# Annual General Meeting

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The Annual General Meeting was held at 3.30 p.m. on Wednesday, 25th May, 1960, at 69 Eccleston Square, London, S.W.1. *Chairman*: Sir Julian Huxley. Ten persons were present.

## *ANNUAL REPORT*

The Secretary presented the Annual Report and referred briefly to its contents. He made particular reference to the Council's decision to increase the annual subscription to the Society from one guinea to two guineas and the life subscription from 10 guineas to 20 guineas; to the change in the publisher of *The Eugenics Review* from Messrs. Cassell & Co. Ltd., to The Pergamon Press; and to the formation of the Marie Stopes Memorial Foundation Ltd.

The adoption of the Report was proposed by the Chairman and carried unanimously.

## *STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND BALANCE SHEET*

These were presented by Dr. C. P. Blacker on behalf of the Honorary Treasurer who was prevented by illness from attending the meeting.

Dr. Blacker read to the meeting a statement, prepared by the Honorary Treasurer, on the accounts for the year to 31st December, 1959.

The adoption of the Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet which had been proposed by the Honorary Treasurer in his written statement was seconded by Mr. C. W. Usher and carried unanimously.

The General Secretary was asked to convey to the Honorary Treasurer an expression of sympathy in his illness and best wishes for his full recovery.

# Extraordinary General Meeting

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An Extraordinary General Meeting was held at 3 o'clock on Wednesday, 23rd November, 1960, at 69 Eccleston Square, London, S.W.1. *Chairman:* Dr. J. A. Fraser Roberts. Fourteen Fellows were present.

The Meeting had been called for the purpose of considering the following SPECIAL RESOLUTION:

"That Article 26 of the Articles of Association be amended by adding to the last line the following words:

'up to a maximum of six years consecutive service for all Honorary Officers except the Treasurer.' "

After a short discussion the Chairman put to the meeting the Motion "that the above Special Resolution be not put."

The Motion was agreed with no dissentients.

It was agreed that a note, signed by the Chairman, should be sent at once to all Fellows and Members of the Society informing them of the action taken at the meeting, and explaining that this course had been taken primarily to make it clear that the proposed Special Resolution was not intended to be in any way a reflection on the present holder of the office of Honorary Secretary. In the second place it had become clear that the Articles of Association of the Society could with advantage be brought up to date and the change originally proposed would thus come up for consideration in a wider revision.

## CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL

The Consultative Council has suffered a loss in the death of W. L. Hutton, M.D.

Sir Arthur Ellis, O.B.E., M.A., D.M., F.R.C.P., has been appointed a member of the Council.

## ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

The Council has decided that the *Society's* Articles of Association shall be revised both to conform more closely to modern practice (Companies Act, 1948) and to remove certain ambiguities.

The revised version has been prepared, with legal advice, and it is hoped that technicalities will be completed shortly so that it may be submitted for adoption by Special Resolution at an Extraordinary General Meeting on 24th May, 1961.

## MEETINGS

*The Galton Lecture.* The Galton Lecture for 1961 was delivered on Wednesday, 8th February by Sir Robert Platt, Bt., M.Sc., M.D., P.R.C.P., on "Inherited Disease in Man." The Chair was taken by Sir Julian Huxley, and about 100 people were present. The Lecture took place at Manson House, 26 Portland Place, W.1, and was preceded by tea.

*The Darwin Lecture in Human Biology.* The first Darwin Lecture in Human

Biology, sponsored by the Institute of Biology in association with the *Society*, was delivered on Wednesday 23rd November, 1960 by C. E. Ford, B.Sc., Ph.D., on "The Cytogenetics of Sex in Man." The Chair was taken by Professor A. S. Parkes, and about 200 people were present. The Lecture took place in the Lecture Hall, Natural History Museum, Cromwell Road, S.W.7.

*Members' Meeting.* At its meeting on 8th June, 1960, the Council agreed that the programme of Members' Meetings should be reduced, on account of poor attendances, and that in future the *Society* should concentrate where possible on joint meetings with related bodies. In the light of this decision one Members' Meeting only has been held during the period under review. This took place on Wednesday, 14th December, 1960, at the Rooms of the Royal Society, Burlington House, W.1, when the lecture was given by A. C. Stevenson, B.Sc., M.D., F.R.C.P., D.P.H., on "Modern Trends in the Population Genetics of Man." Dr. C. O. Carter was in the Chair.

#### *EUGENICS REVIEW*

*The Eugenics Review* has continued to appear under the Editorship of Mrs. Hodson.

The Editorial, Publications and Library Committee, which has met four times during the past year, consists of Mr. P. R. Cox (Chairman), The Rev. Dr. D. Sherwin Bailey, Dr. C. P. Blacker, Mr. P. Bloomfield, Dr. C. O. Carter, Dr. J. P. M. Tizard and Mr. C. W. Usher, with the President and Honorary Treasurer as *ex officio* members.

