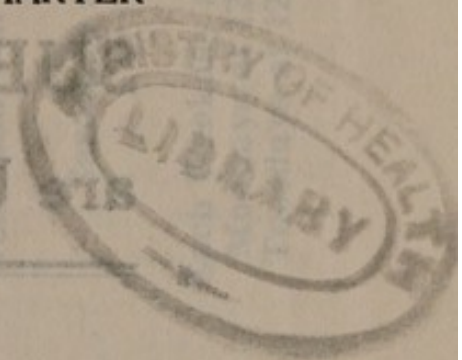

ANNUAL BOARD.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF TRUSTEES, held in the Board Room of the Institution, on Tuesday, the 31st March, 1931.

The Treasurer's Report having been read, the following Resolutions were passed :—

1.—That the Accounts for the past year, with the Report, be printed and presented to the Trustees and Subscribers as early as possible.

2.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to Mr. Walter Harding for filling the Office of President, and for his handsome donation of One Hundred Guineas.

3.—That Emeritus Professor J. Hill Abram, M.D., F.R.C.P., be President for the ensuing year.

4.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to Mr. Holford Harrison for his services as Treasurer, and that he be requested to continue in office during the ensuing year.

5.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to the Honorary Physicians and Surgeons of the Infirmary for the able discharge of their arduous duties, and also to the Consulting Physicians and Surgeons; that the following be severally re-appointed :—

The Honorary Physicians, Drs. Hay, Matthews, and Wallace Jones, the Honorary Surgeons, Messrs. Kelly, Jeans and Woolfenden, the Honorary Gynaecological and Obstetrical Surgeon, Mr. Blair Bell, the Honorary Physician for Tropical Diseases, Professor Warrington Yorke, the Honorary Oculist, Mr. Burroughs, the Honorary Radiologist, Mr. Roberts, the Honorary Laryngologist, Mr. H. V. Forster, the Honorary Physician to Out-patients, Dr. Bigland, the Honorary Assistant Physicians, Drs. Cohen and Coope, the Honorary Surgeon to Out-patients, Mr. Kennon, the Honorary Assistant Surgeons, Messrs. Reid and Nuttall, the Honorary Assistant Gynaecological and Obstetrical Surgeon, Mr. St. George Wilson, the Additional Honorary Assistant Gynaecological and Obstetrical Surgeon, Mr. Herd, the Honorary Assistant Orthopaedic Surgeon, Mr.

Watson Jones, the Honorary Assistant Laryngologist, Mr. John Roberts, the Honorary Assistant Physician to the Department of Psychological Medicine, Dr. Barton Hall, and that the following appointments by the Election Committee be confirmed and the Honorary Medical Officers re-appointed.

6.—That this Meeting of the Trustees desires to record its appreciation of the services of Dr. A. J. O'Leary as Honorary Anaesthetist for 26 years, and Dr. Walter Ramsden as Honorary Chemical Pathologist for 15 years, and that they now be appointed Honorary Consulting Anaesthetist, and Honorary Consulting Chemical Pathologist respectively to the Institution.

7.—That Messrs. William L. Bateson, J. J. Verdin Cooke, Domingo de Larrinaga, Rushton Parker, W. A. Rushton, members of the General Committee who retire by rotation, be severally re-appointed, and that the following members of the Election Committee, who, in accordance with By-Law No. 15 retire by rotation, be re-elected, viz: J. Hill Abram, Sir James Barr, T. R. Glynn, S. Mason Hutchinson, T. C. Litler Jones, Sir James P. Reynolds.

8.—That the best thanks of the Meeting be given to Mr. Walter Harding for presiding, and to the Lord Mayor for attending.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1930.

Again, as in the seven preceding years, a record has been established in the number of In-patients admitted.

In 1930 the number of such patients admitted to the Wards was 6,850, which is an increase of 98 over the number admitted during 1929.

Although this may not appear to be very substantial, it is in fact a remarkable achievement, having in mind that the number of beds has remained at the same total for the past five years, during which same period the In-patient admissions have increased by no less than 18%. It would seem however, that the peak has now been reached.

The average number of days resident of each In-patient was reduced to 15.25.

In addition to the number of In-patients admitted, there were 437 births in the Maternity Ward, which is an increase of 70 over the previous year.

The number of new Out-patients registered in 1930 totalled 51,267. This is a substantial increase over the previous year, but inasmuch as the method of recording has been altered to come into line with the uniform system, the comparable figures are not available.

The number of operations performed on In-patients was 3,441, and there were 3,010 operations in the Out-patient Department.

The foregoing figures are striking evidence of the energy, skill and devotion displayed by the respective staffs of the Hospital, and the Committee records its high appreciation of those services.

The total income for the year amounted to £51,925, and whilst this is £788 more than the receipts for 1929, yet it is £2,646 less than the total expenditure for the year, which was £54,572.

Extraordinary expenditure, which was mainly due to the overhauling of the Heating and Hot Water Installation, and the provision of a new Film Store, amounted to £1,687.

