SIR.

I have the honour to submit the Triennial Report on the working of hospitals and dispensaries and other medical institutions in Bengal for the years 1938, 1939 and 1940.

My predecessor Major-General P. S. Mills, C.I.E., M.B.B.S., D.T.M. & H., M.R.C.S., K.H.P., I.M.S., held charge of the department throughout except for short periods, viz., from 24th March 1939 to 30th September 1939 and 13th September 1940 to 4th October 1940, when he was on leave. The following officers held charge of the department during these periods:—

- Lt.-Col. T. C. Boyd, I.M.S., from 24th March 1939 to 29th May 1939.
- Lt.-Col. K. S. Thakur, I.M.S., from 30th May 1939 to 30th September 1939 and again from 13th September 1940 to 4th October 1940.

Indian Medical Service.—No changes were introduced in the cadre of this service. In addition to the two posts of the Resident Medical Officers of the Presidency General Hospital, Calcutta, which had already been filled up by the members of the I.M.S., the post of the Resident Medical Officer, Eden Hospital of the Medical College Hospitals, was for the

first time filled by an I.M.S. Officer, viz., Major G. W. B. Fisher, I.M.S., with effect from the 10th October 1939.

As a result of the war which broke out in September 1939, 8 officers of the I.M.S. in civil employ were called by the Defence Department to military duty. The department also lost the services of the following officers through transfer or retirement:—

- 1. Lt.-Col. P. C. Banerjee, retired on 5th January 1939.
- 2. Lt.-Col. T. C. Boyd, transferred to United Provinces as I.G.C.H., in May 1939.
- Lt.-Col. P. F. Gow, retired on 28th June 1940.
- 4. Lt.-Col. N. C. Kapur, retired on 21st October 1940.
- Lt.-Col. E. H. V. Hodge, retired on 28th August 1938.
- Lt.-Col. T. H. Thomas, retired on 3rd March 1940.
- 7. Bt.-Col. Sir R. N. Chopra, C.I.E., K.H.P., retired on 17th August 1940.

Bt.-Col. Sir R. N. Chopra was reemployed to continue as the Director of the School of Tropical Medicine, Calcutta.

Against the depletion of the above 5 officers, the department received only 4 I.M.S. officers during the triennium under review.

Indian Medical Department.—The total strength of the cadre of the I.M.D. in Bengal at the end of the previous triennium was 12. During the 3 years under review 2 officers, viz., Dr. J. A. Hyde and Lt.-Col. W. E. Frederick were reverted to the military department. Two more officers, viz., Capt. A. D. Campbell and Dr. J. M. Connor retired from service. There was thus a depletion of 4 officers against whom 4 new I.M.D. officers were received. The strength of the cadre of the I.M.D. officers thus remained the same at the end of 1940.

Bengal Medical Service (Upper and Lower).—During the triennium under report, 27 officers were recruited in the Bengal Medical Service, Upper, and 67 officers were recruited in the Bengal Medical Service, Lower. The strength of the cadre of these two services at the end of the triennium stood at 171 and 272 respectively and the numbers of temporary officers were 6 and 7, respectively.

The noteworthy changes that occurred in these two services during the period under review were as follows:—

 - (7) 3rd Sub-Assistant Surgeon, Alipore Central Jail.
 - (8) 3rd Sub-Assistant Surgeon, Presidency Central Jail.
 - (9) 2nd Sub-Assistant Surgeon, Rajshahi Central Jail.

- (b) Abolition of the post of the Sub-Assistant Surgeon, Police Hospital, Calcutta.
- (c) Replacement of the post of Sub-Assistant Surgeon, Cox's Bazar Subdivision and Dispensary by an Assistant Surgeon.
- (d) Replacement of the posts of the Deputy Superintendents, Campbell Hospital, Calcutta, and the Mitford Hospital, Dacca (formerly held by I.M.D. officers) by Assistant Surgeons.
- (e) Replacement of the post of Sub-Assistant Surgeon, Natore Subdivision and Dispensary by an Assistant Surgeon.
- (f) Creation of 9 posts of Assistant Surgeon teachers for Medical Schools at Burdwan, Jalpaiguri, Mymensingh and Chittagong.

(g) Withdrawal of Assistant Surgeons from the posts of Superintendent, Bengal Vaccine Depot, and the Radiologist, Mitford Hospital, Dacca.

Post-Graduate Training.—The training is given in the case of Assistant at the Medical College, Surgeons Calcutta, once a year, and in the case of Sub-Assistant Surgeons at the Campbell and Dacca Medical Schools twice a year. Owing to dearth of officers, only 8 officers of the Bengal Medical Service, Upper and 11 officers of the Bengal Medical Service, Lower, were able to receive this training in the whole of the period under report. Post-graduate training is available for Government Medical Officers also in the Tropical Medicine in the D.T.M. and L.T.M. classes, but only 3 Assistant and 2 Sub-Assistant Surgeons were deputed to the D.T.M. and 1 Sub-Assistant Surgeon to the L.T.M. courses throughout the triennium.

Medical Education.

Medical Colleges.—Medical Education up to the standard of the M.B. Degree of the Calcutta University and M.M.F. Diploma of the State Medical Faculty of Bengal, was, as usual, given in the two Medical Colleges of Bengal, viz., Calcutta Medical College which is a purely Government institution, and the Carmichael Medical College, Belgachia, which is a private-aided institution.

An important change was made in the course of studies for the M.B. Degree with effect from the summer session of 1940. The length of the course has been reduced from 6 to 5½ years including practical training for a period of 6 months in the hospital at the end of the College course. The old Preliminary Scientific M.B. course has been abolished from the medical course and combined with the I.Sc. course of the Science Colleges.

During the triennium under report there were annually on an average 1,405 male and 35 female students under training in the two institutions as compared with 1,326 male and 21 female students annually in the previous triennium. The number of students who passed out was as follows:—

There was no Muslim student in the Carmichael Medical College, Belgachia, but in the Medical College, Calcutta, 21 seats were specially reserved for them. All these seats were not however taken up by Muslim students. The number of Muslim students admitted was 13 in 1937-38, 16 in 1938-39 and 13 in 1939-40. The numbers passed out during these years were 10, 12 and 6, respectively. From the year 1938-39 special scholarships have been given to the Muslim and the scheduled caste students in order to attract students of the communities to the study of medicine. The number of Muslim students, however, remains steady, owing probably to poverty associated with the general economic depression of the country.

Post-graduate training was imparted to Civil Assistant Surgeons, Sub-Assistant Surgeons and Medical Officers deputed by municipalities and district boards in the various departments of the College and attached hospitals. Private practitioners from both in and outside Bengal, attended the courses of Post-graduate training in the various departments of the institution. It is interesting to note that the demand for such training is ever increasing.

A large number of examinations of material from the attached hospitals and from outside sources was made in the Pathology, Physiology and Chemistry Departments of the College. Researches were carried out on various subjects by the staff of the Medical College and Hospitals during the period under review.

Medical Schools in the province remained the same as before, viz., 6 Government and 3 private. The proposal for the establishment of another Medical School at Barisal was revived in 1939 and it was decided to have the foundation stone laid by His Excellency the Governor of Bengal and to proceed with the details of the scheme so as to give effect to the proposal as soon as money is provided for the purpose. Training was imparted as usual up to the standard of the Final Licentiate Examination of the State Medical Faculty of Bengal.

There were altogether 8,863 students under training during the period under report as compared with 8,820 in the preceding triennium. The number of students who have passed out was 1,178 as against 1,114 in the preceding triennium.

Considerable improvements have been effected in the hospitals attached to the Government Medical Schools at Burdwan, Mymensingh and Chittagong. These institutions were given capital grants of Rs. 15,318, Rs. 25,000 and Rs. 25,000 respectively for their required improvements. In accordance with the recommendations of the Inspection Committee of the State Medical Faculty of Bengal, effect was given to the scheme for the appointment of separate teachers for individual subjects in the four Medical Schools at Burdwan, Mymensingh, Chittagong and Jalpaiguri in 1938. Efficient teaching is now available in all the Government Medical Schools.

The question of improving the standard of education in Medical Schools has been under consideration for some years past. The Indian Medical Council has also insisted on the raising of the standard of medical school education to one which would be registrable under the Indian Medical Council Act. The proposal for introducing an improved course of training on the lines of the revised

M.B. regulations of the Calcutta University with I.Sc. (Medical) as its preliminary qualification was, therefore, recom-mended by the State Medical Faculty and the Bengal Council of Medical Registration. The matter has been under the consideration of the Government. But it involves very heavy financial liabilities. There is also a question of policy as to whether it will be either worth while or possible to maintain the exisitng 6 Government and 3 private Medical Schools. The question of conversion of the Dacca Medical School into a Medical College has already been investigated by a Committee appointed by Government of which the Surgeon-General was the President. The Committee has already submitted its report to Government and the final decision is awaited. It is apprehended that under the present war conditions it would be difficult to undertake such schemes involving big capital and recurring expenses.

The Inspection Committee of the Bengal Council of Medical Registration, in the course of their inspection of the Medical Schools made many valuable suggestions for the maintenance of an efficient standard of teaching, and improvements as far as finances allowed have been made both in the Schools and in the attached hospitals according to the suggestions of the Inspection Council.

School of Tropical Medicine, Calcutta.—This is essentially an institution for research and the teaching of Post-graduate students in Tropical Medicine, but considerable use is made of its facilities for investigation and treatment of cases which are not possible with the resources of ordinary hospitals, and patients resort to it for this purpose from places far and wide.

