

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The History of the Infirmary

1866.—Preston and County of Lancaster founded by Deed of Trust, dated 12th March.


The appeal realised £45,000, of which £20,500 was bequeathed by Mr. John Bairstow, whose memorial bust stands on Main Corridor. Mr. C. R. Jacson appointed Chairman (served until 1894), Messrs. E. R. Harris and John Cooper (Treasurers), Mr. R. T. Easterby (Secretary), Mrs. Russell (Matron).

1869.—Dispensary opened on 18th October.


Dr. R. C. Brown (afterwards Sir Charles Brown) appointed Honorary Medical Officer, 1893 Consultant.

Royal Patronage bestowed by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria.

REPORT

OF THE

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT for the Year 1935.

The Board of Management has the honour to submit the Annual Report for the past year, being the sixty-sixth since the opening of the Infirmary in 1869.

His late Majesty King George V.

The lamented death of His Majesty King George V caused a sense of deep sorrow to the Board and everyone connected with the Infirmary. The Royal Family has been connected with the Infirmary since its foundation. The Royal patronage was bestowed by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria when the Hospital was founded, was continued by His late Majesty King Edward VII, and again conferred in January, 1911, by His late Majesty King George V. This patronage was no mere form—each year His late Majesty and Queen Mary sent a box of grapes and sometimes venison for the Staff and patients, gifts which were much appreciated by all.

The Princess Royal visited the Infirmary in 1925 and 1929, and on the last occasion His late Majesty was pleased to allow the New Patients' Wing (which the Princess then opened) to be named "The Princess Mary Wing."

The Chairman.

The Board records its deep regret that a serious illness has, since last October, deprived the Infirmary of the invaluable services of the Chairman, Mr. Alex. Foster, J.P., and assures him of its sincere sympathy. It is most satisfactory to hear of the improvement in Mr. Foster's health, and it is the fervent hope of the Board and all connected with the hospital that he may soon be restored to health and able to resume his labours on behalf of the Hospital.


The Year's Work.

The record of the past year, has, nevertheless, been one of quiet yet satisfactory progress from every point of view. The work has continued at high pressure. Whilst no material increase has taken place in the number of beds, which have again been occupied to their fullest capacity, there was an increase of 2.5 per cent. in the number of out-patients treated and 6 per cent. in the aggregate attendances. Judged by the appreciation expressed by patients and their relatives and the generous support given by the public, the Board feel that the high reputation of the Institution has been maintained, and the work carried out has proved invaluable to and given general satisfaction to the large population served.


The aggregate number of patients who received benefit was 37,300, the daily average number treated being 926—316 in-patients and 610 out-patients. A summary of the year's work is appended in the Medical Report which follows.

In-patients.

The number of patients treated to a conclusion was 5,735, of whom 93.5 per cent. were cured or relieved, 1.3 per cent. unrelieved and 5.2 per cent. died. Of the 303 deaths, 122 took place within 48 hours of admission; when these are deducted, the rate is reduced to 3.1 per cent., as compared with 3.6 per cent. in the previous year. As 2,213 patients were admitted either as the

result of serious accidents or emergencies, the results may be considered highly satisfactory. The average stay of each patient in the Infirmary was 16.6 days.

The work in the Children's Wards at the Infirmary and the Lostock Hall Hospital was hindered considerably by the prevailing epidemic of infectious diseases in the district.

Auxiliary Hospitals.

The two Homes of Recovery have again proved of great value in relieving the Wards at the Infirmary and in assisting in the recovery of 1,190 patients, of whom 584 women and 102 children were transferred to Lostock Hall and 504 men to "The Willows." It will be realised that these Homes have a great value, enabling, as they do, the Infirmary to treat a larger number of cases. The patients transferred derive benefit from the quiet surroundings of these delightful Homes, an important factor during the convalescent stage of illness.

Convalescent and Spa Treatment.

Ninety-two persons were sent for recuperative treatment to the Southport Convalescent Hospital and twenty-five to the Devonshire Hospital, Buxton, for treatment of rheumatic conditions. The Board expresses its gratitude to the Governors of the Cotton Districts Convalescent Fund for providing these facilities and thanks to Alderman H. Astley-Bell, J.P., for serving as a Representative Governor of the above Fund, and allowing himself to be elected recently for a further period of service.

