IMPORTANT.

Appointment of Governors.

The Statutes definitely state :-

DEATH OF THE RIGHT HON. LORD ARMSTRONG, D.C.L., D.L., J.P.

The House Committee record with profound regret the death on 15th October, 1941, of the former Chairman, the Right Hon. Lord Armstrong, D.C.L., D.L., J.P.

Lord Armstrong retired from the Chairmanship only a few days before his unfortunate death as the result of an accident.

His association with the Infirmary extended over a period of 48 years, and during that time he was Chairman from 1902 to 1903 and from 1920 until the date of his resignation on 2nd October, 1941. The House Committee are deeply conscious of the great loss which charitable associations in the North generally, and this Hospital in particular, have suffered by his death.

His munificent gift of £100,000 towards the cost of building the present Infirmary will stand as a monument to his memory for all time.

The House Committee would take this opportunity to place on record their gratitude for his generous benefactions, for his great interest in the welfare of the Infirmary, and for his unfailing courtesy and kindness to all.

IN-PATIENTS AND OUT-PATIENTS.

During the year 14,198 patients were admitted to the general Wards of the Infirmary, as against 14,151 in 1940, which shows an increase of 47. New Out-patients show an increase of 4,923, and subsequent attendances an increase of 27,598, which makes a total increase in Out-patient attendances of 32,521.

The House Committee draw attention to the important and difficult problem of the large numbers of Out-patients attending this Hospital. In the present national emergency the problem is one of much concern, particularly in view of the call-up of many of our Medical and Surgical Staff to His Majesty's Forces.

The average length of stay of each In-patient was 12.46 days, which is slightly less than in the preceding year.

BEDS OCCUPIED AND BEDS AVAILABLE.

The average number of beds occupied during the year was 487, as against 495 in the previous year; a decrease of 8.

The total number of available beds in the general wards is 616, but of this number 74 are reserved for the reception of air raid casualties. Special equipment for resuscitation has been installed, also emergency lighting. The beds are kept in constant readiness for any emergency which might arise out of enemy action. 316 beds provided and equipped by the Ministry of Health are available, and reserved for possible air raid casualties.

OPERATIONS.

The number of operations performed was 17,423, as against 17,545 in the previous year, which shows a decrease of 122. The decrease is made up of 11 In-patients and 111 Out-patients.

APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN.

The House Committee have pleasure in reporting that Sir Ralph Mortimer, O.B.E., M.A., J.P., has been unanimously elected as their Chairman in succession to the late Lord Armstrong.

Sir Ralph Mortimer has been a member of the House Committee since the year 1912, and has been Vice-Chairman since 1920. His name is prominently associated with many charitable and welfare organisations in the district. He has always displayed the keenest personal interest in the work of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, and as Vice-Chairman has conducted the business of the various Committees with a broad and impartial spirit, endeavouring to give to all the benefit of his wide and valuable experience.

Sir Ralph Mortimer in accepting office as Chairman has expressed his deep appreciation of the honour, and has vouched to do everything in his power to further the best interests of the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

APPOINTMENT OF VICE-CHAIRMAN.

The House Committee have also pleasure in reporting the appointment of Mr. Norman D. Newall, O.B.E., J.P., as Vice-Chairman in succession to Sir Ralph Mortimer.

Mr. Newall has been a member of the House Committee since the year 1933, and Chairman of the Finance Committee since 1936. He has always shown a deep interest in the work and welfare of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, and his advice and counsel on the financial affairs of the Hospital have been of the utmost importance and value. We are fortunate in having him as Vice-Chairman, where his business experience and goodwill will continue to be applied for the benefit of this Infirmary.

PRESIDENT.

The House Committee have pleasure in reporting the appointment of The Right Rev. Noel Baring Hudson, Lord Bishop of Newcastle, as a President of the Royal Victoria Infirmary in succession to his predecessor, The Right Rev. Harold Bilbrough.

HONORARY LIFE GOVERNOR.

At a Quarterly Court of Governors held on 29th March, 1941, Mr. T. Swinhoe, of Stobswood, was elected an Honorary Life Governor in recognition of his valuable services to this Hospital as Treasurer of Stobswood Miners' Lodge over a period of thirty-four years.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL STAFF.

The House Committee record the death of Dr. T. C. Hunter, M.D., B.S., an Honorary Consulting Physician. Dr. Hunter was associated with the Infirmary for a period of 30 years and held the appointments of Medical Registrar 1911 to 1913, Honorary Assistant Physician 1913 to 1933, and Honorary Physician 1933 to 1935, and from then onwards as an Honorary Consulting Physician. The House Committee would take this opportunity of expressing their gratitude and appreciation of the loyal services which Dr. Hunter rendered to the Infirmary, and place on record their deep regret at the loss they have sustained by his death.

The House Committee record with deep regret the retirement of Dr. Horsley Drummond, M.D., B.S. from the office of Honorary Physician in accordance with the statutory age requirements. Dr. Drummond has been associated with the Infirmary for a period of 35 years, having held appointments as House Surgeon, House Physician, Honorary Assistant Physician and Honorary Physician. The House Committee are deeply sensible of the loss which his retirement entails, and take this opportunity of expressing their deep appreciation of the able services which he has at all times given in the interests of the patients under his care, and of his endeavour to secure the highest possible efficiency in the work of the Infirmary. In acknowledgment of such services the Governors, at a Quarterly Court held on 31st July, 1941, unanimously appointed him an Honorary Consulting Physician.

To fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Dr. Drummond, Dr. A. G. Ogilvie, M.D., B.S., M.R.C.P., Honorary Assistant Physician since the year 1933, has been appointed an Honorary Physician.

The House Committee have also to report the appointment of Mr. G. F. Rowbotham, B.Sc., F.R.C.S., as temporary Neurological Surgeon.

