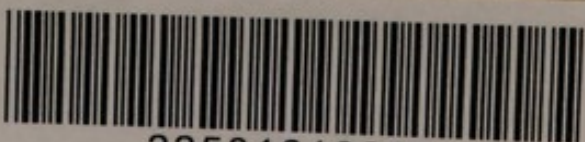

Annual Board.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF TRUSTEES, held in the Board Room of the Institution, on FRIDAY, the 13th March, 1925.

The Treasurer's Report having been read, the following Resolutions were passed :—

1.—That the Accounts for the past year, with the Report, be printed and presented to the Trustees and Subscribers as early as possible.

2.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to Dr. Thomas R. Glynn for filling the Office of President, and for his handsome donation of One Hundred Guineas.

3.—That Sir James P. Reynolds, Bart., be President for the ensuing year.

4.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to Mr. Holford Harrison for his services as Treasurer, and that he be requested to continue in office during the ensuing year.

5.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to the Physicians and Surgeons of the Infirmary for the able discharge of their arduous duties, and also to the Consulting Physicians and Surgeons.

6.—That Bye-Law No. 29 be altered so as to read as follows:—“Except with the express permission of the General Committee no Honorary Officer shall hold an appointment as Physician or Surgeon to any other Charitable Institution, or to a Workhouse or Gaol, or hold any appointment under the Poor Law. Any such permission granted may be withdrawn by the General Committee at any time.

If any candidate for the post of Honorary Officer shall hold any other such appointment as aforesaid, he shall engage to resign that appointment if required to do so by the General Committee within three months from the day of his election, failing which resignation his election shall be void.

7.—That the Meeting of the Trustees desires to record its appreciation of the services of Dr. R. J. M. Buchanan as Honorary Physician for twenty-three years, and of the services of Mr. W. Thelwall Thomas as Honorary Surgeon for thirty-three years, and that they now be appointed Honorary Consulting Physician and Honorary Consulting Surgeon respectively to the Institution.

8.—That the Honorary Physicians, Drs. Hay and Owen; the Honorary Surgeons, Messrs. Litler-Jones and Kelly; the Honorary Gynæcological and Obstetrical Surgeon, Mr. Blair Bell; the Honorary Surgeon to the Lock Department, Mr. Wilson; the Honorary Physician for Tropical Diseases, Dr. Stephens; the Honorary Oculist, Mr. Burroughs; the Honorary Laryngologist, Mr. Guthrie; the Honorary Dermatologist, Dr. MacKenna, the Honorary Radiologist, Mr. R. E. Roberts; the Honorary Assistant Physicians, Drs. Wallace Jones and Bigland; the Honorary Surgeon to Out-Patients, Mr. Woolfenden; the Honorary Assistant Surgeon, Mr. R. Kennon; the Honorary Assistant Physician for Tropical Diseases, Dr. Yorke; the Honorary Assistant Laryngologist, Mr. Forster; be severally re-appointed, and that the following appointments by the Election Committee be confirmed, and the respective Honorary Medical Officers re-appointed:—

Honorary Physician—Dr. J. C. Matthews.

Honorary Assistant Physician—Dr. Henry Cohen.

Honorary Surgeon—Mr. Frank Jeans.

Honorary Assistant Surgeon—Mr. Hamilton Bailey.

9.—That Messrs. H. D. Bateson, J. J. Verdin Cooke, Domingo de Larrinaga, G. H. Melly, Sir Charles A. Nall-Cain, Bart., Rushton Parker, Edward Paul, H. R. Rathbone, Members of the General Committee, who retire by rotation, be severally re-appointed, and that the following Members of the Election Committee who, in accordance with Bye-Law No. 15, retire by rotation, be re-elected, viz.:—Messrs. F. C. Bowring, A. H. Bright, Thomas B. Grimsdale, H. Douglas Horsfall, J. Bruce Ismay, Sir B. S. Johnson, A. S. Mather, J. Arthur Smith.

10.—That the best thanks of the Meeting be given to Dr. Thomas R. Glynn for presiding, and to the Lord Mayor for attending.

Report for the Year 1924.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting the Report for 1924. The work in nearly all departments continues to expand, as the following figures show, and the thanks of Committee and patients are due to the Surgical, Medical and Nursing Staffs for the skill and energy displayed in dealing with such increasing numbers.

