CONSTITUTION AND LAWS.

--:0:--

CONSTITUTION.

- 1. This Society is formed to unite and organise voluntary efforts for the collection and diffusion of well-established sanitary knowledge, which bears on the physical and moral welfare of all classes of society.
- 2. It will also be in accordance with the aims of this Society to give support to practical efforts for carrying out the laws of health in daily life.
- 3. It invites the co-operation of both men and women in its work.
- 4. In forming voluntary Branch Societies it will endeavour to work according to the divisions of the country into health districts; hoping to enter into friendly relations with the existing Sanitary Authorities.
- 5. It will be the special aim of the Society to promote sanitary knowledge in Families and Households, whose influence will thus afford the best support and guidance to sanitary legislation.

LAWS.

- 1. The work of the Society will be carried on by an Executive Committee, assisted by a General Committee, and by Corresponding Members.
- 2. A General Meeting of Members shall be called in the beginning of each year, to receive the Annual Report, the resignation of the Executive Committee, to

elect the Executive Committee for the ensuing year, and new Members of the General Committee if necessary. Members of the Executive Committee are re-eligible.

- 3. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to meet at least twice a month, to direct the business of the Society, except during the vacation as shall from time to time be determined. It must consist of as many as seven Members, of whom three shall constitute a quorum. It shall have power to add to its number, and to appoint Sub-committees.
- 4. The Members of the General Committee may be consulted at any time by the Executive Committee. They may be invited to preside over or otherwise assist at public meetings.
- 5. The payment of one guinea, annually, due on the 1st January in each year, constitutes Membership, or, ten guineas at once, Life-Membership. Members will be notified of all Meetings, Lectures, and Discussions. They will be assisted by the Secretary to obtain any sanitary information they may desire, and will be entitled to one copy of all Reports and transactions issued by the Society.
- 6. These and all future Laws may be altered or added to at a General Meeting of the Members, special notice of the alteration being given a fortnight beforehand.
- 7. Annual Subscribers of sums under one guinea are entitled to Notice of Meetings, &c., and the Annual Report.

REPORT.

At the commencement of the sixth year of the National Health Society the Committee are desirous of presenting to their subscribers a condensed report of their proceedings for the year, feeling that any advocacy for the claims of a Society engaged in purely sanitary work is practically unnecessary now from them. Under this conviction, the Committee think it best merely to state the work done during the year, and to acknowledge the assistance they have received in the shape of subscriptions and gratuitous lectures.

The following lectures (see next page), beginning in January, 1878, have been delivered under the auspices of the Society:—

Thus it will be seen that sixty-three lectures to audiences of different classes have been delivered, chiefly to Mothers' Meetings and Working Mens' Clubs. In all cases the lectures have been much appreciated, and the audiences considerably larger than in former years. In many places applications have been made for the repetition of the lectures, and there is strong evidence that the desire for this sort of instruction is increasing amongst the class of persons whom it is most desirable to interest. Miss Barnett's lectures on cooking have all been illustrated by practical demonstrations, the dishes

prepared before the audiences being tasted by them after the lecture.

Many additions have this year been made to the list of publications. Orders from Russia, Cape Town, New Zealand, America, Berlin, and Paris have been sent for the papers and small leaflets. Dr. Oscar Liebreich, of Berlin, introduced by the Treasurer, Mr. Hertz, visited the office and took away two copies of all the Society's publications—one for the university and the other for the Princess of Prussia, who is much interested in sanitary matters. Permission was requested by a German lady to translate the papers into German, the same lady being anxious to form a Society of a kind similar to our own in Berlin.

A new Almanac has again been brought out this year, with many good and cheap cookery receipts in it.

SWIMMING PRIZES.—The Committee has been enabled through the kindness of a friend to offer prizes for swimming to the London Schools Swimming Club and to the Girls Public Day Schools Company, should they establish a swimming club. The amounts offered varying from 5s to £1.

NEW DIAGRAMS.—A Member of the Committee has been kind enough to make a present of some new diagrams to the Society for the use of their lectures. Presents of diagrams will be thankfully received by the Secretary.

PLAYGROUNDS.—In the summer the Committee again applied to the School Board to allow three play-grounds in the east of London to be opened on the Saturday holiday, the Society undertaking to pay 5s. a week for caretakers for each playground. The Board

however, refused to allow the playground in Great Castle Street to be opened on account of the Jews residing in the neighbourhood, whose prejudices might be offended, and only to permit the others to be opened on condition that the Society should engage and pay a policeman to keep order during play hours. The Committee found that this could not be done under a cost of 15s. per week. It is hoped that by the next summer some different arrangement may be made with the School Board.