The House Committee desire to record their appreciation of the manner in which the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff have met the heavy demands made upon them during the past year, and to express their gratitude for the continuance of such devoted service on behalf of the patients.

ADMINISTRATION.

The House Committee have to announce the retirement of Mr. S. Dunstan, F.C.I.S., F.H.O.A., as House Governor and Secretary.

Mr. Dunstan entered the service of the Infirmary in the year 1904 as Head Pharmacist, and in the year 1922 was appointed House Governor and Secretary. Whilst holding the position of Head Pharmacist he was responsible for introducing methods whereby the Infirmary could manufacture many of its own commodities, by which means considerable saving in expenditure was effected. During his tenure of office as House Governor and Secretary he did much valuable work for the Infirmary, and his services were greatly appreciated. In recognition of these services the Governors, at a Quarterly Court of Governors held on 31st July, 1941, unanimously appointed him an Honorary Life Governor.

A Testimonial is also being raised in appreciation of his long and loyal service to the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

Mr. Dunstan is succeeded in the position of House Governor by Dr. A. W. Sanderson, formerly with Messrs. Cadbury Brothers, Bournville.

Dr. Sanderson is a graduate in Medicine and Surgery of the University of Edinburgh, and has, in addition, a wide commercial knowledge. He held important appointments with the firm of Cadbury Bros., first as Senior Medical Officer to its 10,000 employees, and afterwards as Head of its Export Department. His selection as House Governor was made from a wide field of applicants, and it is felt that his appointment to this important post will prove of inestimable value to the future administration of the Hospital.

The following new appointments have also been made:-

Mr. Clayton Welsh, A.C.A., formerly Chief Audit Clerk to the County Council of Durham, has been appointed Accountant.

Mr. D. T. Wedderburn, A.H.O.A., formerly Chief Clerk to the House Governor and Secretary, has been appointed House Governor's Assistant.

Mr. R. L. Wake, M.I.M.A.R.E., formerly Resident Engineer and Clerk of Works to the Newcastle General Hospital and Elswick Grange Institution, has been appointed Clerk of Works.

Of the 336 nurses in the R.V.I. there are 6 Sisters, 2 Staff Nurses and 28 Probationer Nurses in the Leazes Hospital (Pay-bed Section).

The average daily number of nurses on the Staff during the year, including Auxiliary Nurses, was 365.

The Heath Examinations for Nurses were held in November and the Heath Medal and Prize were awarded to Nurse I. James.

The General Nursing Council of England and Wales have approved provisionally of the Royal Victoria Infirmary as a complete training school for Male Nurses for a period of two years from December, 1940, or for the duration of the war, whichever is less.

The Committee are again indebted to the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff for their professional attention to the Nurses.

ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

There have been 6,607 patients dealt with in 1941, as compared with 5,786 in 1940. Of these 3,409 were assisted and 2,731 were given advice.

There were 3,312 instruments supplied and repaired during the year, as compared with 3,166 in 1940.

The Committee are grateful to all who have in any way assisted in the work of the Almoner's Department during the past year, and take this opportunity of expressing their thanks and appreciation.

It should be noted that the above figures relating to patients admitted do not include "Services" cases.

The total number of patients admitted was 1,315 and the average length of stay of each In-patient was 18.2 days.

The highest daily bed occupation was 80 and the lowest 43.

The number of operations for the year was 1,072.

A financial statement appears on page 12, and reference to this will show the expenditure amounted to £14,702 8s. 10d. the cost per occupied bed being £224, as against £227 in the previous year.

CASTLE HILL CONVALESCENT HOME, WYLAM-ON-TYNE.

The number of beds available throughout the year was 100 and the average number occupied was 97.3.

The total number of patients transferred from the Infirmary to the Home during the year was 1,729, as against 1,197 in the previous year, which shows an increase of 532. The increase is due to the de-reservation of beds under the Emergency Medical Services Scheme, which has resulted in the Home being used to the full capacity.

The average length of stay in the Home was 20.5 days, which compares with 22 days in the previous year.

Maintenance cost for the year amounted to £6,598 7s. 0d., an increase of £994 11s. 1d., as compared with the previous year.

Each occupied bed cost £68, as compared with £77 in 1940.

Miss K. V. Balshaw, Matron of Innes Hopkins Memorial Home, Ryton-on-Tyne, 1923 to 1934, and Matron of Castle Hill Convalescent Home, Wylam-on-Tyne, 1934 to 1941, has resigned. Miss L. B. Holmes has been appointed her successor.

The House Committee place on record sincere thanks and appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Miss Balshaw during her tenure of office as Matron.

NEWBROUGH LODGE, HEXHAM-ON-TYNE.

The number of beds available throughout the year was 15, and the average number occupied was 13.

95 children were transferred from the Infirmary to Newbrough Lodge during the year, and the average length of stay of each patient was 50 days.

Maintenance cost for the year amounted to £1,472 18s. 3d., the cost per occupied bed being £113.

The accommodation at Newbrough Lodge was only available for part of the year 1940, therefore yearly comparative figures against 1941 are not obtainable.

The cost per occupied bed on ordinary expenditure (excluding Leazes Hospital and the Convalescent Homes) was £299 10s. 3d. as compared with £266 8s. 7d. in the previous year.

OBITUARY.

The Committee record with deep regret the loss they have sustained by the death of the following:—

Mr. Edward Fothergill, L.D.S., R.C.S., who was Honorary Dental Surgeon to the Infirmary during the years 1880 to 1888.

Mr. R. H. P. Orde, O.B.E., B.A., F.H.O.A., who was House Governor and Secretary of the Infirmary for 20 years, and since his resignation in 1922 had been associated with the Central Bureau of Hospital Information as Director, and with the British Hospitals Association as Honorary Secretary. His work for the Voluntary Hospitals generally, and for this hospital in particular, will always be remembered with deep appreciation. Mr. Orde's death is a great loss to the hospital world, where his experience and personality were of great value and won for him the respect and affection of all who were privileged to work with him.

