

Report.

THE Directors are happy to announce that, owing in great measure to the efforts of the newly-formed Council under the active presidency of H.R.H. Princess Christian, it has at last been found possible to take a step forward and proceed with the erection of the new bungalow for the accommodation of further patients, to which we have so long looked forward.

It is with great regret that we record the death on the 21st of April of Father George, S.D.C., who had acted as Chaplain and devoted himself entirely to the life of the place since 1919. His death was in part the cause of, and shortly followed by, the decision of the Society of the Divine Compassion to withdraw from'St. Giles' Homes, a decision occasioned solely and inevitably by the lack of numbers sufficient to carry on all their many activities. When the Reverend Clinton Engleheart, Chaplain to the Lepers of Robben Island, began in 1912, with the help of Lady Loch and Sir Arthur Downes, to raise money for the foundation of the Homes, the Society of Divine Compassion undertook their administration at his request. It is impossible in a Report to do justice to the labours of the various Members of the S.D.C. who have lived and worked amongst the patients since those early days, or to give any idea of their neverfailing devotion under the most difficult and trying circumstances. We must content ourselves, therefore, with the bare record of our deep gratitude for all that they have done and our sincere regret at the decision which they felt bound to make.

It was no easy matter to fill, even in part, the gap occasioned by the retirement of the Brothers, and it was a piece of good fortune when the Reverend W. P. Pring, happening to come by accident on a visit to the Homes, heard of our difficulties, and offered himself as Chaplain. Father Pring came into residence in September, and in spite of great personal discomfort, owing to the lack of proper accommodation, has taken up his duties with enthusiasm. These include keeping of the accounts and the general outdoor management of the place.

The new bungalow is planned to hold four patients. But more patients necessarily entail more nurses; and the little house where Sister Clare lives with her staff is not large enough for all the workers who will be required to look after the increased number of patients. It was therefore decided to adapt the building formerly occupied by the Brothers of the S.D.C. for the use of more Nurses, and to build also a cottage for the Chaplain. These buildings, now in course of erection, will exhaust the money at our disposal, and we must therefore set about to collect further funds for the complete drainage system, which with the growth of the place has become a very urgent necessity, for the making of a road, and for other much-needed improvements.

We are happy to report that Sir William Haynes-Smith, K.C.M.G., late Governor of Cyprus, has joined the Board.

The death of Dr. John Turner, who joined the Board in 1918, is much regretted, not only by the Directors but by the Nurses and the patients, to whom he showed great kindness, attending them regularly every month for several years.

The Directors wish to record their sincere gratitude to Mr. Paul Waterhouse, P.R.I.B.A., one of the best friends of "St. Giles," for his invaluable help and advice and never-failing courtesy and kindness during the past nine years. They desire to offer their warm thanks to Mr. Thomas G. Angell, L.R.I.B.A., of the firm of Messrs. Imrie and Angell, who has designed the buildings now in hand, giving his services freely.

The Directors beg to thank their friends and supporters whose liberality has made possible the erection of the new buildings for many handsome donations. They gratefully acknowledge a grant of £700 from the United Services Fund, £125 from the Trustees of the Strathcona Bequest, £200 from the Trustees of the Sherburn Hospital, Durham, and £25 from the Trustees of Ripon Hospital. They have received £700 under the will of Miss Land, during her lifetime a generous benefactor to "St. Giles." A useful addition has been made to the building of "Moor House," paid for by money collected almost entirely by Sister Clare. Very substantial help has been given by local friends of "St. Giles," who have collected large sums of money towards the building fund, and have also purchased a houseboat and a sailing boat on the River Crouch for the use of the patients during summer. A sum of \pounds 144 has been kindly lent for a year, free of interest, towards the cost of the Chaplain's bungalow. A meeting held in Holy Trinity Hall, Sloane Square, on November 14th, at which an entertainment was given by juvenile members of "The Old Vic "Shakespeare Company, resulted in the raising of a sum of $\pounds 116$. The best thanks of the Directors are offered to Miss Baylis, to Miss Roma Frank, and to all who took part in or helped to organise this very successful performance.

The Directors are glad to announce that they have received the promise of a donation of $\pounds 1,000$ conditionally on the further sum of $\pounds 5,000$ being given before the end of October next. In view of the fact that the annual grants and subscriptions fall short of the amount required for a year's maintenance and upkeep of the Homes by $\pounds 1,100$, it will be seen how very essential it is that an endowment fund should be created. It is to provide the nucleus of such a fund that the generous donor has come to our assistance. The Directors appeal most earnestly to their supporters to make it possible for them to inform the donor that his condition has been fulfilled.

In accordance with the Articles of Association, Sir Montagu Pollock, Bart., and Dr. J. M. H. MacLeod retire from office, but being eligible offer themselves for re-election.
