

### ANNUAL REPORT, 1942-43.

IN order to comply with the Paper Controller's request for economy the Council feel it desirable to condense the Annual Report to the briefest possible record of a few outstanding features of the year's work.

The membership has reached the highest peak, no fewer than 520 members having joined since July 1st, 1942. This increase has resulted in a record number of enquiries and visits, as well as in a volume of service, particularly relating to medical, canteen and legal questions, which have been successfully dealt with, in spite of many changes in the staff and a certain amount of dislocation. A record number of appointments have been made from the Society's panel.

One of the most pleasing features of the year's work has been the close and friendly association established with practically every Government Department—an association which made possible in November last the holding, in London, of a two-day conference in co-operation with the Treasury, when the welfare of departmental office staffs was discussed. Over two hundred delegates from the departments took part and the Right Hon. Ernest Bevin, M.P., Minister of Labour and National Service, spoke at one of the sessions. Short lecture courses of this type have proved extremely useful and during twelve months 2,700 delegates from member firms have attended.

A considerable number of meetings, of every kind and in many districts, have been addressed by the Director and members of the staff, and the appreciation expressed by those responsible for these gatherings has proved that this educational work has been of great value in promoting interest in welfare work.

The contact with other countries, notably the United States of America, has been maintained with pleasing results.

By the death of Mr. Sam Mavor the Council has lost one of its oldest members—one who was always eager to help in any way possible in the development of the Society's work.

The Council desire to acknowledge their indebtedness to the Right Hon. Lord Plender, G.B.E., the honorary auditor, and to Mr. Harold Hargrove, honorary solicitor, for their very valuable services during another year.

When the war is over, and paper restrictions removed, the Council hope to prove to the members that the Society has made no small contribution to the national effort.

## NOTES ON THE ACCOUNTS, 1942-43

The Accounts are presented in somewhat different form this year—
the special funds raised during recent years (including the balance of the
gift received ten years ago for development work) having been merged
in the general fund account. Out of this small reserve fund it will be
possible to cover the cost of extension work as and when the need arises:
at the present rate of progress the receipts from membership subscriptions
should be adequate to meet the normal expenditure of the Society.

Income for the year ended 30th June last totalled £21,504 and Expenditure £16,158, shewing a surplus of £5,346. This very favourable result is due, in the first place, to the striking success of the appeal made by Sir Charles Craven for gifts to mark the 25th anniversary of the Society and, secondly, to the influx of new members. The financial position is much more satisfactory now than at any other time during the twenty-five years the Society has been in existence. By their support, firms have shewn that they value the practical services they receive in return for their annual subscription. Our desire is to maintain those services at their present high standard of usefulness, and we welcome the co-operation of our friends in making known to non-members the benefits to be derived from membership.
