KING GEORGE'S FUND FOR SAILORS.

1927.

GENERAL.

In presenting the 11th Annual Report of King George's Fund for Sailors, for the year 1927, the General Council have much pleasure in announcing that the Fund continues to make satisfactory progress. The past year is noteworthy in its annals for two reasons—first, that in May HIS MAJESTY THE KING graciously honoured the Fund by becoming an Annual Subscriber of £100, and, secondly, that the date July 5th saw the completion of the first decade of its existence as King George's Fund for Sailors.

HIS MAJESTY on the inauguration of the Fund in 1917 was graciously pleased to contribute the munificent sum of five thousand two hundred pounds, and HIS MAJESTY's recent expression of continued interest in, and approval of the objects and administration of, the Fund has given the greatest gratification and encouragement to the General Council. They desire to draw attention to the remarks by H.R.H. THE DUKE OF YORK, President, at their meeting at St. James's Palace, on December 15th (see page 11), who expressed a hope that HIS MAJESTY's gracious example would be as generously followed as individual circumstances allowed.

The completion of the Fund's first ten years' work demands a few retrospective remarks. In March, 1917, a Meeting of Shipowners, Royal Naval and Mercantile Marine Officers, Merchants, Representatives of Marine Benevolent Institutions and others interested in the sea was held at the Marine Society. It was then resolved to take immediate action to recognise the country's debt of gratitude for the courage and disregard of danger shown by the mariner, and to provide support, by the medium of a central fund, for the excellent organisations existing for his help and comfort in sickness and distress, and for the relief of his dependents. The Fund to bear the same relation to the Marine Benevolent Institutions as King Edward's Hospital Fund for London to the Metropolitan Hospitals.

Captain (now Sir) ARTHUR W. CLARKE, an Elder Brother of the Trinity House, was moved to the Provisional Chair, and meetings were held at the Trinity House, when the initial steps were taken to establish the Fund. Subsequently, on July 5th, 1917, by the courtesy of the Lord Mayor of London, a public meeting was held at the Mansion House, when His Lordship was supported by Sir Edward (now Lord) Carson (First Lord of the Admiralty), Admiral Sir John (now Earl) Jellicoe (First Sea Lord),

the High Commissioners of Australia and New Zealand and a large number of distinguished persons. It was then announced that HIS MAJESTY THE KING had been pleased to command that the Fund should henceforth bear his name, and be called "King George's Fund for Sailors," and, further that H.R.H. PRINCE ALBERT had been graciously pleased to accept the office of President of the Fund, and H.R.H. THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT the Chairmanship of the General Council.

First contributions of £30,000 were announced from the platform on this occasion, and these were immediately followed by generous donations from H.R.H. THE PRINCE OF WALES and other Members of the Royal Family. Committees were formed in London and the Provinces in order to assist further in augmenting the Fund, and in making its aims and objects generally known to the public. As a result, liberal support flowed in from the Shipping Companies, the various Corporate bodies in London, from the County Committees, and from Scotland and Wales. A large sum was raised by the *Daily Telegraph* through the efforts of Lord Burnham and the Staff, the response to this appeal being generous and widespread. Navy Week in London and the Provinces also added a substantial sum to the movement. Patriotic Societies of every kind forwarded support, and considerable sums were received through Church collections and Freemasons' Lodges. The efforts of the Press in publishing the objects of the Fund must not be overlooked, as they contributed largely to the success of the appeals. Nor was Greater Britain behindhand, for the most generous assistance poured in from India, the Dominions, and the Colonies; each vying with the other to express their gratitude for the heroic work of the Seamen of the Empire. In short, in the space of three years the magnificent total of over one million pounds had been collected, of which about two-thirds was invested, to form the capital of the Fund, and the balance was distributed in relief to the Marine Charities.