New arrangements have been made for the publication of *The Eugenics Review*, Messrs. Cassell & Co. Ltd. having indicated their wish to terminate their agreement owing to reorganisation. A contract has therefore been signed with Pergamon Press Ltd., who took over publication with the January, 1961, issue.

The increased price of 10s. per issue and £2 per volume, mentioned in last year's Annual Report, will come into effect with the April, 1961, issue.

#### *DARWIN RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS*

On 28th June, 1960, Dr. D. T. Hughes and Dr. A. W. F. Edwards were appointed Darwin Research Fellows. Each started work on 1st September, 1960: Dr. Hughes, under Professor Koller at the Chester Beatty Research Institute, London, on the cellular basis of inheritance and the mechanism of genetic variability in man; and Dr. Edwards, under Professor Thoday in the Department of Genetics, Cambridge, on the mode of inheritance, variability and selective forces involved in human child-birth.

Both appointments are for two years.

In view of the fact that applications were received from younger men it was possible to appoint two Research Fellows on this occasion.

The Council has decided, if funds are available, to appoint a Research Fellow each year provided that there is a suitable candidate.

## GRANTS

During the period under review the Council has made the following grants:

*Dr. W. Weiner.* A sum of £200 for an investigation of the ABO status of rhesus children.

*Professor D. R. Newth.* A sum of £850 for research on the genetics of obesity in man, the work to be conducted by Mr. R. J. Withers.

### *The Oliver Bird Trust*

(a) A sum of £500 towards the cost of the Population Investigation Committee's field studies on marriage and family growth.

(b) A sum of £1,000 to cover the second year's work of a special-problem birth control clinic in Newcastle-upon-Tyne under the direction of Dr. Mary Peberdy.

### *International Planned Parenthood Federation*

(a) World Population and Planned Parenthood Appeal. A sum of £1,000.

(b) Region for Europe, near East and Africa. A sum of £250 towards the regional administration expenses. This renewed for one further year the original grant of £250 a year for two years made to the Region in June, 1959.

*The Society for the Study of Human Biology.* A sum of £100 a year for three years for the expenses of overseas speakers travelling to attend its annual symposium.

## PUBLIC OPINION SURVEY

The Council has decided to conduct a pilot survey of public opinion on eugenics. This survey, which will be held without prejudice to any subsequent larger enquiry, will be advised by Social Surveys (Gallup Poll) Ltd. A questionnaire is now in course of preparation.

## THE MARIE STOPES MEMORIAL FOUNDATION LIMITED

The Balance Sheet as at 31st December, 1960 and the Revenue Account for the period 30th May to 31st December, 1960 of the Marie Stopes Memorial Foundation Limited, the *Society's* subsidiary Company, will be found at the end of this Report.

The memorial clinic at Whitfield Street has been under the management of the Foundation since 30th May, 1960 and considerable progress has been made. Structural alterations to the premises, which have also been redecorated throughout, were completed in February, 1961 and new clinic and office equipment have been installed.

There has been an encouraging, if small, increase in the number of patients attending the clinic and pre-marital sessions are now being held.

Further, arrangements are under consideration with the International Planned Parenthood Federation and the Family Planning Association for overseas nurses to be trained at the clinic it being felt that this important work would have held a special appeal for Dr. Stopes.

It is hoped that there will be an official opening ceremony at the clinic in May, 1961.

#### REPRESENTATION AT CONFERENCES

*International Planned Parenthood Federation.* The second Conference of the Region for Europe, near East and Africa was held in The Hague from 11th-17th May, 1960. Dr. C. P. Blacker, who attended in his capacity of Administrative Chairman of the Federation, acted as the *Society's* delegate.

*International Union of Family Organisations.* A Conference of the Commission on Marriage Guidance of the International Union of Family Organisations was held in Dusseldorf from 23rd-25th June, 1960. Dr. C. P. Blacker and Lady Lewis attended as the *Society's* delegates.



The second International Conference of Human Genetics is to be held in Rome from 7th-12th September, 1961. The Council has agreed that the *Society* should send up to six delegates to this Conference.

#### SOCIETY'S PREMISES

During the year under review the *Society* has continued to make all three rooms on its second floor available, rent free, to the International Planned Parenthood Federation.

The *Society* has continued, also, to make one room on its ground floor available, rent free, to the British Social Biology Council.

#### LIBRARY

During the past year fifty-five books have been added to the Library by gift or purchase: 114 books and periodicals have been borrowed, twenty-three of them by the National Central Library. The Librarian has borrowed two books from the National Central Library for re-loan to Fellows and Members.

