



Hearty thanks are due to these ladies, who have so actively assisted the work of the Society by organizing these lectures, and also to those who have so kindly lent their houses for this purpose, as well as for the examinations held at the conclusion of each course.

Nearly 1,500 students have attended these courses of lectures during the year, proving in a highly satisfactory manner that the interest of former years taken in these classes is still maintained.

MEDAL EXAMINATION.—The third examination for the Medal of the Society was held on December 19 by the usual examiners, Dr. H. Willingham Gell, M.A., M.B. Oxon., Mr. John Gay, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., and Mr. Owen Lankester, M.R.C.S., for which eight ladies entered, the successful ones being Miss Amy Shepherd, Miss Irene Petrie, Miss Rebecca King Sandell, Miss Georgina Robertson, Miss Alice M. S. Rendell, and Miss Mary Phœbe Parry, all of whom will receive their SILVER MEDALS at the public meeting, which it is hoped will be held again next May, by the kindness of his Grace the Duke of Westminster, in Grosvenor House.

COUNTY COUNCIL TECHNICAL EDUCATION. —The sphere of the Society's work has been very widely extended during the past year by application having been made from many of the County Councils for lady teachers to give series of "Homely Talks" to members of the working class throughout the counties, in connection with the scheme for Technical Education. The subjects include "Home Nursing," "Laws of Health," "First Aid in Accidents," and "Artisan Cookery."

The first application was made by Mr. C. T. D. Acland, M.P., in April last, who succeeded in obtaining the services of fifteen of the lady teachers of the Society. For three months these lecturers made a tour through the towns and villages of Devonshire, where a most perfect organization was arranged for their visits in rotation to enlighten the villages, whose local secretary generally the clergyman of the village—had applied to the Central Secretary at Exeter for their services. The whole scheme was carried out most successfully, with the greatest enthusiasm, by local secretaries, teachers, and village audiences.

Since this first successful attempt many other counties have applied for similar courses of "Homely Talks," including Surrey, Norfolk, Suffolk, Lincoln, Essex, Cambridge, Kent and Buckingham, the work having been carried out in every instance with increasing success by the Society's staff of lady teachers, and it is greatly hoped it may now be permanently continued throughout England. The Secretary will be glad to supply all further particulars of this work, including terms, etc., to persons anxious to organize such teaching in their neighbourhoods.

TRAINING TEACHERS. — The Society, finding that more applications were made than could possibly be supplied by the somewhat limited staff of the Society's lecturers, arranged during the winter courses of *training* lectures for intending teachers of "Homely Talks." The following rules were drawn up, showing the qualifications considered necessary before a lady could be received as a student or intending "Homely Talker" for country lectures amongst the poor, preference being always given to those who had already trained as hospital nurses, deaconesses, or were accustomed to work amongst the poor.

QUALIFICATIONS.—"Anyone wishing to enter on "the course of training for enabling her to go up for "the Society's examination, and to qualify for the post of "Country Lecturer amongst the poor, must be an "educated gentlewoman, over twenty-five years of age, "and must have undergone Nursing Training at a "hospital or infirmary, and the Society's course of In-"structions for Teachers at the Society's Offices, 53, "Berners Street, on House Sanitation, Hygiene, Elemen-"tary Anatomy and Physiology, Home Nursing and "First Aid. They will also be required to pass the "Society's Examinations (theoretical and practical)."

The courses of instruction for intending teachers were arranged as follows, and the examination on the first three subjects (which have already been concluded) was held on December 22, when the following ladies succeeded in satisfying the examiners : Miss Dunbar, Miss Webb, Miss White, Miss Morgan-Brown, Miss T. G. Smith, Miss Baker, Miss Morgan, Miss Alice M. S. Rendell, Mrs. Kemp, Miss Pridham, Miss Sills, and Miss Silverlock.

The above Lectures will take place at 53, Berners Street, and will be of a specially practical nature, adapted to the requirements of the proposed Lectureships.

A Special Certificate will be given to successful candidates at the Examination.

Course of Nursing Training at a Hospital or Infirmary.

Fee for the above Course, £10 10s., including Examination.

This Course will not be considered as qualifying Candidates to give the Society's Technical Lectures on "Nursing," "First Aid," "Hygiene," and "Physiology," unless they have special knowledge in any of these subjects.

DR. A. T. SCHOFIELD'S LECTURES TO LADIES ON DOMESTIC AND PERSONAL HYGIENE. — These lectures have been resumed at various centres, and have been well attended, a large average from each class entering for the Society's examination held at the conclusion of each course.

FREE LECTURES AND "HOMELY TALKS."— The demands for these free lectures and practical "Talks" have been as numerous as ever, and it is only the want of funds that has prevented the Secretary from meeting all the applications received for this important branch of the Society's work, which is so much needed in the poor districts of London and the suburbs.