Out-patients.

There was again another increase in the number of patients treated in the Out-patients' Department (762 more than in 1934); 31,565 received attention, including 12,141 accident and casualty cases. The attendances totalled 194,472 (increase 11,019, approximately 6 per cent.)

Motor Accident Cases.

Four hundred and three persons were treated as a result of motor traffic accidents (or 32 more than in the previous year). Of these, 157 were in-patients, who occupied beds for 4,051 days (or an average of 11 beds daily). The cost of treatment was £1,483 16s. 3d., towards which £1,096 19s. 1d. was recovered, leaving £386 17s. 2d. to be paid out of the general funds of the Institution, as compared with £763 15s. 7d. in 1934.

This reduction was due firstly to a reduction of 14.5 per cent. in the average number of days these patients occupied beds in the Institution, brought about by the improved methods of treatment which the Surgical Staff are now able to employ through the opening of the Orthopædic Department, with its new plaster section; and secondly to the larger limits of maintenance fees which the Hospital is now allowed to claim in cases where compensation is



paid to the injured party, owing to the passing of the amended Road Traffic Act, which came into force on the 1st January, 1935, and as a result of which 74 per cent. of the cost was recovered, as against 56 per cent.

The Nurses' Training School.

The School continues to flourish and uphold its high traditions. Two hundred and fourteen applications for training were received, and thirty candidates selected. Satisfactory results have again been obtained by the Nurses taking the Examinations of the General Nursing Council and the Central Midwives' Board. Twenty-five Nurses entered for the Final State Examination, and twenty-four passed (twenty-two at first entry). In the Preliminary State Examination, twenty-seven candidates entered, of whom twenty-three passed at first entry. Sixteen Pupil Midwives obtained the Diploma of the Central Midwives' Board.

The Annual Distribution of the Training School Medals and Prizes took place on the 27th May by Miss W. W. Bowling, Matron of the Sheffield Royal Infirmary and a Member of the General Nursing Council for England and Wales.

Staff.

The Board records its indebtedness to the Members of the Visiting Medical and Surgical Staffs for the high standard of their work and unremitting care of the patients, and also extends its thanks for the satisfactory services rendered by the Resident Medical and Surgical Staff.

Mr. Edward Bell-Jones, F.R.C.S. (of Liverpool) has recently been appointed to assist Mr. B. L. McFarland, F.R.C.S., in the Orthopædic Department to cope with the abnormal growth of work in this Department since it was opened on the 1st September, 1934.

For the first time in the history of the Infirmary, a lady House Surgeon was appointed for the Resident care of the Maternity and Ophthalmic Departments, with satisfactory results.

The Board appreciates the efficient manner in which the Nursing Staffs have carried out their exacting duties. Their sympathy and devotion to duty played a considerable part in the healing of the sick under their care. It also expresses its satisfaction with the excellent work carried out by the Administrative and other Staffs.

Miss M. A. Marks, the Matron, attained her Jubilee in the service of the Infirmary, having been appointed Assistant Matron in 1910 and Matron in 1912. The Board desires to place on record its appreciation of her devoted service, and sincerely trusts that she may long be spared to serve the Hospital.

Board of Management.

The Board regrets the retirement from the Board of Councillor James Harrison and Councillor H. E. Rhodes, two Representatives of the Corporation of Preston, but is glad to welcome in their places The Right Worshipful The Mayor of Preston (Councillor E. Ley, J.P.) and Councillor C. W. Beetham.

The manner in which Alderman R. C. Handley, J.P., the Chairman of the Workpeople's Infirmary Fund and an esteemed Member of the Board, and Mrs. Handley carried out the duties of the offices of Mayor and Mayoress of Preston during the year gave great pleasure to the Board. Congratulations were also accorded to Mr. Handley by all connected with the Infirmary upon his elevation to the Aldermanic Bench.

Finance.

The finances of the Institution have been maintained and the Fund for the erection of the New Maternity Hospital has progressed satisfactorily.

Reviewing the Income and Expenditure account, the year's income was made up as follows:—

The Ordinary Income was increased by £596, and the legacies for the Endowment Fund were £453 more than in the previous year, but the Extraordinary Income was £7,227 less.