Lieut.-Col C. H. Innes Hopkins, D.S.O., who in 1923 presented to the Infirmary Ryton Towers, Ryton-upon-Tyne, as a Convalescent Home in memory of his two sons who lost their lives in the Great War. It will be recalled that this Home was sold in 1933, and the proceeds devoted to the upkeep of a Ward in the Infirmary which is known as the "Innes Hopkins Memorial Ward."

Mr. W. Straker, C.B.E., J.P., former Secretary of Northumberland Miners' Association. During the years 1907 to 1933 Mr. Straker was a member of the House Committee and various Sub-Committees. He was an enthusiastic worker in the interest and welfare of the Infirmary, doing much work in helping to augment the subscribed income from the Northumberland Miners. In acknowledgment of his many services to the Infirmary he was, in the year 1934, elected an Honorary Life Governor.

Alderman J. Moore, J.P., who was a member of the House Committee and various Sub-Committees representing Newcastle upon Tyne Corporation since the year 1923. He was a regular attender at Committees and took a keen personal interest in all matters appertaining to the work of the Infirmary, and his advice and counsel were much appreciated.

Miss Ellen Hood, who was employed as housemaid to the resident doctors, both in the old Infirmary and the present buildings, her service extending over a period of between 60 and 70 years. Miss Hood was a most devoted and loyal servant, and untiring in her service to the residents, to whom she was affectionately known as "Ellen."



Named Beds and Cots.

It would be difficult to suggest a better means of keeping in perpetual memory a relative or friend than the naming of a bed or cot.

A celebration of an event or a thank offering can be marked by the endowment of a bed or cot in the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

A bed may be named by a donation or legacy of £1,000 and a cot by a donation or legacy of £500. These amounts should be nett and not subject to any deductions for tax.

Every year approximately 26 patients occupy each bed or cot and money received for an endowment fund is invested and the income applied towards the maintenance of the bed or cot.

A tablet appropriately worded is affixed to each named bed or cot.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS.

ALL SUBSCRIBERS TO THE HOSPITAL WHO PAY INCOME TAX GIVE THEIR SUBSCRIPTIONS OUT OF INCOME UPON WHICH THEY HAVE ALREADY PAID TAX, BUT THE HOSPITAL CAN RECOVER THE TAX, AMOUNTING TO ONE GUINEA FOR EACH GUINEA SUBSCRIBED SO LONG AS THE INCOME TAX REMAINS AT 10/- IN THE £.

INCREASE OF SUBSCRIPTIONS BY RECOVERY OF INCOME TAX.

By virtue of the Income Tax Act, 1918, and subsequent Finance Acts, it is possible for the Hospital to effect an increase of its income by the recovery from the Inland Revenue Department of the Income Tax that has been paid by its subscribers in respect of their subscriptions. To enable the Hospital to do this, however, it is necessary that each subscriber should enter into a legally binding contract to pay to the Hospital an annual subscription of definite amount during a period of at least seven years.

The agreement is terminable by death, so that a subscriber's estate would not be liable for subsequent payments of the subscription.

The above figures do not include the Leazes Hospital Pay-bed Section or the Convalescent Homes which are shown separately on pages 46 to 48 inclusive.

During the year, 16,106 patients were admitted to the general wards of the Royal Victoria Infirmary (an analysis of which is shown below) against 14,442 in 1942: an increase of 1,664. The increase over the last year is largely due to the use of beds in Wards 2 and 5, which had previously been set aside for the reception of air-raid casualties, and to a larger turn-over of patients. The percentage of beds occupied was 88.5 as against 82.3 in the preceding year.

The decision to use the beds in Wards 2 and 5 was made owing to the lull in enemy activity in this district, and in consequence of the pressing need for further surgical in-patient accommodation. Arrangements have been made to evacuate the patients from these wards should an emergency arise out of enemy action necessitating their use for this purpose.

The average length of stay of each in-patient was 12.03 days, which compares with 12.5 days in the previous year. The length of stay shows a decrease of .47 days, and this is accounted for by the increased number of patients admitted; the demand on the bed accommodation being much greater than in the previous year.

New out-patients numbered 113,144 as against 106,617 in the previous year, which shows an increase of 6,527. Out-patient attendances numbered 205,352 as against 215,751 in the previous year, which shows a decrease of 10,399. Reference to the tables of in-patients and out-patients will show where these increases and decreases have occurred.

The appointments system for out-patients consultations which was instituted last year has been successful in considerably eliminating the waiting time of out-patients. Instead of a crowd of patients all coming at the one time, there is now a steady flow both going to and coming from the Hospital.

Improvements in the Waiting Hall of the Orthopædic Department by the erection of screens to protect the patients from draughts has added greatly to their comfort whilst waiting.

In the main Out-patient Department improvements have been agreed and will be put into effect when materials can be obtained.

OPERATIONS.

The number of operations performed was 16,886, which compares with 16,882 in the preceding year.

ALTERATIONS TO STATUTES.

At a Quarterly Court of Governors held on 17th June, 1943, the following alterations to Statute II. was agreed:—

Line 8—After the word "Radiological" delete the word "and" after the word "Children's" add the words "and Dental."

The alteration to this Statute has been made in order to provide for the appointment of an Honorary Dental Surgeon to the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

At a Quarterly Court of Governors held on 25th September, 1943, it was agreed that the following new Statute be substituted for the present Statute III.:—

NEW STATUTE III.

- Governors. (1) Every person subscribing £2 2s. 0d. or more per annum shall be a Governor.
 - (2) Any Company, Firm, Body of Employees or Charitable Organisation contributing in any one year the sum of £10 shall be entitled to elect one of their members as a Governor for the succeeding year in respect of every £10 so contributed.
 - (3) The Honorary Officers of the Institution shall be Governors so long a they continue in office.

IIIA.

Life Governors.