As to the distributions made by the Fund. In 1917 there existed a large number of temporary war-time organisations for Seamen, and these were generously assisted, while the permanent Marine Charities, dealing equally with the distress of Seamen in war and peace, were not overlooked. Within six months of the inauguration of the Fund a first distribution of £55,000 had been made, and at the close of 1927 the total distributions by the Fund amounted to £548,751 amongst 150 Marine Charities; an annual distribution approximating to £50,000. The cost of collecting, administration and distribution working out at 4.8 per cent.

On March 1st, 1920, the Fund was honoured by the grant of a Charter of Incorporation by HIS MAJESTY THE KING, and this was received by H.R.H. THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT, Chairman, at a Special Meeting of the General Council held at St. James's Palace on May 19th of the same year. A message of congratulation and good wishes from HIS MAJESTY was read at the meeting, and also one from H.R.H. THE PRINCE ALBERT, President.

In turning to the work of the Fund during the past twelve months, the General Council have gratification in recording that the Annual Subscriptions and Donations have been well maintained, and that the individual number of contributors shows a further satisfactory increase. It must be borne in mind by the charitable public that voluntary contributions play a very necessary and valuable part in keeping the annual distributions of the Fund up to the level of past years. The needs of the numerous approved Marine Benevolent Institutions and Funds, which the Fund assists, after careful examination of their work and methods and inspection by the Honorary Auditors, show no diminution, and if the Fund is to maintain its invaluable public work there must be no falling off in the amount of its yearly allocations.

One legacy has been received during the year amounting to £617 12s. This is on account of the legacy bequeathed by the late Mr. W. S. DAVIDSON, of Quebec, the effect of whose Will is still undecided, but it is anticipated that a further amount will be received by the Fund. The testator directed that

his bequest was to form a trust, and " the income therefrom to be distributed amongst Maritime Charities working on behalf of the Seamen of the Merchant Service." The foregoing sum has accordingly been invested, and the income will be added to that of the Wills Trust, as the objects of the two Trusts are identical. It is somewhat disappointing that no bequests have been allotted during the past year to the Fund by Executors in the exercise of their discretionary powers. The Council desire once again to bring to the notice of Executors and Trustees the advantages offered by the Fund in cases where the Testator has expressed an interest in charitable objects connected with the sea.

The Council, in tendering their cordial appreciation to those who have so generously contributed to the Fund during the year, desire to give special mention to the following :—

On May 3rd THEIR MAJESTIES THE KING AND QUEEN were graciously pleased to attend a special performance of the film " The Flag Lieutenant," at the Marble Arch Pavilion, when the proceeds were to be devoted to King George's Fund. Their Majesties were received by the Deputy Chairman, Captain Sir ARTHUR CLARKE, in the absence abroad of both the President, H.R.H. THE DUKE OF YORK, and the Chairman, H.R.H. THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT, when the following presentations were made: Mr. and Mrs. ISRAEL DAVIS and Captain ALFRED DAVIS, the proprietors of the Pavilion, and, at the conclusion of the performance, Lieut.-Colonel W. P. DRURY, R.M., joint author of the play with Major LEO TREVOR, and Mr. MAURICE ELVEY, who directed the production of the film. At its conclusion HIS MAJESTY THE KING said that he and the Queen had enjoyed the production immensely, and were delighted that British films were at last coming to the front and taking the place to which they were entitled. As a result of the performance the Council subsequently received the sum of £1,000 from Mr. and Mrs. ISRAEL DAVIS, which they once again most gratefully acknowledge.

The grateful thanks of the General Council are due to a number of workers in London and the Provinces through whose efforts support has been received during the year. In January a dramatic entertainment was held at Southwater, the proceeds of which were subsequently forwarded to the Fund by the organiser, Lady STIRLING-HAMILTON, to whom the Council tender cordial thanks for her kindly help and interest. On May 28th the Merseyside Appeal Committee held their Annual Flag Day in

Liverpool and the adjacent towns, which brought in £900—their most successful effort for some years past. The total collected by that Committee for the Fund since 1918 is £9,432, and the Council tender special thanks to Mr. F. G. D'AETH, Hon. Secretary, LADY THURLOW, Miss REDFEARN, and the members of the Appeal and Ladies' Committees for their continued interest in and hard work on behalf of the Fund.

