The President (from the Chair) announced that it was with great regret that he had to report, firstly, the retirement of Mr. Aird Whyte from the Chairmanship of Council and, secondly, the resignation of Dr. C. O. Carter from the General Secretaryship.

The President, in reminding the meeting that Mr. Whyte had, since 1954, taken on the additional duties of Honorary Treasurer, expressed the *Society's* deep gratitude for and appreciation of the inestimable service Mr. Whyte had given since he succeeded the late Mr. Bramwell as Chairman of Council in 1949. It was recorded with great satisfaction that Mr. Whyte had agreed to continue in office as Honorary Treasurer.

The President reported that he would himself take the Chair at Council meetings for the time being.

The President then recorded the *Society's* great indebtedness to Dr. Carter for all that he had done as General Secretary during the years since 1952 when he had succeeded Dr. Blacker. Dr. Carter had given invaluable service and it would be hard to replace him. The President extended to Dr. Carter best wishes for success in his new work and expressed the hope that he would remain in close contact with the *Society* in the future.

Dr. Blacker, from the floor, endorsed the President's remarks and expressed a vote of thanks to Mr. Whyte and to Dr. Carter.

AUDITORS' REMUNERATION

The Honorary Treasurer reported that Messrs. West and Drake would continue to serve as the *Society's* Auditors.

CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL

There have been no changes in the Consultative Council during the year under review.

SECRETARIAT

Dr. G. C. L. Bertram has been appointed General Secretary of the *Society* in succession to Dr. C. O. Carter who resigned in April 1957 to join the staff of the Medical Research Council's new Clinical Genetics Research Unit at the Institute of Child Health.

The Council hereby expresses its appreciation of the valuable services given to the *Society* by Dr. C. O. Carter during the five years (May 1952-April 1957) of his Secretaryship.

Dr. Bertram, who had for some years been a member of the *Society's* Council, took up the Secretaryship on 1st October, 1957. He is a Fellow of St. John's College, Cambridge.

JUBILEE DINNER

In celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the foundation of the *Society* in 1907, a Dinner was held at 8 o'clock on Wednesday, 4th December, 1957 at the Savoy Hotel, London.

There were four speeches during the evening. The President, Sir Charles Darwin, who was in the Chair, proposed the health of the guests and was followed in reply by Mr. Max Nicholson who, at the last moment, took the place of Lord Simon of Wythenshawe who was indisposed. Sir Alexander Carr-Saunders, a past President, then proposed the health of

the *Society* and the reply was read by Mrs. Nancy Raphael on behalf of Mrs. Margaret Pyke who was also prevented by ill-health from attending.

AWARD OF GOLD MEDAL

At the conclusion of the speeches the presentation of the *Society's* second Galton Medal was made by Sir Charles Darwin to Dr. C. P. Blacker in recognition of his great services to the *Society* during his twenty-one years as General Secretary from 1931-1952.

Dr. Blacker thanked the President and reviewed the main phases of the *Society's* fifty years' history. He expressed his personal indebtedness to many past members of the *Society's* Council and of its staff.

The Dinner was a most successful occasion. In spite of extremely bad weather, which prevented some of the guests from arriving, the total number present was 146 out of an expected 183. A full report appears in the April 1958 issue of *The Eugenics Review*.

THE GALTON LECTURE

The Galton Lecture for 1958 was delivered on Wednesday, 19th February, by Professor Aubrey Lewis, M.D., F.R.C.P., on "Fertility and Mental Disorder". The Chair was taken by Sir Charles Darwin and about ninety people were present.

The meeting was held at Manson House, 26 Portland Place, W.1, and was preceded by tea.

11th December, 1957: Dr. J. S. Weiner on "The Settlement of Europeans in Extreme Climates." Dr. J. A. Fraser Roberts was in the Chair.

22nd January, 1958: Dr. G. C. L. Bertram on "Eugenics in the Age of Crowding." Dr. C. P. Blacker was in the Chair.

19th March, 1958: Symposium on New Human Demands in Industry. *Speakers*: Mr. Alec Rodger, The Hon. Michael Layton, Mr. R. Peddie and Dr. K. Hutton. Mr. J. G. W. Davies was in the Chair.

EUGENICS REVIEW

The Eugenics Review has continued to appear under the Editorship of Mrs. K. Hodson (Miss K. Lane).

The Editorial Committee, which has met four times during the past year, consists of Mr. P. R. Cox (Chairman), Dr. C. P. Blacker, Mr. Cecil Binney, Mr. C. W. Usher, Dr. C. O. Carter, Dr. G. C. L. Bertram and the Editor.