The total Expenditure was £65,635 3s. 9d., of which £47,569 16s. 3d. was in respect of Ordinary Maintenance, and £18,065 7s. 6d. for Extraordinary Expenditure (including £16,812 9s. 8d. paid to Contractors in respect of the New Maternity Hospital and ancillary extensions). The Ordinary Expenditure was higher than the previous year by £1,763, chiefly on account of an increase of £1,144 in the amount of necessary repairs and renewals to buildings and plant, and painting and decorating, £203 being arrears of fees due to the Visiting Medical Staff and the remainder incurred through the increased volume of work.

The nett result of the year's work in a financial sense is a deficit on the Maintenance Account which has been reduced to £250 8s. 4d., and there is a balance in the Maternity, etc. Extensions Fund of £11,317 18s. 11d. to meet payments to Contractors, leaving still to be raised about £3,000, which, it is estimated, will still be required to complete the building.

Attention is drawn to the Statement of Accounts following this Report, containing detailed particulars of the Income and Expenditure, with comparisons for the year 1934.

Subscriptions and Donations.

It is regretted that for the first time in many years the amount received from annual subscribers shows a reduction of £134 13s. 0d. The amounts received from a number of new subscribers helped very considerably to reduce the loss, which is due to the Committee of the L.M. and S. Railway Servants' Hospital Fund being unable to continue its subscription of one hundred guineas, and to certain firms being obliged, by reason of bad trade, to withdraw or reduce subscriptions which they have given for many years. The Board, however, hopes that better times may soon return and earnestly appeals for the help of many persons in the district who can afford to subscribe, but have not yet done so.

On the other hand, the Board expresses its sincere thanks to the firms, societies and individuals who have assisted the work of the Institution by services, subscriptions, donations or grants and by organising entertainments or other efforts in aid of the Maintenance, Building or other Funds.

Especially do they record their gratitude to the following donors of special gifts to the New Maternity Hospital Building Fund.

To Mrs. K. Hollas (of Red Scar) and her brother, Mr. Harwood, for a gift of £1,000, in commemoration of which the Board have agreed to name a Bed in the New Hospital in memory of their mother, the late Mrs. Harwood; to the Preston and District Amateur Operatic Society (who have undertaken to raise £1,000 for the naming of a Bed), for a gift of £121 1s. 9d. from the proceeds of their production, "The Maid of the Mountains," and to Mr. Robert Cardwell, of Knott End, for a donation of £105.

As mentioned in the last Report, Messrs. Ingham & Tipping, Ltd. have, through their Chairman, Mr. J. E. Ingham, completed a settlement of Shares in the Company for the support of a further Bed (bringing the total number of beds named by the firm to four).

Workpeople's Infirmary Fund.

The Board expresses its sincere thanks to the Officers and Members of the Executive Committee of the Workpeople's Fund, the general body of Representatives and those employed in the Mills, Workshops, and Business Houses, as well as those who have assisted in the collection, for the most generous assistance rendered by this Fund towards the maintenance of the Institution.

The record sum of £26,009 8s. 11d. was received, or £1,099 4s. 7d. more than the preceding year. This increase demonstrates to the Board, and indeed to the Public at large, in a most practical way an increasing appreciation of the Infirmary's work on the part of the workers who receive its benefits, and it is hoped that the results of the effort will act as an incentive to other sections of the population who also benefit from the Hospital's services.

Thanks are also extended to this Committee and its Representatives for organising public entertainments in Preston, Longridge and Goosnargh, by which further sums of £37 3s. 3d. for the New Maternity Hospital Building Fund and £95 4s. 7d. for the Maintenance Fund were raised.

Church and Sunday School Collections.

Grateful thanks are tendered to the Clergy and Ministers and Congregations of the Churches of the various denominations for the response made to the annual Hospital Sunday appeal. The following is a summary of the amounts received:—Anglican Churches, £933 14s. 6d.; Free Churches, £295 15s. 7d.; Roman Catholic Churches, £157 18s. 3d.; and private donations 12s. 11d., the total being £1,388 1s. 3d., a decrease of £84 8s. 7d.

As the amount of the collection tends to suffer owing to inclement weather at the time of the appeal (in January), it is hoped that all concerned will endeavour to maintain this most necessary source of income at its former strength.