On March 15th Mr. LIONEL TAYLOR, who acted as Honorary Secretary of the South Wales and Monmouthshire Branch of King George's Fund for Sailors in 1918-19, forwarded the final balance in hand of the Fund collected in S. Wales amounting to £550. The Council in gratefully acknowledging the receipt of this contribution, which makes a total of £5,750 received from that branch, desire to express their warm thanks to Mr. TAYLOR and the members of the Committee for their successful efforts. In the same month the London Shipping Orchestral Society held a concert in the Kingsway Hall on behalf of the Fund and gave an excellent performance, the Fund subsequently receiving a useful donation as a result. Thanks are due to all those who gave their services on this occasion, and whose musical capabilities deserve greater recognition by the general public than they have received hitherto.

To the Press grateful recognition must here be made of the assistance rendered at all times during the year. The Council cannot estimate the value of the publicity which is invariably accorded to the work of the Fund, and take this opportunity of expressing their warm appreciation.

The Council consider it desirable to draw attention to the Report presented to Parliament in March last by the Departmental Committee appointed by the Home Office on the Supervision of Charities. The Committee were called "to consider and report whether any form of supervision is desirable over collecting charities (that is to say, charities which seek financial support from the public), and if so to make recommendations in the matter." The Committee were appointed in April, 1925, and held a number of meetings and examined a number of witnesses, including a representative of the Fund, hearing a great deal of evidence both for and against the proposal for compulsory registration of all charities. Eventually in their report they do not recommend the institution of any universal system of supervision over collecting charities, and matters will remain as they are.

Though the Council regret that no recommendation has been made which might improve existing conditions, they fully realise the difficulties and appreciate the extreme complexity of the question. Before leaving the matter, however, they take the opportunity of quoting in full one very important paragraph in the Committee's report, which they submit for the earnest consideration of the public generally, and more especially of wealthy and generous-minded persons, who are invited to subscribe largely, or lend their names, to charities of which they know little or nothing.

"Par. 130. Our notice has been called to the carelessness with which people holding prominent positions allow their names to be associated with unsubstantial charities. It cannot be doubted that this practice is exceedingly mischievous, and we have thought it right to consider carefully the question of imposing partial responsibility for the management of the charity in such cases. We have reached the conclusion that action in this direction would be very difficult, but at the same time we take this opportunity of urging that such people should make the most careful enquiries before they allow their names to be used as those of patrons or members of any charitable organisation."

King George's Fund has among its primary objects the distribution of charitable gifts for the sailor to the exemplary Institutions. It can be applied to and made use of by those who, desiring to benefit seamen and their dependents, are in doubt where to place their patronage and donations to serve the best purpose.

The General Council met five times during the year. H.R.H. THE DUKE OF YORK, President, was graciously pleased to preside at the December meeting, and H.R.H. THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT, Chairman,

at those in June and October. One meeting was held at St. James's Palace by the gracious permission of HIS MAJESTY THE KING, and three meetings were held in the Court Room of the Trinity House. The Annual General Meeting, by kind permission of the LORD MAYOR, took place at the Mansion House, Mr. Sheriff H. P. SHEPHERD, in the absence of the Lord Mayor, a Vice-President of the Fund, presiding on that occasion. The General Council again desire to record their gratitude to the ELDER BROTHERS OF THE TRINITY HOUSE for the continued kindness and courtesy which they have extended to the Fund at all times since its inauguration.

Mr. STANLEY MITCALFE, a member from 1917-22, when he resigned. He took a warm interest in all work for the welfare of seafarers, and was active up to the last in efforts on their behalf, and more especially in connection with Seamen's charities in the Tyne district.

