

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF TRUSTEES, held in the
The Board Room of the Institution, on Tuesday, the 5th
April, 1932.

The Treasurer's Report having been read, the following
Resolutions were passed:—

possible.

of President, and for his handsome donation of One Hundred
Guineas.

3.—That Sir Charles Nall-Cain, Bart., be President for the
ensuing year.

4.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to Mr.
Holford Harrison for his services as Treasurer, and that he be
requested to continue in office during the ensuing year.

5.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to the Hon-
orary Physicians and Surgeons of the Infirmary for the able
discharge of their arduous duties, and also to the Consulting
Physicians and Surgeons; that the following be severally re-

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1931.

During the year 6,413 patients were admitted to the Wards. This is a decrease of 437 as compared with the previous year, but bearing in mind that the number of beds is unchanged, and the fact that for the preceding eight years records in the number of admissions have been established, the reduction is not unexpected.

In addition to the number of in-patients admitted there were 459 births in the Maternity Ward which is an increase of 22 over the previous year.

The average number of days resident of each in-patient was 16.

The number of new out-patients registered during the year amounted to 50,187, and the out-patient attendances recorded totalled 205,613, comprising the following:—

The number of operations performed on in-patients was 3,441 and there were also 4,503 operations performed in the out-patient Department.

From these figures it will be seen that the activities of the respective Staffs have been maintained on a very high standard, and the Committee would take this opportunity of recording its high appreciation of the skill and devotion displayed.

The total income from all sources for the Maintenance Account amounted to £49,733, and the total expenditure for the year was £52,018 showing a deficit for the year of £2,244 11s. 1d.

It is disappointing to put on record that the receipts from the Merseyside Hospitals Council were only £11,880, showing a reduction of £4,090 as compared with 1930. If the previous year's contribution had been maintained, which was reasonable to expect, especially having in mind that the cost to the Hospital of "1d. in the £" Scheme contributors and their dependants amounted to £18,811, the year's accounts would have shown a very favourable aspect.

Much has been said in the Press and elsewhere about the Liverpool Hospitals being extravagant, but as far as this Hospital is concerned very careful watch is kept over the expenditure, and it is pleasing to note that for the year under review the average cost per week per patient has been reduced to £2 14s. 3½d. as compared with £2 15s. 10½d. for 1930, and the total expenditure for the year shows a reduction of £2,830 compared with the previous year.

The accumulated deficit on the General Account has now reached a total of £38,050.

Free Legacies amounting to £4,450 4s. 3d. (see page 33) were received during the year, and the following donations of £200 and upwards are gratefully acknowledged:—

The Committee again records its keen appreciation of the subscription of the Prudential Assurance Company towards the maintenance of beds, but regrets that for two successive years it is noticeable they are unable to record any contributions for the endowment of beds, and would bring to notice this most useful way of perpetuating the memory of a relative or friend. At the moment there are 64 Beds or Cots endowed in the Hospital.

The Committee is most grateful to the Trustees of the late Mr. John Rankin for a contribution of £2,500 to the Capital Maintenance Fund.

It is pleasing to report that the second portion of the Nurses' New Home is now in occupation, and the Countess of Derby formally opened the Building on December 12th, 1931.

The cost of the second portion of the Home amounted to £59,000 and whilst all available funds have been utilised for this building, and many kind gifts of money and furnishings have been received, we are faced with a deficit of £9,000 on this building account, for which at present there are no funds to meet it.

The opening of the New Home leaves the site of the old building available for utilisation, and it has been the desire of the Committee that the site should be used in the provision of additional beds, probably for paying patients.

It will, of course, be understood from frequent letters and reports mentioned in the Press, that most Hospitals are short of funds, and such is the state with us, but if the necessary capital were available the Committee would seriously consider putting the site of the old building to use as previously indicated.

The Committee places on record its extreme pleasure that the honour of Knighthood has been conferred upon Sir Henry Wade Deacon, who has been Chairman of the Committee since 1912. It regrets that for the past few months he has been in ill-health but hopes he will soon be able to resume his duties.

It is with great regret that the Committee records the deaths of Dr. T. R. Glynn, who had been Honorary Physician to the Infirmary from 1871 to 1901 and Consulting Physician since 1901, and Mr. Rushton Parker who had been Honorary Surgeon from 1877 to 1907 and Consulting Surgeon since 1907.

