THE EUGENICS SOCIETY

The Annual General Meeting was held at 4.30 p.m. on Friday, 30th May, 1952, at the Rooms of the Royal Society, Burlington House, Piccadilly, W.1.

Chairman: Mr. Geoffrey Eley.

Fifteen Fellows and Members were present.

The Chairman conveyed to the meeting apologies for absence from Sir Alexander Carr-Saunders (President) and Mr. G. Aird Whyte (Chairman).

MINUTES.

MATTERS ARISING

The Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on Tuesday, 29th May, 1951, which were contained in the Annual Report, previously circulated, were taken as read and were unanimously approved.

FROM THE MINUTES

(a) Publication of a Library Catalogue.

The Secretary reported that consideration had been given to economical methods of producing a new Library Catalogue—a matter raised at the Annual General Meeting in 1951 by Mr. J. P. Brander. Estimates had been obtained for copies in Roneo and would be submitted to the Council at its next meeting.

(b) Revision of the Society's Holdings of Gilt-Edged Securities.

The matter had been raised at the Annual General Meeting in 1951 by Mr. J. P. Brander. The Chairman reported that the Finance Committee, which meets twice or three times a year, gave, as a routine, careful attention to the Society's list of investments. The balance between gilt-edged and other securities was continually reviewed.

The Secretary briefly reviewed the main items contained in the Report.

The Chairman then drew attention to the item in the Report entitled Secretariat, wherein was announced Dr. Blacker's retirement, after twenty-one years, from the General Secretaryship of the Society. He expressed the Society's great indebtedness to Dr. Blacker and deep appreciation of his guidance of its affairs during his long term of office. The Chairman also welcomed Dr. C. O. Carter, who succeeds Dr. Blacker as General Secretary. From the floor Mr. Cyril Bibby, on behalf of Fellows and Members, supported the Chairman's remarks.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the Report which was carried unani-

mously.

In this report, the accounts relate to the period from 1st January, 1952, to 31st December, 1952, inclusive. The rest of the report covers the period 1st April, 1952, to 31st March, 1953, inclusive.

Consultative Council The Consultative Council has suffered losses in the deaths of Sir Charles Arden-Close, K.B.E., C.B., C.M.G., F.R.S., and Professor W. J. Dakin, D.Sc., F.L.S., F.Z.S.; and in the resignation of Miss Evelyn Fox, D.B.E.

The Galton Lecture The Galton Lecture for 1952, postponed owing to the death of His late Majesty King George VI, was delivered on Friday, 4th April, by Dr. J. A. Fraser Roberts, M.A., M.D., D.Sc., F.R.C.P., on "The Genetics of Mental Deficiency." The Chair was taken by Sir Charles Darwin. A vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. Eliot Slater who opened the discussion which followed. Some 150 persons were present.

The Galton Lecture for 1953 was delivered on Wednesday, 18th February, by Professor T. H. Marshall, C.M.G., M.A., on "Social Selection in the Welfare State." The Chair was taken by Mr. G. Aird Whyte and some 80 persons were present. A vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. G. C. L. Bertram.

Both meetings were held at Manson House, 26, Portland Place, W.1, and were preceded by tea.

- 16th December, 1952. Professor Roger Russell on "Experimental Studies of Hereditary Influences on Animal Behaviour." Professor A. J. Lewis was in the Chair.
- 21st January, 1953. Dr. J. D. Nisbet on "Family Environment and Intelligence." Professor P. E. Vernon was in the Chair.
- 25th March, 1953. Dr. Gertrude Willoughby on "Population Problems and Family Policy in France." Mrs. B. Bosanquet was in the Chair.

Eugenics Review Since July, 1952, the Eugenics Review has appeared under the Editorship of Miss K. Lane who has been supported by an Editorial Committee

The rising cost of the Eugenics Review has for some time given concern to the Council and it has therefore been decided by the Editorial Committee that, in the interest of economy, issues from April, 1953, will be printed on cotine rather than antique paper.

Occasional Papers The eighth paper in the series entitled Family Environment: a Direct Effect of Family Size on Intelligence by Dr. J. D. Nisbet, will be published this year (1953).

Problem Families Committee The report of the five investigations carried out under the auspices of the Committee and entitled Problem Families: Five Inquiries, was published by the Society on 1st November, 1952, and has been well received. Copies are available from the Society at 5/-, postage 7d.