Sir JOHN WIMBLE, K.B.E., Hon. Treasurer and Chairman of the Finance Committee. Joining the Council on the inauguration of the Fund he became Chairman of the Finance Committee in 1918, and with his expert knowledge and advice nearly the whole of the investment of the Fund's capital was carried out. Five years later he became one of the two Honorary Treasurers, and was the senior Hon. Treasurer at the time of his decease. He was always ready to give time and attention to the affairs of the Corporation, and his knowledge, ability and experience will be much missed.

The Distribution Committee (under the Chairmanship of Vice-Admiral G. R. MANSELL), the Finance Committee (Chairman, the late Sir JOHN WIMBLE), and the Collecting Committee (Chairman, Captain Sir ARTHUR W. CLARKE), have met at intervals during the year, and the Council desire to thank the members of these Committees for their valuable advice and assistance and for their regular attendance.

DISTRIBUTION.

The number of applications from Marine Benevolent Institutions to participate in the Main Grants of the Fund was 92, and of these 85 were allocated grants. The total grants for the year amounting to £48,250.

INTERIM GRANTS.

These amounted to £5,450, and were mainly devoted to Samaritan and Emergency Funds, administered on behalf of the Fund by a number of old established Societies, where the need is urgent and assistance to which cannot well be deferred until the Main Distribution at the end of the year. Though it was hoped that the urgency of some of these would have died down before this, there is still a call on the Fund from that quarter which requires early attention. The special thanks of the Council are due to all those administering these Samaritan funds free of expense, and for the kindly and yet careful manner in which individual applications are dealt with.

MAIN GRANTS.

These amounted to £40,000, and were allocated to the various old established Institutions and Funds which have received grants in past years. The needs of the large majority of these have shown little change in the last twelve months. It will be observed that generous awards have again been made to the training ships for boys. It is a matter for regret that public support of these has not kept pace with the greatly increased cost of modern education since 1914. The Council again wish to lay stress on the importance of these institutions to the nation from the view of policy. They are not merely charities, but training establishments which in a brief period greatly improve the physical well-being of their inmates and turn out sturdy youths, well suited for the rigours of a sea life, to become the seamen of the future and to maintain the due proportion of the British element in our ships.

H. H. WILLS FUND.

The income accruing from this Trust, amounting to £2,800, was allocated by the Distribution Committee in collaboration with Dame MARY WILLS, D.B.E. This Trust is solely for the benefit of Seamen and Sailors of the Mercantile Marine, and nine institutions or funds, which comply with the terms of the Trust, were made awards. In accordance with what is understood to be the wish of the testator, the greater part of the income has been devoted to the augmentation of pension funds for aged and infirm seamen who have served their country afloat long and faithfully.

The visiting and reporting upon the Institutions which appeal for assistance is a matter to which the Council attach great importance, and they desire to express their indebtedness to the Honorary Visitors of the Fund who voluntarily undertake this special duty. No less than sixty-three of the Institutions and Funds applying for grants during the year have been inspected and reported upon, and the reports received have not only been of material assistance to the Council in allocating their grants, but of considerable interest.

The General Council are open to receive special or urgent applications from Marine Institutions at any time during the year, and they will come up for immediate consideration. On the second Saturday in March an advertisement will be inserted in the Press, inviting applications from Marine Benevolent Institutions desirous of being considered at the Main Distribution of the Fund for the current year. It is desired again to emphasise the fact that the absence of a grant, or the variation in the amount of a grant, to a Marine Benevolent Institution, implies only that the Council, having before them the current circumstances of the case, have decided upon the allocation accordingly.

A MEETING of the GENERAL COUNCIL was held at St. James's Palace on Thursday, December 15th, 1927, at 5 p.m., H.R.H. The DUKE OF YORK, President of the Fund, presided.