Mr. W. Blair Bell, who has given devoted service to the Hospital as Honorary Gynæcological and Obstetrical Surgeon since 1905, has resigned his appointment, and is recommended to the

Trustees for appointment as Honorary Consulting Gynæcological and Obstetrical Surgeon.

Dr. E. E. Prebble, found it necessary to relinquish the post of Honorary Anæsthetist which he had held since 1929.

The following appointments on the Honorary Medical Staff have been made during the year :—

Mr. J. St. George Wilson as Honorary Gynæcological and Obstetrical Surgeon in place of Mr. W. Blair Bell.

Dr. S. Hesselberg, as Honorary Anæsthetist.

The Rev. R. Clayton, who had been Chaplain since 1925, resigned on his acceptance of a living at Coventry, and has been succeeded in the Chaplaincy by the Ven. Archdeacon G. J. Howson.

The Committee regrets to record the death of Mr. P. H. Marsden who had been Pharmacist to the Infirmary since 1895. He has been succeeded by Mr. B. Whalley.

Mr. Percy G. Davies has been elected a member of the General Committee, and Mr. J. J. Verdin Cooke has resigned from the Committee in consequence of his leaving to reside in the South of England.

The Committee again takes pleasure in recording its thanks to the Red Rose Ball Committee for a contribution of £482 to the Nurses' Home Building Fund.

The Ladies' Linen League goes on from strength to strength and during the year contributed 3,118 articles and £145. The Committee takes great pleasure in recording its gratitude for this most effective and continued help.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1931.

The year under review is principally noticeable for the fact that the second portion of the New Nurses' Home was completed and formally opened in December by the Countess of Derby. This further extension enables us to move the whole of our Nursing Staff and maids to the new Home, and the old quarters in Ashton Street are now entirely vacated. It is with the very greatest pleasure that the Committee are thus able to bring to realization their long cherished idea that the surroundings and general amenities enjoyed by those who help to minister to patients committed to the care of the Infirmary should be the best that can be afforded. In the New Home the cultural side of life is not overlooked, and a library replete with all the best literature is one of its features, as also writing and recreation rooms where peace and quiet can be secured in off duty time. The private rooms of the Sisters and Nurses have been planned with an eye to the comfort and dignity of surroundings and with the intention that in every way this should be in truth our Nurses' Home. We pay tribute to the work of our architect, Mr. E. B. Kirby, in having produced a building worthy of the city and of those who will occupy it. And he has, in addition, in the closest collaboration with the Matron, been extraordinarily helpful in securing, within the limits of our finances, many detail amenities that otherwise we might not have had. We also wish to place on record the valuable help we received towards beautifying the Home from the late Mr. George Audley who presented many pictures from his own personal collection. Mr. John Collier to mark his appreciation of the care he received whilst temporarily in a private ward of the Royal has supplied a beautiful library fitment.

We cannot close the report without once again recording our indebtedness to the Matron, Miss Mary Jones, for her untiring efforts towards perfecting every branch of the work of her department. The Preliminary Training School which she inaugurated is now in full being and the results achieved therefrom have been a great asset in securing that continuity of high nursing skill that has long been a feature of the Royal.

We would, in conclusion, draw the attention of our supporters to the fact that there is still a debt of £10,000 on the completed portion of the Nurses' Home, and that the third and final section has yet to be built. We cordially invite donations in large or small amounts towards the liquidation of the debt.

MATRON'S REPORT FOR 1931.

Thirty-two Candidates entered the Preliminary Training School, and, with the exception of one, passed on to the Hospital. Four Probationers left during the first year.

Nineteen Nurses completed three years' training, two left (being a three years' engagement) one was appointed Night Sister at the Royal Liverpool Babies' Hospital, Woolton, the other a Sister at the Royal Liverpool Children's Hospital, Myrtle Street.

Thirty Nurses completed four years' training and left, and were subsequently appointed:—one, Night Sister, Victoria Hospital, Accrington; one, Sister at the Beverley Hospital, Yorkshire; one, Sister at the Pontypool Hospital; one, Sister at the Royal Liverpool Children's Hospital, Heswall; one, Theatre Sister at the Royal Infirmary, Chester; one, Sister at the Royal Hospital, Wolverhampton; one, Welfare Sister at Messrs. Bryant & May's Factory; one, Staff Nurse at Forbes Fraser Hospital, Bath; one, Staff Nurse at Bury Infirmary; seven to do private Nursing, and fourteen to fill vacancies in Thornton to prepare for taking the Central Midwives Board Certificate.

