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

### **Annual General Meeting**

The Annual General Meeting was held at 4.30 p.m. on Wednesday, 21st May, 1958, at the Rooms of the Royal Society, Burlington House, Piccadilly, wr. *Chairman:* Sir Charles Darwin. Thirteen persons were present, of whom 11 were Fellows.

### ANNUAL REPORT

The Secretary presented the Annual Report and referred briefly to its contents.

The adoption of the Report was then proposed by Dr. Carter, seconded by Mr. Binney and carried unanimously.

### STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND BALANCE SHEET

These were presented by the Honorary Treasurer.

Mr. C. G. Tomlinson, from the floor, asked the reason for the fall in the amount of income tax recoverable on covenanted subscriptions. The Honorary Treasurer explained that the number of these subscriptions had decreased because some Fellows and Members who had originally signed covenants when the scheme was first introduced had not wished to continue after the expiry of their seven-year contract.

He went on to inform the meeting that this scheme would now be discontinued. It had been laid down by the Board of Inland Revenue that in view of the benefits and privileges available to Fellows and Members of the Society, their subscriptions could not be considered pure income profit; the Society, therefore, could not be treated as having suffered tax by deduction and was no longer considered eligible for tax repayment on these subscriptions.

The adoption of the Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet were then proposed by Dr. Hutton, seconded by Mr. Usher and carried unanimously.

### AUDITORS' REMUNERATION

The Honorary Treasurer reported that Messrs. West & Drake would continue to serve as the Society's Auditors.

The following was RESOLVED:

"That the Auditors' remuneration for the current year to 31st December, 1958, shall be the sum of eighty guineas with a further charge for additional accountancy as may be agreed between the Auditors and the Treasurer."

The resolution was proposed by the Honorary Treasurer, seconded by Mr. Binney and carried unanimously.

### PRESIDENTIAL REMARKS

Before the end of the meeting the President welcomed Dr. G. C. L. Bertram who was for the first time attending an Annual General Meeting as General Secretary of the Society.

The President touched briefly on the work of the Society during the past year, drawing special attention to the Jubilee Dinner held on 4th December, 1957, to mark the fiftieth anniversary of the Society, at which Dr. C. P. Blacker had been presented with the second Galton Medal.

The President also made particular mention of the formation, by the Society, of an autonomous A.I.D. Investigation Council under the Chairmanship of Dr. A. S. Parkes; and of the forthcoming publication of a Broadsheet—the first, it was hoped, of a series on topics of eugenic interest—on West Indian Immigration.

In his closing remarks the President said that consideration was being given to an increased circulation of the Society's publications so that they might reach a wider public. He hoped that in this way there might be stimulated a greater awareness of the work of the Society and that the coming year would see an advance in this direction.

### Annual Report: 1958-9

The Council has suffered a great loss in the death, on 15th January, 1959, of The Hon. Mrs. Ursula Grant Duff. Mrs. Grant Duff had served on the Council since 1933 and was an active and valued member. Obituary notices appear in the April 1959 issue of *The Eugenics Review*.

The Consultative Council has suffered a loss in the death of Sir Robert Ensor, M.A.

Sir Macfarlane Burnet, O.M., M.D., F.R.C.P., F.R.S., has been appointed a member of the Council.

### THE GALTON LECTURE

The Galton Lecture for 1959 was delivered on Wednesday, 18th February, by Mrs. Mary Stocks, B.Sc., LL.D., Litt.D., on "Reflections on a Changing Class Structure." The Chair was taken by Sir Charles Darwin and about eighty people were present. The Lecture took place at Manson House, 26 Portland Place, W.1, and was preceded by tea.

At its meeting on 15th October, 1958, the Council decided that, in future, the Galton Lecturer should be awarded a cash emolument or a piece of plate (of equivalent value) according to his or her choice. Expenses would be paid as in the past.

Mrs. Stocks accordingly received from the hands of the President, after her lecture, a piece of plate, designed and made by Mr. Leslie Durbin and engraved with the Society's emblem—Galtonia candicans.

### MEMBERS' MEETINGS

The following meetings were held in the Rooms of the Royal Society, Burlington House, by kind permission of the President and Council of the Royal Society: 21st May, 1958: Dr. C. O. Carter on "Three Surveys of Promising Families." (See below.) Sir Charles Darwin was in the Chair.

15th October, 1958: Dr. Christopher Tietze on "Human Fertility— Statistical Considerations." Dr. C. P. Blacker was in the Chair. This meeting was held jointly with the International Planned Parenthood Federation.

12th November, 1958: The Rev. Dr. D. Sherwin Bailey on "The Lambeth Conference and the Family." Mr. D. Caradog Jones was in the Chair.

10th December, 1958: Dr. J. A. Fraser Roberts on "Human Genetics at Two International Conferences." (Xth International Congress of Genetics, Montreal, 1958 and Fourth International Biometric Conference, Ottawa, 1958.) (See below.) Dr. J. M. Tanner was in the Chair.

18th March, 1959: Dr. R. W. Parnell on "Physique and Family Structure." Dr. C. O. Carter was in the Chair.

No meeting was held in January 1959.

### EUGENICS REVIEW

The Eugenics Review has continued to appear under the Editorship of Mrs. K. Hodson.