During the year a record number of In-patients were admitted to the wards, namely 5069, which is an increase of 289 over the admissions of the previous year. The number of new Out-patients reached a total of 31,191, an increase of 2,075 over the previous year. Out-patient attendances numbered 174,795, in which were included 44,554, in the Orthopædic Department, and 7,943 (200 being for radium treatment) in the Radiological Department. Operations on In-patients totalled 2,420, and 1,584 operations were performed in the Out-patient Department. In the Thornton Ante-Natal Ward 47 births were recorded.

Having in mind the increased number of patients treated, it is satisfactory to note that the total ordinary expenditure for the year shows a reduction of £1,125 as compared with the previous year, reductions being shown under all headings with the exception of provisions, where the increased price of food is reflected in a total increase under this heading of £646.

The ordinary income for the year was £33,769, an increase of £204 over 1923, which at first glance would appear to be satisfactory, yet it is £7,714 less than the ordinary expenditure, and points to the fact that it is to legacies and other precarious and uncertain sources of income that we have to look in order to balance our finance. Although the year under review has yielded more than

the average amount for legacies, the excess of total expenditure over total income for the year was £1,487, and the accumulated deficit on the general maintenance account is therefore raised to £24,210.

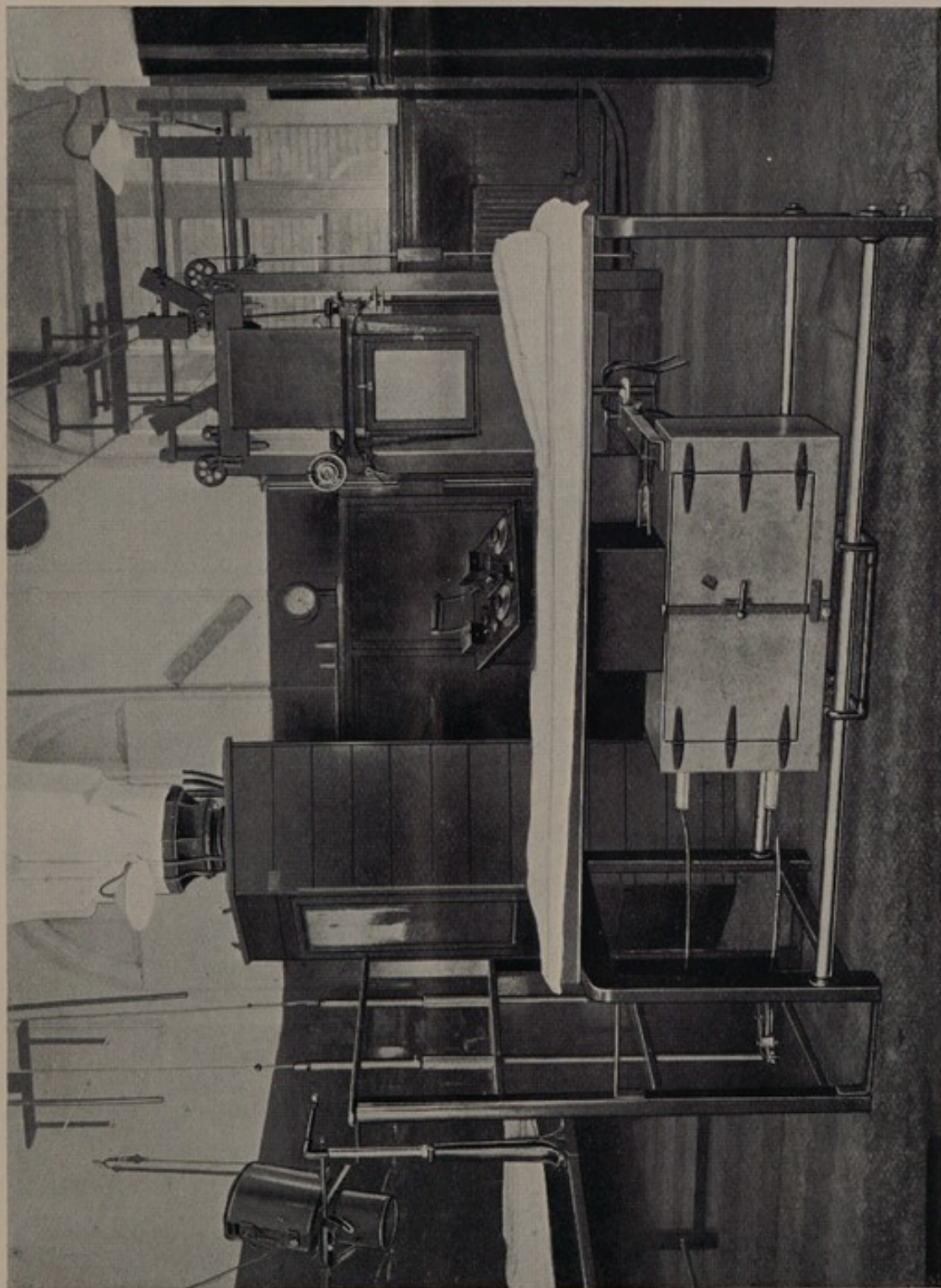

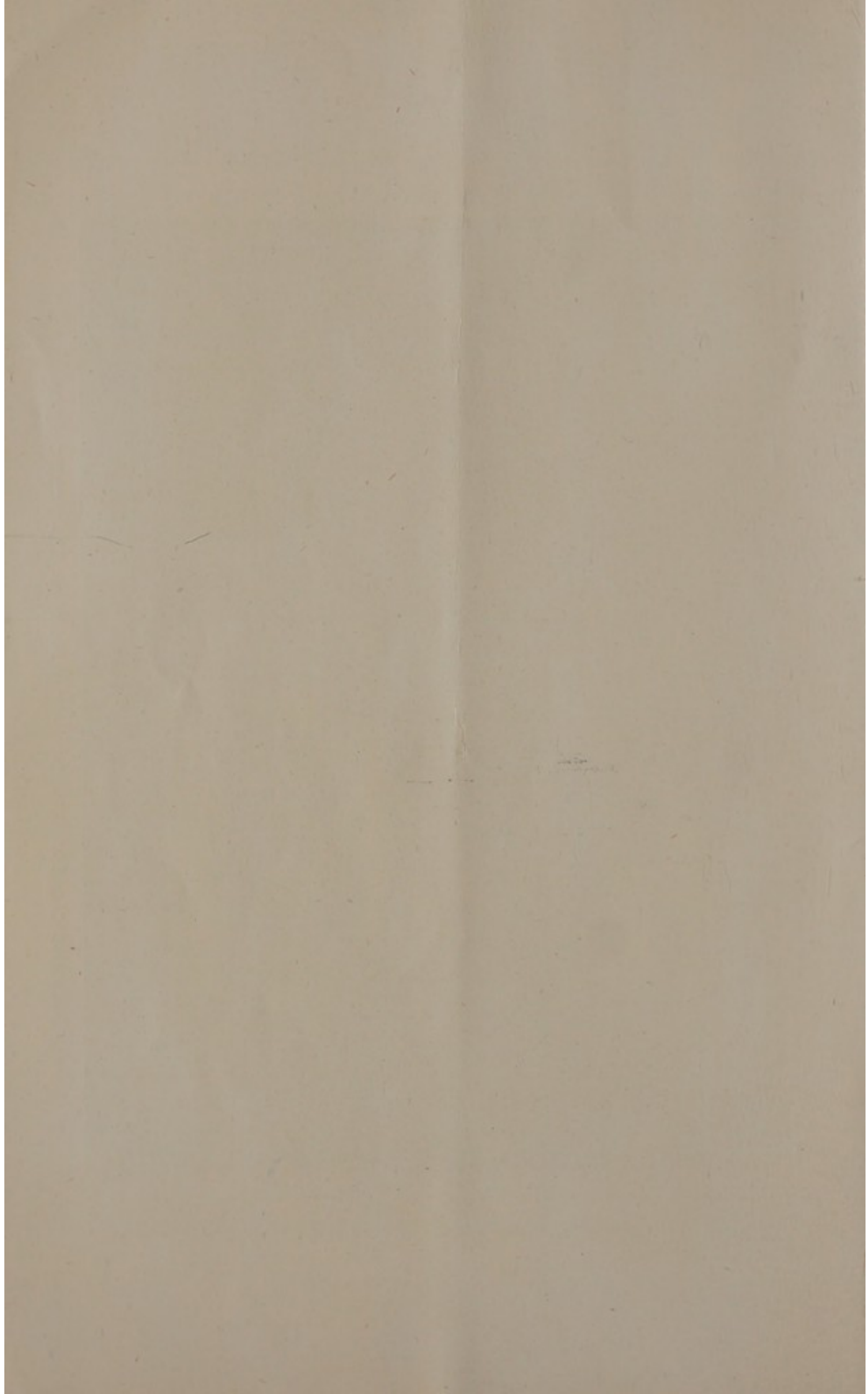

The contributions received this year from the Hospital Saturday and Sunday Fund were £3,600, a decrease of £120 from the previous year's contribution. It is to be regretted that this contribution continues to decrease, and it is to be hoped that something tangible may result from the action the Lord Mayor is taking in connection with a proposed contributory scheme.

