



4th. That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to Holford Harrison, Esq., for his services as Treasurer, and that he be requested to continue in office during the ensuing year.

5th. That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to the Physicians and Surgeons of the Infirmary for the able discharge of their arduous duties, and also to the Consulting Physicians and Surgeons.

6th. That the Honorary Physicians, Drs. Bradshaw, Abram and Buchanan; the Honorary Surgeons, Messrs. Paul, Bickersteth and Thomas; the Honorary Gynaecological

Surgeon, Dr. Grimsdale; the Honorary Surgeon to the Lock Department, Dr. Bernard; the Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon, Mr. Bickerton; the Honorary Laryngologist, Dr. Hunt; and the Honorary Dermatologist, Dr. Roberts, be severally re-appointed.

7th. That the Honorary Assistant Physicians, Drs. Hay and Williams; the Honorary Assistant Surgeons, Messrs. Litler-Jones, Kelly and Jeans; and the Honorary Assistant Gynæcological Surgeon, Mr. Blair-Bell, be severally re-appointed.



Report for the Year 1910.

Another year has passed, and it becomes the duty of those to whom the management of the Royal Infirmary is entrusted to submit a report of their proceedings.

In the wards there had been no cessation of the work of relief undertaken and accomplished—it is believed satisfactorily—and in the Out-Patient Department a large number of deserving patients suffering from minor ailments or injuries have been attended to and helped. In this department, one of the most valuable in the Hospital for the class it is designed to treat, the drawbacks from insufficient accommodation and conveniences are increasingly obvious. It is therefore with satisfaction the Committee are able to report that such good progress has been made with the new Out-Patient Building that it is nearing completion, and the formal opening is in sight. Certain details, such as the furnishing, have yet to be thought out, but it is confidently expected the ceremony will be performed by the Earl of Sefton at the end of March. From all points of view, the facilities to be afforded in that building for dealing with cases for which it was specially designed, cannot be over-estimated, whether it be in the interest of the casual sufferers or as a means of study—notably with special departments for Eye, Ear, Nose, Skin, and Women's Diseases, which could not be observed under the same conditions in the wards. The financial position in this connection stands thus: there is a shortage on the building fund of £6,000. Towards this deficiency the Committee are trusting to the gift of £5,000 from the Corporation, and with some confidence that the power will be obtained at as early

a date as possible, and that the citizens will meet the efforts of voluntary supporters of the Hospital in the liberal spirit to which they are surely entitled.

Demands — reasonable demands — for improvements in administration in matters professional and domestic, if they are to maintain their leading position, are constantly being made on the Committee, which involves more expense. The X Ray Department, which is so successful in the treatment of disease and of ascertaining the extent of injuries, and was with difficulty available outside a Hospital—needs revision and extension ; while many other new methods are being discovered and put into use. Bacteriological examinations also are much more in request, for which an extra grant has been made to the University. And, in view of the new Out-Patient Department, some addition to the nursing staff is needed. Changing conditions in that relation have caused the Committee of the Nursing Home to require an additional £500 a year ; still, the £3,500 now paid by the Infirmary compares favourably with the expenditure for that purpose in other Hospitals. It is, therefore, in contemplation to add one or two more of the houses in Ashton-street to the three already occupied by nurses, so that all the night nurses may be placed in the charge of a Superintendent, away from the unavoidable noises of the Hospital—to their greater comfort and better health. Will some benevolent friend give £500 for that most beneficent purpose ?

It has been pointed out in recent reports that the old maintenance fund was nearly exhausted. The fund was instituted in 1890 to aid the additional expense incidental on the opening of the then new building. Donations amounting to £26,050 (including £3,000 for permanent investment) were received, with certain annual contributions. The gifts

were made on the understanding that a tenth part with the annual contributions and the interest on the permanently-invested funds would be devoted to general purposes. The fund has been so well conserved that it has served its purpose for twenty years. It has now come to an end, and the balance with the invested funds has been transferred to the general account. An effort was commenced last year to raise a new maintenance fund, and towards that donations have been received amounting to £14,000. The Committee confidently hope friends will come forward and support this effort to find another £11,000, and make the fund equal to that raised in 1890.