- (1) Any person giving £100 or more at any one time or ir any one year shall be a Life Governor. Every person bequeathing a legacy of £100 or more may nominate by his Will one person to be a Life Governor or if no such nomination be made, his Executor or Executors may nominate a Life Governor.
- (2) Any person rendering special services in collecting or raising money for the Institution may be appointed a Life Governor.

IIIB.

Ho norary Life Governors. The House Committee may from time to time propose to a Court of Governors the name or names of persons who in virtue of Special Services rendered to the Institution are worthy to be designated "Honorary Life Governors" with the full privileges of Life Governors.

IIIC.

The House Committee may from time to time make rules regulating any of the matters of the proceeding six paragraphs.

OLD STATUTE III.

Subscribers of two guineas or more a year shall be a Governor during the period of their subscriptions.

Benefactors of fifty guineas or more at one time shall be Governors for life.

Any person bequeathing a legacy of fifty pounds or upwards may, by his or her will, nominate a Life Governor.

Any Society, Association or Company contributing in one year the sum of ten pounds or upwards, shall be entitled, for every ten pounds, to appoint one of their members a Governor for the succeeding year.

The House Committee shall have authority to elect any individual a Governor for one year in return for any sum collected of not less than ten pounds.

Any individual, in acknowledgment of special services rendered in the Institution, may be elected a Governor for life by a Court of Governors on the recommendation of the House Committee.

The Honorary Officers of the Institution shall be Governors so long as they continue in office.

HONORARY DENTAL SURGEON.

The House Committee have much pleasure in recording the appointment of Professor R. V. Bradlaw, L.D.S., L.R.C.P., M.R.C.S., as Honorary Dental Surgeon to the Royal Victoria Infirmary. Professor Bradlaw is Director of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Dental Hospital and School, and is not only well known in this capacity, but also as a member of the House Committee. Professor Bradlaw will have an operating session and a nominal number of beds at his disposal in the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

CHILDREN'S DEPARTMENT.

The Out-patient department of the recently established Children's Department was opened on 1st July, 1943. Arrangements have been made with the Babies' Hospital of Blagdon, Seaton Burn, to use this department for their out-patients, and they have transferred equipment and apparatus which has assisted in the furnishing of the department.

The Committee take this opportunity to place on record their appreciation of the friendly co-operation of the University of Durham and the Babies' Hospital in the development of the Children's Department at the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

Out-patients are seen every afternoon with the exception of Saturdays and Sundays.

MINERS' WELFARE COMMISSION—RE-HABILITATION CENTRES.

On the suggestion of the Miners' Welfare Commission the House Committee has agreed to supply medical personnel for the re-habilitation centres at Hartford Hall, near Bedlington, and at the Hermitage, Chester-le-Street. Mr. C. Gordon Irwin, M.B., B.S., F.R.C.S. (Ed.), Honorary Orthopædic Surgeon to the Royal Victoria Infirmary, has been appointed as Honorary Medical Director of the Centres, and two of the Orthopædic Registrars will be Surgeons-in-charge, one for each centre. The Surgeons, although employed part-time at the Centres, will remain members of the Royal Victoria Infirmary Medical Staff and will be responsible clinically to Mr. Irwin, who, in turn, will be responsible to the Management Committee of the Miners' Welfare Commission. The Miners' Welfare Commission will refund to the Royal Victoria Infirmary any expenditure incurred in its assistance to the scheme.

These Centres will provide treatment for Miners of the Counties of Northumberland and Durham who have suffered fractures and similar injuries, and who require post hospital reconditioning.

SCHOOL OF PHYSIOTHERAPY.

A Massage School was founded in the year 1919 and celebrated its 25th Birthday on 1st October, 1943. Since its inception this department has treated some 2,000,000 cases. The School was founded on the recommendation of Dr. W. D. Arnison, M.A., M.D., L.R.C.P., M.R.C.S., who was at that time Honorary Physician in charge of the Electrical Department.

Miss M. G. Nicholson, T.M.G., T.M.E., of the Chartered Society of Massage and Medical Gymnastics, has been principal of the School since its foundation.

His Majesty the King has now approved by Order in Council the change of the name of the Chartered Society of Massage and Medical Gymnastics to that of "Chartered Society of Physiotherapy" and in consequence the House Committee of the Royal Victoria Infirmary have decided to re-name the Massage School "The School of Physiotherapy."

PHARMACEUTICAL SCHOOL.

The Royal Victoria Infirmary has been granted recognition for the purpose of accepting pupils for training under regulations of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain.

PROPOSED NEWCASTLE HOSPITAL CENTRE.

The Governors will remember that, prior to the outbreak of war, meetings were held with representatives of other Voluntary Hospitals in Newcastle-upon-Tyne to consider co-ordination of services. Sites in the Infirmary grounds were allocated to the various Hospitals and tentative plans were prepared for new buildings for grouping together the Voluntary Hospitals of Newcastle. Later, an application was made to the Commissioner of Special Areas for a grant in aid of extensions and eventually the Commissioner made an offer of a block grant of £155,000 from the Special Areas Fund. This was accepted and a joint public appeal was then launched by the Hospitals concerned for £350,000 for the proposed Hospital Centre on the Castle Leazes Site, Newcastle.

Much valuable work was done and a lot of progress was made, but with the advent of war and the consequent interruption of the projected building scheme, the meetings were suspended.

The discussions were resumed towards the end of 1942 and the Newcastle Hospital Centre Joint Committee was appointed. This Joint Committee appointed a Sub-Committee with the following terms of reference:—

"To advise the Joint Committee to what extent it can make a complete unified Hospital Centre."