Many hundreds of these lectures have, however, been given to the mothers belonging to Mothers' Meetings aud Unions, as well as to the members of the Y.W.C.A., Girls' Friendly Societies, and Working Girls and Boys' Guilds, etc., at Earlsfield, East Sheen, Norwich, Gloucester, Woking, Danny - Hassocks, Wokingham, Chiswick, Plumstead, the Chelsea Barracks (for the soldiers' wives), Cobham, Kingston-on-Thames, Highgate, Brompton, Southgate, Nine Elms, Forest Gate, Ratcliffe, Blackfriars, Toynbee Hall, Lambeth, and elsewhere, on such subjects as "Home Nursing," "Washing and Dressing," "How to Keep the Home Healthy and Happy," "What to Do until the Doctor Comes in Cases of Accidents, as Burns, Scalds," etc., "The Prevention of the Spread of Fevers," "How to Disinfect," "Words to Mothers, and How to Rear their Infants," "Food and Cookery, with practical demonstrations, for the Working Classes," etc.

MISS FLORENCE STACPOOLE has given numbers of her most popular "Talks to Mothers." In Exeter she delivered a series to the members of the Women's Co-operative Society, and so greatly were they appreciated that the women of their own accord collected by subscriptions amongst themselves the sum of half a guinea, which they sent to the Society towards giving other poor women of their own class similar teaching.

MRS. DICKSON, MISS ROBERTSON, and MISS STURGESS (Medallists of the Society) have been as fully engaged as in previous years in spreading the knowledge they themselves have acquired at the classes of the Society, amongst the poor.

MISS PARRY is now engaged in giving the County Council Technical Lectures, in which work she is proving herself of great value to the Society. She has also been most successful in her "Ambulance" Classes for young people. She taught a large class of working boys and girls in Ratcliffe, E., who had lately left school. After each lecture practical demonstrations were given in bandaging, the putting on splints, applying tourniquets, etc., and at the conclusion an examination was held, the candidates acquitting themselves most creditably.

These lectures and "Homely Talks" can always be had on application to the Secretary. Members of the Society are entitled to a certain number free of charge for the poor of their neighbourhood.

MEETING AT GROSVENOR HOUSE .-- To the kindness of his Grace the Duke of Westminster the Society is again indebted for being allowed once more to hold the annual meeting for the Distribution of the Medals and Certificates in the Rubens Gallery, Grosvenor House. The meeting, which took place on Saturday, May 9, was as ever a complete success, and her Grace the Duchess of Westminster, as in former years, presented the Medals and Certificates to the successful candidates, who, on this occasion, presented themselves in such large numbers that, together with their friends and the members of the Society, the beautiful rooms were filled to overflowing. The Silver Medal of the Society was bestowed upon the following ladies : Miss Emily Peascod, Miss Emmie Sturgess, Miss Mary Delcomyn, Miss Susan Sills, Miss Mary R. Pridham, Mrs. Bell, Miss Edith M. Martyn, Miss Ella Lambert, Miss Charlotte Williams, and Miss Florence Bland.

THE DUKE OF WESTMINSTER took the chair and amongst those who spoke on the occasion were Dr. Thorne Thorne, F.R.S., and the Rev. C. J. Ridgeway.

DONATION FROM THE DUKE OF WEST-MINSTER.—Most hearty and sincere thanks are due to his Grace, who at the conclusion of the meeting announced his intention of giving a donation of £100 to the Society as an encouragement for the amount of useful work done and accomplished during the year. Later on many of the leading members of the Society followed his example by doubling their subscriptions, for which help the Society is greatly indebted.

LONDON SCHOOL BOARD.—There has been no examination for the Society's prizes during this year.

LIVERPOOL SCHOOL BOARD.—The examination in "Animal Physiology" for the Society's prizes was held in December, on which occasion 16 schools presented candidates, as against 14 last year. Excluding those disqualified, 90 girls were examined, an increase of 14 on the previous year. Of these 86 passed and 4 failed. The examiners report that "on the whole the results were distinctly good, and compare favourably with those of former years."

NORTH LONDON COLLEGIATE SCHOOL FOR GIRLS.—The Society's Prizes for "Laws of Health" and Domestic Economy for the year 1891 were presented as follows:

METROPOLITAN PUBLIC GARDENS THE ASSOCIATION .- This very active body, which is affiliated with the National Health Society, laid out five recreation grounds in 1891, opened two gardens temporarily, and was instrumental in acquiring seven open spaces for public use, made grants of seats for three thoroughfares and five spaces, planted trees in streets in nine districts, held classes in gymnastics in three grounds every Saturday during the year, erected two drinking-fountains, and successfully opposed two Bills in Parliament. There is no lack of energy on the part of those who are engaged in the work, and its results are becoming so well known that the advice of the Secretary upon open space matters is sought for from all parts of the United Kingdom and from foreign countries. The work "is one whose importance can hardly be over-estimated, because it is one for which the necessity is ever increasing." Funds are much needed in order to carry out the various schemes on hand, for which permission has been obtained, and all who sympathise with the efforts of the Association should communicate with the Earl of Meath, the Chairman, or with the Secretary, at 83, Lancaster Gate, W.
