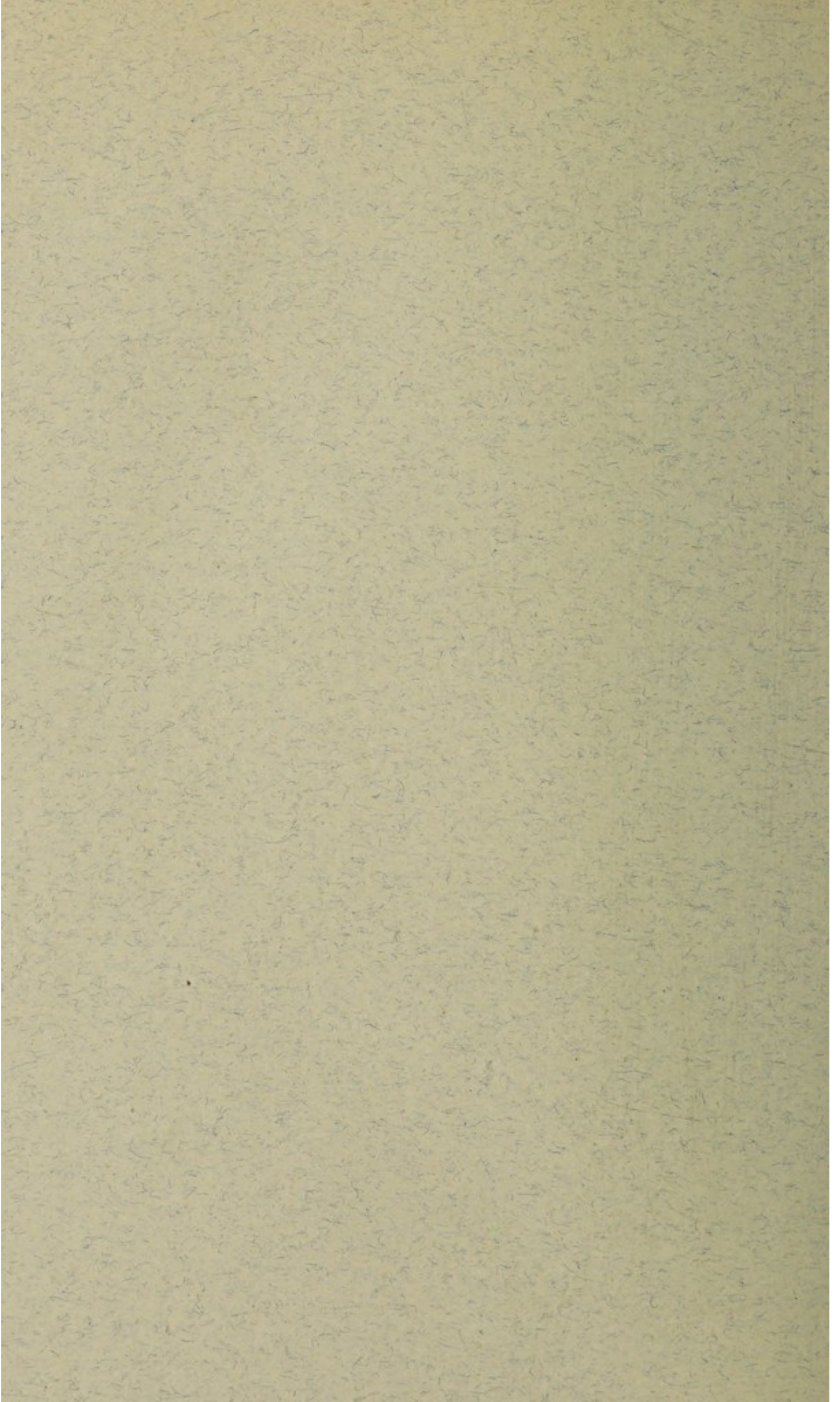

Report of the Executive Committee.

IN 1926 two new cases were received into the Homes, making a total of eleven patients.

The year has been one of progress. As stated in the last Report, great improvements were made during the winter of 1925-26 to Moor House, which has served very inadequately as nurses' quarters since the Homes were started in 1914. The building was re-opened by our President, Her Highness Princess Marie Louise, on April 29th. It is a great satisfaction to know that the Sisters have at last a substantial and damp-proof dwelling and that the worst, at any rate, of the discomforts they had so long endured without a murmur are at an end. Besides the main structural alterations, the house has been considerably enlarged; it now has a good refectory, a community room, a bigger kitchen and several new cells.