Special thanks are due to the Leyland Parish Church for a splendid collection of £101 14s. 6d., and the generous assistance given by many other Churches is gratefully acknowledged.

" Alexandra" Rose Day.

This Festival was again held in Preston and the district served by the Hospital (under the presidency of the then Mayoress of Preston, Mrs. Handley), with the assistance of a large band of ladies, the amount raised being £666 5s. 0d., of which £359 8s. 7d. was contributed in Preston, and £306 16s. 5d. in the County districts. Nowadays there is a tendency for Flag Day appeals to lose their former popularity. It is, however, hoped that this old established National flower collection, founded by our late Queen Alexandra, will not be allowed to lose any of its former appeal.

The Board's sincere thanks are extended to the ladies who took charge of districts, Managers of Works, Teachers and Scholars of Schools and all who assisted in the effort. The gifts and donations of the ladies and gentlemen who responded to the Mayoress's appeal and the services rendered by those who sold roses in the streets or from door to door are fully appreciated.

Ladies' Maternity Committee.

The Ladies' Maternity Committee has made frequent reports to the Board on the care of the patients in the Maternity Department, and has continued to raise additional funds to meet the cost of equipping the Labour Unit, and providing the main sterilising plant and other appliances in the New Hospital, in the construction and equipment of which they have taken a keen interest. A Garden Fete was held at Red Scar (by kind permission of Mr. and Mrs. Hollas) and a Bridge and Whist Drive in the Town Hall.

The Board expresses its sincere thanks to the Officers and Members for the splendid assistance they have rendered.

Ladies' Linen League.

The Ladies' Linen League has again assisted the work of the Infirmary by supplying bed and other linen to the value of £285 13s. 7d.

This most helpful organisation has now been in existence for twenty-four years, during which it has supplied the Infirmary with linen to the value of £5,160.

The Board tenders its sincere thanks to the Committee and Collectors, and extends its appreciation of the League's splendid record of service.

Gifts in Kind.

Gifts in kind have again proved a most useful addition to the Infirmary's income. The Board acknowledges, with grateful thanks, the receipt of the gift for the patients of grapes from the Hampton Court vine by His late Majesty King George V and Queen Mary. They are also indebted for the following gifts:—

52,526 eggs, collected chiefly through the efforts of the Teachers and Scholars of the various Schools in the county area; the soda water used in the Infirmary, by Messrs. Ellis Wilkinson, Ltd.; Harvest offerings from the Clergy, Ministers and Congregations; a grand piano for the Nursing Staff by Mr. F. Treasure; the turkeys provided for the Christmas dinners at the Infirmary and Lostock Hall as a result of Dr. T. H. Miller's collection, and at "The Willows" through the generosity of Mr. W. W. Galloway, J.P.; the large gift of toys at Christmastide supplied by Miss Hilda M. Foster and her friends; the gifts of money or kind by a large number of ladies and gentlemen which helped to give the patients such a good time at Christmas, and numerous gifts during the year.

PERSONAL SERVICE. Blood Donors.

Of many who have voluntarily assisted the Infirmary in its work, none are more deserving of thanks than those who offered themselves as donors of blood in an effort to save life. Many are the times when these friends have been called upon. The Board accords its sincere thanks to these gentlemen for their sacrificing service, and especially to those Members of the local Branch of Toc H, through whose agency the nucleus of a panel of blood donors has been formed. Unfortunately, the list is still small, and so an appeal is made to men and women to offer themselves for this service.

The larger the list, the greater will be its usefulness, and the fewer the calls upon each donor.

Thanks are also accorded to :-

Chaplains.

The respective Chaplains for their frequent visits and ministrations to the patients.

Ladies' Sewing Party.

The Ladies' Working Party, who attend at the Infirmary regularly each Wednesday afternoon to meet many domestic requirements.

Toc H Library.

The Lady Members of Toc H who attend weekly and distribute from bed to bed books from the Library, and also the gentlemen from the same Society who visit the Lostock Hall Hospital each Sunday for the same purpose—services which have been much appreciated by the patients.

The Press.

The Proprietors of local Newspapers for the great assistance they render in publishing reports descriptive of the Institution's work.

Local Authorities.

To the Members and Officers of the Preston Town Council, the Lancashire County Council and of other local bodies for assistance they render the Infirmary in many ways.