Though there had been many withdrawals, a number of new subscribers have come forward, so that the list reached just over £3,000, and the allotment from the invaluable Hospital Sunday and Saturday Fund was again £3,004 12s. For this generous contribution the Committee tender their warm and appreciative thanks. Legacies were £2,819, and donations £1,510. There is a debt of £166 on the Convalescent fund, for which they beg increased support to enable them to secure for patients the change and fresh air so essential for their more speedy recovery. On the expenditure side increased prices for bread, meat, bacon, and for butter, add up to higher figures ; coal, drugs, dressings, and instruments have also cost more. Apart from Legacies, which for the most part have been invested, the receipts were £16,829, and the expenditure £18,647, resulting in a deficiency of £1,818, which brought the debt to £6,391. Voluntary contributions from 183 persons able to do something towards the cost of maintenance were £296, and inquiries were made into 12,775 cases ; 4,061 patients were treated in the wards, and 23,972 in the Out-Patient Department, which with 54,117 re-attendances, brought the total attendances given in the year to 82,150.

The Committee lament with deep regret the withdrawal by death of two of their esteemed colleagues, Mr. Stanley Rogerson and Mr. John Henderson, whose conspicuous business abilities and sound judgment were of great value to the Hospital. They have elected Mr. C. A. Cain and Mr. A. J. Oakshott to the vacancies.

The Lady Superintendent, Miss Jones, after 17 years service, was selected for a most important and honourable position under the Local Government Board as Inspectress of Poor Law Institutions, and in her place Miss F. B. Cameron, from the Pendlebury Children's Hospital, has been appointed. Miss Ainslie was appointed Assistant Lady Superintendent in July, 1910.





Regulations as to the Private Wards.

- 1.—That the five small single wards in connection with the south-east pavilion shall be set apart for Paying Patients, and for the use of Sick Nurses when so required.
- 2.—That the minimum charge for a Paying Patient shall be three guineas per week, for board, ordinary medicines, attendance and nursing; and one guinea per week for the services of the Resident Medical Officer. Special medicines and extras will be charged for. Higher rates of charge may be made by the Committee having regard to the circumstances of the patient.
- 3.—That if the services of a Special Nurse be required, the same shall be paid for by the Patient at the rate of one guinea and a-half per week.
- 4.—That unless it has been otherwise previously arranged, Patients on admission shall be in the care of the Honorary Physician or Surgeon of the day, who is entitled to charge his usual fees for professional services.
- 5.—That Patients shall not be admitted for a less period than one week.
- 6.—That payments shall be made weekly in advance.
- 7.—That except in emergencies, application for admission shall be made in writing to the Secretary, who will submit the case for the decision of the Committee.
- 8.—That no infectious, chronic, incurable, lunatic, venereal, or otherwise objectionable case shall be admitted.
- 9.—That no Patient shall be allowed to remain in the Institution for a longer period than four weeks, without the special sanction of the Committee.
- 10.—That no one shall be allowed to remain in the Institution who has been inadvertently received, either in regard to the nature of the case or the circumstances of the Patient.
- 11.—That Patients may be visited by their friends any day, including Sunday, between the hours of three and five p.m.
- 12.—That Patients and their visitors must conform in all respects to the prescribed regulations.
- 13.—That no articles of food or drink shall be brought into the Institution without express permission.
- 14.—That the Committee shall have absolute power at any time, without assigning any reason, to put an end to the stay of a Patient in the Infirmary; but in the event of a Patient being required to leave in the middle of a week, a proportionate part of the payment made by a Patient for the current week shall be returned; except in the case of dismissal for misconduct, when no return will be made.

All correspondence relating to the admission of Patients should be addressed to the Secretary in the first instance.

N.B.—Cases of Incurable or Infectious Disease cannot be admitted under any circumstances.

Every Patient (if possible) should come provided with sufficient change of Linen, Soap, Towel and a pair of Slippers.