The accumulated deficit on the General Account has now reached the distracting total of £35,805.

Free legacies amounting to £2,225 3s. 4d. were received during the year, and the following donations of £200 and upwards are gratefully acknowledged :—

The Committee also renews its expression of gratitude to the Prudential Assurance Company for the subscription towards the maintenance of beds.

Excellent progress has been made with the building of the second portion of the Nurses' New Home, and it is anticipated that the Home will be ready for occupation towards the end of 1931.

The Committee is glad to report that legacies to the Nurses' Home Building Fund of :—

£5,000 from the Trustees of the late Mr. Alexander Elder ;
and £2,000 from the late Mr. John Rankin,
have been received during the year, and also records its grateful thanks for the donations of :—

£400 from the Guild of Undergraduates, Liverpool University ;
and £200 from the Bernhard Baron Charitable Trust,
towards this Fund. It would point out however, that a sum of £25,000 is still required to pay for this second instalment, and a still further sum of £23,000 is needed for the completion of the third and final portion of the New Home.

The Committee makes an urgent appeal for contributions to this Fund.

To meet the increased demand for beds as evidenced by the long waiting list, the Committee have recognised for some time the necessity for providing more beds, but until the Nurses' New Home was completed and paid for, they could not consider any other financial responsibility. However, quite recently the Vice-Chancellor of the University received a communication from the Liverpool Hospital Staffs Association, asking for more co-ordination among Hospitals, and better facilities for the training of Medical Students. The Vice-Chancellor consulted the representatives of various hospitals, with others interested, and now this Committee has received from its Medical Board a suggestion that a further 150 beds should be provided to relieve the congestion. This can no doubt be done by adding two floors on the present blocks of the Hospital, and would include beds for the special departments and private paying wards for patients of moderate means. Another suggestion is to build on land close to the Hospital. A scheme covering the demand for increased accommodation is now being prepared. The idea is excellent, but where are the funds to build to come from?

During the year the Committee has entered into an agreement with the National Radium Commission for the establishment of a Radium Centre for Liverpool at the Royal Infirmary, and this is being worked in conjunction with the University. It is anticipated that the cost in connection with this Centre, may entail an expenditure approximating to £1,000 per annum.

A department of Psychological Medicine has also been instituted during the year.

It is with great regret that the Committee record the deaths of:—

Mr. Herbert Rathbone, who had been a member of the Committee since 1897;

Mr. G. H. Pilkington, who had been a member since 1908; and Mr. T. Barrett Bicket, who had been a member since 1926, and hereby records its appreciation of their services.

It is also regretted to have to report the deaths of:—

Dr. R. W. MacKenna, who had been Honorary Dermatologist at the Hospital since 1920; and

Dr. Phoebe Bigland, who had been a member of the Medical Staff since 1917.

Each had rendered devoted service to the Hospital in their respective spheres.

Dr. A. J. O'Leary, who had given devoted service to the Hospital as Honorary Anaesthetist for 26 years, has resigned his appointment, and is recommended to the Trustees for appointment as Honorary Consulting Anaesthetist.

Dr. Elizabeth Hunt resigned from the appointment of Medical Officer in charge of the Actino Therapeutic Department, and appreciation of her services is hereby recorded.

The following appointments on the Honorary Medical Staff have been made during the year :—

Dr. R. Stopford-Taylor as Honorary Dermatologist in place of Dr. R. W. MacKenna, deceased.

Dr. A. O. Ross, Honorary Surgeon to the Lock Department in place of Dr. R. Stopford-Taylor.

Dr. S. Barton Hall, as Honorary Assistant Physician to the Department of Psychological Medicine.

The Committee renews its gratitude to the Red Rose Ball Committee, for a contribution of £369 to the Nurses' Home Building Fund.

The Ladies' Linen League contributed 2,772 articles and £145 during the year, and the Committee are most grateful for this most substantial and continued help from the League.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1930.

The year under review has been particularly noticeable for the gradual completion of the second portion of the Nurses' New Home, and as anticipated in our previous Report, we are glad to announce that it will be ready for occupation in the Autumn of 1931. There will still be the third and final portion waiting to be completed, but as the debt remaining at present amounts to nearly £25,000, it is obvious that however desirable the completion of the final block may be, it will have to wait until we have satisfactorily dealt with the debit now outstanding. It is however, gratifying to know that our Nursing Staff will shortly be housed in what we can fairly claim to be one of the finest Homes in the Kingdom, and indeed it is only right that it should be, seeing that our original Nursing Home, attached to the Infirmary, was the birthplace of the system of one of the branches of modern nursing.

The Preliminary Training School has given further evidence during the past year of its great value in securing for potential nurses a working knowledge of what is required of them before they actually enter into the daily life of the Wards. The Matron will be pleased to welcome any visitors who may wish to see this School, especially those who may contemplate entering the Nursing Profession, or who may have relatives desirous of so doing.

