ANNUAL REPORT 1956-1957

In this Report, the accounts relate to the period from 1st January, 1956, to 31st December, 1956, inclusive. The rest of the Report covers the period 1st April, 1956, to 31st March, 1957, inclusive.

Council

The Galton Lecture

The Galton Lecture for 1957 was delivered on Wednesday, 13th February, by Professor Tage Kemp on "Genetic-Hygienic Experiences in Denmark in Recent Years". The Chair was taken by Dr. C. P. Blacker and about 65 people were present.

The meeting was held at Manson House, 26, Portland Place, W.1, and was preceded by tea.

Eugenics Review

The Eugenics Review has continued to appear under the Editorship of Miss K. Lane.

The Editorial Committee, which has met four times during the past year, consists of Dr. C. P. Blacker, Mr. Aird Whyte, Mr. Cecil Binney, Mr. C. W. Usher, Mr. P. R. Cox, Dr. C. O. Carter and the Editor.

Report on Infant Morbidity and Mortality

A report entitled "Morbidity and Mortality in the First Year of Life", edited by Professor F. Grundy and Dr. E. Lewis-Faning, is now being prepared for publication by the *Society*.

The enquiry described in this Report is a survey of infant sickness and infant mortality in fifteen areas of England and Wales. It covers the first year of life of a little over 20,000 infants born in 1952.

It is expected that the Report will be published in the early Summer.

Promising Families Committee

During the year under review the Promising Families Committee met once.

Their second survey, in a large borough of the same southern county of England in which the first survey was conducted, was completed. In this case, the index children to the families were nominated by the Heads of Primary Schools in the borough and were 8 or 9 years old. One hundred and twenty-seven couples completed the *Society's* questionnaire.

The Committee hopes to conduct one more survey, again by nomination from Primary Schools, if co-operation can be obtained from another Education Authority, and then to publish a report which would embody the results of all three surveys.

Grants

(a) The International Planned Parenthood Federation. The Council has made a new grant of £250 per annum for one year, renewable for a further period of two years, to the International Planned Parenthood Federation as a contribution towards Headquarters expenses.

- (b) The Family Planning Association. The Council has also made a new grant of £250 to the Family Planning Association for the purpose of completing its work on testing the harmlessness of contraceptives.
- (c) Mr. Cyril Bibby. The Council has made to Mr. Cyril Bibby a grant of £25 in aid of publication of his proposed book on T. H. Huxley.

International Congress of Human Genetics

The First International Congress of Human Genetics was held in Copenhagen from 1st to 6th August, 1956. Several members of the *Society's* Council—Professor A. J. Lewis, Dr. J. A. Fraser Roberts and Dr. J. M. Tanner—and Dr. C. O. Carter, the *Society's* General Secretary, were among those who attended the Congress.

An Account of the meeting appeared in the October, 1956, issue of the Eugenics Review.

Representation of the Society on other Organisations

The Council is represented by Dr. C. P. Blacker and Mr. R. Weatherall on the British Committee of the International Union of Family Organisations; by Mr. J. C. Trevor on the Joint Committee of Anthropological Research and Teaching; by Dr. C. O. Carter on the National Council of Social Service; and by Mrs. Grant Duff on the following organisations: The National Council of Women, the National Association for Maternity and Child Welfare, the British Social Biology Council and the National Baby Welfare Council. Dr. Blacker has continued to be the Honorary Secretary of the Population Investigation Committee.

Society's Premises

The maisonette on the third and fourth floors of 69, Eccleston Square, has been let to Mrs. M. K. Brown, a member of the *Society*, on a five years lease ending 25th March, 1961, at a rental of £300 per annum exclusive of rates.

The Society has continued to make all three rooms on its second floor available, rent free, to the International Planned Parenthood Federation.

Library

During the past year 60 books have been added to the Library by gift or purchase; 136 books and periodicals have been borrowed, 24 of them by the National Central Library. The Librarian has borrowed six books from the National Central Library for re-loan to Fellows and Members.

During the year the total tax recovered by the Society by means of subscriptions paid under Covenant amounted to £71.

Accounts for 1956

The Balance Sheet, and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year to 31st December, 1956, together with a list of the *Society's* investments will be found at the end of this Report.

For the year to 31st December, 1956, Ordinary Income showed a surplus of £422 over Expenditure. Grants were drawn upon to the extent of £1,152. After allowing for a small taxation adjustment the excess of Expenditure over Income was £745, which deficit is carried to the General Fund Account.

A Schedule of Grants approved by the Council appears as usual on the Balance Sheet and shows in each case the extent to which they have not been fully drawn upon at the close of the financial year.

As at 31st December, 1956, the General Fund stood at £79,634 which compares with £68,608 at the end of 1955.