Entertainers.

To a large number of Societies and individuals who have entertained the patients at the respective Hospitals.

Clocks.

Mr. H. Gardner, of Plungington Road, Preston, for winding and repairing the clocks at the Infirmary without charge.

Police Force and Fire Brigade.

To the Preston and Lancashire Police Forces and Preston Fire Brigade and the St. John Ambulance Brigade for their attendance upon and transport of patients and relatives following road and other accidents.



THE present Department (the first Maternity Home in Preston and District) was commenced in 1922 by the adaptation of a Medical Ward erected in 1874. It has served a great need; especially when mothers have abnormal confinements, and where housing conditions are unsuitable, but the accommodation has outgrown its usefulness.

In 1922 there were 51 admissions; in 1928, 245; and in 1935, 413. This beneficent work has outgrown the meagre accommodation.

No more useful memorial to perpetuate the memory of a dear one or an honoured name can be selected than the naming of a Bed or Cot in the Infirmary, as, year after year, it assists in bringing back to health 18 patients stricken by disease or injury. £1,000 names a Bed, £500 a Cot.

On the other hand, there are many friends of the Infirmary who are not in a position to name a Bed or a Cot, but who are able to bequeath a smaller sum. The Board respectfully suggests to all so placed that they should consider the needs of the Infirmary when making a Will or Codicil.

New Maternity Hospital.

The erection of this new building has progressed to the extent that it should be ready for the official opening in the late Summer, and immediately after that event for the reception of patients. Much thought has been given to every detail in the construction of the building, its plant and equipment, and, when opened, it will undoubtedly rank high among the Maternity Hospitals of the Country. It is quite possible that this new Hospital will become the centre for the organisation in Preston and the area covered by this Infirmary of the new maternity services which are to be instituted in connection with the effort to reduce maternal mortality.

As mentioned in another part of the Report, only £3,000 remains to be raised to open the building free of debt.

The Board feels that the successful completion of the undertaking is now in sight, and that there should not be any difficulty in completing the effort, a result which will give great pleasure not only to the Board, but to many friends who have worked so assiduously.

The Social and Recreation Clubs of Preston and District are making an effort to raise at least £500, and the Nursing and Administrative Staffs at the Infirmary are also making efforts by way of Concerts and Sales for this purpose.

A Committee representing Kirkham and Wesham, with Mrs. Strange, as Chairman, are to be heartily congratulated on a notable achievement in raising, in spite of great difficulties due to the bad trade of the district, ± 500 to name a Cot in the new building. The inception of other efforts will be welcomed by the Board.

Medical Apparatus.

Medical science is ever progressing, and new apparatus to aid diagnosis, to treat disease and to assist in carrying out treatment more effectively, are constantly being evolved. During the year, a new Mobile X-Ray Unit was purchased for use in the Wards, as well as new appliances and instruments for the Operating Theatres, Pathological Department and Treatment Rooms. An Emergency Lighting Set has also been installed for use in the Operating Theatres in the event of the failure of the normal electricity supplies.

Generally, every effort has been made to meet the constantly changing requirements of the Medical and Surgical Staff, and it is felt that the results achieved are testimony to the value of and necessity for such a policy.

The Future.

A perusal of this Report and the Reports of the past few years will indicate that, with the ever widening field of medical and surgical science, the calls on the Infirmary are constantly increasing, adding fresh responsibilities to an already heavy burden. As

Donations for or towards the above much needed improvements will be gratefully acknowledged by the Board of Management.

part of the general development of the Hospital, Radium and Orthopædic Departments have recently been added, but up to now it has not been found possible to add beds to supply the special needs of these Departments. Furthermore, for some years there have not been sufficient beds to accommodate the number of medical cases requiring treatment and to ensure the adequate training of the Nurses in medical work, a deficiency which has been repeatedly pointed out by the General Nursing Council.

With the completion of the effort in connection with the New Maternity Hospital, the Board feels that it is vitally important to the needs of the community and the reputation of the Infirmary that these deficiencies should now be made good, and propose to take the necessary steps to this end. In this they will to some extent be assisted by the adaptation of the present Maternity Ward, which will become available with the opening of the New Hospital.

