In this report the accounts relate to the period from 1st January, 1967 to 31st December, 1967 inclusive. The rest of the Report covers the period from 1st April, 1967 to 31st March, 1968.

During the period under review the Executive and Finance Committee met twice.

### CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL

The Consultative Council has suffered a loss in the death of Dr. A. Piney.

### MEETINGS

The Galton Lecture. The Galton Lecture for 1967 was delivered on Tuesday 25th April by Dr. A. H. Halsey on "The Changing Relations between Biological and Social Sciences" (subsequently published in *The Eugenics Review* under the title "Sociology, Biology and Population Control"). The Chair was taken by the President and about seventy people were present. The Lecture took place in the Rooms of the Royal Society and was preceded by a sherry party.

The Galton Lecture for 1968 will be integrated in the symposium (see below) and will be given by Dr. G. Ainsworth Harrison on "The Race Concept in Human Biology". Dr. Harrison is Reader in Physical Anthro-

pology in the University of Oxford.

The Darwin Lecture in Human Biology. The seventh Darwin Lecture in Human Biology, sponsored by the Institute of Biology in association with the Society, was delivered on Tuesday 23rd May, 1967 by Professor E. C. Amoroso on "The Evolution of Viviparity". Professor A. S. Parkes was in the Chair and some 150 people attended. The Lecture took place in the Lecture Hall of the Natural History Museum.

The eighth Darwin Lecture will be given, also in this Lecture Hall, at 5.15 p.m. on Tuesday 28th May, 1968 by Professor J. S. Weiner on the

subject of human adaptability.

Joint Meeting. A proposal is under consideration to arrange jointly with the Royal Anthropological Institute a lecture on some topic of mutual interest to both organisations.

### THE EUGENICS REVIEW

The Eugenics Review has continued to be published quarterly but Volume 59 was the last to appear under the Editorship of Mrs. K. Hodson who has now retired.

The Editorial Board, which has met twice during the year, has consisted of Mr. P. R. Cox (Chairman), Mr. D. R. Brothwell, Dr. C. O. Carter, Professor P. Sargant Florence, Professor E. Grebenik, Professor H. Lehmann, Mr. John Peel, Professor J. E. Meade and Professor J. M. Tanner with the Honorary Secretary as an ex officio member.

It will have been seen from the Foreword to the March 1968 issue that by decision of the Council publication of the *Review* will be discontinued at

the end of the year, with the completion of Volume 60.

The Council has decided to launch, through the Galton Foundation, a Journal of Biosocial Science, the purpose of which will be to focus attention on the common ground between biology and the social sciences and to promote inter-disciplinary communication. Its contents will be limited to original papers, reviews, lectures, proceedings and major book reviews, and the first issue will appear in January 1969. The Editorial Board will include Mr. D. R. Brothwell, Dr. C. O. Carter, Dr. Martin Cole, Mr. P. R. Cox, Dr. R. G. Edwards, Professor P. Sargant Florence, Professor E. Grebenik, Dr. A. H. Halsey, Dr. G. Ainsworth Harrison, Professor Raymond Illsley, Professor H. Lehmann, Professor J. E. Meade, Sir Alan Parkes, Mr. John Peel, Lord Platt, Dr. D. M. Potts, Professor J. M. Tanner and Dr. Angus Thomson. The Editors in Chief will be Dr. C. O. Carter and Professor E. Grebenik. Sir Alan Parkes will act as Executive Editor.

The Council has also decided that, beginning in 1969, a regular Newsletter shall be issued from the Society's office; in the first instance this will be circulated only to members but it might later be made available to a wider public.

### LIBRARY

The Council has under consideration plans for increasing the use of the Library, which include new policies for purchasing, and consequentially, in view of restricted space at present, for disposal of books. The possibility of making the Library available to other organisations is also being discussed.

### THE GALTON FOUNDATION

The Trust Deed of the Foundation has now been finalised and, having been accepted by the Charity Commission and the Inland Revenue, is awaiting signature pending the appointment of Trustees. The sum of £100 to start the Trust has been guaranteed by a donor.

The Trust purposes are:

(a) the promotion of the biosocial sciences including the study of

the conservation, evolution and progress of mankind and the publication of the result of such study; and

(b) such other charitable purposes of an educational or scientific nature as can conveniently be promoted in conjunction with (a) above.