The completion of the New Nurses' Home was delayed owing to strikes during the summer. It is a great satisfaction to be able to announce that the New Home was opened by Miss Cummins just before her retirement from the Matronship, 30th December

last, when old and present nurses and their friends met together and had tea in the New Dining Room. The result of the Red Rose Ball, £373, together with an anonymous donation of £750 on the day of opening, enabled us to be able to open the New portion of the Nurses' Home completely free from debt.

Dr. R. J. M. Buchanan, under the age regulation, tendered his resignation during the year. He has been a member of the Staff since 1901. Dr. J. C. Matthews was appointed Honorary Physician to fill this vacancy, and Dr. Henry Cohen as Assistant Physician was elected to fill the vacancy created by Dr. Matthews' promotion. To the regret of all connected with the Hospital, Miss Cummins, who had been Matron since 1911, decided owing to ill-health to retire from active work, and Miss M. Jones, Assistant Matron, was appointed to succeed Miss Cummins and took up her duties from the 1st of January, 1925.

The present X-Ray Department having proved too small for the increased work and installation of new apparatus an appeal was made for extension of this Department and the installation of the Deep Therapy Apparatus, and in response we received the very kind gift of £2,000 from E. F. Callister, Esq., and £500 from an anonymous donor, per Dr. Roberts. These gifts enabled the work to proceed, and it is hoped the new X-Ray Department will be ready for use very shortly.

The Ladies' Linen League still continues its activities, and the Committee are very grateful for the donation of £100 for the purchase of Linen, together with some 1,252 articles to the Hospital during the year by the League.

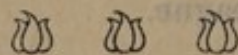
The Committee are glad to record their appreciation of the voluntary services of the Liverpool Personal Service Society in the aftercare of such patients as are needing assistance, and also wish

to express their grateful thanks to Mrs. Winwood Gossage and Alderman A. S. Mather for their good offices in respect of the gift to the Infirmary of the right of nomination in perpetuity to the "William Henry Tate Bed" endowed at the Liverpool Convalescent Home, Woolton, to the memory of the late Sir William Henry Tate, Bart., by whose death the Infirmary lost a very sincere friend.

The Larrinaga Maternity Ward up to the present has been vacant, and it is intended now to furnish the same for the reception of patients. This will involve an expenditure of something like £750 for equipment, besides an additional expense per year for maintenance. This extension of the maternity work throws an extra financial responsibility on the Hospital's resources.

Mr. R. G. Hough, the Corporation's representative on the Committee having resigned, Alderman W. A. Robinson was appointed in his place.

Since the end of the year it is regretted to have to mention that Mr. Thelwall Thomas' connection with the Hospital as Honorary Surgeon has been severed under the operation of the age rule, and the Committee take this opportunity of tendering to him their high appreciation of his services to the Hospital for 33 years.

Annual Report for 1924.

There is very little of special note to refer to in the general working of the Training School and Home for Nurses, except perhaps to draw attention to the fact that the receipts from private nursing again show a decrease from the preceding year. This may once again be explained by the fact that we had fewer fourth year nurses available for the private Nursing Staff, some taking advantage of the new conditions of later years, whereby those who have had previous experience in other Hospitals are allowed the privilege of leaving at the end of their third year. The receipts and expenditure account, except as mentioned above, shows little, if any, alteration from the preceding year.

The outstanding feature of 1924 has been the opening, on the very last day of the period under review, of the first Wing of the New Nurses' Home. It seemed to your Committee fitting and proper that the Matron, Miss Margaret Cummins, who had been so closely associated with the idea of the new Home since its commencement, should herself perform the opening ceremony. The Home is worthy to rank with the best in the kingdom, all the most modern and up-to-date appliances both for comfort and labour-saving having been brought into use. Special attention has been directed to the amenities of the nurses' rooms, which are furnished on the lines of a real home rather than an Institution.