Post-graduate Teaching.—The School of Tropical Medicine held classes for the D.T.M., L.T.M. and D.P.H. examinations which have attracted Post-graduate students from all parts of India and even from countries beyond India. Since 1933 the D.P.H. classes are held in the All-India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health, Calcutta, which is affiliated to the Calcutta University. The lectures and demonstrations in the subjects of Protozoology and Helminthology were, however, given by the staff of

the School of Tropical Medicine to the students of the D.P.H. courses during this period.

During the triennium, a large number of students was admitted into this School for training for one of its diplomas as will be seen from the figures given below:—

Rockfeller Foundation Scholarship.—A scholarship was awarded to Dr. R. N. Choudhuri, Assistant Professor of Tropical Medicine in 1938 for the study of Tuberculosis. Dr. Choudhuri made an intensive study of the subject and obtained the diplomas M.R.C.P. (Edin.) and T.D.D. (Wales). He returned to his post of Assistant Professor of Tropical Medicine in July 1940.

A scholarship was awarded to Dr. S. Lal, a worker under the Indian Research Fund Association, in 1939, to study Bacteriology. Dr. Lal continued his studies in the United States of America in the Harvard School of Public Health under the Harvard University, Ratgers University, and the State Health Laboratory of Dr. Wordsworth.

Research Work.—The School with its team of research workers is engaged in carrying out investigations in connection with the etiology and treatment of tropical diseases. For details of work done by the School reference may be made to the annual reports of the School and to numerous papers published by its different workers. A brief statement of the work done on some of the important subjects is given in Appendix IV.

Drug testing and control.—The nucleus of a Provincial Laboratory for testing of medicinal drugs, sera and vaccines started in connection with the Departments of Pharmacology, Chemistry and Bacteriology, made satisfactory progress during the period.

Pasteur Institute, Calcutta.—The function of this institution is two-fold, viz., treatment of local cases and issue of anti-rabic vaccine to the different treatment centres. The number of these centres at the end of the triennium under

review was 216 as compared with 167 of the previous triennium. These were distributed as follows:—

The total number of patients who attended the institution during the 3 years under review was 9,336 as compared with 8,389 in the preceding triennium. Chemical Examiner's Department.—
The staff of the department consisted of the Chemical Examiner to the Government of Bengal and 10 Assistant Chemical Examiners of whom 6 are gazetted and 4 non-gazetted officers. Dr. Sachi Kumar Chatterjee, M.B., D.T.M., 3rd Assistant Chemical Examiner, who went on study leave to England, returned to his duties in July 1938, after obtaining the Ph.D. degree of the Edinburgh University.

In 1939 the non-technical staff of the department has been increased by the appointment of a clerk, a store-keeper and a packer.

The reorganisation scheme of this department which was initiated in 1934 and which is expected to increase the efficiency of the department and at the same time effect a saving of about

Rs. 3,000 per annum, is still under consideration of Government.

The total number of articles examined in the department was 61,035 during the three years under review, as compared with 25,650 during the preceding triennium. This abnormal rise is due to the increase in the number of articles in all sections, especially in the Excise Section. In addition to the routine examination of all medicinal preparations for assay of their alcoholic strength, about 5 per cent. of the B.P. drugs were also tested quantitively to determine if they satisfied the B.P. specifications. The analytical work of three other provinces, besides Bengal, viz., Bihar, Orissa, Assam and of the states under the Eastern States Agency are also done in this department.

The rate of contribution payable by other Governments for analytical work done on their behalf remained at Rs. 12 per article as in the previous triennium.

Original investigation on toxicology were carried out in this department and a number of articles on scientific subjects were published during the period under review.

Imperial Serologist's Department.-The department was transferred to the control of the Central Government with September 1933. The from Imperial Serologist, however, is connected with several activities of the Medical Department of Bengal: he is a Professor of Serology and Immunology in the Calcutta School of Tropical Medicine, and a Visiting Physician to the Carmichael Hospital for Tropical Diseases, Calcutta; he does serological work (Wassermann reaction and other complement-fixation reactions) for hospitals in Bengal; he runs a blood transfusion service for hospitals in Calcutta and is also partly responsible for supplying donors of blood in connection with a provincial emergency scheme; and he contributes to research work. The total activities of his department are briefly given below:-

I.—Medicolegal work.

This is the primary function of the Imperial Serologist. Bloodstains, on exhibits in criminal cases from all over India and Burma, are identified as to their source, for forensic purposes. Details of work undertaken during the financial years 1938-39, 1939-40 and 1940-41 are—

II .- Professorial work.

In 1938 and 1939 lectures were delivered and practical classes held on Immunology and Serology for the D.T.M. and L.T.M. courses of the School of Tropical Medicine and for D.P.H., D.P.H. & Hy. and D.M.C.W. courses of the All-India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health.

In 1940 classes were held for the School of Tropical Medicine only.

III .- Clinical Work.

The item specially studied is syphilis, its latency in the tropics, its reciprocity to tropical diseases and the false Wassermann reaction due to tropical diseases. Allergic conditions are also studied.

IV.—Routine serological work undertaken for clinical purposes, including blood-grouping tests for transfusion of blood.

A considerable amount of research work was also done during the period under report.

Hospitals and Dispensaries.

Classification of Institutions.—The hospitals and dispensaries were classified as before into the following categories:—

- State Public Institutions (Class I).
- 2. State Special Institutions, e.g., Police Hospitals, Communications and Works Department Hospitals, Forests Hospitals, Canals Hospitals, etc. (Class II).

- 3. Local fund institutions (Class III).
- 4. Private-aided institutions (Class IV).
- Private non-aided institutions (Class V).
- 6. Railway Hospitals and dispensaries (Class VI).
- Institutions receiving subsidies from local bodies (Class VII).
 - 8. Union Board dispensaries (U).
 - Village dispensaries (V).
- Hospitals and Dispensaries other than Allopathic, e.g., Homoeopathic, Ayurvedic and Unani.

Calcutta Hospitals and Dispensaries (including the Howrah General Hospital).—Number (Statement A).—The number of hospitals and dispensaries at the beginning of the triennium under report was 54, viz., 47 allopathic, 3 Ayurvedic and 4 Homoepathic. Five institutions of the allopathic system were added to the list, viz., one in 1938 and four in 1940. The total number of institutions on the list at the end of 1940 thus stood as follows:—

Of the above, seven institutions were exclusively meant for the treatment of females.

Thirty-one institutions had accommodation for in-patients while the remaining twenty-eight gave treatment in the outdoor only.

Beds.—The total number of beds in the hospitals of all categories was 4,375 at the beginning of the triennium under report. There was a net increase of 149 beds during the 3 years under review. The total number of beds at the end of 1940 was thus 4,524.

The increase in the number of beds is mainly due to the opening of the new Lady Dufferin Victoria Hospital where there are now 229 beds as against 98 beds at the beginning of the period under report.

The largest number of beds (747) is provided in the Medical College Hospitals. The Campbell Hospital which comes next in order has 712 beds including 215 beds for infectious diseases.

The total number of beds provided in the hospitals under classes I, III and IV, the daily average number of in-patients and the percentage of average daily occupation of beds were as follows:—

The figures for the Medical College Hospitals show the extent to which extra beds had to be provided in the hospital throughout the triennium under report.

Patients treated.—The total number of patients treated during the triennium in the hospitals and dispensaries following the Allopathic system of medicine was 3,545,955 or 1,181,985 on the average per year as compared with a total of 3,097,394 patients or 1,032,465 patients per year on the average during the previous triennium.

In the institutions following systems of medicine other than Allopathic 1,111,192 patients were treated during the period under report as compared with 410,240 during the previous triennium or an annual average of 370,397 patients as against 136,747.

The large increase of patients in institutions other than Allopathic is probably due to the fact that the population of Calcutta has increased and the rush of patients to the hospitals has been greater than what the Allopathic hospitals and dispensaries could deal with.

The total number of patients treated in institutions of Classes I, III and IV was 3,095,432 as against a total of 2,663,439 patients during the preceding triennium.

As in the previous triennium, the Medical College Hospitals treated the largest number of patients. The number of patients treated in these hospitals as well as in some other hospitals where patients were treated in large numbers, is shown below:—

In-patients.—The total number of inpatients treated in all classes of hospitals and dispensaries (including Ayurvedic and Homoeopathic institutions) during the triennium under report, was 500,881 or 166,960 annually on the average as compared with 287,382 or 95,794 annually on the average during the preceding triennium, showing an increase of 213,499 patients. Of these, 215,159 patients were admitted at the Avurvedic and Homeopathic hospitals and 285,722 in the Allopathic institutions. Of the total patients treated in the Allopathic hospitals, 243,814 patients were treated in the Classes I, III and IV institutions and the remaining 41,908 patients in other classes of hospitals. Mortality.—The average rate of mortality among in-patients treated in all classes of Allopathic hospitals in Calcutta has steadily come down during the triennium under report, viz., 8.45 per cent. in 1938, 8.21 per cent. in 1939 and 7.12 per cent. in 1940 as compared with 10.07, 10.61 and 9:00 per cent. in 1935, 1936 and 1937. The rate of mortality is the highest at the Campbell Hospital which is evidently due to the fact that it has a large number of beds for infectious cases such as cholera, smallpox, meningitis, etc.