The Editorial Committee, which has met four times during the past year, consists of Mr. P. R. Cox (Chairman), Dr. C. P. Blacker, Mr. Cecil Binney, Mr. C. W. Usher, Dr. C. O. Carter, Dr. G. C. L. Bertram and the Editor.

With the July 1958 issue the price of *The Eugenics Review* was increased to 5/- a copy. This change was agreed by the Editorial Committee and was made as a first step towards putting the publication of the *Review* on to a more economic basis. The Committee will consider a further increase in about two years' time.

With the same issue, the *Review* appeared in a new format (the page size remaining constant), thus implementing the decision of the Editorial Committee that, as in the past, the general format should continue to evolve in parallel with public taste.

### EUGENIC BROADSHEETS

The Society's Broadsheet on West Indian Immigration was published in September 1958, and was, in general, favourably received.

A total of 3,500 copies was printed of which approximately 2,500 were distributed, free of charge, following a circulation list recommended by the Editorial Committee. This included all Members of Parliament, Privy Councillors, certain Peers, Anglican and Roman Catholic Bishops, Headmasters and Headmistresses of the principal Independent Schools and some Trade Unions.

A steady sale from the *Society's* offices of copies, at 1s. 6d. each, has been maintained since publication.

The second Broadsheet in the series, on Problem and Promising Families, is now being drafted.

### PROMISING FAMILIES COMMITTEE

The Committee's third survey, to which reference was made in last year's

Annual Report, was completed in the Spring of 1958.

A report on this, and the two previous surveys, was given by Dr. C. O. Carter, the Committee's Secretary, at a Members' Meeting on 21st May, 1958. (See above.) The report was published in the October 1958 issue of The Eugenics Review.

### GRANTS

During the period under review, the Council has made the following grants:

Dr. J. A. Fraser Roberts. A sum of £50 as a contribution towards his expenses in attending the Xth International Congress of Genetics held in Montreal in August 1958. (See below.)

The Family Planning Association. A sum of £50 for such distribution to its

Branches as the Association shall decide.

Dr. E. V. Kuenssberg. A sum of £150 to assist in the establishment of a family record system in a group practice in Edinburgh. This project was brought to the notice of the Council by Professor A. M. Kennedy, himself a member of the Council, of the Department of Psychological Medicine in the University of Edinburgh.

### REPRESENTATION AT CONFERENCES

International Union of Family Organisations. The World Family Congress of the International Union of Family Organisations was held in Paris from 15th–23rd June, 1958. Dr. C. P. Blacker and Dr. Hilda Lewis attended as the Society's delegates.

Xth International Congress of Genetics. At this Congress, which was held in Montreal in August 1958, the Society was represented by Dr. J. A. Fraser Roberts. As mentioned above, Dr. Fraser Roberts gave a report on the Congress to a Members' Meeting in December 1958. (See also Grants above.)

The National Council of Women. Mrs. J. B. Bramwell represented the Society at the Annual Conference of the National Council of Women held in

Leamington Spa from 21st-24th October, 1958.

International Planned Parenthood Federation. The Sixth International Conference on Planned Parenthood was held in New Delhi from 14th–21st February, 1959. Dr. C. P. Blacker, who attended this Conference in his capacity as Vice-Chairman of the Federation, was the Society's delegate. Two other members of the Society's Council, Dr. A. S. Parkes and Mrs. M. A. Pyke, also attended this Conference.

### REPRESENTATION OF THE SOCIETY ON OTHER ORGAN-ISATIONS

The Council has been represented by Dr. C. P. Blacker and Dr. Hilda Lewis on the British Committee of the International Union of Family Organisations; by Mr. J. C. Trevor on the Joint Committee of Anthropological Research and Teaching; by Dr. C. O. Carter on the National Council of Social Service; by Dr. C. P. Blacker, Dr. G. C. L. Bertram and Mrs. M. A. Pyke on the British Social Biology Council; and Mrs. Grant Duff was the Council's representative on the following organisations: The National Council of Women, the National Association for Maternity and Child Welfare, and the National Baby Welfare Council. Dr. Blacker has continued to be Honorary Secretary of the Population Investigation Committee.

### SOCIETY'S PREMISES

During the year under review the *Society* has continued to make one room on its ground floor available, rent free, to the British Social Biology Council.

The Society has continued, also, to make all three rooms on its second floor available, rent free, to the International Planned Parenthood Federation.

### LIBRARY

During the past year sixty books have been added to the library by gift or purchase: 110 books and periodicals have been borrowed, thirty of them by the National Central Library. The Librarian has borrowed five books from the National Central Library for re-loan to Fellows and Members.

ACCOUNTS FOR 1958

The Balance Sheet and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year to 31st December, 1958, together with a list of the *Society's* investments will be found at the end of this Report.

For the year under review, ordinary income showed a deficit of £509, salaries and administration expenses having risen.

Income tax on covenanted subscriptions not now being recoverable there is a debit item of £125 brought forward in respect of 1956/57.

Grants were drawn upon to the extent of £357 which compares with £501 in 1957 and £1,152 in 1956.

The final balance is a deficit of £968 carried to the General Fund Account.

As at 31st December, 1958, the General Fund stood at £80,831 which compares with £79,570 at the close of the preceding year, while for comparison purposes, it may be noted that at the end of 1955 the value was £68,608.