The Board appeals therefore most earnestly to the people of Preston and of the large County area served to accord in the future to the Infirmary a measure of support even larger than in the past, to enable them to meet the increasing needs of the Institution. If the Public will continue to give it adequate support, the Infirmary is capable of meeting the acute medical and surgical needs of the district for many years to come, and to serve them with the same care and efficiency as during the sixty-six years of its existence.

In Conclusion.

The Board expresses its appreciation of the support given during the past year to the Infirmary and its two Auxiliary Hospitals, which is a measure of the confidence in the Institution of all sections of the people, in Preston and the County of Lancaster.

The average number of beds available was 290, and the average number of In-patients 260, compared with 259 in 1934. The length of stay of each patient has averged 16.6 days, compared with 16.3 days last year.

The death rate was 5.2, compared with 6 per cent. in 1934. 122 of the deaths took place within 48 hours of admission. If these are deducted, the death rate is reduced to 3.1 per cent. (3.6 last year).



Examination Results.

The Alex. Foster Gold Medal was won by Nurse Cheese, and the Hilda M. Foster Silver Medal by Nurse Edith Hall.

The Hospital Final Examinations were again held in May and October. The Examiners were:— Dr. Duncan, Dr. Pimblett, Dr. Toulmin, Dr. Baker, Dr. Rigg, to whom we extend our thanks.

Fifteen entered for the May Examination, and all were successful. Nurse Cheese being first, with 91.5 per cent. Eight entered for the October Examination, and all were successful. Nurse Hardman being top with 80 per cent.

Sixteen Pupils obtained the Certificate of the Central Midwives' Board.

Twenty-five Nurses took the State Final Examination in 1935, and twenty-two passed at first entry. Twenty-seven Nurses took the State Preliminary Examination, and twenty-three passed.

Presentation of Medals and Badges.

The presentation of Medals and Badges was most graciously performed by Miss W. W. Bowling, Matron of the Sheffield Royal Infirmary, a Member of the General Nursing Council for England and Wales. Miss Bowling also presented the Preliminary Training School prizes and the Anderson Essay prize to Nurse Cheese.

Nurses' Re-union.

The seventh Annual Re-union of the Nurses' League was held also on this day.

Applications for Training.

There were 243 applications for training, and 30 were selected on probation.

Health.

On the recommendation of the Medical Board, "Schick" testing for diptheria, and subsequent immunisation, was instituted amongst the Nursing Staff, with satisfactory results.

The auxiliary Dining Room was equipped and opened, enabling the Night Staff to have their meals away from the Wards—this has undoubtedly resulted in an improved health record.

Lectures.

The Lecturers to Nurses for the year were—Mr. Duncan, Dr. Sykes, Mr. Shaw, Mr. Davies, Dr. Pimblett and Dr. Rigg; Lecturer to Pupil Midwives: Dr. Pimley.

General.




The continued serious illness of the Chairman is a great sorrow to the Nursing Staff, and they wish to be associated with me in our great hope that he may soon be restored to health and strength.




OUT-PATIENTS' DEPARTMENT—EYE, EAR, ETC., CLINICS.











Fifty-third Annual Report

OF THE

Workpeople's Infirmary Fund.


The Committee of Representatives of the Infirmary Work-people's Fund beg to submit their Report for the year ending the 31st December, 1935.

The Statement of Contributions following this Report covers the period of one year to the 30th September, 1935. The collections from the Mills, Workshops and Business Houses of Preston were £13,788 13s. 2d. and from the County District £9,731 7s. 9d.; the London, Midland and Scottish Railway Servants' Hospital Fund forwarded £1,808 17s. 6d. in respect of their members, and Bank interest added £2 6s. 6d. making a total of £25,331 4s. 11d. To bring these accounts into line with those of the Board of Management (whose financial year ended on the 31st December, 1935) the usual adjustments shown in the Statement have been made. The grand total for the year ending the 31st December, 1935, is therefore £26,000 1s. 9d. compared with £24,910 4s. 4d. or an increase of £1,089 17s. 5d.

The Committee are pleased to record this progress, which would have been greater but for a decrease of £300 in the amount received from the London, Midland and Scottish Railway Servants' Hospital Fund.

