrick and other persons of repute, from Addison to Dickens, might have been seen in their days within the Gardens.*

*A quip on Vauxhall—about the time of the above-mentioned Tickets—terminates as follows :—*

*" The motley crowd we next with care survey ;  
The young, the old, the splenetic, and gay ;  
The fop emasculate, the rugged brave ;  
All jumbled here, as in a common grave."*

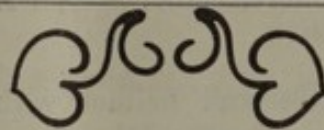