A sum of up to £480 in support of his studies of a Hokkaido Population: the Ainu and Ainu-Japanese of Northern Japan.

At 31st December, 1967 the Grants Fund stood at £370 representing the grant to The Society for the Study of Human Biology (1963) £50, which had not been drawn at that date, and a balance of £320 undrawn by Mr. Harvey (1967).

### SYMPOSIA

The Society's fourth symposium, on Genetic and Environmental Influences on Behaviour, took place on Thursday and Friday, 27th and 28th September, 1967 in the Meeting Rooms of the Zoological Society of London.

As usual there were four sessions. The first, under the Chairmanship of the President who opened the meeting, was on comparative studies; the second, for which Professor Parkes took the Chair, covered environmental influences. The third and fourth sessions, on the second day, dealt with interrelations and with genetic influences, and the Chairmen were respectively Professor J. M. Thoday and Dr. C. O. Carter.

The Meeting Rooms which together hold 250 people were filled to capacity on both days and many of the audience took part in discussion for which time was allowed after every paper. Much interest, too, was displayed in the films, introduced for the first time into the programme, which were shown at the end of each day.

The Proceedings will be published as volume four in the series of the Society's symposia. During 1967, 123 copies were sold of volume one, Biological Aspects of Social Problems, and 1,070 copies of volume two, Genetic and Environmental Factors in Human Ability making up at the end of the year total sales since publication of about 1,706 and 1,261 respectively. Volume three, Social and Genetic Influences on Life and Death, was published in December 1967; sales at the end of the year amounted to 112.

Arrangements are now being made for the fifth symposium, on Biosocial Aspects of Race, which will again be held in the Meeting Rooms of the Zoological Society, London, on Thursday and Friday, 26th and 27th September next. As planned at the time of writing the four sessional topics will be genetic aspects, physiological and psychological aspects, demo-

graphic aspects and sociological aspects.

A full programme will be obtainable in May from the Society's office.

### THE MARIE STOPES MEMORIAL FOUNDATION LIMITED

The Balance Sheet and Revenue Account for the year to 31st December, 1967 of The Marie Stopes Memorial Foundation Limited will be found at the end of this Report.

There was an excess of income over expenditure for the year amounting to £1,992 which, added to the Revenue Account balance at 31st December, 1966 of £6,495 increased the revenue surplus to £8,487. Of this balance £6,194 was carried forward, the sum of £2,293 having been expended during the year on training, the domiciliary service, grants and an allocation of £1,000 to the Eugenics Society. A further allocation of £702 charged to the Revenue Account was made to the Society in respect of administrative and secretarial expenses.

The cost of the training courses for overseas personnel was £724 which was reduced by fees received of £531 to a net figure of £193, and the domiciliary service was allocated the sum of £350 towards the cost of a follow-up survey. The grants were of £500 to Brook Advisory Centres Limited (the last of three equal payments guaranteed annually until 1967), and of £250 to Mr. C. J. Rowe in aid of his research on family size and delinquency.

By decision of the Board the Foundation is now paying rent, backdated to 1st January, 1967 of £2,000 per annum for the Whitfield Street premises to the landlords, The Society for Constructive Birth Control

Limited, after eight years of rent-free accommodation.

There have been no changes during the year in the membership of the Board who are Dr. G. C. L. Bertram (Chairman), Mrs. H. Brook, Dr. C. O. Carter, Mr. John Peel, Mrs. Elizabeth Mitchell and Mr. A. I. Wyborn. Miss Schenk has continued to serve as Secretary.

The domiciliary birth control service has continued during 1967 under the direction of Dr. Elizabeth Horder with the assistance of Dr. Phyllis Fleury. It was fully financed by the London Boroughs of Camden and Westminster and on 1st January, 1968 Westminster's Health Department took over entire responsibility for all its new patients. This is a most satisfactory outcome of the four years' work which the Foundation has directed and it is hoped that, before long, the Camden Health Department will follow suit. A follow-up survey has been undertaken of all those families who have received the service and whose whereabouts are known,

and a report is in preparation.

Training facilities for overseas personnel have again been extended. In addition to the usual six courses, all of which were fully subscribed, for nurses, a one-day course was held in the autumn for those who had not enrolled for the full training. Courses were also held for male nurses, three from Malta and three from Mauritius; these were organised at the request of the Ministry of Overseas Development from whom full payment was received.

