Revision of List of Fellows and Members The Council has revised the list of Members and transferred twenty-six from Membership to Fellowship.

Galton Lecture The Galton Lecture was delivered on Friday, 16th February, 1951, by Dr. G. C. L. Bertram, M.A., Ph.D., on the following subject: Eugenics and Human Ecology. The meeting was held at Manson House, Portland Place, W.1, and was preceded by tea. The Chair was taken by Mr. G. Aird Whyte in the absence of the President. A vote of thanks was proposed by Mr. Cecil Binney and was carried unanimously. Some 65 people were present.

19th December, 1950. Mr. Paul Bloomfield on "The Ideal of an Elite." Mr. G. Aird Whyte was in the

16th January, 1951. Dr. C. O. Carter on "Congenital Malformations." Dr. J. A. Fraser Roberts was in the Chair.

13th March, 1951. Dr. H. J. Eysenck on "A Study of Neuroticism in Twins." Dr. Eliot Slater was in the Chair.

Eugenics Review The July, 1950, number was the first to be issued under our new Editor, Dr. C. O. Carter, Dr. Carter, who also holds a research post at the Hospital for Sick Children, Great Ormond Street, has been assisted in his editorial work by Mrs. C. R. M. Edwards.

Statement of Objects A revised version of the Society's "Statement of Objects" was produced in September, 1950, to take account of the recommendations of the Royal Commission on Population. The new version consists of three main parts with the following titles: Eugenics; Objects, Definitions and Scope: Eugenic Studies: Eugenic Policies. It is published in a cover similar to that of the Eugenics Review.

Occasional Papers The sixth paper in this series, entitled Problem Families in Bristol, by R. C. Wofinden, M.D., D.P.H., was published in November, 1950, price 2/6d.

A further paper on The Expectation of Mental Infirmity in a Sample of the Danish Population, by Dr. Kurt Fremming of Denmark, is due for publication in the autumn.

New Edition of Galton's "Hereditary Genius" A new edition, identical in all respects with that of 1892, was published by Messrs, Watts & Co. in September, 1950, price 10/6d. The Society made a grant of £100 towards the costs of production and the Committee of University College kindly waived their right to royalties in order that the price should be as low as possible.

New Edition of Galton's "Inquiries into Human Faculty" The edition of 1911 produced by Messrs. Dent & Sons Ltd., as No. 263 in their Everyman Library, became unobtainable in the course of 1950. An arrangement has been reached with this firm to produce for the Society a new edition of 2,000 copies.

Problem Families Committee In the course of the year, the report on the investigation carried out in North Kensington reached the office. This report, and the relevant cards (PFC 4's) of the five inquiries (Rotherham, Bristol, West Riding, Luton and North Kensington) became available during 1950 and have been coded in the Society's office. It is hoped to produce a report next year.

As already stated, the report on Problem Families in Bristol, by Dr. R. C. Wofinden, has been published as an Occasional Paper.

Family Planning Association An analysis has been completed in the Society's office of an inquiry, subsidised by the Society in 1947 by a grant of £100, and sponsored by the Family Planning Association. Questionnaires filled in by 43 clinics affiliated to the Association, comparing figures for a pre-war and a post-war year, have been analysed. The report will not be published, but copies are in possession of the Family Planning Association,

Representation of the Society on other Organisations The Council is represented by Dr. C. P. Blacker on the British Committee of the International Union of Family Organisations; by Mr. J. C. Trevor on the Joint Committee for Anthropological Research and Teaching; and by Mrs. Grant Duff on the following organisations: The National Council of Women, The National Association for Maternity and Child Welfare, The British Social Biology Council and The National Baby Welfare Council. Dr. Blacker has continued to be Honorary Secretary of the Population Investigation Committee.

Society's Premises The Society continued to make one of the three rooms on its second floor available, rent free, to the International Committee on Planned Parenthood. Of the two remaining rooms one has been let to the Research Office of the Children's Reception Centre which is under the auspices of the Caldecott Community in Mersham, Kent.

Library During the past year 99 books have been added to the Library by gift or purchase, including numerous volumes presented by Mrs. B. S. Bramwell from the library of her late husband; 33 books have been borrowed and 17 have been secured for Fellows and Members from the National Central Library.

\*This sum represents the legacy from the late Mr. B. S. Bramwell which was mentioned in the text of last year's Annual Report.

Since the end of its financial year, the Society has also received a most generous donation of £400 from Lord Horder, but this naturally does not figure in the present accounts. Lord Horder's gift, however, serves to remind us once again how much the Society has owed to him over a long period of years during twelve of which he presided over our Councils with unfailing liveliness, and with a wisdom that was delightfully spiced with wit.

COVENANTS, During the year a number of additional members replaced their annual subscriptions by covenants bringing an increased benefit to the Society—without any increased cost to the covenanters—of about £23. It is hoped that gradually subscription by covenant may be extended even more widely. The total tax recovered by the Society by this means during 1950 amounted to £82 19s. 4d,

ACCOUNTS FOR 1950. A statement of Income and Expenditure during 1950, together with the Balance Sheet at 31st December, 1950, will be found at the end of this Report and a list of the Society's investments at the same date is set out on page 7.

During 1950 Income exceeded Ordinary Expenditure by £447 14s. 2d. From this surplus the Society paid out £239 19s. 0d. in respect of various grants and allocated £200 to the Staff Pension Reserve Fund. The Balance of £7 15s. 2d, was carried to the General Fund Account which also benefitted during the year to the extent of £2,226 15s, 11d, from profits (less losses) on the sale of investments. The General Fund thus now stands at £75,382 14s. 6d.

The Society is committed to the making of further disbursements of £150 12s, 3d. on account of grants that are set out in a Note on the Liabilities side of the Balance Sheet. The grants disbursed during the year are detailed in the second part of the Income and Expenditure Account.