Promising Families Committee The Council has appointed a Sub-Committee to formulate a method of ascertaining "promising families," that is families which are conspicuously successful in raising happy, healthy and intelligent children. This Sub-Committee will make a recommendation to the Council.

Grants

- (a) International Planned Parenthood Federation. The Council has made a grant of £250 a year for three years to the International Planned Parenthood Federation as a contribution towards the expenses of maintaining its London office. The grant is to take effect from 1st September, 1953. This follows on a contribution of £750 made by the Council in 1952 to enable the Society's two delegates to go to the Bombay Conference (see below) and also to defray part of the expenses of another delegate who remained in India to lecture and to give training in contraceptive technique to doctors, nurses and health visitors.
- (b) Dr. Helen Blyth. The Council has made a grant of £200 for a year, renewable for a further year, to Dr. Helen Blyth, a medical practitioner in Leeds, to enable her to carry out a genetic investigation of cases of Muscular Dystrophy in the West Riding of Yorkshire.

(c) Mr. James Shields. The Council has made a grant of £40 to Mr. James Shields, a Research Assistant in the Genetics Unit of the Institute of Psychiatry, University of London, to enable him to attend the IXth International Congress of Genetics at Lake Como, Italy, in August, 1953.

Representation of the Society on other Organisations The Council is represented by Dr. C. P. Blacker and Mrs. Grant Duff on the British Committee of the International Union of Family Organisations; by Mr. J. C. Trevor on the Joint Committee for Anthropological Research and Teaching; and by Mrs. Grant Duff on the following organisations: The National Council of Women, the National Association for Maternity and Child Welfare, the British Social Biology Council and the National Baby Welfare Council. Dr. Blacker has continued to be Honorary Secretary of the Population Investigation Committee.

Representation at Conferences Dr. C. P. Blacker represented the Society at a Conference convened by the International Union of Family Organisations held from 8th 13th September 1952 in Oxford

held from 8th—13th September, 1952, in Oxford.
Dr. C. P. Blacker, Dr. G. C. L. Bertram and Dr.
Margaret Hadley Jackson represented the Society at
the 3rd International Conference on Planned Parenthood held from 24th November—1st December, 1952,
in Bombay. Dr. Blacker there gave a paper on "Con
trol of Fertility in Human Cultures," Dr. Bertram
on "The Inevitability of Limitation of Population,"
and Dr. Jackson on "Fertility, Sterility and Infertility."

Mrs. Grant Duff represented the Society at the Conference of the National Council of Women held in Eastbourne in November, 1952.

Society's Premises The Society has continued to make the largest of the three rooms on its second floor available, rent free, to the International Planned Parenthood Federation and also the small room, which was vacated by the Research Office of the Children's Reception Centre in June, 1952.

The Society's premises are now in a good state of repair and decoration following agreement with the War Damage Commission as to their liability consequent upon bomb damage. At a moderate additional cost painting and other repairs have been carried out to good effect.

Library During the past year 63 books have been added to the Library by gift and purchase; 248 have been borrowed, 40 of them by the National Central Library. The Librarian has borrowed 18 books from the National Central Library for re-loan to Fellows and Members.

A type-written classified catalogue has been prepared and copies may be borrowed by Fellows and Members for periods of a fortnight.

Covenants During the year the total tax recovered by the Society by means of subscriptions paid under Covenant amounted to £89 1s. 6d.

Accounts for 1952 A statement of Income and Expenditure during 1952 together with the Balance Sheet as at 31st December, 1952, will be found at the end of this Report. A list of the Society's Investment at the same date is set out on page 4. The market value of our investments suffered a further slight depreciation during the year.

During 1952 Income exceeded Ordinary Expenditure by £56 7s. 5d., but, after the Society had disbursed the Grants voted by the Council for special purposes and had allocated £200 to the Staff Pension Reserve, there was a loss of £912 6s. 2d. on the year. This loss was carried to the General Fund where it was partially offset by a profit of £724 17s. 1d. resulting from the sale of certain investments.

The General Reserve now stands at £76,314 13s. 11d.

The Society stands currently committed to the making of grants to a total of £1,090 and it seems clear that the bulk or the whole of this sum will have to be found by drawings on the General Fund.
