

The Resolution was proposed by the Honorary Treasurer, and carried unanimously.

Before the close of the meeting Dr. C. P. Blacker, from the floor, expressed the Society's great appreciation of the services given by Sir Charles Darwin in the six years of his Presidency. Throughout his term of office he had taken an active part in the affairs of the Society which had gained much in prestige from his interest and support. Happily, Sir Charles Darwin had agreed to accept election to the Council so that the Society would be able to retain its contact with him.

Dr. Blacker also expressed thanks to Mr. Geoffrey Eley, who had retired from the Finance Committee because of increasing pressure on his time, for the great help he had given to the Society during his years as Honorary Treasurer and subsequently as a member of this Committee.

Lastly, Dr. Blacker thanked Mr. Aird Whyte for the able way in which he handled the Society's finances.

THE GALTON LECTURE

The Galton Lecture for 1960 was delivered on Wednesday, 17th February, by Eliot Slater, M.D., F.R.C.P., D.P.M., on "Galton's Heritage." The Chair was taken by Sir Julian Huxley, and about 100 people were present. The Lecture took place at Manson House, 26 Portland Place, W.1., and was preceded by tea.

20th January, 1960: Mr. R. H. S. Robertson on "The Output of Scientists in Scotland—1600 to 1950." Dr. D. C. Martin was in the Chair.

23rd March, 1960: Professor J. F. Danielli on "New Life in Old Bodies."
Dr. E. Hindle was in the Chair.

EUGENICS REVIEW

The Eugenics Review has continued to appear under the Editorship of Mrs. K. Hodson.

The Editorial, Publications and Library Committee, which has met four times during the past year, consists of Mr. P. R. Cox (Chairman), The Rev. Dr. D. Sherwin Bailey, Dr. C. P. Blacker, Mr. P. Bloomfield, Dr. C. O. Carter and Mr. C. W. Usher, with the President and Honorary Treasurer as ex officio members.

At its meeting on 17th February, 1960, the Council agreed in principle that the price of *The Eugenics Review* should be increased to 10/- per issue and £2 per volume. The date at which this increase will be made is under consideration.

DARWIN RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

At its meeting on 17th February, 1960, the Council decided to offer a Darwin Research Fellowship, open to those qualified in science or in medicine wishing to pursue research work in the field of human population genetics with special reference to the range of human variability.

The Fellowship has therefore been advertised and it is hoped that an appointment, which will be for up to three years, will be made in the near future.

The offer of this Fellowship revives a pre-war practice.

DARWIN LECTURE IN HUMAN BIOLOGY

The Council has agreed that a Darwin Lecture in Human Biology shall be established, the first Lecture to be held if possible in October, 1960, and thereafter annually, for a trial period of five years.

The Lectures will be arranged by, and under the sponsorship of the Institute of Biology but in named association with the Society. The Lecturers and topics will be agreed as between the Institute and the Society which will meet all expenses of arrangement and advertisement in addition to the Lecturer's emolument.

A.I.D. INVESTIGATION COUNCIL

The A.I.D. Investigation Council, which was set up as an autonomous body by the *Society* in 1958, has completed its initial survey. The following report of the Council's activities has been received from its Chairman, Dr. A. S. Parkes:

Meetings have been held at regular intervals and doctors known to be practising the technique have been interviewed. In the light of information so received the Council prepared a written memorandum of evidence which it submitted in May, 1959, to the Departmental Committee on Artificial Insemination (this memorandum was later printed in the January, 1960, issue of *The Eugenics Review*). In June, 1959, Dr. Parkes and Dr. Bloom gave oral evidence on behalf of the Council to

the Departmental Committee.

The Council, which is planning its work on a long-term basis, has devised a questionnaire for a follow-up inquiry to be made of doctors who have already given verbal information to the Council and also of those who have not yet been able to do so. It is hoped to conduct such an inquiry annually and that the information obtained will form the basis of periodic reports.

The A.I.D. Investigation Council is constituted as follows: Dr. A. S. Parkes (Chairman); Dr. P. M. Bloom and Dr. Margaret Jackson (joint Honorary Secretaries); The Rev. Dr. D. Sherwin Bailey, Mr. C. Binney, Dr. C. P. Blacker, The Rev. Dr. H. L. Philp and Mrs. Mary Stocks.

GRANTS

During the period under review the Society's Council has made the following grants:

International Planned Parenthood Federation Region for Europe, Near East and Africa.

A sum of £250 a year for two years as a contribution towards the regional administration expenses.

Dr. Ainsworth Harrison. A sum of £250 for a pilot survey, in Liverpool, of some aspects of the genetics and biological fitness of Negro x European hybrids.