#### OBITUARY

#### FINANCE

**LIFE COMPOSITION.** As a natural extension of the increase to £2 2s. 0d. of the annual subscription to the *Society* the Council has decided that the composition for life membership shall be raised from ten to twenty guineas. The new rate has been in operation since May, 1960.

**DONATIONS.** During the year to 31st December, 1960, the *Society* has

gratefully received the following donations: Mr. John Brockenbrough Fox, £1 15s. 0d. (\$5.00); Mr. G. R. S. Snow, £8 0s. 0d. Mr. William Stewart has given £2 2s. 0d. annually, as from December, 1960, towards the expenses of *The Eugenics Review*.

ACCOUNTS FOR 1960. The Balance Sheet and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year to 31st December, 1960, together with a list of the *Society's* Investments will be found at the end of this Report.

In the year under review the total deficit at £5,419 was considerably larger than in recent years in part because the Council approved larger Grants as well as the Darwin Research Fellowships. In effect, this meant that the *Society* disbursed a larger part of its increased capital values.

No deductions are here made for the Staff Pension Reserve, which is a provisional item, nor for Grants not fully drawn at 31st December, 1960 and amounting to £2,742.

The value of 69 Eccleston Square and Mews is that approved by the Agents to our Ground Landlords in 1959. The *Society* has repossessed itself of the Mews property which is now being modernised, thus enhancing its value. The Maisonette, being the self-contained top two floors of No. 69, is now again in our hands. These two items should let at rentals totalling £1,000/£1,200 p.a.

It will be observed that no value has been placed upon the *Society's* Library which is possibly unique being the only one of its kind in the world. The Library is insured at £7,550. But this position is now under review.

No credit has been taken in respect of benefits accruing to the *Society* under The Marie Stopes Memorial Foundation Limited.

The conclusion is that the *Society's* assets very considerably exceed £100,000.