After the Minutes of the last meeting had been signed, HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS, the President, gave the following address :—

“ MY LORDS AND GENTLEMEN,

We are meeting again to receive and sanction the annual recommendations of the Distribution Committee and to give our supporters an account of our labours during the year, so that they may know that we have not been resting on our oars.

It is worthy of remark that in July last the Fund, in its forward progress, passed a notable milestone on its journey in completing the tenth year of its existence. Those have been strenuous years of successful endeavour, and in considering them retrospectively we may reasonably congratulate ourselves on having accomplished work of very considerable importance on behalf of the Marine Benevolent Institutions.

At the time this Fund was inaugurated, the Great War was still in progress, and it was evident that when peace ensued, those Institutes and Funds which cared for the Sailor, whether of the Royal Navy or the Merchant Service, and his dependents, in sickness and distress, would be hardly pressed to raise the necessary funds; whilst, concurrently, the demands upon them, as a result of the war, would be exceptionally heavy. It was at this juncture that King George's Fund came into being, and by its means the nautical charities were assisted to stabilise their incomes and to tide over a time of great stress and difficulty.

In addition, the aftermath of the war necessitated the establishment of a number of temporary funds to meet the extraordinary conditions which arose when the Sea Services, after an expansion in personnel quite unprecedented in the history of our country, were reduced to their normal establishment. The necessity for many of the funds is now, I am glad to say, passing away, and some of them have already ceased to be, but the large majority have received generous and timely help at the hands of this Fund.

The Distributions of the Fund in aid of the nautical charities have averaged £50,000 annually up to the present time. The beneficent work of these permanent charities is very widespread, and it is as indispensable as ever. If the generous British public will only continue to support us as they have hitherto, we shall hope to be in a position to do even better than this as time goes on and the work of the Fund is more widely known and appreciated.

It may be an encouragement to those who have not become supporters to know that in May last His MAJESTY THE KING, who gave a magnificent donation to the Fund on its inauguration, graciously signified his intention of becoming an Annual Subscriber of one hundred pounds. May I hope that this Royal example may be as generously followed as individual circumstances will allow."

Commodore the DUKE OF MONTROSE then welcomed HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS, who last presided in 1926, prior to his visit, with H.R.H. THE DUCHESS OF YORK, to Australia and New Zealand. He congratulated the President on the results of the tour and his success as an Empire builder.

The Report of the Distribution Committee was presented by Vice-Admiral GEORGE R. MANSELL, the Chairman; that of the Finance Committee by Sir FREDERICK LEWIS; and that of the Collecting Committee by Commodore Sir RICHARD WILLIAMS-BULKELEY. It was resolved in each case that the Report be received and adopted.

Captain Sir ARTHUR CLARKE, Deputy Chairman, then gave a short statement on the work of the Fund during the year, and moved the election of:—

As Vice-Presidents—

The LORDS MAYOR OF ENGLAND AND WALES and the LORDS PROVOST OF SCOTLAND.

Also a vote of thanks to the Honorary Visitors.

Mr. BUTLER ASPINALL, K.C., seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

EARL FORTESCUE then moved a vote of thanks to HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS for presiding at the meeting, which was seconded by Sir CHARLES PARSONS, and carried with acclamation.

HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS, in his reply, said:—

"MY LORDS AND GENTLEMEN,

I think all I can say is—Thank you. It is always a very great pleasure to me to come here each year and to know that this Fund is getting on extraordinarily well in every way and that it does some good. In these hard times it is nice to be connected with something which is not, as you might say, almost on its beam ends."

The proceedings then terminated.

