



FOR BRITISH LEPERS.



#### FOREWORD.

UNTIL 1914 there existed in this country no institution in which lepers could find refuge. It is roughly estimated that there are from 50 to 100 lepers in the British Isles at the present time. These have contracted the disease, with a few rare exceptions, in the Colonies or elsewhere abroad.

Leprosy is a cruel disease associated with great disfigurement and helplessness, and its very name is liable to excite horror and repulsion. Hence the victims of it are apt to be shunned and neglected. They are not readily received in hospitals, and it is with the utmost difficulty that they can find a lodging. To meet this great need the Homes of St. Giles came into existence.

Though unfortunately at the present time no certain cure for leprosy is known to medical science, much advance has of late years been made in the treatment of the disease, from which advance our patients derive the fullest benefit.

An estate of twenty-seven acres with a small farmhouse in a secluded part of Essex was bought as a nucleus for the Homes. Bungalows were erected for the reception of the patients. The old farmhouse was enlarged to accommodate the nurses, and the other buildings were added, such as a small chapel (made out of an old barn), a chaplain's house, gardener's cottage, guest house, laundry, and a medical block containing a small operating room.

There the patients are tended by the Mother and Sisters of the Community of St. Giles, who devote their lives to this work. They receive regular medical treatment, and their spiritual needs are served by a resident chaplain.

The Homes are entirely unsectarian, and the only condition for admission is that the sufferer be a British subject and resident within the British Isles. There is accommodation in the Homes for about twelve male and two female patients. Patients with means are expected to contribute what they can afford, but those without means are equally welcome.

All this work has been done by voluntary subscription without Government help, and we earnestly appeal to you to enable it to be carried on.

## Report of the Executive Committee.

THE year 1935 has proved a difficult one for the Homes, but in spite of this the work has been satisfactorily carried on.

In June one of our patients died. He had been in the Homes barely a year, and as at the time of admission he was suffering from the disease in an advanced stage, and was both crippled and blind, he required constant care and attention. He was always very grateful for and appreciative of all the nurses and doctors were able to do for him.

We are pleased to be able to report that in July another of our patients was able to leave the Homes, the disease in his case having been arrested, and was at that time in a non-infective state.

A patient who was in the Homes some years ago came back to us in November for further treatment.

At the end of 1935 there were nine patients in the Homes, seven men and two women, and two out-patients were receiving periodic treatment and assistance.

The Sisters of the Community of St. Giles have given most devoted service throughout the year to the care and well-being of the patients, but owing to their numbers being small the Homes have been obliged to employ two, and at times three, paid nurses throughout the year, and in addition have had to obtain the assistance of paid domestic helpers in running the Homes. This, of course, has greatly increased expenses and has added to the financial strain of carrying on the work. One happy feature of this, however, is that the wife of one of the patients, a trained nurse, has been able to go to the Homes and assist with the nursing.

The late Miss G. P. Ricketts, of Brighton, very kindly remembered the Homes in her Will and gave us a legacy of £1,000. This amount, after deduction of legacy duty, was received in March. This handsome contribution enabled the Homes to carry out a much needed extension of Moor House, which was completed at a cost of £780.

The Committee is deeply grateful to H.H. Princess Marie Louise for the keen personal interest which she takes in the Homes, and also to Her Highness and the Fellowship of St. Giles over which she presides, not only for the gifts and special needs of the patients which they supply, but for the renewal of their grant of £600 to the general funds of the Homes.

The patients themselves have contributed £523 1s. 5d. towards maintenance, and to them the Committee tenders its sincere thanks.

The Committee again records its gratitude to the Reverend Mother and the Sisters of St. Giles for their devotion to the work; and to the Chaplain, the Rev. C. B. Underwood; to Dr. Ivan Pirrie, the Medical Officer, not only for his care of the patients, but also for the many ways in which he assists in the management of the Homes; to Dr. R. G. Cochrane and his successor, Dr. E. Muir, of the British Empire Leprosy Relief Association, for their visits to the Homes and assistance in the treatment of the patients; to Mr. A. C. King, the Dental Surgeon; and to Mr. E. F. King, the Ophthalmic Surgeon.

The Committee cannot close this Report without acknowledging its deep gratitude to Miss Lilian Baylis, C.H., M.A. (Oxon.), Hon. LL.D., Birm. (Hon.), for her kindness in taking parties to the Homes and arranging entertainments which are a source of real pleasure to the patients. During the year members of the Vic-Wells Opera, Shakespeare and Ballet Companies, gave of their valuable time in order to visit the Homes and bring joy into the lives of these poor sufferers. Amongst our visitors have been Miss Mary Casson, Miss Ann Casson and Mr. Christopher Casson (the three children of Dame Sybil Thorndike, who takes a very great interest in the work), Mr. Christopher Casson being a member of the Vic-Wells Shakespeare Company.

We are also grateful to Dr. Hussey who went to the Homes and lectured on his experiences in the Antarctic with Sir Ernest Shackleton's expeditions, and illustrated his lecture with lantern slides. His lecture was both interesting and instructive and greatly enjoyed by the patients.

In conclusion, the Committee would again stress that the Homes are largely dependent upon the charitable public for the means of carrying on the work, and do not benefit from any State grant, and the Secretary will be most grateful for names of those who will become annual subscribers, and will thankfully acknowledge donations towards the funds, no matter how small.


Fig. 10   Fig.	Name				S	Ar	nua		Do	nati	ons