This Sub-Committee consider the basic principles governing the aims and objects of the Hospital Centre may be defined as follows:—

- (1) That the Hospital Centre shall be planned to give the greatest degree of collaboration and co-operation between the participating Hospitals.
- (2) That the aims of this collaboration and co-operation shall be :-
 - (a) To provide the most efficient medical and nursing services for the patients.
 - (b) To develop and maintain a standard of work necessary for a University Teaching Hospital, a Training School for Nurses, and Centre for Medical Research.
- (3) That the buildings shall be planned to implement these aims and to provide the most efficient and economical arrangement of services.
- (4) That the buildings shall be architecturally satisfying as well as functionally efficient.

When discussions were interrupted by the outbreak of war, the general understanding was that the various participating Hospitals would be allotted land on the Castle Leazes site around the Royal Victoria Infirmary with varying degree of common services. It is now felt that a greater degree of centralisation and unity of purpose must be attained and the Sub-Committee approve the principle of a unified Hospital Centre Scheme.

The Committee have not yet been able to study the design of the building in detail, but they are unanimously of the opinion that it must be structurally pleasing and that it must function as a unified Hospital and University Teaching Centre and not as a number of separate Hospitals.

The Joint Committee and the Sub-Committee are meeting regularly but they are still in the preliminary stages of the discussion on the proposed Hospital Centre. These discussions will include:—

- 1. General Survey of the site.
- 2. Examination of the numerical estimates of in-patients and out-patients and their conversion into capacity equivalents.
- 3. Study of the working of the Hospital Centre as a traffic problem.
- 4. Possible use of the site and general suggestions for arrangements of buildings.
- 5. Preparation of diagrams.

CANCER ORGANISATION.

The requirements of the Cancer Act, 1939, have been postponed until May, 1944, but Local Authorities have been asked to submit schemes to the Minister of Health for his approval. Many meetings have been held by the Local Authorities in the North-East Region under the chairmanship of Alderman Walter Thompson, and a memorandum and draft agreements are now under final preparation and discussion, and one or two other meetings of Local Authorities and Hospital Authorities will be held to agree these documents before their submission to the Minister of Health.

The general intention in the North East Region is to provide a regional service whereby anyone suffering from cancer in any of its forms will have prompt, efficient and adequate diagnosis and treatment.

The Royal Victoria Infirmary will be asked to function as the Headquarters Hospital for the proposed Cancer Scheme in the North East Region.

THE FIRE GUARD (BUSINESS AND GOVERNMENT PREMISES) ORDER, 1943.

During the year constant supervision has been maintained over all the fire fighting organisation of the hospital. The equipment has been inspected periodically and everything possible has been done to ensure that the organisation will function to its highest degree.

400 Fire Guards are registered on our rota and approximately 50-60 have been on duty every night during the year. These consist of Royal Victoria Infirmary employees, Medical and Dental Students, and Pool Fire Guard.

Full provisional arrangements have been made for the adoption of the new Fire Guard Plan under which closer co-operation will be established with the National Fire Service so that the most efficient use can be made of the Fire Guards and the National Fire Service.

A Wardens Post has been established at the Royal Victoria Infirmary and to man this post 14 members of our Staff have been fully trained as air raid wardens.

We continue to receive much valuable help and co-operation from Divisional Officer Leyland of the National Fire Service and from the National Fire Service Teams who are regularly on the Royal Victoria Infirmary premises under the leadership of Company Officer Cowie.

The House Committee desire to thank the members of the National Fire Service, the Wardens, the Fire Guards, the Ambulance Drivers and Attendants and all those who have in any way assisted in the Fire Prevention Organisation in the Hospital.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL STAFF.

The House Committee desire to record their appreciation of the services of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff during the past year and to express gratitude for the personal service which they have given to the patients attending the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

The Medical staffing of the hospital is becoming increasingly difficult under war time conditions due to the recruitment of Medical and Surgical personnel to His Majesty's Forces, and in consequence of this much additional work has been thrown upon the remaining staff.

RETIREMENT OF PROFESSOR PYBUS.

The House Committee regret to record the retirement from active membership of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff of Professor F. C. Pybus, M.B., M.S., F.R.C.S., Senior Honorary Surgeon, whose term of office expired on 2nd November, 1943, under the statutory age limit. Professor Pybus has been associated with the Royal Victoria Infirmary for a period of 38 years, his first appointment being in 1906 as Surgeon in charge of the Out-patient Dressing Department. Other appointments since then have been House Surgeon, Surgical Registrar, Acting Assistant Surgeon. Honorary Assistant Surgeon, and for the past eighteen years as an Honorary Surgeon. The House Committee is very grateful for the valuable service rendered by Professor Pybus and have placed on record their appreciation of his interest in the welfare of the patients who have come under his care, and his loyalty in maintaining the high reputation of the Royal Victoria Infirmary. The House Committee recommended that he be appointed an Honorary Consulting Surgeon in acknowledgment of his services, and this recommendation was unanimously accepted by the Governors at a Quarterly Court held on 30th December, 1943.

APPOINTMENT OF HONORARY SURGEON.

To fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Professor Pybus the House Committee has appointed Mr. W. A. Hewitson, M.B., M.S., F.R.C.S., Senior Honorary Assistant Surgeon, as an Honorary Surgeon. Mr. Hewitson has been associated with the Royal Victoria Infirmary since the year 1917 and has held appointments as House Physician, Surgical Registrar, and for the past sixteen years as an Honorary Assistant Surgeon.

SPECIALIST DEPARTMENTS.

Improved arrangements have been made for Mr. G. S. Row-botham, B.Sc., F.R.C.S., who was appointed Honorary Neuro-logical Surgeon in 1941. Mr. Rowbotham attends at the Royal Victoria Infirmary regularly on Saturdays, and as required, to consult in determining the diagnosis and treatment of patients suffering from disease or injury to the brain and spinal cord.

- Mr. G. Mason, M.B., B.S., F.R.C.S., has been appointed Honorary Thoracic Surgeon and attends at the Royal Victoria Infirmary regularly on Wednesdays, and as required, for consultation on patients suffering from injury or disease of the chest.
- Mr. W. E. M. Wardill, M.B., B.S., F.R.C.S., has been appointed Honorary Plastic Surgeon and attends at the Royal Victoria Infirmary regularly on Thursdays and as required, for consultation on patients in need of faciomaxiliary repairs.