Out-patients.—The total number of out-patients treated in all classes of Calcutta Hospitals and Dispensaries (including Ayurvedic and Homocopathic institutions) during the triennium under report was 4,221,638 or an average of 1,407,213 a year as against a total of 3,220,252 or an average of 1,073,417 a year during the previous triennium. Out of the total patients treated, 961,405 patients received treatment at the Ayurvedic and Homeopathic institutions and 3,260,233 in the Allopathic institutions. Of the latter, 2,852,618 patients attended the State, public, local fund and aided hospitals and dispensaries and the rest attended the other categories of institutions, i.e., State special, private and Railway hospitals and dispensaries. Medical College Hospitals.—The Medical College Hospitals show a distinct increase of patients both in the indoor and outdoor departments. While in the preceding triennium an average of 18,110 and 173,877 patients respectively were treated annually in the indoor and outdoor, during the period under report the figures were 22,134 and 195,571 respectively.

During the triennium under report there has been a further fall in the death rate among the in-patients; the figure being 7.03 per cent. as against 7.87 per cent. in the preceding triennium.

The Eden Hospital for midwifery and Gynæcology continued to be as popular as ever. The number of cases treated there during the last three years was as follows:—

Certain sections of the hospitals notably the Bengali Labour Ward, Septic Ward of the Eden Hospital, the Diphtheria Ward and the female medical and surgical wards remained overcrowded as in previous years.

The scheme for opening the remaining beds of the Eden Hospital Extension on a paying basis has not yet matured. It is expected that money will soon be forthcoming for the purpose.

The total number of operations performed in the Medical College Hospitals was 24,512 in 1938, 22,596 in 1939 and 28,590 in 1940, of which 5,916, 5,044 and 8,647 respectively, were selected and important operations.

The nursing staff of the hospital was strengthened in July 1940 by the appointment of 20 additional nurses consisting of one night sister, 5 staff nurses and 14 probationers. This has been a great relief to the nursing staff of the hospital who were under the strain of heavy work in the overcrowded wards.

The female ward and the operation theatre of the Sir John Anderson Casualty Block have been opened and are now in working order. The Coronation annexe which is an additional wing of the Sir John Anderson Casualty Block has also been completed. Out of the total cost of Rs. 54,700 required for

construction of this wing, Government contributed Rs. 30,000 and the remaining amount, viz., Rs. 24,700 was raised by donations from the public. The Medical College Centenary Committee are to be congratulated on this.

The Silver Jubilee Radium Department of the Hospital is now in working order. There is a Radium Board appointed by Government and the function of this Board is to control the funds of the department. The rules and regulations for the running of the department have been approved by Government.

One important addition to the hospitals is a clinic for Psychiatry and Neorology which was opened in June 1939.

Campbell Hospital.—The system of division of the hospital into a number of self-contained units which was introduced in 1935 worked satisfactorily during the triennium under report.

The number of patients increased both in the indoor and outdoor departments. The mortality rate also diminished. On the average there were 14,237 indoor and 51,511 outdoor patients annually as compared with 11,761 indoor and 38,358 outdoor patients on the average during the preceding triennium. The mortality rate on the average was 19.76 per cent. as against 22.01 per cent.

The necessity of a Chest Clinic and a Skin Department in the outdoor department of the hospital is keenly felt. Plans and estimates have been prepared for the new outdoor department as the present outdoor department is extremely congested and overcrowded and is quite unsuited to modern requirements.

The scheme for improvement of the nursing arrangements of the hospital has been sanctioned by Government and the quarters for the nurses have been under construction. Effect will be given to the scheme as soon as the quarters are ready.

A Deep-X'ray Therapy Apparatus has been purchased and installed in the hospital. This will be a real boon to the inoperable cases of malignant diseases.

The Labour Gynæcological Ward of the hospital had a large increase in the number of patients. There was a constant load of many extra beds every day. Labour cases admitted during the triennium were 685,958 and 1,265 for the years 1938, 1939 and 1940 respectively. Presidency General Hospital.—The hospital is ordinarily meant for European patients but Indians of European mode of living are also admitted in it. The number of patients treated in the hospital showed a gradual increase from year to year as will appear from the table below:—

There is a proposal for opening a Psychological clinic for the outdoor treatment of mental cases in this hospital similar to one already opened at the Medical College Hospitals.

The Voluntary Venereal Hospital, Alipore.—This is an institution for the treatment of venereal diseases among women. It is an indoor hospital with an accommodation of 82 beds. The Civil Surgeon, 24-Parganas, is the parttime Superintendent of the Hospital and a Lady doctor with M.B. degree works as the Deputy Superintendent and Medical Officer in charge of the hospital.

The patients treated in this hospital come mostly from the poor class of women of Calcutta and its adjoining districts. The number of patients treated and the daily average attendance for the 3 years under report are shown below:—

Carmichael Hospital for Tropical Diseases.—This hospital is attached to the Calcutta School of Tropical Medicine and is pre-eminently a research institution. It does not therefore cater for all ordinary patients as in the case of other general hospitals. The standard of treatment available in the hospital is of the highest order.

The attendance of patients in the indoor department showed a steady increase, while in the outdoor department the figures varied from year to year as will appear from the details given below:—

Malaria accounted for the largest number of cases treated in the hospital. Other diseases for which a large number of patients was treated were diseases of the skin, Leprosy, Epidemic dropsy, etc. The mortality rate was very low, the figures being 1.56 per cent. in 1938, 1.79 per cent. in 1939 and 1.87 per cent. in 1940.

The Carmichael Medical College Hospital, Belgachia.—The hospital is attached to the Carmichael Medical College, Belgachia, and its management is vested in the Council of the Medical Education Society of Bengal. The institution is an example of private enterprise. The generous support of the charitably disposed public in the shape of donation and honorary services is largely available for the institution and the Council of the Medical Education Society of Bengal is to be congratulated on their energy and enthusiasm in the maintenance and administration of this institution.

The hospital stands 2nd only to the Medical College Hospitals, Calcutta, in its record of out-patients. The surgical side of the hospital also compares favourably with the other large hospitals of Calcutta. The figures for the 3 years under report are given below:—

The hospital continues to be expanded every year. The most noteworthy additions during the triennium under review were—

- Construction of a 3rd story on a part of the surgical hospital to accommodate 37 beds.
- (2) Construction of the Sir Nilratan Sarkar Research institute.

Howrah General Hospital.—This is the largest hospital in the neighbourhood of Calcutta and a large number of patients from Calcutta receive treatment in the institution. The hospital has accommodation for 199 patients including 44 beds for Europeans. This is one of the centres for the treatment of seamen.

The average number of patients treated during the 3 years under report was 4,308 in the indoor and 31,330 in the outdoor, as compared with 4,137 and 3,568 respectively during the preceding triennium. The death rate among inpatients also showed a gradual fall. The figures were as follows:—

Mental Observation Ward, Bhowanipore.—As in the previous triennium, the accommodation available in the institution was 6 beds for Europeans including 2 paying beds and 24 for Indians including 3 paying beds. There was also a segregation ward of 2 beds.

The total cost for the upkeep of the institution was Rs. 23,396, Rs. 22,203

and Rs. 23,938 in 1938, 1939 and 1940 respectively. Additional comforts were also given to patients out of the Trust Fund attached to the institution founded by Mr. Owen John Elias. Amounts spent from this fund were Rs. 193 in 1938, Rs. 259 in 1939 and Rs. 146 in 1940.

It was mentioned in the last triennial report that administrative sanction of Government was accorded for a trained Indian female nurse being sent with every Indian female patient transferred to Ranchi Mental Hospital. This has since been finally sanctioned by Government.

Hospitals for the treatment of Leprosy.—The number of hospitals exclusively for the treatment of Leprosy remained the same as in the previous triennium, viz., three only. These were (1) Albert Victor Hospital for the treatment of Leprosy, Gobra, Calcutta; (2) Ranigunj Leper Home, Burdwan and (3) Bankura Leper Home, Bankura.

The Leper Hospital at Gobra is a state aided institution under the management of a Board of Trustees constituted under the Albert Victor Leper Hospital Act, 1935. The other two institutions are maintained by the Mission to Lepers out of the funds raised by the mission and by aids from Government.

The accommodation available in these hospitals at the end of 1940 was for 562 patients against 559 patients at the end of 1937. The table below shows the number of patients treated during the 3 years under review:—

The total cost of upkeep of the institutions was Rs. 94,930 in 1938, Rs. 1,12,736 in 1939 and Rs. 88,859 in 1940. The Albert Victor Leper Hospital received annually a grant of Rs. 60,000 from Government.

Cholera.—The largest number of cases was treated at the Campbell Hospital, Calcutta, viz., 1,605 in 1938, 2,480 in 1939 and 1,750 in 1940. The next largest number of such cases was recorded at the Carmichael Medical College Hospital, Belgachia, the figures being 1,601, 1,915 and 1,898 in 1938, 1939 and 1940 respectively.

Diphtheria.—The majority of cases of Diphtheria were treated at the Medical College Hospitals, Calcutta, viz., 324 in 1938, 369 in 1939 and 553 in 1940. The Carmichael Medical College Hospital, Belgachia, also treated a large number of cases, the figures being 173, 122 and 110 respectively during the 3 years under review.

Leprosy.—Special treatment for Leprosy is available at the Leprosy Department of the School of Tropical Medicine, Calcutta. The total number of patients treated in this institution was 1,554 in 1938, 1,560 in 1939 and 1,675 in 1940. The department is growing in popularity as will appear from the increase in the number of patients from year to year. There is also one leper hospital in Calcutta, viz., the Albert Victor Leper Hospital, Gobra, the detailed working of which is described elsewhere in the report.

Malaria.—Malaria still continues to be one of the commonest disease treated in Calcutta Hospitals. The following table shows the comparative figures during the 3 years under review in the hospitals and dispensaries where the incidence was large:—

Smallpox.—The majority of cases of smallpox was treated at the Campbell Hospital, Calcutta, where special accommodation for such patients is available. The figures of this hospital for the 3 years under review were 902, 1,241 and 866 respectively.