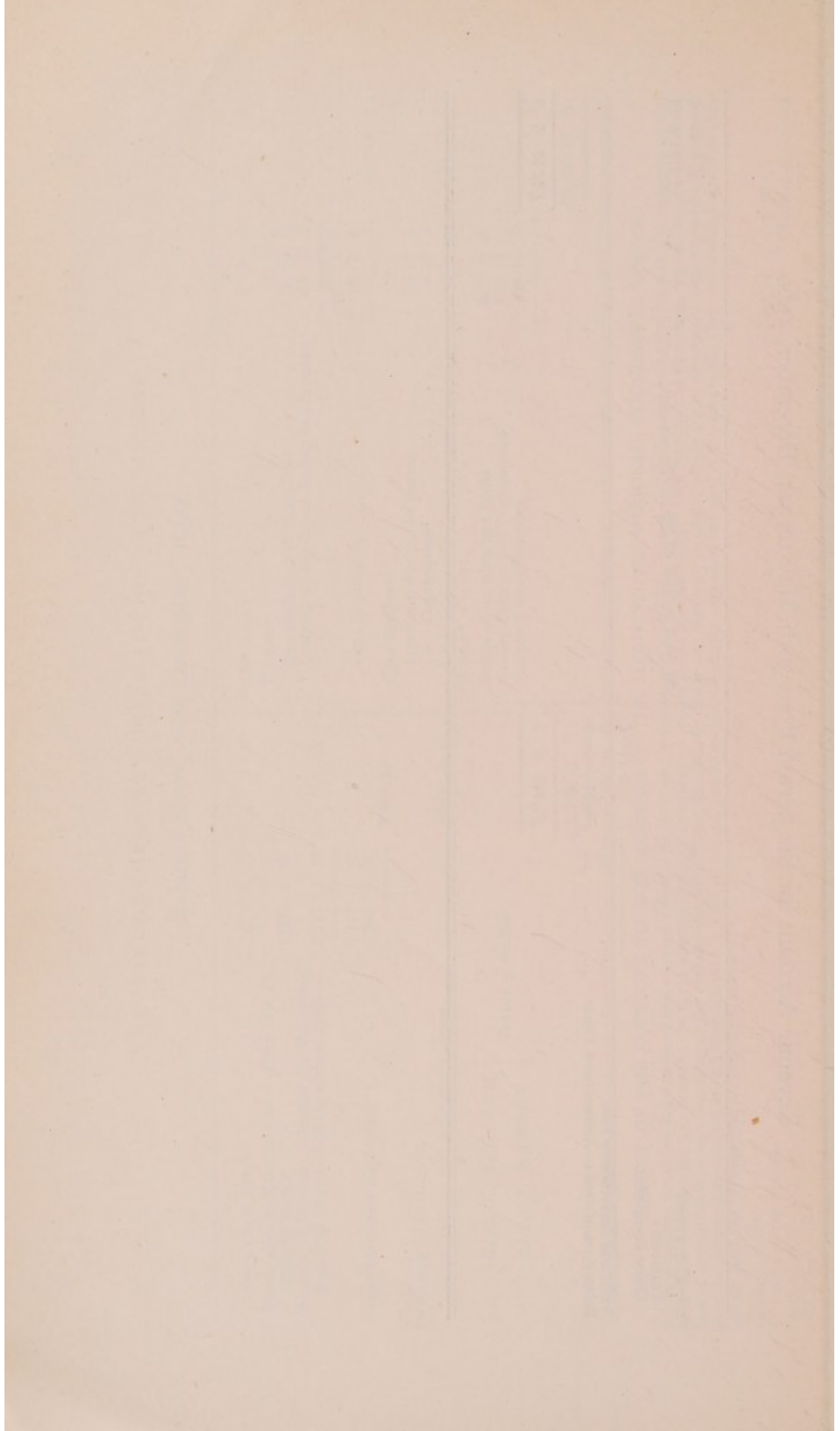

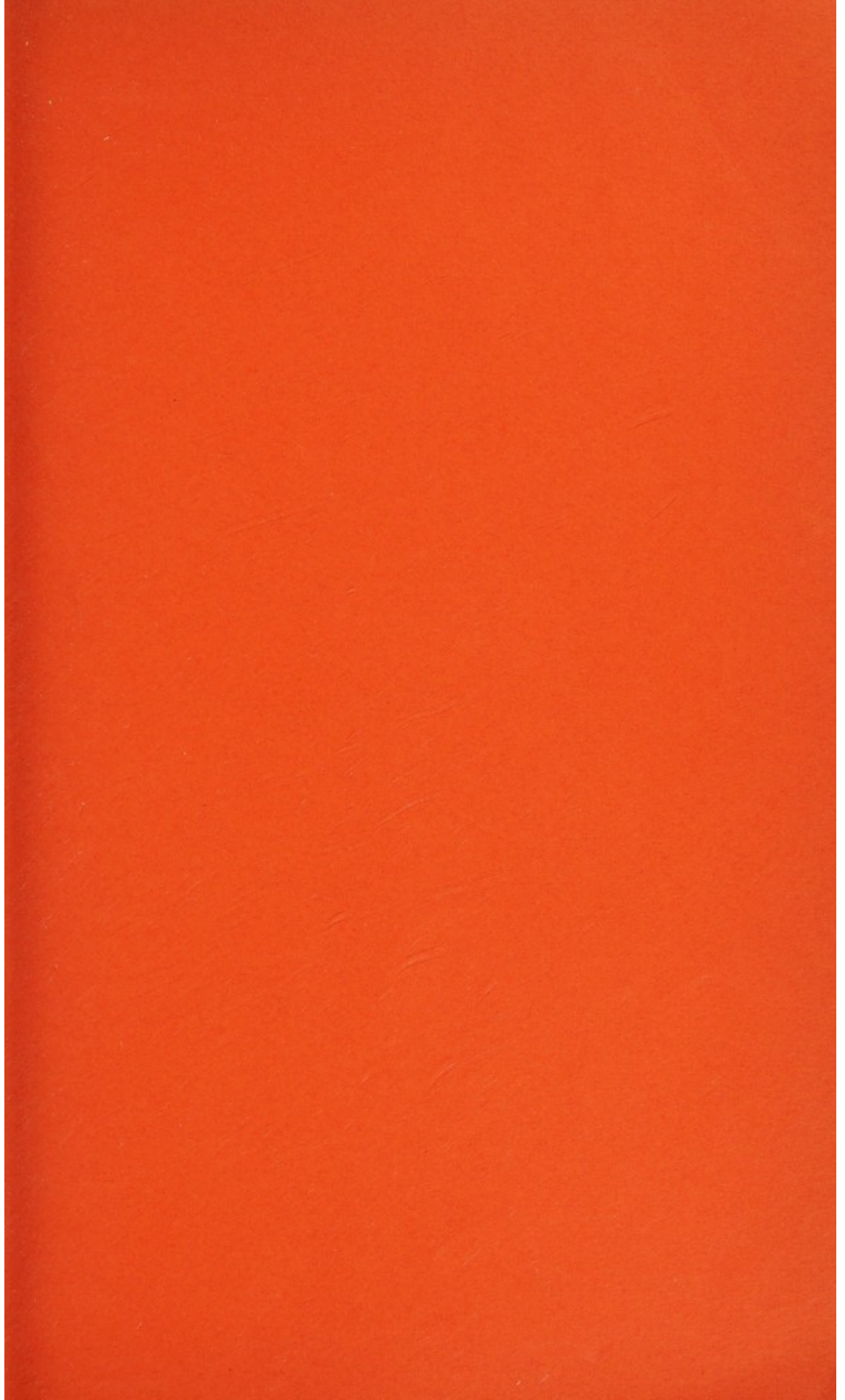