Dr. G. Davison, M.D.; B.S., M.R.C.P., D.C.H., R.C.P. & S., has been appointed Honorary Assistant Physician to the Children's Department. Dr. Davison has held appointments in the Royal Victoria Infirmary as House Surgeon, House Physician, as Junior Assistant Pathologist and as Medical Registrar.

Dr. Elsie Wright, M.D., B.S., who has held various appointments in the Children's Hospitals in Newcastle, has also been appointed an Honorary Assistant Physician to the Children's Department.

Dr. E. B. S. Scobie, M.B., Ch.B., D.C.H., R.C.P. & S., has been appointed as First Assistant and Dr. Brenda Morrison, M.D., B.S., as Registrar to the Children's Department.

PROFESSOR WILLAN-NAVAL APPOINTMENT.

The House Committee have much pleasure in extending to Professor R. J. Willan, M.V.O., O.B.E., V.D., M.B., M.S., F.R.C.S., an Honorary Consulting Surgeon of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and Emeritus Professor of Surgery of King's College, congratulations upon the honour of being appointed Consulting Surgeon to the Royal Navy with the rank of Surgeon Rear-Admiral.

BRIGADIER A. H. WHYTE-TERRITORIAL DECORATION.

The House Committee wish also to congratulate Brigadier A. H. Whyte, D.S.O., M.S., F.R.C.S., an Honorary Surgeon of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, who was awarded the Distinguished Service Order in 1940, upon the further honour of being awarded the Territorial Decoration.

Of the 338 nurses in the Royal Victoria Infirmary there are 5 Sisters, 8 Staff Nurses and 36 Probationer Nurses in the Leazes Hospital Pay-Bed Section.

The average daily number of Nurses on the Staff during the year, including Auxiliary Nurses, was 362.

The Heath Examinations for Nurses were held in December, and 47 candidates presented themselves for the examination for the Hospital Certificate of Training, all but one of them being eligible for the Heath prizes. 42 passed the examination and gained certificates. The Heath Medal and 1st prize was awarded to Nurse K. Harrison. The House Committee desire to express thanks to the Trustees of the Heath Bequest Fund for administering the Fund and for the prizes granted.

. The recommendations of the Rushcliffe Committee on Nurses' Salaries and Emoluments have been adopted by the House Committee and came into force on 1st April, 1943. All salaries of members of the Nursing Staff have been adjusted to comply with the recommendations.

ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

There have been 7,171 patients dealt with in 1943 as compared with 7,803 in 1942. Of these 3,974 were assisted and 2,744 were given advice.

There were 4,574 instruments supplied and repaired during the year as compared with 4,737 in 1942.

The House Committee desire to express their thanks and appreciation to all who have in any way assisted in the work of the Almoner's Department during the year.

The total number of patients admitted was 1,307 as against 1,358 in the preceding year; a decrease of 51.

The average length of stay of each In-patient was 19.72 days as against 18.3 days in the previous year.

The highest bed occupation was 84 and the lowest 48.

The number of operations for the year was 1,058, which compares with 1,165 in the preceding year.

The House Committee have received and approved a report by the Leazes Hospital Committee and other appropriate Sub-Committees for the re-organisation of the Leazes Hospital.

On and after 1st April, 1944, it is proposed to bring the organisation more closely under the central administrative control of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and a revised scale of charges will operate. For all patients with an income under £800 per annum these charges will be according to the medical or surgical requirement of the patient and the accommodation selected. CASTLE HILL CONVALESCENT HOME—WYLAM-ON-TYNE.

The total number of patients transferred from the Royal Victoria Infirmary to the Home during the year was 1,799 as against 1,690 in the previous year, which shows an increase of 109.

The number of available beds throughout the year was 100 and the average number occupied was 84.5.

Average length of stay of each In-patient was 17.14 days, which compares with 18.1 days in the previous year.

Maintenance cost for the year amounted to £7,921, an increase of £888 as compared with the previous year.

Each occupied bed cost £94 as compared with £84 in 1942.

NEWBROUGH LODGE, HEXHAM.

The House Committee has to report that as accommodation has become available for children in Emergency Medical Services Hospitals within easy access of Newcastle the Children's Hospital Annex at Newbrough Lodge, Hexham, was closed on 25th June, 1943.

It will be remembered that in 1937 Mr. and Mrs. N. D. Newall made a gift to the Royal Victoria Infirmary of Grey Court, Riding Mill, to be used as a Convalescent Home for Children. This Home was destroyed by fire in 1940 and shortly after this Mr. and Mrs. Newall offered part of their residence at Newbrough Lodge in order that children from the Royal Victoria Infirmary should still have convalescence in the country.

The House Committee are grateful to them for the use of this accommodation which has performed a useful service to the Royal Victoria Infirmary. The Children's Hospital Annex will remain at present as static emergency accommodation but this arrangement will be reviewed within the next few months and in all probability the Home will be closed completely on 7th April, 1944.

FINANCE.

During the year 1943 the Infirmary spent on the maintenance of the hospital and welfare of patients £204,134. Contributions to meet this expenditure were received as follows:—

The income for the year was £29,004 short of the sum required to pay the ordinary expenses of the hospital, and the service of the R.V.I. has again been maintained only by drawing upon reserves and borrowing from the Bank the money not otherwise provided.

The seriousness of this position has been constantly with the Finance Committee during the past four years, and has been repeatedly brought to the attention of the Governors of the Infirmary and the general public.