Tuberculosis of lungs.—As in the previous triennium the largest number of tubercular cases was treated at the Medical College Hospitals, Calcutta. The figures were 8,751 in 1938, 3,603 in 1939 and 4,647 in 1940. The local and municipal fund contributions were mainly received by the private and local fund hospitals and dispensaries. Among State hospitals, the Campbell Hospital is the only institution receiving such grant to the extent of Rs. 42,500 in each of the 3 years under review.

The Sambhu Nath Pundit Hospital also received a sum of Rs. 19,000 in 1938.

As in the previous triennium, the Carmichael Medical College Hospital, Belgachia, received the largest amount under the head "Funds collected by Hospital Committees, Charitable contributions and donations". The figures were Rs. 38,085, Rs. 40,391 and Rs. 63,319 in 1938, 1939 and 1940 respectively. A list of all notable donations with the names of the donors and the specific purpose for which these were given during the years 1938 and 1939 were published in the annual reports of the respective years. The donations received in 1940 have been similarly tabulated at Appendix II to this report.

Of the total realisation of Rs. 14,81,765 as fees and contributions from patients, Rs. 9,67,575 belonged to State hospitals as per details given below:—

Invested capital (Statement G).—The invested capital of the Calcutta Hospitals and Dispensaries under classes I, III, IV, i.e., State public, local fund and private institutions at the beginning of the triennium under review, as stated in the annual report of 1938 was Rs. 25,59,809. A further sum of Rs. 4,87,553 was invested during the triennium under review against which securities worth Rs. 3,13,899 were sold and deposits amounting to Rs. 69,886 were withdrawn.

The Islamia Hospital, Calcutta, being brought under the supervision of Government in 1940 its invested capital of Rs. 48,312 had to be incorporated in the account. There was an inaccuracy in the figures of 1939 which after correction showed an increase of Rs. 1,057. The balance of the invested capital at the end of 1940 thus stood at Rs. 27,12,946.

Mufassil Hospitals and Dispensaries.

—Number (Statement A).—The triennium opened with 1,488 Allopathic, 74 Homeopathic, 11 Ayurvedic and 4 Unani Hospitals and Dispensaries.

During the period under review, 215 Allopathic Dispensaries were opened and 22 such Dispensaries were closed. The total number of these Dispensaries at the close of the triennium thus stood at 1,681, showing a net increase of 193.

The number of newly opened dispensaries of the non-Allopathic systems during the three years under report, was 25 Homeopathic, 2 Ayurvedic and 2 Unani. Only one Ayurvedic Dispensary was closed.

The total number of Homeopathic, Ayurvedic and Unani institutions at the end of 1940, thus stood at 99, 12 and 6 respectively.

Out of 1,681 Allopathic institutions, 16 were State public, 41 State special, 1,242 local and municipal fund (including village and union board dispensaries), 123 private-aided, 178 private non-aided, 71 Railway and 10 subsidised by district boards.

Of the 215 newly opened dispensaries 178 were local-fund (including village and union board dispensaries), 29 private-aided, 4 private non-aided, 2 Railway, 1 subsidised and 1 State special. Of the 22 dispensaries closed, 3 were

State-special, 9 local-fund, 1 private aided, 2 private non-aided and 7 Railway.

Of the total number of Allopathic institutions in the mufassil 1,432 were in the rural areas and 249 were in the urban areas. The Homeopathic, Ayurvedic and Unani Dispensaries are mostly situated in the rural areas.

Besides the above regular and permanent dispensaries, there were, as in the previous triennium, a number of temporary dispensaries and medical centres under the District Health Officers, mainly for the treatment of malaria and kala-azar, and for rendering medical aid of a simple nature to people attending melas and fairs, etc. The number of such temporary institutions in 1938, 1939 and 1940 were 524, 609 and 888 respectively.

The two itinerant dispensaries at Darjeeling and Chittagong Hill Tracts worked throughout the triennium as before.

There were four travelling eye dispensaries under the auspices of the Society for the Prevention of Blindness in Bengal. Besides these, the 16 National Welfare Units organised by the Publicity Department for propaganda and rural uplift work, had with each of them, the paraphernalia of a small dispensary touring in 18 districts and giving medical relief of simple nature to the public.

Beds.—The total number of beds in the mufassil hospitals at the beginning of the triennium was 6,347, viz., 4,631 for males and 1,716 for females. The number increased to 6,375 in 1938 and 6,555 in 1939. The number of beds in 1940 shows, however, a decline to 6,012, viz., 4,406 for males and 1,606 for females. As figures for some private hospitals have not been received and incorporated in the statement for 1940, the decrease in the number of beds this year is more apparent than real.

The number of beds in the State public, local-fund and private-aided institutions showed a commendable increase, viz., from 3,767 in 1937 to 3,962 in 1940 or a total increase of 195 beds. The new beds were mainly provided in the Sadar and Subdivisional Hospitals.

Patients treated.—The total number of patients treated in the hospitals and dispensaries in the mufassil during the three years under report, was 37,714,412, as against 32,275,660 in the previous triennium, showing thereby an increase of 5,438,752 patients. The number treated under the various systems of medicine in each of the three years under report is shown below:—

In-patients.—Altogether 310,607 patients were treated in the indoor wards of all classes of hospitals in the mufassil during the triennium under report, as compared with 287,064 in the preceding triennium showing an increase of 23,543 patients.

The average death rate among the in-patients was 5.43 per cent. as against 6.61 per cent. in the trieunium ending in 1937.

Of the total in-patients, 216,699 were treated in the State public, local-fund and private-aided institutions, and 93,908 in the institutions of other categories as compared with 188,533 and 98,531 respectively in the preceding triennium. The daily average of inpatients in these institutions was 2,679;46 in 1938, 2,789;14 in 1939 and 2,952;40 in 1940.

The hospitals at the district headquarters treated 119,279 in-patients as against 104,031 in the previous triennium, showing an increase of 15,248 patients.

As in the previous triennium the largest number of in-patients in the mufassil was treated at the Mitford Hospital, Dacca. The figures for this and other sadar hospitals where a large

Out-patients.—The total number of outdoor patients treated in the mufassil hospitals and dispensaries including those treated in the medical centres and non-Allopathic dispensaries was 37,199,302, as compared with 31,988,596 in the preceding triennium showing an increase of 5,210,706 patients. The figures for the individual years were 12,844,603 in 1938; 12,025,996 in 1939 and 12,328,703 in 1940.

The number of out-patients treated in the State public, local-fund and private-aided institutions during the triennium under review was 26,596,681 as compared with 22,326,821 in the previous triennium showing an increase of 4,269,860 patients. The daily average of attendance in these institutions was 66,118.74, 56,729.50 and 69,654.60 in 1938, 1939 and 1940 respectively.

Of the total number of out-patients, 1,608,034 were treated in the hospitals at the district headquarters as compared with 1,528,606 in the previous triennium showing an increase of 79,428 patients. The figures, year by year for the 3 years under report were:— 542,459, 532,073 and 533,502 respectively. In 10 hospitals the number of patients remained more or less steady and in 7 there was a gradual fall while in the remaining 10 sadar hospitals the number of patients treated showed distinct increase. The fall was very remarkable in the case of the Sadar Hospital, Barisal (49,121 in 1938. 28,861 in 1939 and 18,859 in 1940), and the Sadar Hospital, Jessore (8,125 in 1938, 6,579 in 1939 and 6,412 in 1940). The reason for the decrease in the case of the Sadar Hospital, Barisal, is apparently the imposition of a small fee, while in the case of the Sadar Hospital, Jessore, it is reported to be the opening of a few dispensaries in the

neighbourhood of the Sadar Station from where patients used to attend the Sadar Hospital formerly. Among the sadar hospitals where gradual increase of out-patients was noticed, the Fraser Hospital, Burdwan, and the General Hospital, Chittagong, stand very prominent. The figures for the Fraser Hospital, Burdwan, for the 3 years under report were 35,148, 55,238 and 57,275; and those for the General Hospital, Chittagong, were 24,890, 28,944 and 44,520 respectively. The increase was due to growing popularity of the institutions in consequence of the various improvements and expansions made during recent years.

As in the previous years, the Mitford Hospital, Dacca, treated the largest number of out-patients, viz., 73,059 in 1938, 71,162 in 1939 and 69,794 in 1940. The other hospitals where a large number of cases was treated are shown below:—

Cholera.—The number of cholera cases showed a very slight increase, viz., 26,615 against 26,232 in the preceding triennium, while the number of deaths showed a slight fall, viz., 1,148 against 1,180.

Dysentery.—There was an increase in the number of cases treated for this disease, viz., 808,351 (723,962 amœbic and 84,389 bacillary) as compared with 686,748 in the previous triennium.

Kala-azar.—A gradual increase is noticed in the number of kala-azar cases. The total for the period under report was 295,594 as against 251,872 in 1935-37 and 199,966 in the triennium previous to that.

Malaria.—Malaria still continues to account for the largest number of patients treated for any single disease. The total number of cases treated during the triennium under review was 12,021,269 as against 9,411,020 and 9,123,748 in the two preceding triennia.

Influenza.—The number of influenza cases is gradually increasing. The total number for the three years under review was 660,374 as compared with 599,469 and 447,921 in the preceding two triennia.

Smallpox.—There was a considerable decrease in the number of smallpox cases, the total number for the triennium being 2,634 with 98 deaths as against 4,870 with 263 deaths in the preceding triennium.

