





FOR BRITISH LEPERS.



FOREWORD.

UNTIL 1914 there existed in this country no institution in which lepers could find refuge. It is roughly estimated that there are from 50 to 100 lepers in the British Isles at the present time. These have contracted the disease, with a few rare exceptions, in the Colonies or elsewhere abroad.

Leprosy is a cruel disease associated with great disfigurement and helplessness, and its very name is liable to excite horror and repulsion. Hence the victims of it are apt to be shunned and neglected. They are not readily received in hospitals, and it is with the utmost difficulty that they can find a lodging. To meet this great need the Homes of St. Giles came into existence.

Though unfortunately at the present time no certain cure for leprosy is known to medical science, much advance has of late years been made in the treatment of the disease, from which advance our patients derive the fullest benefit.

An estate of twenty-seven acres with a small farmhouse in a secluded part of Essex was bought as a nucleus for the Homes. Bungalows were erected for the reception of the patients. The old farmhouse was enlarged to accommodate the nurses, and the other buildings were added, such as a small chapel (made out of an old barn), a chaplain's house, gardener's cottage, guest house, laundry, and a medical block containing a small operating room.

There the patients are tended by the Mother and Sisters of the Community of St. Giles, who devote their lives to this work. They receive regular medical treatment, and their spiritual needs are served by a resident chaplain.

The Homes are entirely unsectarian, and the only condition for admission is that the sufferer be a British subject and resident within the British Isles. There is accommodation in the Homes for about twelve male and two female patients. Patients with means are expected to contribute what they can afford, but those without means are equally welcome.

All this work has been done by voluntary subscription without Government help, and we earnestly appeal to you to enable it to be carried on.

Report of the Executive Committee.

THE year 1933 has been one of the most difficult and critical through which the Homes have passed since their inception. The financial state of the country and the general economic depression have caused a marked falling off in subscriptions and donations, while the cost of upkeep has rather increased than diminished, and it has only been with difficulty that the Committee has been able to balance its budget.

Since the regretted retirement of Mother Clare in 1932 many difficulties have been encountered in respect of internal administration. These are fortunately now all things of the past and the work of the Homes is being happily and efficiently carried on by Mother Mary Elizabeth. Father Harold Smith has succeeded Father Hardy as Chaplain. The Community has been strengthened during the past few months and is taking its part in the nursing and care of the patients with great devotion.

At the end of 1933 our patients were ten in number, two women and eight men. Two of the latter were admitted during the year, one a soldier who had served in India and South Africa, and the other a native of Malta. Three out-patients, in whom the disease is inactive, receive periodic treatment and advice. The patients' general health has varied as it usually does, chiefly as the result of climatic changes. In spite of the medical skill and care and the use of the most up-to-date remedies, we are unable to report any case of cure, though in several there has been much alleviation of suffering. Every effort is made to provide occupation for those who are well enough to do any sort of work, as this has a helpful influence on their general health and mental outlook. One is specially interested in wireless, another in breeding pigs, a third has a large chicken run, while two more find their interest in gardening. A small greenhouse has been put up for their use and encouragement.

We have suffered a great loss in the death of our oldest patient, a native of Iceland, beloved and admired by all with whom he came in contact. He went to sea at eighteen, and spent an adventurous youth in whalers in the Arctic. Later he became naturalized as a British subject and worked in the docks in Aberdeen. He was awarded the Royal Humane Society's medal on two occasions for saving life from drowning. His courage, patience and courtesy through years of suffering and increasing disability can never be forgotten.

This year we are faced with expenses in connection with certain structural changes in the Homes. The medical block where the routine treatment is carried out requires to be heated, and we have to install a bath for the nurses who are there on night duty.

The Committee are again indebted to Her Highness Princess Marie Louise and the Fellowship of St. Giles for their contribution of £600 to the general funds and in aid of the special needs of the patients.

After many years' service at the Guest House dispensing hospitality to the patients' friends, the doctors and all the visitors to the Homes, Miss Haughton has decided to retire into private life. We are deeply grateful for all she has done and wish her many years of enjoyment of her well-earned rest.

Report of the Committee.

As far as the Fellowship is concerned the year has been on the whole uneventful. The subscriptions to the London Centre show a slight increase. The Annual Meeting resulted in the addition of several new associates who more than balanced the inevitable losses that automatically occur each year. The Quiet Day and Annual Meeting were well attended, and all were very glad of the opportunity of seeing and welcoming the new Superior, Mother Mary Elizabeth, who gave a most interesting account of the Homes. Dr. Macleod took the chair, and our President as usual gave a most stirring address.

It is interesting to find the various ways in which friends have been obtaining financial support for the Fellowship. Dr. Vincent Nesfield is very kindly giving to the funds all the proceeds from the sale of his charming little book on Job. The very beautiful language and symbolism of the book of Job are presented in what is to many of us a new and deeply interesting light, by the explanation of his disease as leprosy. The footnotes provided by Dr. Nesfield form a most helpful commentary on the text. Copies of this book may be obtained for 2/6 on application to the Hon. Secretary. As is shown in the Oxford Report, Mr. Brownlow has generously given all the takings from the sale of his gramophone records, while many others have organized Garden Fêtes, American Teas, etc.

In spite of all these helpful efforts the financial statement shows a decrease in the total collections and a corresponding decrease in our deposit account, on which we have had to make a serious inroad. It is therefore much to be hoped that in 1934 there will be some further substantial increases to balance this deficit.

The happy condition of the patients in spite of their sufferings is sufficient inducement and reward to all who have it in their power to help in this way. We are much indebted to Lady Lechmere who most kindly undertook to collect an extra £40 in about a fortnight to make good the heaviest of our losses at the moment. Without this splendid help it would not have been possible to make our usual contribution of £600 towards the annual upkeep of the Homes.

The value of the needlework branch is greater than words can express. Mrs. le Breton's work in organizing the supplies, and Lady Furley's in her management of the Oxford branch, both result in a steady supply of necessities for the patients and the Sisters.