While the Committee are very pleased to record an increase of £22,724 in the ordinary income of the Infirmary, principally due to increase in the subscribed income to which reference is made in the report of the Subscriptions Committee, and this increase is a very welcome set-off to the constant rise in ordinary expenditure, which will continue in 1944, it has left almost unaffected the position of the annual deficit of the order of £30,000 which has been the experience in the last three years. It is essential that this deficit be removed, and this can only be done by a substantial increase in subscribed income. The Finance Committee earnestly hope that the aim of the Subscriptions Committee to induce an adequate subscribed income will be realised in 1944.

The expenditure for 1943 is £14,050 more than the expenditure for 1942. £2,056 of this increase is due to an alteration in the recording of expenditure on the Radium Department towards which the North of England Cancer Campaign provides an annual contribution. This contribution in past years has been deducted from the expenditure and not shown in the accounts. The full expenditure and the income of £2,056 is now recorded. Similarly, the full expenditure on Pensions is now recorded and the appropriate contribution of £1,278 from the Pension Fund shown as a receipt.

The major items accounting for the remaining increase of £11,152 in expenditure in 1943 are as follows:—

During the year the income from legacies has again been above the average, a total of £32,581 11s. 6d. being received, of which £10,443 6s. 11d. has been added to the endowment fund in accordance with the directions of the testators. The balance has been carried to the legacies reserve account, the total of which now stands at £38,495 0s. 7d.

A sum of £50,294 14s. Od. has been received during the year from the Minister of Health and added to the Emergency Hospital Services Suspense Account, from which £15,000 has been transferred to revenue account to meet the cost of treating military patients during the year. It is hoped the balance of both the Legacies and Emergency Hospital Services Suspense Accounts will be available for building and other purposes as required; for the time being these funds have to be used as a set-off against the bank overdraft on revenue account, which at 31st December, 1943, amounted to £161,468 6s. 5d. This overdraft, principally created

by the failure of income to keep pace with the rising wartime expenditure, is a constant source of anxiety to the Finance Committee and remains as a serious obstacle to the full and proper development of the hospital. Our duty as an Infirmary is to provide proper accommodation and care for the sick and injured who come for advice and treatment and our function as a University Teaching Hospital and the Key Hospital and Medical Centre in the North-East is to develop the scientific investigation into the causes and best treatment of disease and disability. The Finance Committee are conscious of their responsibility in controlling the income and expenditure of the Infirmary for these purposes and they feel that there can be few subjects more worthy of consideration by anyone seeking to provide relief to the sick and physically disabled than the provision of adequate general funds including a sum of money for the removal of the overdraft.

OBITUARY.

The House Committee record with profound regret the loss they have sustained by the death of the following:—

His Grace the Duke of Portland, who was a President of the Royal Victoria Infirmary for many years.

Mr. Robert Whillis, M.A., M.B., B.Ch., F.R.C.S. (Ed.), who was associated with the Royal Victoria Infirmary for a period of seventeen years and held appointments in the Throat, Nose and Ear Department as Registrar, Honorary Assistant Surgeon and from the year 1941 as Honorary Surgeon in Charge of that department.

The House Committee desire to express their deep appreciation of his services to the hospital and their sense of the loss of one who was much esteemed by all his colleagues and members of the House Committee.

Dr. Peter P. Bedson, D.Sc., F.C.S., J.P., who was Honorary Pathologist and Analytical Chemist during the years 1888 to 1913, and who on his retirement from this post was appointed an Honorary Life Governor in acknowledgment of his services.

Dr. H. E. Gamlen, M.B., B.S., D.P.H., who was Honorary Assistant to the Radiological Department from 1923 to 1925 and Honorary Physician in charge of that department from 1925 to 1930, since when he has been an Honorary Consulting Physician to the department. Dr. Gamlen was one of the pioneers of X-ray work and suffered severely from exposure to X-radiation during the Great War. The House Committee are conscious of the great personal sacrifices made by the late Dr. Gamlen in the interests of the science of Radiology and also of his unremitting services to the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

Mr. T. Dunbar who was elected a member of the House Committee in March, 1943, representing Newcastle and Gateshead Gas Company. Mr. Dunbar was a Governor of the Royal Victoria Infirmary for many years prior to his election to the House Committee and gave much devoted time in the interests and welfare of the hospital.

Mr. W. Johnson, V.C., who was employed as a porter by the Royal Victoria Infirmary for many years prior to the Great War, and who for his valour and distinguished services in 1918 was

awarded the Victoria Cross.

GENERAL.

The House Committee desire to express gratitude to the various Committees, the Honorary Treasurer, the Honorary Solicitors, the Auditors, the House Governor, the Matron, the various Heads of Departments, the General Staff, the Arnison Surgical Aid Society, the Newcastle Blood Transfusion Service, the Singing Band, the Ward Garment Guild, and all friends who have assisted in entertaining the patients. The House Committee are also grateful to all those who have sent gifts of money and in kind and to those who have so generously helped in other ways.

It is regretted that owing to ill-health Mr. J. Walker, who has represented Gateshead District on the House Committee for a period of 30 years, has been obliged to resign from the Chairmanship of the Patients Admission Committee. Mr. Walker has been Chairman of this Committee since 1941 and was previously Vice-Chairman from the year 1933. He has rendered invaluable service to the Royal Victoria Infirmary during his long association, and in 1918 his services were recognised when he was appointed an Honorary Life Governor.

We continue to receive much help and advice from the Central Medical War Committee and the Local Medical War Committee on the many Medical staffing problems which confront us under these difficult war-time conditions. These difficulties rather than diminishing are becoming more complicated as the war proceeds. Increasing demands are being made for the recruitment of Medical personnel for His Majesty's Forces, and the problem of staffing the Hospital is daily becoming more complex.

We again record our thanks to the various officials of the Ministry of Labour and National Service for their sympathetic consideration of our Labour requirements.

The general position in regard to the deferment and retention of Lay employees has shown some general improvement. The situation in regard to Domestic employees should improve by the direction of domestic labour to Hospitals which is proposed by the Minister of Labour and National Service.