Tuberculosis of lungs.—The extent of the ravages of this disease is still on the increase. The total figure for the three years under report was 57,372 as against 50,702 in 1935-37 and 38,672 in 1932-

The majority of these cases were treated in the outdoor departments of the district headquarters hospitals. In some of these hospitals facilities were also available for indoor treatment, but the accommodation was too small for the demand, the total number of beds for tuberculosis being only 95 in all the sadar hospitals at the end of 1940.

There were only two special tuberculosis hospitals outside Calcutta, viz., the Jadavpur Tuberculosis Hospital, 24-Parganas and the Darjeeling Tuberculosis Hospital. The number of patients treated in these two institutions during the 3 years under review was as follows:—

local and municipal contributions also showed some increase, viz., Rs. 2,85,948 over the previous triennium. Fees and contributions from patients were Rs. 8,40,312 as compared with Rs. 6,03,451 showing a commendable increase of Rs. 2,36,861. This is a distinct mark of the growing popularity of the hospitals among the people who are able to pay. There was a noticeable fall under the head "Funds collected by Hospital Committee, Charitable Contributions and donations." The amount for the 3 years under report was Rs. 9,40,729 against Rs. 12,19,955 in the previous triennium. This appears to be due partly to the economic condition of the people and partly to the various other claims on local charity.

His Excellency the Governor of Bengal gave numerous grants, as in the previous triennium, to mufassil hospitals and dispensaries in the course of his tours. Notable among these are—

As in the previous triennium, a steady increase is noticed in the

expenditure under the items salaries, medicines and diet, due mainly to the opening of new dispensaries and expansion of the activities of some of the old ones.

Invested capital (Statement G).—The invested capital of the hospitals and dispensaries under classes I, III and IV in the mufassil at the end of the preceding triennium stood at Rs. 32,67,574. During the three years under report an amount of Rs. 4,30,956 was invested which securities against Rs. 1,14,199 were sold and Rs. 36,702 withdrawn. An amount of Rs. 30,364 had to be eliminated from the accounts of the invested capital on account of incorrect statistics submitted by some of the institutions. The invest-ed capital thus stood at Rs. 3,517,265 at the close of the triennium under report.

New dispensary buildings and other improvements.—Notes with regard to new dispensary buildings erected and improvements made generally in the hospitals and dispensaries in the province during the years 1938 and 1939 were given in the annual reports of the respective years. A note with regard to such buildings and improvements made during the year 1940 is given in Appendix III to this report.

Nursing.—Calcutta Hospitals.—The following table gives an idea of conditions in regard to nursing in the principal hospitals in Calcutta:—

The nurses shown against the hospitals Nos. 5, 8, 10, 11 and 13 are mostly hospital-trained and not qualified according to the standard prescribed by the State Medical Faculty of Bengal, or the Bengal Nursing Council. In other hospitals, the nurses are, except in Nos. 1 and 3, mostly of the junior nursing certificate standard.

Compared with the previous triennium, there was a slight increase in the number of nurses employed in the Lady Dufferin Victoria Hospital, Medical College Hospitals, Calcutta, Howrah General Hospital, Carmichael Medical College Hospital, Belgachia, and the Chittaranjan Seva Sadan. In the other hospitals the number remained more or less the same. The average number of beds per nurse remained almost the same as in the previous triennium, the figure varying between 1 to 12.

The nursing staff of the Medical College Hospitals, Calcutta, had to work under severe strain owing to the system of providing extra beds when the normal capacity of the ward or wards was full. The Bengali labour ward and Septic ward of the Eden Hospital, the Diphtheria Ward and the Female Surgical and Medical Wards of the Medical College Hospital and the Casualty Wards of the Sir John Anderson Block were particularly remarkable for overcrowding. In July 1940, Government sanctioned the employment of 20 additional nurses consisting of one Night Sister, 5 Staff Nurses and 14 proba-tioners, and this eased the situation to a great extent. Nevertheless, the nurses had to work extra time to cope with the pressure of heavy work, and they are to be congratulated in the ungrudging spirit with which they did their duty. Though one would always like to see the end of this overcrowding in hospital wards, there seems no likelihood of any mitigation of the existing state of affairs until more hospitals are built for this growing city of Calcutta.

There was no difficulty in obtaining candidates for general training during the period under review. As regards the training and appointment of Indian female nurses in the Medical College Hospitals, Calcutta, though the scheme mentioned in the last triennial report was in force throughout the triennia, sufficient and suitable candidates were not available for recruitment. In 1940

there were 16 applicants and 5 of them were selected. In spite of all the difficulties, the nursing arrangements of the Medical College Hospitals, Calcutta, was maintained at a high standard of efficiency and for this the Lady Superintendent and her staff are to be congratulated.

Nursing arrangement in the Campbell Hospital remained as inadequate and unsatisfactory as before. The proposal for opening a training centre for nurses in the hospital has been approved by Government.

In the Presidency General Hospital, Calcutta, the nursing facilities were maintained at the highest standard. The average number of patients per nurse was 1.78 in 1938; 1.86 in 1939 and 1.97 in 1940.

The nursing arrangements at the Sambhunath Pundit Hospital, Calcutta, were quite inadequate. The Hospital is a training institution for junior nursing certificate. As reported in the last triennial report, the question of increasing the nursing staff of the Hospital was taken up and as a result of this administrative sanction of Government has been received to increase the number by three. There seems however scope for further increase in the nursing staff in order to ensure proper nursing of the patients.

Mufassil Hospitals.—There was no appreciable improvement in the nursing arrangements of the mufassil hospitals during the triennium under review. Even among the district headquarters hospitals, there are very few institutions where nursing arrangements can be said to be fairly adequate. Services of qualified and registered nurses were, however, available in the following sadar hospitals, though the number employed cannot be said to be sufficient:—

In the district sadar hospitals at Birbhum, Bankura, Nadia, Khulna and Tippera, a few unqualified nurses did the work of nursing. There were no nurses at all in the remaining eight sadar hospitals. The patients in these hospitals are looked after by the compounders, ward servants, and in some cases, by the friends and relatives of the patients themselves.

Among the subdivisional hospitals, registered nurses were employed at the L. M. Hospital, Asansol (Burdwan), Walsh Hospital, Serampore (Hooghly) and Charteris Hospital, Kalimpong (Darjeeling). There were nurses, some unqualified, also at the subdivisional hospitals at Contai (Midnapore), Basirhat, Diamond Harbour and Baraset (24-Parganas), Ranaghat, Kusthia, Chaudanga, Meherpore (Nadia), Lalbag and Kandi (Murshidabad), Brahmanberia (Tippera), Natore (Rajshahi), Kurseong and Siliguri (Darjeeling).

Besides the sadar and subdivisional hospitals, nurses were appointed in the following hospitals in the mufassil:—

Proper nursing facilities in the mufassil hospitals are one of the pressing needs. The main difficulties are (1) want of qualified nurses; and (2) want of funds for employing them. The Nursing Council constituted under the Bengal Nurses Act, is doing immense service in the shape of supplying registered nurses for appointment in hospitals. It can be fairly expected that in the course of a few more years, there

will be a sufficient number of registered nurses available for appointment, but the question of finding adequate funds from the hospitals is a difficult problem to solve.

Training of nurses.—The total number of registered nurses and midwives at the end of 1940 was 2,432. The number of nurses and midwives under training and the number who passed out year by year during the triennium under report are given below:—

Of the total number of Medical Officers, 1,325 were in the urban and 1,517 in the rural areas as compared with 1,263 and 1,365 respectively in 1937. The number of Medical Officer in the rural areas shows a commendable increase which seems to be due to increase in the number of rural dispensaries. The fall in the number of I.M.S. and salaried graduates seems to be due to a number of officers being deputed to military duty.

The number of nurses, midwives and dais in the rural areas has slightly increased but this is still hopelessly inadequate.

Control of Drugs and Pharmacy.-As in the previous triennium, the labora-tories of the Chemistry, Bacteriology and Pharmacology departments of the School of Tropical Medicine, Calcutta, under the Provincial Government and the Biochemical Standardization Laboratory of the All-India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health, Calcutta, under the Central Government, were engaged in testing drugs throughout the triennium under review. The result of the assay revealed numerous instances of spurious or substandard drugs finding access in the Indian market, but in the absence of any legislation on the subject, no action could be taken against the persons or firms concerned with these drugs. The Indian Drugs Act has however been passed in 1940. It is expected that with the enforcement of this act the situation will improve to a large extent.

With regard to Pharmacy, there is no institution at present in India where

higher training on the subject can be imparted. An elementary training known as the compounders' course continued as in the previous years, only in the 5 Government Medical Schools in Bengal, viz., Campbell, Dacca, Burdwan, Mymensingh and Chittagong. The syllabus consisted of a theoretical course of one year in any of these Medical Schools followed by another year's practical training in a hospital or dispensary recognised by the State Medical Faculty of Bengal.

The need for an improved training having been keenly felt, a proposal for an intensive course of training was submitted by the State Medical Faculty of Bengal, but for lack of funds to meet the extra cost involved in the scheme, effect could not be given to it.

As reported in the previous triennial report, a donation of Rs. 2,00,000 was received from a generous gentleman towards the establishment of a College of Pharmacy in Calcutta. The Committee appointed by Government to investigate the desirability and possibility of establishing such an institution submitted its report to Government in October 1939. The recommendations of the Committee are that a College of Pharmacy in Calcutta is possible and institution should train that the students for a diploma and a degree course of the Calcutta University. A Site Selection Committee has been appointed by Government and it is expected that when the site is selected, a start will be given to the Scheme.

