Long,** noted American explorer and engineer, a series of five original letters covering ten pages, dated from Germantown, 1811 to 1812; a very interesting series of early letters from the pen of the famous Western Pioneer who explored the country between the Mississippi and the Rocky Mountains, Long's Peak, one of the highest points, was named after him
- 2 Sir Alexander Cuming, chief of the Cherokees, his original manuscript written while in prison to the Rt. Hon. Stephen Theodore Janssen, Lord Mayor of London, signed and dated June 26th, 1755; wherein he writes . . . "That by the disposition of Providence and the unanimous consent of a naked free and savage people your memorialist became duly qualified to lay the Crown of the Cherokee nation, their Eagles Tails and Scalps of their Indian enemies at His Majesty's feet as a token of their homage and submission" . . . etc., together with another notebook containing a reference to the Cherokees

- 3 American distribution of His Britannick Majesty's Forces, 1765, an important manuscript showing the Forces, Commanders and Colours in America, Jamaica, Florida, Dominica, etc., by the famous Dan. Paterson, Qt. Mr. General, and of road-book fame
- 4 Charles Sumner, distinguished American Statesman, a very fine letter of four pages quarto, from Boston dated, 1840, re the adoption of the Federal Constitution, and mentions Harrison, Everett, Clay, Webster, etc.

- 7 **Jefferson Davis,** President of the Confederacy, an original letter re a beautiful tribute to the character of General Robert E. Lee, . . . "It does not often fall to the lot of the unsuccessful to be so well appreciated by their own generation"... together with another, and portraits
- 8 **John Adams,** President of the United States; Signer of the Declaration of Independence, an important letter, "In 1755 I took a decided part against France and Great Britain so thoroughly disgusted with the folly, the ignorance, the cowardice or treachery of her conduct of the War against Canada"...
- 9 John C. Calhoun, distinguished American Statesman, a letter from the Department of War dated 1823, granting permission
- 10 Simon Bolivar y Ponte, "El Liberador" President and Dictator of Peru and Colombia, a fine letter from Carracas dated, 1826, written in Spanish

- 11 **Charles Carroll of Carrrollstown,** Signer of the Declaration of Independence, survived all other Signers, an original letter from Baltimore dated, 1829, of a domestic nature
- 12 William H. Seward, distinguished American Statesman, a letter from the Department of State, Washington, 1865; Henry Clay, U.S., Senate
- American Emigration, an original Petition to the King requesting . . . "the sole power of sending servants as well as convicts as others . . . to any yor Majtyes, Forraigne Plantations," and for this privilege they state they are prepared to pay a thousand pounds, a manuscript note states "introduced by Col. Sarsfield" (Patrick Sarsfield of the Siege of Limerick Fame and supporter of James II.)
- 14 Hiram S. Maxim; Andrew Carnegie; Daniel Webster; James Bryce; George Ticknor, etc.
- General George Clinton, distinguished Major General in the American Revolution, Vice-President under Jefferson; first Constitutional Governor of New York, a printed Commission 1789 to a Lieutenant in the New York Militia, with seal; and a Georgia Document dated, 1796
- 16 Dr. William Emery Channing, famous Cleric (grandson of the Signer), an original letter, with specimens of signatures at different periods
- 17 William Lloyd Carrison, Eminent Slavery Abolitionist, a very fine letter relating to slavery and emancipation, dated Boston, 1854
- 18 Captain Maury, distinguished American Nautical Geographer, an original letter dated, 1859
- 19 Jenny Lind, famous songstress, a very fine four page original letter signed Jenny L. Goldschmidt from Hamburg

- An oil painting showing the Rev. John William's missionary station at Raiatea (Society Islands), drawing of William's residence at Raiatea, and a pencil sketch by Agate of the U.S. Exploring Expedition, 1841, depicting the Mission Chapel and William's grave at Upolo
- 87 Rev. John Williams' Bible, containing family register and letter from Williams to his mother; a bible given to her son by Mrs. Williams (see fly leaf), Testament in the Raratongan language used by Williams, and a memoir to Mrs. Williams by her son