From the financial side, the net sum debited to the General Account of the Royal Infirmary has increased by £339, this being brought about primarily by a sharp falling off in the receipts from Private Nursing, due doubtless to a variety of causes, one of which we may hope was the improved health of Citizens during the year 1930.

It is pleasing to record that the high standard of efficiency of the Nursing Staff is fully maintained, and that notwithstanding the increasing technical knowledge required in the Final Hospital Examinations conducted by outside examiners, all of the nurses

who entered passed. We congratulate the Matron on this result, and at the same time, thank our Honorary Medical Staff who devote many hours during the year in placing their wide range of knowledge at the disposal of the Nurses through the medium of carefully considered and instructive Lectures.

With the new and ever increasing demand for fully trained members of the Nursing Profession in one or other departments of the Public Health Services of the Country, and the knowledge that certificates of success at the "Royal" is known to be of value to applicants for any such post, we would draw the attention of parents or Heads of Schools to the possibilities of the Profession as being a career in every way worthy of being brought to the notice of those under their charge.

Once again the Committee would like to place on record their grateful thanks to the Matron for the valuable services she renders in this most important adjunct of the general work of the Hospital.

MATRONS' REPORT FOR 1930.

Thirty-three Candidates entered the Preliminary Training School and passed on to the Hospital.

Thirty-five Probationers entered during the year, out of whom two left for reasons of health.

Thirty-one Nurses completed three years training, and were placed either on the Private Staff or to fill vacancies as Charge Nurses in the Special Departments of the Hospital.

Twenty-seven Nurses completed four years training and left. One was appointed Sister at the Cumberland Infirmary, Carlisle; one—Sister at the General Hospital, Macclesfield; one—Sister at North Lonsdale Hospital; one—Theatre Sister at the Infirmary, Leigh; one—Sister at the Liverpool Open Air Hospital, Leasowe; two—Sisters at the Royal Liverpool Children's Hospital, Liverpool; one—X-Ray Charge Nurse at the Royal Infirmary, Perth; one to subsequently take up Missionary Work in China; four to do Private Nursing; fourteen to fill vacancies in Thornton Ward, and all were successful in gaining the C.M.B. Certificate.

To our great regret Sister Bowden left the Out-patient Department, for home reasons. She was replaced by Sister Staveley from Ward IX, and that vacancy was filled by Sister Walker who had been Junior Home Sister for two years.

There were no failures in the Hospital Final Examinations. Miss Wolseley Lewis and Mr. Russell-Howard were the Examiners.

The Annual Meeting of the Linen League and Nurses Prize-giving has now become a big function. The Hall of the Orthopaedic Department was filled to its utmost capacity with an enthusiastic audience. The Lady Mayoress of Liverpool (Mrs. Lawrence Holt), took the Chair, and with her usual charm presented the Gold Medal to Nurse Egerton, and the Silver Medal to Nurse Pritchard, for

gaining the highest number of marks in the Hospital Final Examinations. Special Book Prizes for the Examination in Hygiene, were given to Nurse Wilson, Nurse Kathleen Smith, Nurse Tegla Davies, Nurse Cook, and Nurse Dams.

The Annual Meeting of the College of Nursing was held in Liverpool (for the first time) in May, and proved to be a great success. A great effort was made during the year to complete the Endowment Fund of the College of Nursing to £100,000. Her Majesty the Queen received Purse at Headquarters, May 30th, and Nurse Ida Mansbridge had the honour of presenting a Purse containing £388 14s. 6d. on behalf of the Training School of this Hospital.

After exciting play we were again fortunate in winning the Walter Harding Cup for Tennis (for the Hospitals of Liverpool and District) for the third time; the finals taking place at the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board Courts at Aigburth.

Our own homely Tennis Tournament was enjoyed as usual, the Cup being well won for the Nurses' Home by Nurse Bradley and Mr. Rutter.

The second portion of the Nurses' New Home is making rapid progress, and we look forward to its opening in the Autumn.

The Twelfth Annual Report of the Royal Infirmary Linen League was read and passed at the Annual Meeting on SATURDAY, 29th March, 1930, the LADY MAYORESS in the Chair.

Subscriptions and Donations amounted to £161 0s. 6d., of which £145 was handed to the Hospital for the purchase of Linen.

A Show of Linen contributed by the Vice-Presidents and Associates was held in the Out-patients' Department. It was significant of the interest taken in the Hospital that the quality of the Linen was excellent, while in quantity it exceeded that sent in the previous year by 234 pieces, the total number received being 2,772.

The Membership has risen steadily and this year again we have three new Vice-Presidents. There is an increase of new Associates in almost every group and this we owe to the splendid work of the Vice-Presidents and also to those Associates who have helped by enlisting their friends. Our Membership last year amounted to 1,065, while this year we have 96 new members, making a total of 1,161.

The Royal Infirmary Linen League has lost a very valuable and devoted friend in the late Mrs. DOVEY. She was a leading voluntary worker for many years on behalf of the Liverpool Hospitals and had been a Vice-President of the Royal Infirmary Linen League since 1927.