The recommendations of the Hetherington Committee on Hospital Domestics' wages rates and conditions was published during the year, and the House Committee, after careful consideration, have agreed to their adoption. The necessary adjustments have been made in the wages of Resident and Daily Domestics and the increases will involve the Hospital in an additional expenditure of £3,000 per annum.

Apart from wages and conditions of service such as hours of work and off duty time, it is recognised that the question of amenities is one of considerable importance. The principal amenity is accommodation, but owing to the impossibility of securing labour and building materials during the war very little can be done to effect any immediate substantial improvements. The question is one which will not be lost sight of and every consideration will be given to it as opportunity presents itself.

The House Committee desire to acknowledge the assistance of the Press in giving publicity to matters relating to the work and needs of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, and thank the City Council for granting the use of the City Hall for the purpose of holding the Annual Meeting; also Alderman Walter Thompson, J.P., then Lord Mayor of Newcastle, for presiding at the last Annual Court of Governors.

REPORT OF THE SUBSCRIPTIONS COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR 1943.

The total subscribed income for the year 1943 was £114,709. 11s. 5d.; an increase of £12,460 1s. 0d. over the amount received in the previous year. £5,879 of this increase came from workmen contributors and £6,581 from other voluntary contributors.

The 1943 contributions from workmen were equal to 37 per cent. of the total amount expended during the year on maintaining the hospital. Other voluntary donors contributed 19 per cent. of the expenditure; in total, 56 per cent. of the expenditure for the year 1943 was met from subscribed income.

The increase in workmen's contributions, while very welcome and greatly appreciated, is disappointing when compared with the increase of £15,700 in 1942 and the increase needed to ensure the financial stability of the hospital. The Committee have continued their efforts to enrol as subscribers workpeople not already making direct contributions to this hospital, and a further 127 new groups of workmen have during 1943 agreed to become direct subscribers.

While the importance of enrolling new subscribers is fully appreciated the Committee are convinced that the enlisting of new subscribers cannot of itself provide any substantial solution to the immediate financial problem of the hospital. The true solution lies in an increased rate of contributions by all subscribers and the workmen governors on the House Committee invited all workmen governors to attend a meeting in the City Hall, Newcastle, on 27th November, 1943, when the need for increased subscriptions was fully explained and an appeal made for a direct subscription of at least 3d. per head from all workmen in the district. The response to this appeal has been good. Every possible effort is being made to obtain its general acceptance and with the full understanding of the Infirmary's need and the continued assistance and good-will of the governors of the Infirmary and the workpeople of the district the appeal will be successful.

The interest of the general public in the welfare of the Infirmary and the general appreciation of its service has been well expressed by the increase in income from personal donors, patients' contributions, employers' contributions and the large number of efforts and local collections organised by voluntary workers and district committees. There has been a substantial increase in the number of subscriptions paid under a 7-year covenant and these covenants now provide an addition of some £300 per annum to the value of the covenanted subscriptions.

The increased income from general contributors is very welcome and the Committee are most appreciative of the financial support of and the spirit of the very many who have given so much personal time and effort on behalf of the Royal Victoria Infirmary.

The Committee again express their deep appreciation of the facilities offered by employers in so kindly acting as honorary agents in collecting and forwarding workpeople's contributions and of the assistance of the various officials and honorary workers of medical charity funds. These aids are of great importance to the Infirmary.

Towards the end of 1941, when the seriousness of the financial position, created by wartime conditions, and by plans for improvement and development, was becoming more clearly recognised, a subscribed income target of double the 1940 income was aimed at. The following table shows the progress made to date:—

For the year 1944 the subscribed income target is at least £160,000. This income is necessary to carry on the work of the hospital. Ward 1 .- THE "KING EDWARD" WARD .- This ward is named the "King Edward" Ward, after H.M. King Edward VII., Patron of the Instition, by whom the opening ceremony, on the 11th July, 1906, was performed.

Ward 2.—The "Queen Alexandra" Ward.—This ward is named the "Queen Alexandra" Ward, after H.M. Queen Alexandra, who was present with H.M. King Edward VII., at the opening ceremony on the 11th

July, 1906.

Ward 3 .- THE "GIBSON" WARD .- Male side: This ward is named the "Gibson Ward," after Thomas Geo. Gibson, Esquire, J.P., of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, to commemorate his gift of £5,500 to the Queen's Commemora-

tion New Infirmary Fund.

THE "HEATH" WARD.—Female side: This ward is named the "Heath" Ward, after George Yeoman Heath, Esq., M.D., D.C.L., F.R.C.S., a distinguished Surgeon, and a Consulting Surgeon to the Institution. Elected Surgeon, 9th November, 1854; re-appointed Surgeon, 1869; appointed Consulting Surgeon, 1880; died, 4th March, 1892.

Ward 4 .- THE " NORTHUMBERLAND " WARD.

Ward 5.—THE "RILEY LORD" WARD.—This ward is named the "Riley Lord" Ward, after Sir Riley Lord, J.P., Chairman of the Building Committee of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, by whose zeal and energy, when Mayor of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in 1896-7, a fund of over £100,000 was raised for the re-building of the Royal Infirmary in commemoration of the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria in 1897.

Ward 6 .- THE "HUME" WARD .- This ward is named the "Hume" Ward, after George Haliburton Hume, Esquire, M.D., D.C.L., F.R.C.S., Ed., Honorary Surgeon to the Royal Infirmary, 1878-1905, and afterwards

a Consulting Surgeon to this Institution.

Ward 7.—The "Workmen's Memorial" Ward, in acknowledgment of the contribution of £18,670. 2s. 7d. by the workmen of the Counties of Newcastleupon-Tyne, Northumberland and Durham, to the Queen Victoria Commemoration New Infirmary Fund. The following Workmen Governors were members of the House Committee at the time of the opening of the Royal Victoria Infirmary on 11th July, 1906:-Mr. E. W. 
