- 179 Moussen's apparatus, to show liquefaction of ice at a low temperature by pressure
- 180 Wooden cylinder with broad brass ring, as above ; compound plate of brass and iron, to show bending by unequal expansion ; and contraction apparatus, to show iron bars broken by contraction
- 181 Conduction apparatus, consisting of four dissimilar metals in wooden ring and cups for phosphorus, showing different conducting powers
- 182 Fifteen Prince Rupert's drops, to show the brittleness of suddenly chilled glass ; wooden cylinder with broad brass ring as above ; copper cube, to fill with hot water, used as a source of heat with Melloni's bench ; about 2 dozen candle bombs, being small glass bulbs partly fitted with water, which, when placed in candle, explode by steam pressure ; and Moussen's apparatus, showing liquefaction of ice at a low temperature by pressure

- 189 Marriott's apparatus, as above ; exhausting syringe ; transfer plate with jet and stopcock for fountain on vacuo ; and condensing syringe

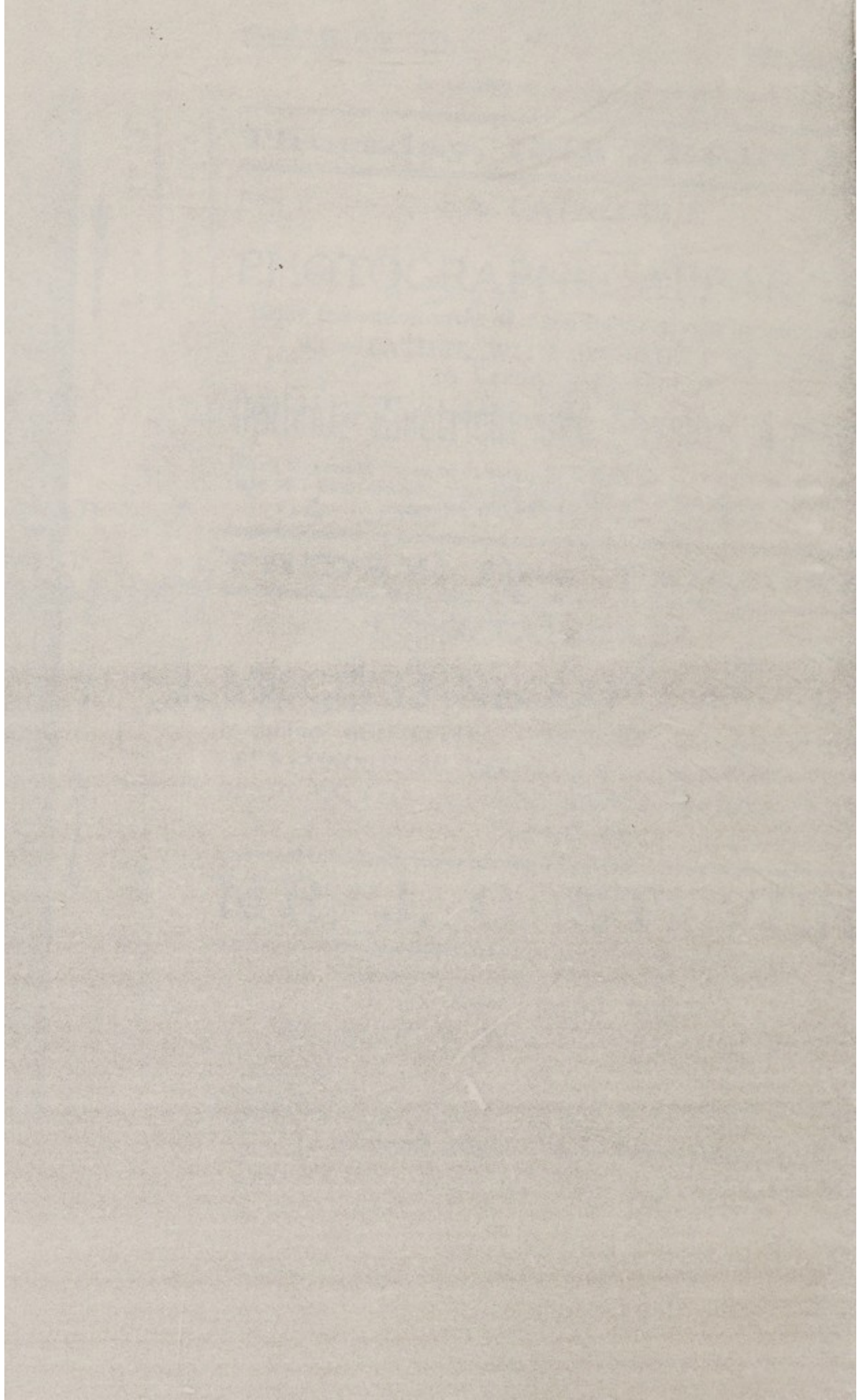