The result indicates still another fall in employment in the Cotton industry and decreases in the Transport and Tailoring Trades, but a further slight general improvement in most of the other trades and businesses; it also shows that the propaganda work has proved successful. 104 new contributing establishments and several hundreds of new individual contributors have been

added to the lists, 486 of the latter joining through the Secretary's Office. New Honorary Collectors have been enlisted in Preston, Tarleton and Walton-le-dale.

Whilst the Committee appreciate the services rendered by all the Collectors of the Fund, they feel that mention should be made of the following achievements by Individual Members' Sections—The Leyland Committee collected £165 14s. 8d.; Kirkham Committee £151 17s. 9d.; Pilling Service Guild £147 12s. 0d.; Preesall Committee £120 11s. 7d.; Garstang and District Committee £107 10s. 5d.; Hambleton Committee £77 14s. 10d.; Freckleton Committee £35 7s. 6d.; and the following Collectors, Mrs. Royles, Wesham, £57 16s 0d.; Miss Cragg, Great Eccleston, £50; Miss Thompson, Greenhalgh, £43 0s. 0d.; Mr. C. Ratcliffe, Lostock Hall and Middleforth, £42 12s. 10d.; Mr. F. Allen, Catforth, £24 7s. 6d.; Mr. T. Baron, Bamber Bridge, £23 13s. 8d.; Mrs. James Taylor, Bretherton, £21 10s. 6d.

The Committee are exceedingly grateful for the splendid support given to the Fund during the past year, and extend their most cordial thanks to the Collectors in the Mills, Workshops and Business Houses; those who have worked so hard to gather in the individual members' subscriptions, and indeed all who have in any way helped to bring about the splendid result of the past year.

Whilst so much has been, and is being, done to further the great work carried on at the Infirmary and its Auxiliary Hospitals at Lostock Hall and "The Willows," the Committee beg to point out that the increasing calls for treatment made by the contributors to the Fund and their dependents and new forms of treatment introduced in recent years place an ever-increasing strain upon the accommodation and which must make further additions necessary in the near future. The Committee sincerely trust, therefore, that all the friends will renew their efforts to increase the usefulness of the Fund, and that other ladies and gentlemen in Preston and the county townships will come forward and give their assistance to the same end by enrolling new individual subscribers.

Whilst the Board endeavour to improve the Hospital in every possible way, the people who benefit most from their efforts are the working classes. Consequently, the Board are compelled to look to the Workpeople's Fund for an increasing measure of support. As the efficient maintenance of the Institution is of such vital importance, your Committee wish to point out that the cost of working the Scheme is on the basis of threepence per week, whereas the weekly amount contributed is generally twopence (and in many cases less). The Infirmary has been considerably extended and many new forms of treatment added since the Scheme was re-organised in 1924, but the contribution still remains the same.

The Committee, therefore, once again express the hope that those employed in the better-paid branches of industry will see their way to increase their contributions from the present minimum of twopence to threepence per week. It is vitally important that progress should be made in this matter if the Institution is to maintain its place as an efficient Hospital unit, keeping pace with the ever-onward march of medical and surgical science, and serving the needs of many thousands of our people, including the very large proportion who are members of the Workpeople's Fund.

Under the Scheme, all employees receiving weekly wages and those in receipt of salaries of, or engaged in one-man businesses. and earning not more than, £250 per annum, on production of a certificate of membership may, in consideration of their subscriptions, obtain at the Infirmary and its two Homes of Recovery, according to the available accommodation, the services of these Hospitals and of the Medical and Surgical Staffs, without question or payment, Hospital treatment of an acute nature, which is not provided out of National or Local Government Funds, and excluding confinement cases. Those who have no means of contributing through an organised collection may join the Scheme by applying at the Infirmary to the Secretary, to whom they can pay their contributions quarterly. An appeal is made to those persons who have not yet commenced to contribute to the Fund to do so without delay, and so give their assistance in maintaining the Infirmary in these difficult times.

The Annual Meeting was held at the Town Hall, Preston, on the 27th February, 1935, when Mr. Alex. Foster, J.P. (Chairman of the Board of Management), gave a most interesting address upon the Infirmary's work and development, and expressed the thanks of the Board of Management for the assistance rendered by the Fund during the previous year. Mr. Foster's address, which was the tenth he had given in consecutive years, was again much appreciated by the large number of representatives present. The Committee deeply regret that owing to illness, Mr. Foster has been prevented in recent months from carrying out his duties as Chairman of the Infirmary, and sincerely trust that his health may soon be restored to enable him to continue his great work for the relief of human suffering in Preston and District.