Sister Griffen was appointed second Home Sister in the Nurses' Home. She was replaced in Clarence by Sister Beardsworth from Ward XII, and that vacancy was filled by Sister Laura Jones, the Gold Medallist for 1929.

Sister Mawdsley resigned from Ward I, and was replaced by Sister Davies from Ward V. Sister Mellor, who had been a Staff Nurse in Thornton, was promoted to fill this vacancy.

Sister Middleton was transferred to Ward X to replace Sister Belton, who had taken up Public Health work, and Sister Preston, the Gold Medallist for 1930, was appointed Sister of Larrinaga Ward.

The increase of Senior Nurses in the Wards has been most helpful, not only in the work of the Wards, but in enabling additional time off duty to be given to both day and night Nursing Staffs.

Miss Wolseley Lewis and Mr. Russell Howard were the Examiners in our own Nurses' final examinations; there were no failures.

The Nurses Prize-giving and Annual Meeting of the Linen League was a great success, and it was gratifying to note the steady increase in both membership and interest in the League during these difficult times. The Lady Mayoress (Mrs. Edwin Thompson) took the Chair, and her pleasure was evident when presenting the Gold Medal to Nurse Myra Jones, and the Silver Medal to Nurse Kershaw.

Special book prizes for the Examination in Hygiene were awarded to Nurse Kniveton, Nurse Farrer-Taylor, Nurse Armstrong, Nurse Dalgarno, and Nurse Amy Taylor.

Our Tennis Team was in the final for the Walter Harding Cup, but this year, in contrast to the three previous years, they had to be content with being the runners up.

Great interest was taken in our Tennis Tournament, and the play throughout was good. The Cup was won for Ward IX by Nurse Knapp and Mr. Causey, and was kindly presented to the winners by Lady Rushton.

The great event of the year took place on Saturday, December 12th, when the Countess of Derby graciously opened the second and largest portion of our beautiful new Home for Nurses. The opening Ceremony took place in the Out-patient Hall, and from references made by some of the Speakers, we were reminded of the great work of our pioneers, which made us even more proud of the great traditions of our Training School.

To our great regret Sir Henry Wade Deacon was unable to be present owing to illness.

ANNUAL REPORT.

The Thirteenth Annual Report of the Royal Infirmary Linen League was read and passed at the Annual Meeting on SATURDAY, 18th April, 1931, the LADY MAYORESS in the Chair.

Subscriptions amounted to £166 18s. 0d., of which £145 was handed to the Hospital for the purchase of Linen.

A Show of Linen contributed by the Vice-Presidents and Associates was held in the Out-patients' Department. The quantity of Linen sent constituted a record, exceeding the contribution of the previous year by 452 pieces. The total amounted to 3,214.

The Membership has risen steadily, and nine new Vice-Presidents and their Associates made a welcome addition to the numbers, bringing the total Membership up to 1,302. The Vice-Presidents were congratulated on the splendid work which had achieved such good results in difficult times.

Our grateful thanks are due to Mrs. GRATTON for her kind help with the Secretarial work.

THE LATE MISS NEILSON.

We deeply regret to announce the death of Miss MARY ELIZABETH CHARLOTTE NEILSON. Her family had been closely connected with the Royal Infirmary for many years, and when her brother, the late Mr. Ralph Langton Neilson, joined the Committee in 1892 she became especially interested in the work of the Hospital. Among other things the needs of the Chapel appealed particularly to her and she sent many gifts of fair linen. The poorer patients will miss the generous present she sent every Christmas consisting of a parcel of over fifty useful garments to be distributed amongst them.

In 1919 when the Linen League was first inaugurated, Miss NEILSON immediately encouraged its inception and herself undertook the work of a Vice-President. Within a few months she had enlisted over twenty Members, the majority of whom have subscribed ever since. During the subsequent years she continued most wholeheartedly her work for the League and frequently presided at the informal Annual Meetings for the Vice-Presidents, when the work for the coming year is discussed.

In Miss NEILSON the League had a very devoted friend, and its Members look back with gratitude to all she did to promote its welfare.