Dental Registration.—The Bengal Dentists' Act of 1939 came into force on 16th May 1940. A Dental Board was also established immediately afterwards. The Board is doing its functions, viz., regulating the training examination and registration of dentists in the province. The public will henceforward be able to differentiate between a qualified and unqualified dentist. It is expected that under the fostering care of the Board, the profession will gain in reputation as the years pass on.

Honorary Medical Officers.—Valuable services were rendered by the honorary medical officers attached to hospitals and dispensaries as in the previous triennium. In some of the hospitals in Calcutta, e.g., in the Carmichael Medical College Hospital, Belgachia, ('hittaranjan Hospital, etc., the work

of the hospital was mostly carried out by the honorary staff. In the State hospitals like the Medical College Hospitals, the Campbell Hospital. the Sambhunath Pandit Hospital, at Calcutta, and the Mitford Hospital, Dacca, the honorary visiting physicians and surgeons and their associates have contributed a good deal towards the running of the out-patient departments and wards. The honorary medical officers are also entirely responsible for running some of the special departments of these hospitals. These honorary workers are to be congratulated on the interest and devotion evinced in the discharge of their duties and responsibilities.

The scheme for the appointment of honorary medical officers at the district sadar hospitals under the local bodies sanctioned early in 1937, was in operation throughout the triennium under review and passed its experimental stage. During the triennium under report, a review of the working of the scheme was made with a view to see to what extent it was a success so as to consider the desirability of extending the same to subdivisional hospitals. The scheme on the whole having been found to have worked satisfactorily, Government have sanctioned the extension of the scheme to the subdivisional hospitals where there are at least 10 beds in the indoor or 50 attendances at the outdoor per day. It is expected that the honorary system will work satisfactorily in these hospitals as well.

Visiting Committees.—The Visiting Committees or Governing Bodies as they are called in some cases, continued their work as before in the big State hospitals. These are advisory bodies and are constituted of official and unofficial members, and their services were of help to the authorities of institutions for which they were appointed. Such committees are appointed in the State Hospitals of which the following may be mentioned:—

Inspections.—Inspections of dispensaries in the districts by the Civil Surgeons is a very important measure as this is the only way by which the efficiency of the outlying dispensaries can be maintained at a proper standard. Unfortunately, no improvement could noticed in the matter inspections of these dispensaries by the Civil Surgeons during the period under report, for want of adequate funds for travelling purposes. Only 278 dispensaries were inspected in 1938, 377 in 1939 and 335 in 1940, or on an average 330 dispensaries annually as against 346 dispensaries annually in the preceding triennium. Efforts to increase the grant for travelling allowance of Civil Surgeons have so far been unsuccessful and very little can be expected at present under the war conditions.

The Administrative Head of the Department inspected 27 hospitals and dispensaries in 1938, 19 in 1939 and 17 in 1940, or an average of 21 inspections per annum. Of these, 12, 8 and 6 visits respectively were to district sadar hospitals.

Non-official Organisations.-As in the previous years, there were a number of non-official organisations rendering immense help to the department in the work of medical relief throughout the triennium under review. Among these, special mention may be made of the British Empire Leprosy Relief Association, Bengal Branch, Association for the Prevention of Blindness, Bengal, Bengal Tuberculosis Association, Indian Red Cross Society, Bengal Branch and Ambulance Association, St. John Bengal Branch. A brief report on the working of these associations in relation to their medical activities is given below :-

(I) Bengal Branch British Empire Leprosy Relief Association.—The activities of the Association consisted mainly of propaganda against the spread of leprosy, survey of the disease and help towards the establishment of clinics by local bodies, etc., and the training of doctors in the treatment of leprosy.

The Association took the opportunity of displaying exhibits in connection with leprosy at exhibitions held in 11 centres during the period under review. A number of lectures on leprosy with

the aid of lantern slides were also given at these exhibitions.

As many as 40 municipalities and 17 thanas and union boards were surveyed during the 3 years under review. The total population examined was 113,446 and the number of cases detected for leprosy was 1,681. There were about 134 leprosy clinics of which 47 were inspected during the period.

Lectures were delivered on leprosy to the senior students of the Medical Schools at Mymensingh, Dacca, Chittagong, Jalpaiguri, Burdwan, Bankura, Campbell and the Calcutta Medical School, and the Carmichael Medical College, Belgachia. Besides these, instructive lectures were given at some of the Guru Training and the Muallim Training Schools.

A short course of lectures on leprosy was organised every year at the Leprosy Department of the School of Tropical Medicine, Calcutta, for doctors who attended the course from various districts. Dr. B. N. Ghosh, the Leprosy Officer of this Association also gave a short course of lectures on leprosy to 8 doctors in Bogra district. The Association has been able to organise 3 district branches at Bankura, Murshidabad and 24-Parganas.

The preventive and propaganda work of the Association was very much appreciated and a grant of Rs. 10,000 was given annually to the Association from the provincial revenue.

(II) Association for the Prevention of Blindness, Bengal.—The aims and object of the Association are to give relief and treatment to the blind and to take measures for prevention of blindness. The first travelling Eye Dispensary under the Association was started in 1936 with a grant of Rs. 35,000 from Their Majesties' Silver Jubilee Fund. It worked in conjunction with the sadar and subdivisional hospitals which were made temporary headquarters and from these places it penetrated into the remote villages. The dispensary was named the Jubilee Travelling Eye Dispensary and was a tremendous success. This encouraged the Association and funds were for collected starting another Travelling Eye Dispensary and it was actually started in August 1937. successful career and unfailing popularity of the two Travelling Eye Dispensaries attracted the notice of Government, and in 1938-39 the Education

Department of this Government sanctioned a capital grant of Rs. 10,000 for the maintenance of the 2nd Travelling Eye Dispensary for one year and for the equipment of one more such dispensary. From the following year, this department took up its cause and a grant of Rs. 15,000 was given to start two more Travelling Eye Dispensaries. Thus, altogether 5 Travelling Eye Dispensaries were started and were at work at the end of 1940.

Since the year 1938, these dispensaries worked in the districts of Dinajpur, Mymensingh, Rajshahi, Dacca, Khulna, Faridpur, Midnapore and Rangpur.

Each of these dispensaries are staffed with 2 doctors trained at the Eye Infirmary of the Medical College Hospitals, Calcutta. They are equipped with modern instruments for a miniature eye hospital, magic lantern slides, cinemas, handbills, booklets, posters, etc. The Association has so far published 26 booklets, a few leaflets and 17 varieties of posters.

Enumeration of the blind in the villages forms an important part of the activities of these dispensaries. A sixth unit called the "Eye Examination and Lecture Unit" has been started in 1939 for Calcutta and suburbs for carrying out lectures and demonstrations on prevention of blindness and care of the eyes in addition to undertaking eye examination of school students, inmates of orphanages and workers of jute mills, which have so long been neglected. The table below shows the statistics for the 3 years under review:—

(III) Bengal Tuberculosis Association.—The Association was affiliated to the Tuberculosis Association of India in August 1939. The two-fold objects of the Association—curative and preventive—were successfully worked at during the year under review.

The number of Tuberculosis Clinics where the curative side of the work is carried out continued to be as popular as before. There were 6 such clinics in Calcutta; 1 in Howrah; 1 in Budge Budge (24-Parganas); 1 in Krishnagar (Nadia), and 2 in Darjeeling at the end of 1940. The number of patients examined in these clinics were 75,294 in 1938; 74,098 in 1939; and 78,034 in 1940. There are at present 17 male, 11 female and 7 probationer female Tuberculosis Health Visitors under this Association. They follow the cases from the clinics to their homes and educate the patients and their relatives as to the correct method of keeping such patients at home with the least possible harm to the others. The neighbours are also instructed as to how they can best protect themselves from infection. One whole-time specially trained medical officer inspects these clinics and supervises the work of the Health Visitors. In the matter of diagnosis and treatment, the Association is assisted by the Honorary Physicians of which there are 16 at present.

The publicity and propaganda work of the Association is equally important and laudable. Besides distributions of literature, lectures and demonstrations were arranged in educational institutions, fairs, public parks and bustees in Calcutta and in the mufassil areas. The Association also publishes its monthly journal with the object of bringing the latest method of prevention and treatment of the disease to the knowledge of the general public and social workers.

(IV) Indian Red Cross Society, Bengal Branch.—The Society spent, as usual, the greater part of its income every year in the shape of grants to hospitals and dispensaries. Amounts so spent during the 3 years under review are shown below:—

As in the previous years, Urea Stibamine for the treatment of kalaazar was given to approximately 40 hospitals by Sir U. N. Brahmachari and was distributed in the name of the Indian Red Cross Society.

(V) St. John Ambulance Association, Bengal Branch.—The St. John Ambulance Association is the teaching organisation of the Venerable Order of St. John of Jerusalem.

During the 3 years under review, certificates were granted to 8,328 persons as efficient in First-Aid, Home Nursing and Hygiene and Sanitation.

The Association also maintained two First-Aid Road Stations in Calcutta, upto the end of 1938, when these were closed as it was considered more beneficial to equip and assist mobile detachments of first-aid workers in case of need.

General Remarks.—There has been a steady and all-round progress in the working of the department during the triennium under review. Two Medical Colleges and 9 Medical Schools continued to carry on medical education as before. An important change in the Medical College education is the revised regulations for M. B. Examination according to which the length of the course has been reduced to 5½ years, viz., a preclinical period of 2 years and a clinical period of 3 years followed by a practical training in the hospital for 6 months. This was enforced in June 1940.