The surgical block, begun in 1925, was also completed last year. It contains a small operating theatre, doctors' room, and bedrooms for Sisters on night duty, and enables the inoculations that form a very important part of the treatment of the patients to be carried out under proper conditions. This building, which cost about £700, was to a great extent the gift of the Revd. Clinton Engleheart, Canon of Capetown, who more than anyone else was instrumental in starting the Homes. During the summer, on one of his rare holidays from his duties as Warden of St. Raphael's, Faure, South Africa, Canon Engleheart paid several visits to St. Giles, to the great delight not only of the patients but of the Sisters, who were glad to benefit by advice based on the experience of a life spent in work of the same kind.

The large naval hut in which the nurses had been living during the rebuilding of Moor House has been moved and set up in a convenient position close to the patients' bungalows. A few alterations have transformed it into a fine recreation room, with proper stage and fittings, and a billiard room at the back. Besides providing a suitable place for the patients' own Christmas

performances and the entertainments so kindly given for them by Miss Baylis and other friends, the old billiard room was in this way set free for the reception of another patient, and shortly afterwards occupied.

These improvements involved an expenditure during the year of over £3,000 on Capital Account, some of which could not have been foreseen. The additions turned out to be more costly than was anticipated; new furniture had to be bought, and some quite unexpected, but absolutely essential, repairs carried out. Thus it happens that for the first time for many years the Committee have been forced to apply to their Bankers for an advance.

The regular income of the Homes, namely, that derived from annual grants and subscriptions and from dividends, is less than half that required for their maintenance, and every year or two great effort has to be made to raise the balance needed. Experience has shown that money is more readily forthcoming for special objects, such as a new patients' bungalow, the Chaplain's cottage, or an electric lighting plant, than for the less interesting purpose of mere upkeep.

The Fellowship of St. Giles formed by Her Highness in 1925, with its branches in different parts of the country, has been very active in making known the wants of the Homes, and increasing the number of subscribers, besides collecting money in other ways. It will be seen from the accounts that the Fellowship raised last year £500 for building and £300 for the General Fund.

But many more annual subscribers must be found before constant anxiety as to the future can be removed. The Homes have grown from the humblest beginnings thirteen years ago, and will, it is hoped, continue to do so until every case of leprosy in the country in need of assistance can be taken in. With their growth there is a corresponding increase in annual expenditure and the financial problem becomes more difficult. It is urged that every subscriber should endeavour to enlist at least one new annual subscriber, and with this object in view a copy of the appeal just issued, which gives the main facts about St. Giles, is enclosed with this Report.

The Committee gratefully acknowledge the following grants: from the Government of the Federated Malay States, £100; from the Trustees of the Strathcona Bequest, £245; of Sherburn Hospital, £200; and of Ripon Hospital, £25; also a further donation from the Peter Coats' Trustees of £100, and one of £50 from the St. Francis Leper Guild. They have received legacies of £50 from the Estate of Lady Fermor Hesketh, £500 from that of Miss S. Hewitt, and £100 from that of Mrs. A. H. Taylor. Hearty thanks are again due to Miss Lilian Baylis and the members of the "Old Vic." Company for their ever welcome entertainments for the patients; also to Miss Taverner and the St. Peter's Players for a delightful performance. Mr. Charles Marford has been most kind in painting the stage scenery of the new recreation room. The sum of £78 16s. 5d. was received from Miss Baylis as the proceeds of a concert given at the "Old Vic." on Good Friday for the benefit of St. Giles.

The retirement of Father Cyril on account of ill health is much regretted. The good work that he has done during the year of his Chaplaincy and his constant devotion to the true welfare of St. Giles has earned him the gratitude of all connected with its management. He has been succeeded by Father Illingworth.

There has been an important alteration in the constitution of the Homes since the last Report was issued. The Company of St. Giles was originally founded as a Limited Company incorporated under the Companies Acts. There were good reasons for this at the time, but it involved a liability for Income Tax from which, as a charitable institution, it should have been exempt. The government was vested in a Board of Directors, and the Council had no jurisdiction and took no real part in the management of the Homes.

To remedy this state of affairs the old Company of St. Giles, Limited, has been wound up and a new Association "not for profit" has been formed by licence of the Board of Trade, which Association is still an Incorporated Company, limited by guarantee, but recognised officially as a charitable institution and as such exempt from Imperial taxation. This step has cost some £175, but has avoided an annual liability estimated at £70 per annum.

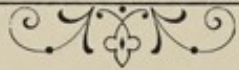
Furthermore, under the new Articles, the government of the Association is vested in the Council and the Executive Committee, so that the Council are now the responsible authority, jointly with the Committee, for the welfare of the Homes.

On the retirement of Sir Montagu Pollock from the Chairmanship, Sir Harold Morris was elected in his place. Dr. George Carmichael Low has kindly consented to act as an additional Honorary Medical Adviser. The Committee are much indebted to Captain Pyddoke, R.N., for his numerous visits to the Homes and helpful interest in every detail of their management.
