

# ANNUAL REPORT, 1934-35.

#### GENERAL.

The past year has been notable for a considerable expansion of the Society's work, a change which has been made possible by the Society's increased income. At a Council meeting held on February 14th, 1934, a subsidy was voted to the Galton Laboratories to meet part of the expenses of publishing the Annals of Eugenics which is now published jointly by the Galton Laboratories and this Society.

The Council has suffered a serious loss in the death of Dr. R. A. Gibbons, and the Society in the deaths of Lord Buckmaster and Lord Riddell, the latter a generous supporter.

#### FINANCE.

During the period January 1st, 1934, to January 1st, 1935, the Society received further sums on account of the Twitchin Estate.

The bulk of this Estate has now been transferred to the Society, and only relatively small additional sums can be anticipated during the current and future years.

A statement of Income and Expenditure, a Balance Sheet and a list of investments are included at the end of this Report.

#### THE LATE MRS. RICARDE SEAVER.

The first payment on account of the income from this Estate was received during the year. It is anticipated that the Society will receive approximately  $\pounds_{125}$  a year therefrom, which sum at a later date should increase to some extent.

#### REVIEW.

The Review is edited by Dr. Maurice Newfield, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., under the direction of an Editorial Committee consisting of Sir Humphry Rolleston, Mr. B. S. Bramwell, Miss E. Corry, Mr. R. Austin Freeman and Dr. Kenneth Aikman. It would be a great help to the Editor if Fellows and Members qualified and willing to review technical works and periodicals, particularly those dealing with genetics, bio-statistics, population, psychology and sociology, would communicate with him, stating their specialities and also whether they could undertake to review works in foreign languages.

#### LIBRARY.

The library now numbers 2,432 volumes. A good many additions have been made to the pamphlet cases during the year. The library depends mainly on books sent for review, and we again thank those reviewers who have generously returned us their copies. The Society's thanks are due to Miss E. Corry for her valuable services as Hon. Librarian.

#### GALTON DINNER AND LECTURE.

The Galton Dinner took place at the Victoria Hotel on Saturday, February 16th, 1935. The Galton Lecture was delivered by Professor A. M. Carr-Saunders, upon "Eugenic Policy in the Light of Population Trends." There were present at the dinner 108 persons and others came afterwards to hear the address. The Chair was taken by the President. A vote of thanks to Professor Carr-Saunders was moved by Sir Arnold Wilson, K.C.I.E., C.S.I., C.M.G., D.S.O., J.P., and seconded by Commissioner Lamb, C.M.G., LL.D. The guests of the Society were: Professor and Mrs. Carr-Saunders, Sir Arnold Wilson, Miss M. Wilson, Commissioner Lamb, Mr. L. G. Brock, Mr. S. P. Vivian, the Lord Bishop of Southwark, Mr. Wilson Harris, Mr. Aylmer Vallance, Professor Winifred Cullis, Dr. E: O. Lewis.

#### JOINT COMMITTEE ON VOLUNTARY STERILISATION.

The Society has been active in giving support to a Joint Committee on Voluntary Sterilisation. The Committee consists of representatives of the Central Association for Mental Welfare, the Mental Hospitals' Association, the National Council for Mental Hygiene and the Eugenics Society. In addition, the Royal Society of Physicians, the Royal Medico-Psychological Association and the Royal College of Physicians have appointed representatives without power to commit their respective associations. The Joint Committee has been given premises on the second floor of 69 Eccleston Square, rent free, and it derives its main financial support from the Society. A Handbook for Speakers has been produced, and resolutions supporting the recommendations of the Brock Report have been passed by a large number of important bodies. A Parliamentary Bill has been drafted, which will be presented to the Minister of Health in the near future, by a delegation consisting of representatives of the County Councils' Association, the Association of Municipal Corporations, the Mental Hospitals Association and the Joint Committee. Further particulars are obtainable from the Joint Committee.

#### POSITIVE EUGENICS.

The Council has appointed a Positive Eugenics Committee which has been instructed to carry out a programme of investigation. In this connection a memorandum is being prepared by Mr. David Glass, to whom a remuneration has been voted by the Council. Mr. Glass has visited France and Belgium with the object of collecting statistical information, unobtainable in this country, upon the workings of French and Belgian equalisation pools.

#### PRE-MARITAL HEALTH SCHEDULE.

In accordance with the item relating to the exchange of certificates of health before marriage, a committee consisting of Dr. R. Langdon-Down (Chairman), the President, the Chairman, Dr. Maurice Shaw, Dr. Stella Churchill and the General Secretary, has been appointed by the Council. A pre-marital health schedule has been prepared and will be published in the course of the year.