Professor D. V. Glass. A sum of £1,000 as a contribution towards the expenses of a historico-demographic study of the Peerage, to be conducted by Mr. T. H. Hollingsworth.

THE MARIE STOPES MEMORIAL FOUNDATION LIMITED In the Spring of 1959 the Society inherited, under the Will of the late Dr. Marie Stopes, the following legacies:

Such books from her Library on Sex and Sociology as the Honorary Secretary (Dr. C. P. Blacker) might choose for the Society's Library. The copyright of her medical text book "Contraception: Its Theory, History and Practice."

The freehold of her house 108 Whitfield Street, London, W.1., to run in trust as a memorial.

The annual profits of her Racials and other registered inventions.

In June, 1959, the Council appointed a sub-Committee, with power to act, to deal with matters arising from the last two of the above-mentioned bequests. It was Dr. Stopes's hope that it would be possible to continue to run a clinic and that the property would be used as a memorial to her. The Committee, which has sought legal advice on administrative and technical procedure, has now completed its work by the formation of a Limited Company, The Marie Stopes Memorial Foundation Limited,

which it is intended will manage a Marie Stopes Memorial Clinic. The Society for Constructive Birth Control owns 106 Whitfield Street, W.1., and the existing clinic founded by Dr. Stopes in 1921 is run from both 106 and 108 Whitfield Street. Arrangements are being made with the C.B.C. so that its funds will be joined with the legacies to the Eugenics Society for the purpose of running the Memorial Clinic. In due course a surplus should be available for the general purposes of the Eugenics Society.

The Articles of Association of the Marie Stopes Memorial Foundation Limited include a provision for its ultimate control by the *Society's* Council through an appointed representative; and the Council has appointed the General Secretary, at present Dr. G. C. L. Bertram, so to act. The Foundation thus becomes a subsidiary Company of the *Society*.

The Board of the Foundation has set up a sub-Committee, to manage the Clinic on its behalf, which will be ultimately responsible to the Board

for all matters concerning the running of the Clinic.

The Foundation is most fortunate in that Sir Russell Brain has agreed to become its President. Dr. G. C. L. Bertram has been appointed Chairman of the Board whose other members are Mrs. M. A. Pyke (who will be convener of the Clinic Committee), Dr. Hilda Lewis, Dr. C. O. Carter and Mr. A. I. Wyborn. Miss F. B. Schenk has been appointed Secretary.

PROMISING FAMILIES COMMITTEE

A broadsheet based on the findings of the Promising Families Committee has not been published as earlier expected. The summarised conclusions of this inquiry have proved more suitable for publication as a further paper by Dr. C. O. Carter, the Committee's Secretary, in a forthcoming issue of *The Eugenics Review*.

REPRESENTATION AT CONFERENCES

International Union of Family Organisations. A Conference of the Marriage Guidance Commission of the International Union of Family Organisations was held in Zurich from 17th-20th June, 1959. Dr. C. P. Blacker attended as the Society's delegate and was accompanied by Mr. N. H. Carrier, of the Population Investigation Committee, whose expenses were also met by the Society.

A report of this Conference, by Dr. Blacker, under the title "Population, Religion and Birth Control" was published in the January, 1960 issue of

The Eugenics Review.

REPRESENTATION OF THE SOCIETY ON OTHER ORGAN-ISATIONS

The Council has been represented by Dr. C. P. Blacker and Dr. Hilda Lewis on the British Committee of the International Union of Family Organisations; by Mr. J. C. Trevor on the Joint Committee of Anthropological Research and Teaching; by Dr. C. O. Carter on the National Council of Social Service and by Dr. Hilda Lewis on the National Council of Women.

SOCIETY'S PREMISES

During the year under review, the *Society* has continued to make all three rooms on its second floor available, rent free, to the International Planned Parenthood Federation.

The Society has continued, also, to make one room on its ground floor available, rent free, to the British Social Biology Council.

LIBRARY

During the past year 157 books have been added to the Library by gift or purchase: 102 books and periodicals have been borrowed, thirty-four of them by the National Central Library. The Librarian has borrowed three books from the National Central Library for re-loan to Fellows and Members.

In July, 1959, the Library received a valuable acquisition under the Will of the late Dr. Marie Stopes (see page 7). The volumes added by this bequest were listed in the October, 1959, issue of *The Eugenics Review*.

Further new shelves have been added to the existing cases in the Library to meet the need for expansion, and three electric radiators have been installed there, thus greatly reducing the risk of dampness affecting the books.