Free accommodation and facilities at No. 106 Whitfield Street have continued to be made available to Brook Advisory Centres Limited.

Certain external repairs to the Whitfield Street premises and further internal improvements and decorations have been approved; the latter include the addition in the rear area of a small kitchen for the staff, and the division into two of one of the rooms on the first floor so as to provide more office accommodation.

There has been a continuing increase during the year in the number of new patients, 2,722 having attended in comparison with 2,575 in 1966, and 717 doctor sessions have been held. These have included two sessions each week for research into blood changes in women taking the oral contraceptive, and new fortnightly sessions, for which Dr. Jeremy Shaw has been appointed, for marriage difficulties. Sessions for cervical smears have remained at one a month.

A Clinic Report is in preparation and it is hoped that it will be published in the spring.

### FINANCE

DONATIONS. During the year to 31st December, 1967 the Society has grate-

fully received a donation of £8 from Mr. G. R. S. Snow.

The Society has also received with gratitude a donation from The Hopkins Donation Fund of \$2,000.00 (£714 16s. 8d.) for disbursal in grants. Approximately £220 of this sum was used to meet the balance of the two-year grant made in 1966, from the Fund's donation for that year, for an inquiry, under the direction of Mr. James Maxwell of the Scottish Council for Research in Education, into differential fertility in relation to intelligence. The remainder was applied to two other grants as follows: £250 to the National Bureau for Co-operation in Child Care for a national study,

under the direction of Dr. M. L. Kellmer Pringle, of children born to unmarried women; and £244 to the Ephebiatric Education Group for a film of sex education (see Grants above).

It will be remembered that in 1965 The Hopkins Donation Fund made a donation of \$2,000.00 (£712 10s. 6d.) for the travelling expenses of overseas speakers at the symposia, and, by permission of the Trustees, this was held over for use in 1966 (Professor A. H. Leighton of Harvard University) and 1967 when the balance, of £549 6s. 6d., was drawn in full in respect of Dr. J. B. Calhoun of the National Institute of Mental Health, Bethesda, Dr. D. G. Freedman of the Committee on Human Development, University of Chicago, and Professor S. G. Vandenberg of the University of Colorado.

LEGACY. In December 1967 the Society received an unconditional legacy of £100 bequeathed by the late Mr. A. H. Scott who had been a member for over twenty-five years.

LEASEHOLD PROPERTY. Messrs. John D. Wood & Co., Estate Agents, of 23 Berkeley Square, W.I., have continued to manage the Society's property.

In June 1967 this Firm, in consultation with Messrs. Currey & Co., Solicitors, agreed, on behalf of the Society, payment to Central Estates (Belgravia) Limited of the sum of £4,575 in consideration of the remainder of the present lease of 69 Eccleston Square and the grant of a new lease for 134 years, this capital sum being equivalent to fifteen years purchase of the reduction in ground rent from £375 to £70 per annum.

The contract for the new lease, which contains no restrictive clauses on the use of the premises or on assigning or underletting as a whole or in part, was completed on 21st December, 1967. The sum of £5,000 was withdrawn in October from The Charities Official Investment Fund to cover the purchase money and professional charges.

External repairs to the house amounting to £223 have been carried out. By decision of the Council one of the rooms in the basement has been redecorated and furnished for use as a staff room.

INVESTMENT. At 31st December, 1967 the Society's investment in the Charities Official Investment Fund amounted to 82,709 income shares being the balance after the withdrawal of 4,946 (£5,000) to provide for the purchase of the new lease (see above).

Accounts for 1967. The Balance Sheet and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year to 31st December, 1967 will be found at the end of this Report.

For the year under review income exceeded ordinary working expenses by £1,280. This surplus was increased by an allocation of £1,000 from The Marie Stopes Memorial Foundation Limited and a donation of £715 from The Hopkins Donation Fund; the latter has been transferred to the Specific Purposes Fund on the Balance Sheet. Net expenditure on the publication of *The Eugenics Review* of £2,502 less the net surplus on the

symposium volumes, £204, has been debited together with the cost of the symposium, £513; these, in addition to the grants approved during 1967,

£830, produced a net deficit of £1,361.

The General Fund which stood at £95,482 at 31st December, 1966 has been reduced by this deficit of £1,361 and after crediting the legacy received from the Estate of A. H. Scott deceased, £100, the balance at 31st December, 1967 was £94,221.