The standard of education imparted at the Medical Schools at present is not considered to be adequate. In a representative conference held at New Delhi late in 1938 it was decided that there should be one uniform standard of medical education throughout India. The subsequent decision in the matter is to raise the Medical School up to the Medical College standard. The question of conversion of the Dacca Medical School into a Medical College has been taken up on the prospect of a princely donation of Rs. 4,00,000 offered for the purpose by a generous gentleman Babu Jagamohan Pal of Dacca. A committee appointed for the purpose has already submitted its reports to Government and the matter is under their consideration. As regards other 8 Medical Schools the question of raising them to Medical College standard is receiving the serious consideration of the authorities. It must be realised that a huge capital and recurring costs will be involved and if no alternative case be found out, some of our existing Medical Schools will perforce have to be closed down.

In order to attract a large number of Muslim and Scheduled Caste students to medical studies, special scholarships have been created from 1938. These are still continuing.

There is a demand for improving the training of compounders but for want of funds no scheme for the purpose could be taken up. Dr. Anklesaria, a private gentleman, offered a donation of Rs. 2,00,000 for establishment of a College of Pharmacy in Calcutta with a view to bring about improved training of compounders in Bengal. A committee appointed by Government has already recommended the proposal in their report and the question of selection of a site is now under investigation.

The province is rich with resources for research work in medical and public health matters. It has therefore been proposed that provision should be made for research scholarships in Bengal. The matter is under consideration of Government.

The progress in medical relief in the province has been not only extensive but intensive as well. The salient features of the progress are shown below:—

- The number of hospitals and dispensaries increased by 198.
- (2) The number of beds increased by 354.
- (3) The number of patients in the hospitals and dispensaries in Calcutta increased annually on the average by 166,960 in the indoor, and 333,796 in the outdoor, while in the mufassil hospitals the average increase annually was 7,848 and 1,736,902 respectively.
- (4) The increase in the number of operations and the persons operated on in the Calcutta hospitals and dispensaries annually were 4,628 and 10,197 and in the mufassil 5,912 and 3,977 respectively.
- (5) X-ray facilities were available at 22 stations in the mufassil at the end of 1940 as against 14 at the end of 1937.

- (6) Government contribution to mufassil hospitals and dispensaries increased from Rs. 3,90,281 in 1937 to Rs. 6,97,757 in 1940.
- (7) Government subsidy of Rs. 500 per thana and Rs. 250 per village dispensary was given to 117 thanas and 439 village dispensaries in 1940-41 as compared with 102 thanas and 287 village dispensaries in 1937-38.

The most noticeable feature of the report of the Calcutta hospitals and dispensaries is the constant over-crowding. The remark is particularly applicable to the Medical College Calcutta, Hospitals, where there some wards is almost always an extra load of 100 per cent. beds. As with the spread of knowledge the people are going to be more and more hospital-minded, the situation is bound to grow worse. The root causes of this overcrowding appear to be two, viz., (1) influx of patients from the mufassil where hospitals with modern facilities are not everywhere available, and (2) expansion of the city of Calcutta without corresponding increase in the number of hospitals. With regard to (1) a scheme for improving the district headquarters hospitals to the extent of making them sufficient for the local needs has been put into operation. The total capital grant sanctioned for the purpose was Rs. 3,00,000 of which Rs. 2,20,000 have been distributed up to 1940-41 to some of the district headquarters hospitals, a list of which has been given elsewhere in this report. With regard to (2), the responsibility clearly to a large extent rests with the local bodies concerned.

Among diseases in general, Tuberculosis, Leprosy, infectious diseases and the diseases of children received special attention during the triennium under review. A short note on each of these is given below:—

Tuberculosis.—It was realised that this fell disease was spreading in alarming proportion every year and Government have taken or proposed to take the following measures to fight this menace:—

(1) A recurring grant of Rs. 10,000 is given every year to the Bengal Tuberculosis Associaciation for preventive work.

- (2) Administrative approval was given to the scheme for free X-ray and medical examination and treatment of Government servants suffering from Tuberculosis.
- (3) A recurring grant of Rs. 10,000 is given every year to the Jadabpur Tuberculosis Hospital for maintenance of 10 free beds for rural patients.
- (4) A capital grant of Rs. 54,000 has also been given in 1940 for improvement of the hospital.
- (5) There was a proposal for giving a further capital grant of Rs. 1,00,000 to this hospital for expansion.
- (6) A recurring grant of Rs. 15,000 is given every year to the district headquarters hospitals from 1938-39 for better treatment and nourishment of tuberculosis patients treated in them.
- (7) There is a proposal under consideration for establishment of a Tuberculosis Hospital in or near Calcutta.
- (8) The proposal for establishment of a climatic Tuberculosis Sanitarium at Darjeeling hills already reported in the previous triennium, is likely to be realised soon.

Leprosy.—The Bankura Leper Home, the Raniganj Leper Home (Burdwan), the Premananda Leper Dispensaries (Calcutta), the Leprosy departments maintained at the Chandraghona Mission Hospital (Chittagong Hill Tracts), and the Kalimpong Mission Hospital (Darjeeling) are the notable institutions maintained by the Mission to Lepers. Government give an annual recurring grant of Rs. 3,000 to the Premananda Leper Dispensaries and Rs. 1,680 to the Kalimpong Leper Hospital. The rest of the Mission Leper Hospitals receive capital grants from Government at the rate of Rs. 4 per adult patient and Rs. 2 per child patient treated in them.

Among the other leper institutions, the Albert Victor Leper Hospital, Gobra (Calcutta), received a recurring grant of Rs. 60,000 per annum. The B. E. L. R. A., Bengal Branch, which does good service to this cause receive a grant of Rs. 10,000 per annum.

Besides this the Leprosy department of the School of Tropical Medicine, Calcutta, is maintained by Government for special treatment of Leprosy.

There is a proposal for establishment of a leper colony at Salboni, Midnapore, by the district board, and the land for the same has already been acquired. There is also a scheme for establishment of leprosy clinics attached to sadar and subdivisional hospitals and also in the union board areas, a portion of the expenditure of which is proposed to be borne by Government.

Infectious Diseases Hospital.—As reported in the preceding triennial report, there was no special hospital for treatment of diseases of this category. The want of such an institution particularly in Calcutta was very keenly felt. The only institution in Calcutta for such cases is the Campbell Hospital, but the provision of beds being far too small, it is very difficult specially on the outbreak of an epidemic, to cope with the needs of the city. The Calcutta Corporation no doubt make special arrangements in such cases but it is not possible for obvious reasons to make the process a successful one. A scheme for establishment of an infectious diseases hospital has therefore been undertaken.

Children's Hospital.—The need for a separate hospital for treatment of diseases of children in Calcutta was felt for a long time. There are separate wards at the Medical College, Calcutta and the Campbell Hospital, Calcutta, with modern facilities for treatment of children under specialist doctors. The accommodation available in these two institutions is not however adequate for the needs of the city. A separate hospital for children with adequate accommodation was therefore considered to be the ideal arrangement. The matter is receiving the attention of Government.

There is much room for further improvement in the medical relief work in the mufassil. In many districts there are thanas without any dispensary at all. In recent years the most noticeable feature of the activities of the Department is the increase in the number of rural dispensaries under Union Boards. The authorities of the Union Boards should however be further

encouraged to establish more dispensaries until there is a dispensary in a group of at least two Union Boards.

The sadar and subdivisional hospitals are mostly in a state of degeneration owing mainly to lack of funds of the local bodies responsible for their maintenance. The scheme for improvement of sadar hospitals by means of capital grant from Government on certain conditions was in force throughout the triennium. Already a number of hospitals have received this grant. There are however others which could not fulfil the conditions although they require the grant most. It has therefore been suggested that these hospitals should be provincialised. The matter is under consideration at present. With regard to subdivisional hospitals, a scheme for giving grant towards the improvement and maintenance of these hospitals at a proper standard of efficiency is under consideration.

Nursing arrangement in the mufassil hospitals has become a problem. To ease the situation to some extent a proposal has been made that nurses should undergo a practical training in a mufassil hospital for a period of 6 months before they are granted qualifying certificates for nursing. A more effective measure would however appear to be the provincialisation of nursing services.

Office.—The office in all branches worked satisfactorily throughout the triennium under review in spite of heavy pressure of work. The war which broke out late in 1939 put still more strain on the already overworked staff. A proposal for strengthening the staff already submitted to Government is receiving sympathetic consideration. Two Upper Division posts have already been created from among the Lower Division assistants. More Upper Division and Lower Division assistants are an immediate need of the office for efficient work.

APPENDIX III.

Improvements effected in Calcutta and mufassil hospitals during the year 1940 in respect of buildings, etc.

A-Calcutta Hospitals.

(1) Medical College Hospitals—

Glazed shutters and asbestos hood were provided on the verandah of the male T. B. ward at a cost of Rs.1,902.

One underground defective water reservoir attached to the new Eye Hospital was replaced with pressed steel water tank above the ground at a cost of Rs.2,243.

Two E. P. W. C. Basins in the 1st floor bath room of the Principal's quarters were provided at a cost of Rs.1,455.

(2) Presidency General Hospital-

- One wooden staircase in the 2nd and 3rd class medical subordinates' quarters was replaced on reinforced concrete sunshade in the outside doors and windows, and a reinforced concrete staircase were provided at a cost of Rs. 3,000.
 - Provision was made of bath tubs, baths and wash hand basins, etc., in the western lavatory of the medical officers quarters (set No. 4) Lady Canning Home, Sister tutors' room and Carmichael Nurses' quarters at a cost of Rs.1,765.
 - Ordinary repairs and quadrennial repairs of the hospital and other attached buildings were carried out at a large expenditure.

