# Report of the Directors.

In 1925 there was a further increase in the number of patients in the Homes; two new patients were received, bringing the total up to eleven. One of the younger patients is so much improved in health that he has been able to leave the Homes after a stay of two years, the disease in his case being apparently arrested.

A new bungalow, designed to accommodate three patients, was built during the year at a cost of about £1,000. On its completion we were able to receive a lady who had for some time been waiting for admission and whose case is a very pathetic one, for she is the widow of one of our former patients, who died in the Homes in 1916. The other new patient is a delightful little boy of nine, who was born in Brazil, and came to school in England at the age of six. His mother is dead; his father, who hurried to England from Brazil in great distress of mind on hearing the diagnosis, has now gone back there, saying that he had never seen the boy so happy before. His education is not being neglected, for he receives regular instruction by the kindness of one of the other patients.

Great improvements have been made to Moor House, the little farm-house which was bought with the property and has been used by the Nurses as their dwelling ever since. It was badly built, cold and damp, the walls were cracked and it began to show signs of collapse. The walls have now been underpinned and covered with weather boarding, and a damp course has been added. The refectory has been lengthened, some additional sleeping accommodation provided, and the kitchen, larder and dairy rebuilt. The expense of these repairs and additions has been great, amounting to some £2,000, but is, however, less than half of what it would have cost to rebuild the whole.

The accommodation provided for the Sisters is of the simplest possible character; they devote their lives freely and entirely to the care of the patients, and do not ask or wish for comforts. A large Naval Hut was put up to shelter them while the alterations were going on; and during six months, from

September to February, they have been practically camping out in the bitterest weather and under conditions of great discomfort. Yet not one word of complaint has ever reached the ears of the Directors.

The high annual cost of maintenance per patient is sometimes a subject of criticism, and compared unfavourably with that in other institutions. But our patients are for the most part very helpless and require a great deal of individual attention and nursing. They receive regular medical treatment twice a week, the drugs and appliances used being of a very costly nature. It will readily be understood that in an institution of this sort, with so small a number of patients, the cost per head is bound to be somewhat high. Our critics do not realise how much is done for love by Mother Clare and the Sisters of St. Giles, and how few and simple are their own wants; nor do they consider how vastly greater would be the cost of running the Homes with paid nursing and domestic staffs.

A medical block has also been built to provide the doctors with suitable quarters for the treatment and inoculation of the patients, which have been lacking hitherto. It contains a small operating room, doctors' room, and two small bedrooms for the use of the Sisters on night duty. This building, which was considered by our medical advisers to be quite indispensable for the proper treatment of the patients, has cost £730.

Electric lighting, which was fitted to the patients' quarters in 1924, has been extended to the remaining buildings, to the great convenience of all concerned. For collecting the balance of £120 needed to complete the installation of the light, we are once more indebted to Mr. Ransford; also to the Revd. Canon Ost, Rector of East Hanningfield, who raised £30 at a garden fête, which he organised for the purpose.

Through the kindness and generosity of Sir William Haynes-Smith, the laundry has been fitted with a complete set of electrical washing and ironing machines. This has proved to be a great boon to the Sisters, saving them an immense amount of labour and discomfort.

Christmastide was saddened by the sudden death from pneumonia of one of the patients, a young man of 26, a native of Singapore, who had been at St. Giles's for nearly four years.

Our President, Princess Marie Louise, has been indefatigable in her efforts on behalf of St. Giles; and, determined to know the Homes from the inside, she has been down to stay with the Sisters at Moor House for several days. She was thus able to enter thoroughly into their life and to make friends with the patients individually, to whom her visits have given the greatest pleasure. With a view to making the work more widely known, Her Highness has formed the "Fellowship of St. Giles," the members of which pledge themselves to work for the support of the Homes. Successful meetings have been held at Chester and Oxford, and the prospects for the future success of this organisation are very encouraging.

We beg to thank our supporters for several very handsome donations, including one of £1,000 from the Peter Coats' Trustees, which has been spent on the erection of the new bungalow. We have received £505 from Mrs. Tetley, £200 from Lady Strathcona, £200 from the British Red Cross, £100 from Lady Grainger, £120 from C. C. Courtauld, Esq., for electric light, and annual grants of £250 from the Trustees of the Strathcona Bequest, £200 from the Trustees of the Sherburn Hospital, Durham, and £25 from Ripon Hospital. Our best thanks are given to the Hon. Mrs. Henn Collins for arranging a theatrical performance at the Century Theatre on February 16th, which brought in £152; to Mrs. Philip Snowden, for her lecture on March 25th, at 27. Grosvenor Square, entitled "Through Bolshevist Russia," at which more than £500 was raised; and to all those other friends who have organised entertainments during the past year, with the object of raising funds for the Homes and interesting the public in their work. Nor must we forget the delightful concerts given at the Homes themselves for the entertainment of the patients by Miss Baylis's "Old Vic." Company, Toc H, and the Burlesque Company. Generous gifts of improved wireless apparatus have also added much to the enjoyment of the patients.

Dr. Pirrie is a very staunch friend of St. Giles, who never spares himself any trouble, and has endeared himself by numerous acts of generosity and kindness to both patients and nurses. Among others to whom we are indebted is Miss Haughton, formerly Matron of Guy's Hospital, who, we are glad to say, remains in charge of the Guest House. We wish to offer her our warmest thanks for many kind services unobtrusively rendered.

It will be seen that a great deal of money, much of which was subscribed for that express purpose, has been spent on building during the year; so that, in spite of the generous donations mentioned above, we find our finances at the time of writing at a very low ebb. Although our institution is a small one, it is carrying on work of national importance. Cases of leprosy, contracted in different parts of the Empire, are constantly coming into the United Kingdom, where there is no state provision for them, so that the Homes of St. Giles may be said to be filling a serious gap in the system of Public Health. Under present financial circumstances there seems little prospect of our getting any pecuniary assistance from the Exchequer; and we are left with the necessity of continuing to raise, beyond what we receive in regular annual subscriptions and grants, about £1,000 a year for maintenance alone.

We regret to announce the resignations of Sir William Haynes-Smith, and of Sir Humphry Rolleston, on his appointment to the Chair of Physic in Cambridge University. Also that of Lord Buxton, to whom our warmest thanks are offered for his kind co-operation and advice since he became Chairman of the Council on its formation in 1921. We are happy to record that Lady Trotter, a Member of Princess Marie Louise's Association, to whom we are already much indebted for her co-operation with Mr. Ransford in starting an Endowment Fund, has joined the Board. We also welcome most heartily Mr. Harold Morris, now President of the Industrial Court, the son of our first Chairman, the late Sir Malcolm Morris. In accordance with the Articles of Association Sir Montagu Pollock and Mr. T. G. Angell retire from office, but being eligible offer themselves for re-election.