It is naturally regrettable that financial conditions only allowed the Committee to undertake one-third of the contemplated building, but we confidently look to the many thousands who have benefitted by their stay in the Infirmary, as well as to those citizens of Liverpool who are better endowed with this world's goods, to come forward with donations that will enable, at least, the second portion of the work to be started without undue delay.

As we pointed out in last year's report in speaking of the Home, we could think of no better way of perpetuating the memory of a person or family than by the contribution of a sum specially earmarked for the construction of a portion of the second wing. The work cannot be started until we have at least £15,000 to £20,000 in hand, but this—even in days when

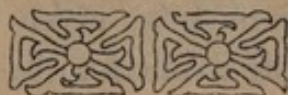
demands are many—should not be impossible when one thinks of the claims that the Nursing Profession in general and the Royal Home in particular—from where, in the provinces, was started the modern method of Nursing—have on the pockets of the public in Liverpool and, indeed, on the whole of the County Palatine of Lancashire.

Before concluding we wish to place on record the splendid work of our late Matron, Miss Margaret Cummins.

Although this Report only covers the period to 31st December, 1924, up to which date she was still in office, yet knowing it will not reach our subscribers until the early days of 1925, we are taking the opportunity of incorporating our appreciation in our Annual Report. During the whole period of her occupation of the position of Matron, extending over 13 years, by her devotion to duty, her single-mindedness in all things that were for the benefit of patients and nurses, and by her resolute insistence on the very highest standard of nursing being maintained by those under her control, she has brought the very greatest credit to the Royal Infirmary, and has left behind a tradition of the highest order. We wish her well in her retirement, and trust that for many years she will enjoy the best of health in the leisure that has been so well earned.

To Sister Mary Jones, our new Matron, who took over office on the 1st of January, we extend a hearty welcome, knowing full well that the work will in no way suffer in her capable hands.

Once again we ask those who read this Report to do what they can to assist us in securing funds for the continuance of the building of the New Nurses' Home.



Matron's Report for 1924.

Applications, both in number and standard, varied little from the previous year. Twenty-nine Probationers entered, of whom five left, either for reasons of health or unsuitability.

Twenty-three Nurses finished their third year, of whom seven are Staff Nurses in special departments, the remainder on the Private Staff.

Eighteen Nurses completed their fourth year certificated, and left (with the exception of one who asked to return on our own Private Staff), one to become Sister at the Sick Children's Hospital, Aberdeen, two Sisters at St. Helens Hospital, three to take the C.M.B. Certificate, two to commence a Nursing Home in Rhodesia, and a Senior Nurse after thirty-nine years' service left pensioned. The remainder to do Private Nursing elsewhere.

One Sister left, the vacancy being filled by the return of a Sister who did holiday duty during the summer.

Examinations.—Mr. Russell-Howard examined the Senior Nurses both written and viva voce, and Miss Wolseley-Lewis in Practical Nursing and Bandaging. There were two failures. The Prize-giving, combined with the Annual Meeting of the Linen League, was a great success. Keen interest was shewn by the Nursing Staff as to who were to be the possessors of the beautiful gold and silver medals—given for the first time. Mr. Wade Deacon declared the winners to be—

Gold Medalist—Nurse Dorothy Jackson.

Silver Medalist—Nurse Doris Prime.

On the whole the health of the Nursing Staff has been good.

The weather was kind for our Annual Tennis Tournament, Sister Durant and Dr. Hawe proved to be the winners, and Nurse Lockhart and Dr. Shrewsbury for Ward VI. the runners up. The Cup has adorned the Study in the Nurses' Home, because a suitable corner was not available in the Orthopædic Department.

On December 30th the first wing of the New Home was an accomplished thing. Our pride was very great to see Matron opening its door with a presentation golden key, for we all knew how hard she had worked for it. To see it built, and herself to have the honour of opening it, must have given her great pleasure. The Day was not without its "other side"—it was Matron's last day on duty, and at the meeting held earlier in the Larrinaga Ward she accepted from her past and present Nursing Staff—as a remembrance of appreciation for all she had done for us, and an expression of good wishes for her future—two Bokara Rugs, a cheque, and a mauve and cream vellum book containing our names, artistically done by the Liverpool School of Art. At the same time Mr. Wade Deacon presented to Matron, on behalf of the General Committee and Medical Board, a beautiful case of plate and a cheque.