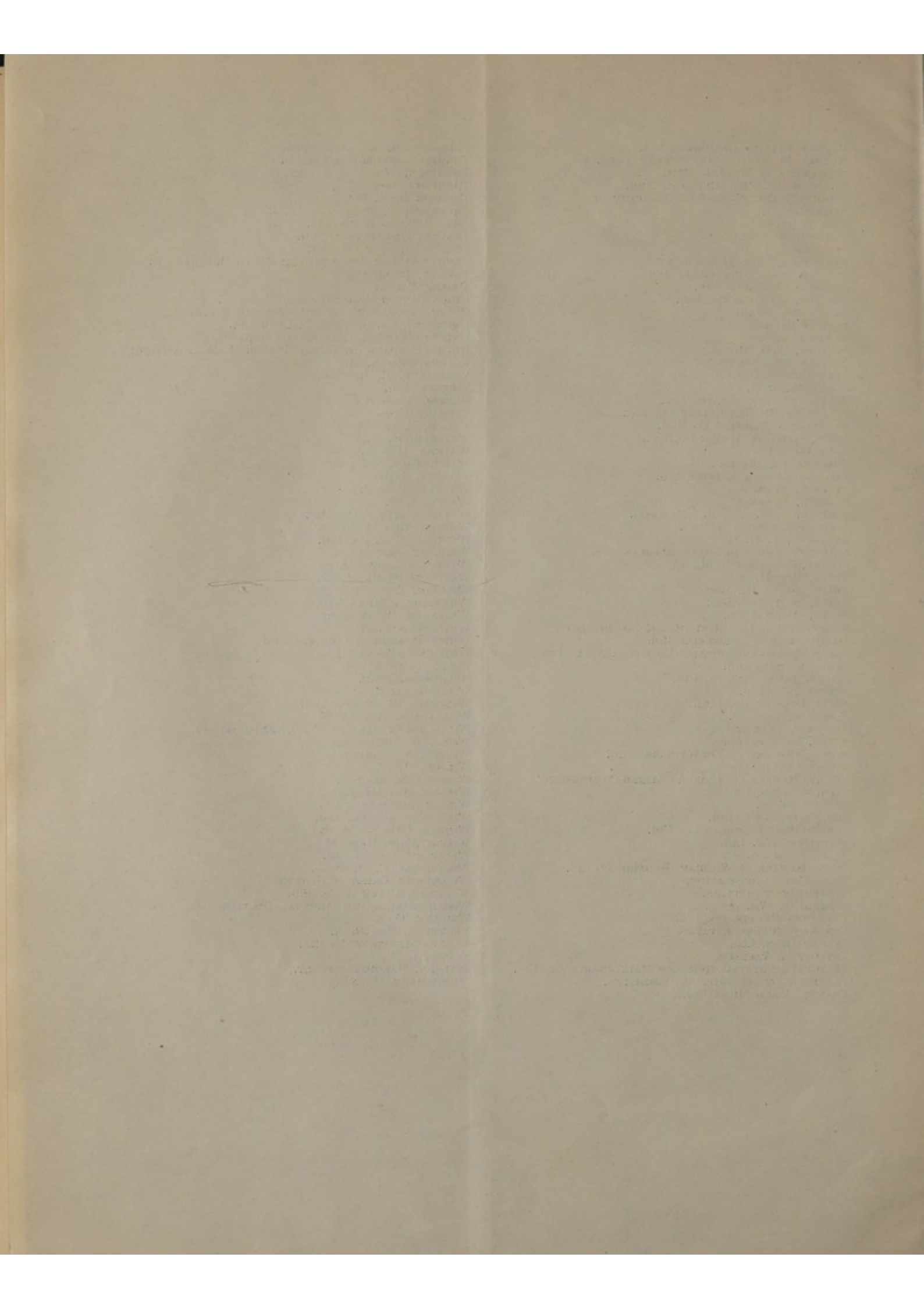

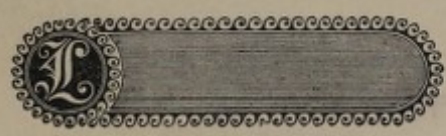

KING GEORGE'S FUND FOR SAILORS.

The object of the Fund is to secure more efficient aid for the Marine Benevolent Institutions throughout the Empire which have done so much for the Mariner in the past, and whose resources have been greatly strained by the calls made upon them in the stress of war.