The total number of persons treated at the Infirmary was again greater than in any previous year, 37,296 patients receiving benefit (an increase of 711, or an average of 926 per day, 330 as in-patients and 596 as out-patients). 5,735 patients were treated in the Wards and 31,565 as out-patients, including 12,068 accidents and casualties. The attendance for advice or treatment at the Out-patients' Department totalled 191,261. 686 women and children received convalescent treatment at the Lostock Hall Hospital, and 504 men at "The Willows" Hospital, and 92 persons were sent to Southport for recuperation and 25 to Buxton for spa treatment.

The Workpeople's Representatives on the Board of Management have reported on their frequent visits to the Infirmary and the Convalescent Hospitals that the patients have generally been well satisfied with the treatment received, and complaints have been negligible. Our sincere thanks are tendered to the Medical, Surgical and Nursing Staffs for the skilled attention and devotion extended to the patients.

Your Representatives on the Board of Management have taken a keen interest in the administration of the Institution and the welfare of the patients, having been regular in their attendance at the various Meetings and Committees, and in visits to the Wards and Departments. They have been satisfied that the three Hospitals (comprising the Institution) have been conducted efficiently and economically. Our thanks are due to them for the services they have so willingly rendered.

The following Members have resigned their seats on the Executive Committee—Mr. T. H. Dent, J.P., on his retirement from business; Mr. John Ashton, a Representative of the Engineering Trades; Mr. A. Roberts, the Secretary of the Preston Branch of the North Lancashire Card, Blowing Room and Ring Spinners' Association; and Mrs. Gwillam, the two last named being Representatives of the Preston and District Textiles Trades Federation, to all of whom the Committee express thanks for the services they have rendered.

The Annual Ball and Whist Drive was again held in the Public Hall, on the 24th October, the proceeds, £37 3s. 3d. being devoted to the commencement of a Benevolent Fund for the relief of members needing special facilities. A second Ball and Whist Drive was also held recently in the Public Hall, resulting in a profit of approximately £60, which has been allocated to a special object in the New Maternity Hospital.

The Committee have asked the Social and Recreation Clubs of Preston and District to make another special effort to raise, if possible, at least £500 towards the money still required to complete the New Maternity Hospital Building Fund. It will be remembered that these Clubs about three years ago raised £1,757 for the purpose of re-equipping the X-Ray Department.

The Committee's appreciation and thanks are also due to the Longridge Representatives, who forwarded £29 6s. 5d. as a result of the Eighth Annual Ball and Whist Drive which they organised and held in the Co-operative Hall, Longridge, on the 27th November; to the Members of the Preston St. David's Silver Band for organising a Concert in the Empress Cinema, on the 24th February, which raised £25 3s. 2d., and to Messrs. T. W. Nelson and J. T. Hey, the Goosnargh Representatives, who again organised a most successful Whist Drive and raised £36 15s. 0d. These sums were handed over to the Board of Management for the general purposes of the Institution.

Before concluding this Report, the Committee wish to place on record the great pleasure that everyone connected with the Fund experienced by the election of their Chairman as Mayor of Preston for the Municipal year 1934/1935, and his elevation to the Aldermanic Bench. Alderman and Mrs. Handley maintained the highest traditions of the offices of Mayor and Mayoress of Preston, rendered great service to the Town and earned the gratitude and lasting respect not only of the people of Preston, but also of a large number of the inhabitants in the country districts. A well-attended Dinner was given in honour of Alderman and Mrs. Handley by the Executive Committee in the Guild Hall, Preston, on the 8th April, a memorable evening being spent by a representative assembly.

In conclusion, the Committee tender their heartiest thanks to all who have assisted in the organisation and management of the collections, to the Trustees and Staff of the Preston Savings Bank for receiving subscriptions, and to all who have supported in any way the Institution during the past year, not forgetting the Officers of the Fund, who have rendered splendid service. They express the earnest hope that the Fund, which is such a vital part of the Infirmary's organisation, may further prosper during the coming year and become an even greater assistance than it has been in the past.