Considerable efforts have been made during the year and energy expended in negotiations for the opening of spaces for the people—the conversion of disused church-yards into gardens and other sanitary measures which can hardly enter into this report as work accomplished, but which nevertheless represent much time and some expense. The committee granted a sum of £5 towards the purchase of a piece of ground near St. Peter's Docks, E. for the purpose of forming a permanent play ground there for the children of that crowded district.

SCHOOL BOARD PRIZES.—The examinations in physiology in the London School Board for the Society's prizes will not take place this year until March, and the result of the Liverpool examination has not yet been heard.

COOKERY PRIZES.—The Society has been enabled to offer prizes for cookery in all the cooking centres connected with the School Board of London.

At the meeting of the Domestic Economy Congress in connection with the Society of Arts, held in Manchester in July last, the Secretary of the National Health Society contributed a paper on health.

COUNTER SEATS.—A pamphlet on Counter Seats

for Shopwomen by Dr. Arthur Edis has been published under the auspices of the Society.

LECTURES.—A course of drawing-room lectures, to take place at 23, Hertford-street, Mayfair, by the kind permission of C. Matthews, Esq., has been arranged for the spring. The following gentlemen have most kindly offered to give these lectures:—Dr. Teale, of Leeds; Professor Corfield, Mr. Ernest Hart, Dr. Arthur Edis, Dr. Horatio Donkin, Mr. Ernest Turner, and Mr. G. Roumanes.

DR. TRIPE'S REPORT.—It having been reported to the Committee that houses were being built in Paddington, the foundations of which had been dug out and rubbish put in its place, Dr. Tripe was requested to report upon the matter. His report was forwarded to the proper authorities, who it is to be hoped will take action in the matter.

HOUSE SANITATION.—The Committee have been anxious during the past year to inaugurate a new branch of the Society's work in the shape of a House Inspection organisation. This scheme has taken some time to organise. The following gentlemen have been kind enough to act as Hon. Members of the Committee of this branch, and the rules drawn up by them are as follows:—

PROVISIONAL RULES.

- 1. All persons shall be entitled to the benefits of this department of the National Health Society upon the following conditions:—
 - A. That the rateable value of the house is not over £250 per annum except as hereinafter stated.
 - B. That the annual subscription, &c., paid shall be as under:—(a). For houses under £60 rateable value, half a guinea per annum. (b). For houses over £60 and up to £250 rateable value, one guinea per annum. (c.) An entrance fee of one guinea in respect of each house up to £63 rateable value, a fee of two guineas for each house over £60 and up to £250 rateable value.
- 2. Each such person (on production of satisfactory evidence of the assessed value of the house and) upon payment of the above named entrance fee and subscription for the first year, shall be entitled to a preliminary inspection of his house, and to a general report on a specified form upon its sanitary condition, with accompanying details, indicating under each head what constituted the proper arrangements of each service.
- 3. Each Member shall, in return for his or her subscription, be entitled to a half yearly inspection of his or her house by one of the Inspectors of the Department, and inspections will be made at other times for a small additional fee it required.
- 4. Each Member shall be entitled to an examination of the junction of his house drain with the sewer, the

fee for such examination shall be paid to the parish authorities by the Department, but if it be found in order to make out the report, that any opening up of the ground, or exposure of pipes, &c., is necessary, such assistance must, in every case be rendered by the subscriber's own workmen, and at his or her own expense.

- 5. The Department does not undertake to provide any plan or working specification of any work found necessary in any house, or to superintend such work during its progress.
- 6. In the case of houses over a rateable value of £250 per annum, the preliminary inspection and general report will not be undertaken by the Department, but on the production of an independent professional report stating that the house is in a good sanitary condition, indicating in detail the arrangement of each service and accompanied by proper plans to scale, special terms will be made for the periodical inspection of the house with a view to its maintenance in a wholesome condition.
- 7. The Department shall limit itself to the inspection of dwellings, and will not undertake the inspection of public buildings, hospitals, cattle lairs, workshops, &c.
- 8. The Department shall limit itself to the inspection of dwellings situate within four miles radius of Charing Cross.
- 9. The Membership shall cease upon failure to pay the annual subscription within two months after it became due.
 - 10. The Department shall commence operations as

soon as in the opinion of the Hon. Executive Council a sufficient number of adhesions shall have been received.

Any one interested in this special branch of the Society's work and willing to become a Member of it is requested to communicate with the Secretary, as the Committee do not feel justified in commencing operations until a certain number of subscribers are found to support their scheme.

SEATS ASSOCIATION. — The Committee also think it desirable to form a branch association for the purpose of erecting seats in the squares and thoroughfares of London, and anyone interested in this special work would further its object by communicating with the Secretary on the subject.
