

ANY OTHER BUSINESS. It was proposed by Mr. Ward Cutler and seconded by Dr. Voge, that the Hon. Editor of the Review be appointed an Honorary Officer of the Society, and become ex officio a member of the General Purposes Committee. An amendment was moved by Dr. Aikman and seconded by Dr. Binnie Dunlop that the appointment of the Hon. Editor of the Review as an Honorary Officer of the Society be referred back to the Council for further consideration. After some discussion it was proposed by Lady Askwith and seconded by Dr. Fisher that the Annual General Meeting recommend to the Council the co-optation of Mr. Eldon Moore personally to the Council and Mr. Ward Cutler withdrew his original motion in favour of Lady Askwith's amendment. Since Dr. Aikman still wished to move his original amendment that the matter be referred back to the Council, this was put to the vote, and carried by 18 votes to 15.



GENERAL.

The past year is notable by reason of the presidency of the Society having been assumed, at the last Annual Meeting, by Sir Humphry Rolleston, and by the acquisition by the Society of its new premises. A reception was held at 69, Eccleston Square, on November 21st, 1933, to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the use of the word "Eugenics" by Sir Francis Galton. The chair was taken by the President and addresses were given by Major Leonard Darwin, Mrs. Neville Rolfe, Mr. W. T. J. Gun, and Lord Horder. One hundred and fifty people were present. In the course of the year, Mr. D. Ward Cutler has resigned from the post of

In the course of the year, Mr. D. Ward Cutler has resigned from the post of Honorary Secretary of the Society. Since the General Purposes Committee has been changed, the Council does not at present recommend filling the appointment.

The Council has suffered a serious loss in the death of the Hon. Lady Mallet.

FINANCE.

During the year the further realization of the Twitchin Estate has been continued by the Executors and considerable additional sums have been handed to the Society. These have been invested. The investments are shown in the balance sheet at the end of this Report. A Statement of income and expenditure also appears at the end of this Report.

THE LATE MRS. RICARDE-SEAVER.

No income has yet been received from this estate. The Executors of the Will have been advised that they cannot proceed to administer the estate until the decision of the Court has been obtained upon certain questions arising upon certain clauses in the Will. Proceedings, to which the Society is a party, to obtain the decision of the Court upon these questions have been commenced, and it is anticipated that the judgment of the Court will be obtained during the next month. Until this decision has been made no income can be received from the estate. The expenses of the proceedings will be paid out of the deceased's estate.

REVIEW.

In May, 1933, Mr. Eldon Moore resigned from the post of Honorary Editor of the Review. The thanks of the Council are due to him for his loyal and painstaking services to the Society. The Review is now edited by Dr. Maurice Newfield, under the direction of an Editorial Committee consisting of Professor R. A. Fisher, Dr. K. B. Aikman, Dr. Austin Freeman, Miss E. Corry and Mr. B. S. Bramwell.

LIBRARY.

The Eugenics Library now contains 2,333 volumes, exclusive of bound periodicals and pamphlets. It is well housed in a large room on the first floor, lined with glass fronted shelves, and offers comfortable accommodation to any who desire to consult books or current periodicals. Thanks are again extended to those reviewers who have presented review copies

Thanks are again extended to those reviewers who have presented review copies to the library. The thanks of the Council are also due to Miss E. Corry for her valuable services as Honorary Librarian.

GALTON DINNER AND LECTURE.

On Friday, February 16th, the Galton Dinner took place at the Rembrandt Hotel. The Galton Lecture was given by Sir Josiah Stamp upon "Eugenic Influences in Economics." There were present at the dinner 149 persons, and others came afterwards to hear the address. The Chair was taken by the President. The vote of thanks to Sir Josiah was moved by Sir Basil Blackett and seconded by Mr. R. G. Hawtrey. The Guests of the Society were Sir Josiah and Lady Stamp, Dr. E. C. Snow, Sir Basil Blackett, Dr. W. H. Coates, Mr. S. P. Vivian, Mr. Oscar R. Hobson, Mr. E. C. Bewlay, Dr. W. Allen Daley and Mr. R. G. Hawtrey.

STERILIZATION.

The policy adopted by the Society received a striking vindication in the Report of the Departmental Committee on Sterilization (known for short as the Brock Committee), which was published on January 18th, 1934. The Brock Committee produced a unanimous report, recommending that sterilization be legalised for precisely those groups of persons for whom it was advocated in the Society's bill, published at the end of the buff pamphlet; but the Brock Committee went further than the Society's bill in assigning to a special category probable carriers of mental deficiency and insanity.

It has been proposed that a Joint Committee be formed consisting of representatives of all organizations interested in giving effect to the recommendations of the Brock Committee. The Society will be represented on this Committee by the President, Sir Humphry Rolleston, Dr. Langdon-Down, the Chairman of the Sterilization Committee, and the General Secretary. At a Council Meeting held on February 14th, 1934, the following resolution was passed:—"That the Council, while supporting voluntary sterilization as recommended by the Brock Report is opposed to compulsory sterilization."

PUBLICATIONS ON HEREDITY.

In the course of the year two important books have been produced under the auspices of the Society. The first volume of Mr. E. J. Lidbetter's "The Social Problem Group" was published in October, 1933 (Edward Arnold, 21/-). This volume, the culmination of twenty-eight years' resourceful investigation by Mr. Lidbetter, is especially welcomed by the Society, which has given support to Mr. Lidbetter from the inception of his enquiry.

"The Chances of Morbid Inheritance" (H. K. Lewis, 15/-) is a symposium written by medical authorities in those categories of disease which are recognised as being in large part hereditary. It has been edited by the General Secretary and produced under the auspices of the Society. The Council's thanks are due to the following who formed an *ad hoc* Committee to guide the General Secretary in editing the book:—Drs. J. A. Ryle, W. Russell Brain, E. A. Cockayne, R. D. Gillespie, R. Langdon-Down and E. Mapother, and Professor R. Ruggles Gates.

OUTLINE OF POLICY.

A revised version of the Society's outline has been produced during the year. a copy of which, under the title of "The Aims and Objects of the Eugenics Society," is enclosed, loose-leaf, in this report.