EUGENIC BROADSHEETS

A Broadsheet on eugenic and other aspects of West Indian Immigration has been prepared for early publication by the *Society*.

It is hoped that this Broadsheet will be the first of a series, each of which will be agreed by the Council. The intention is to present, in wide and fair perspective, the *Society's* attitude to a variety of current, perhaps controversial, topics where genetic factors are important and sometimes neglected.

REPORT ON INFANT MORBIDITY AND MORTALITY

A Report, entitled *Morbidity and Mortality in the First Year of Life*, edited by Professor F. Grundy and Dr. E. Lewis-Fanning, was published by the *Society* in September 1957, and has been well received. Copies are obtainable from the *Society's* offices price 18s. 11d. post free.

A.I.D. INVESTIGATION COUNCIL

At its meeting on the 19th February, 1958, the Council considered the problem of Artificial Insemination and discussed the policy to be adopted by the *Society* in the light of the prevailing controversy.

It was recognized that the subject presented moral, social and legal problems and that clarification was needed before legislation was proposed.

The Council therefore decided that the *Society* should set up this autonomous body which held its first meeting on 26th March, 1958. The foundation members are: Dr. A. S. Parkes, Dr. Margaret Jackson and Mr. Cecil Binney.

The A.I.D. Investigation Council will, for the time being, have its address at the *Society's* offices and will avail itself of the services of the *Society's* Secretariat.

The Council has set aside for the use of the A.I.D. Investigation Council a sum of £500 per annum for two years (*see also Grants below*).

PROMISING FAMILIES COMMITTEE

The Promising Families Committee have this year initiated their third survey, in a south-eastern County of England.

As in the second survey, the index children to the families have been nominated by the Heads of Primary Schools in the area through the good offices of the Chief Education Officer.

GRANTS

(a) *The International Planned Parenthood Federation*. The Council has made a grant of £250 for one year to the International Planned Parenthood Federation as a contribution towards Headquarters expenses.

(b) *The Family Planning Association*. The Council has also made a grant of £250 to the Family Planning Association for such distribution to its affiliated Clinics as the Association shall decide.

(c) *The A.I.D. Investigation Council*. As reported above, the Council has made a grant of up to £500 per annum for two years to the A.I.D. Investigation Council to meet initial expenses.

INTERNATIONAL PLANNED PARENTHOOD FEDERATION

The First Conference of the International Planned Parenthood Federation Region for Europe, Near East and Africa was held in Berlin from 23rd-29th October, 1957.

Dr. C. P. Blacker, who attended this Conference in his capacity as Vice-Chairman of the Federation, was the designated representative of the *Society*.

REPRESENTATION OF THE SOCIETY ON OTHER ORGANISATIONS

The Council has been represented by Dr. C. P. Blacker, Dr. Hilda Lewis and Mr. R. Weatherall on the British Committee of the International Union of Family Organisations; by Mr. J. C. Trevor on the Joint Committee of Anthropological Research and Teaching; by Dr. C. O. Carter on the National Council of Social Service; by Dr. C. P. Blacker, Dr. G. C. L. Bertram, Mrs. M. A. Pyke and Mrs. Grant Duff on the British Social Biology Council; and by Mrs. Grant Duff on the following organisations: The National Council of Women, the National Association for Maternity and Child Welfare, and the National Baby Welfare Council. Dr. Blacker has continued to be Honorary Secretary of the Population Investigation Committee.

SOCIETY'S PREMISES

Since May 1957, the *Society* has made available one room on its ground floor, rent free, to the British Social Biology Council.

The *Society* has continued to make all three rooms on its second floor available, rent free, to the International Planned Parenthood Federation.

LIBRARY

During the past year forty-nine books have been added to the Library by gift or purchase: 129 books and periodicals have been borrowed, twenty-one of them by the National Central Library. The Librarian has borrowed four books from the National Central Library for re-loan to Fellows and Members.

In August 1957, new shelves were added to one of the existing book cases in the Library, thereby considerably increasing the space available for expansion.

ACCOUNTS FOR 1957

The Balance Sheet, and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year to the 31st December, 1957, together with a list of the *Society's* investments will be found at the end of this Report.

For the year under review Ordinary Income showed a surplus of £514 compared with £422 for the preceding year. Grants were drawn to the extent of £337 which compared with £1,152 in 1956. After allowing for Grants paid and one withdrawn there was a deficit of £81 compared with £745 in 1956.

A Schedule of Grants approved by the Council appears as usual on the Balance Sheet and shows in each case the extent to which they have not been fully drawn upon at the close of the financial year.

As at the 31st December, 1957, the General Fund stood at £79,570 compared with £79,634 in 1956 and £68,608 at the end of 1955.