Campbell Hospital-

An additional quarters for nurses was constructed at a cost of Rs.1,31,545.

The open land on the south of the hospital was levelled and dressed at a cost of Rs.2,748.

Carmichael Hospital for Tropical Diseases-

The repair work of the hospital was carried out at a cost of Rs.5,532.

Carmichael Medical College Hospital, Belgachia-

Construction of 3rd story of the Surgical Hospital building was completed at a cost of Rs.12,036.

A lift was erected in the Albert Victor Hospital at a cost of Rs.1,998.

The underground drainage and sanitary fittings were completed at the Surgical Hospital at a cost of Rs.1,142.

The sloping roof of the Albert Victor Hospital was converted into a flat one at a cost of Rs.1,716.

Chittaranjan Hospital-

A new building for outdoor department was constructed at a cost of Rs.18,477.

Lady Dufferin Victoria Hospital-

The new Dufferin Hospital was completed and brought into use during the year 1940.

B-Mufassal Hospitals.

Burdwan-

The old outdoor dispensary of the Fraser Hospital was renovated for use as the nurses' quarters,

Birbhum-

A two-storied building for the Purendarpur Charitable Dispensary with quarters for the medical officer was completed at a cost of Rs.4,500.

Midnapore-

The quarters for the medical officer of the Nandigram Charitable Dispensary were completed at a cost of Rs.2,506.

Hooghly-

The nurses' quarters of the Imambara Hospital were constructed at a cost of Rs.8,600.

24-Parganas-

The construction of the Sandeshkhali Dispensary building was completed at a cost of Rs.8,336.

Murshidabad-

A children ward of 6 beds was completed at the Berhampore Sadar Hospital and the entire cost was met by the Maharaja of Lalgola.

New buildings were constructed for the dispensaries at Bagirapara, Sahora and Kirtipur.

Chittagong Hill Tracts-

The construction of a new building for Lama dispensary with out houses and Sub-assistant Surgeon's quarters was completed at a cost of Rs.14,057.

Rajshahi-

A ward of 20 beds, 2 quarters for compounders, 3 quarters for ward servants, 3 quarters for sweepers, one quarter for nurses were completed at the Rampur-Boalia Sadar Hospital at a cost of Rs.30,000.

Dinajpur-

The construction of the Sapahar Dispensary building was completed at a cost of Rs. 3,655.

Bogra-

New buildings for the Khetlal and Demajani Charitable Dispensaries were constructed at a cost of Rs.3,891.

Malda-

A masonry building was constructed for the Kansat Dispensary and the expenditure was met by the Maharaj Kumar of Kansat.

Darjeeling-

The dispensary building and the Sub-assistant Surgeon's quarters of the Bagdogra Charitable Dispensary were constructed at a cost of Rs.12,335.

APPENDIX IV.

A brief statement of the work done on some of the important subjects in the School of Tropical Medicine during the triennium 1938, 1939 and 1940.

Leptospirosis.—Since the last report, a large number of cases of Leptospiral jaundice have been investigated. Contrary to the experience of several workers, isolation of the causal organism by inoculation of urine into young Guinea-pigs has proved to be of invaluable diagnostic value. During the course of the investigation an interesting observation has been made that during the acute manifestations of the disease, majority of the cases gave positive Wassermann reaction which proved absolutely negative after recovery or even during convalescence. At our suggestion a local firm undertook to prepare anti-sera for therapeutic use which, during the year under review, was under experimental stage. In view of the conflicting reports regarding immunisation with vaccines, experiments of a preliminary nature were also undertaken. The work is being continued.

Epidemic Dropsy.—Investigations into the etiology of this disease were further carried out. No etiological relationship with the three principle theories to this disease could be established. However the studies carried out by Dr. Lall and his co-workers of the all-India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health and the experimental work carried out at the School of Tropical Medicine with the epidemiologically implicated mustard oil in producing a syndrome closely resembling that of epidemic dropsy, is a distinct advance towards the solution of the problem.

Malaria.—Investigations into the therapeutic efficiency of different anti-malarial drugs on the Indian strains of malaria were continued. It was found that Sulphonamide Group of Drugs have definite effect in eradicating the infection. Another synthetic compound, Cilional or Certuna, a German preparation claimed to be an effective crescenticide was also tried with satisfactory results.

Haffkinimor Acriquin, an acridine derivative prepared in India was also tried and found to be as effective as Atebrin.

Crinodora another acridine derivative synthesized by a firm in Milano was also tried and found effective in the treatment of Indian strains of malaria.

The limiting values of atmospheric temperature and humidity governing Malaria Transmission by A. culicifacies, the vector mainly responsible for epidemic malaria, is being worked out, a fact not known to the main body of Malariologists and Medical Entomologists.

Kala-azar.—New antimonial preparations were tried with variable result in the treatment of this disease. Diamidino-stilbene a drug that has been used in the treatment of Trypanosomiasis and in a few cases of kala-azar in other countries was tried for the first time in the treatment of kala-azar in India. After a trial, Dr. Napier has been able to give a very good account of its efficacy. Cases

found to be resistant to antimony treatment were treated successfully with this compound.

Pellagra.—This disease is by no means uncommon in this part of India. A number of cases were seen in the School and a few were admitted and investigated in the Carmichael Hospital for Tropical Diseases. All cases improved rapidly with Marmite, Campolon or Nicotinic Acid.

Cholera.—A comparative test was conducted to evaluate certain drugs other than Bacteriophage for the treatment of cholera. The results showed that the Bacteriophage therapy was the best. A new drug Diseptal B (aminobenzene sulphonyl—aminobenzine Methyl sulphonamide) was tried on 329 cases, and was found to be a valuable therapeutic agent.

Meningitis.—A series of trial were conducted to ascertain the value of certain sulphonamide compounds in the treatment of this disease. Diaminodiphenylsulphone-glucoside was first tried and the death rate was reduced from 60 per cent. in the control series to 32 per cent. Better results were obtained by combining anti-meningococcal serum with this drug. Sulphapyridine and sulphanilimide (manufactured locally and abroad) were also tried. The results showed that Sulphapyridine was the drug of choice where the death was lowest and recovery rapid.

Typhoid Fever.—An exhaustive anytical study of 40 cases admitted in the Carmichael Hospital for Tropical Diseases was made. A detailed description will be found in the Annual Report of the Professor of Tropical Medicine for the year 1940. In a few cases, specific treatment in the form of Bacteriophage, anti-serum and sulphanilamide was given, but in only one case was there an indication that these treatments effected the progress of the disease. The death rate was only 5 per cent. which appears to be lower in comparison with that in this disease amongst Europeans in Europe.

Para-sprue.—Amongst the cases with bowel disorders, several cases were admitted with a history of long continued diarrhea with macrocytic type of anemia, a condition common in Indians in whom true sprue is rare. With an ill-balanced diet and the resultant malnutrition, of the gastro-intestinal mucosa and emaciation, a vicious circle is established. The principle of the treatment is to stop this vicious circle. Liver extract given parenterally together with a high protein diet, very much on the lines followed in the treatment of sprue, have been found to be very effective.

Hookworm.—The most important investigation during this period was the comparison of the efficacy of Thymol, Tetrachlorethylene, and combined oil of Chenopodium and Tetrachlorethylene in the treatment of Hookworm infection. It was found that Tetrachlorethylene either by itself or combined with oil of Chenopodium was much superior to thymol. Other anthelmintics used were Crystal Violet, Hexyl-resorcinol, "Neopanthelmin" and "Sastol."

Chronic ulceratife colitis.—A study of nearly 150 cases of this disease with special reference to diagnosis, pathological findings, radiological analysis and treatment was made. No etiological factor could be determined and it is possible that many factors combine to produce such a condition. In diagnosis radiological findings and the signoidoscopic appearances are usually conclusive. No particular organism could be isolated as being the exciting cause. There is no specific for this condition and the treatment is generally protracted. A low residue diet with adequate necessary vitamins is essential. Prognosis is better than before and in about 50 per cent. of the cases definite improvement takes place.

Amæbiasis.—A large number of cases of Amæbic dysentery and sub-clinical Amæbiasis was investigated in the hospital and certain new remedies including pentavalent arsenic compounds, similar to Carbarsone, prepared in India, were tried. The compound received from the National Institute of Science, Bangalore, proved to be as efficacious as foreign preparations.

Skin Disease.—The work on the anti-septic properties of 20 drugs undertaken was completed. The incidence of microsporon ferruginum and trichophyton crateritormi, causing ringworm of scalp in India was reported for the first time during this period. An improved technique in the treatment of Leucoderma by injections of Oil Bouchi locally on the patches has appreciably increased the percentage of cure and shortened the duration of treatment. Herpes Zoster cases were very successfully treated by injection of tissue filtrate.

Powdered Pyrethrem flowers in the form of an ointment has been tried and yielded encouraging results in the treatment of Scabies and Pediculosis.

Filariasis.—Factors involving the onset of filarial lymphangitis with a view to their allergic or sceptic origin were being studied. Filarial toxin has been isolated and tested in different types of case to study the reactions. This allergen has been found to be an effective therapeutic agent in the treatment of allergic type of filarial lymphangitis. An intensive study of cases of chyluria was also undertaken. In the majority or such cases a leakage of chyle was from the walls of the bladder, while in 20 per cent., the kidney was the seat of the trouble. The incidence of the filarial infection in the population of Calcutta was found to be as high as 10 per cent.

Diabetes.—During the period under review, an important work on the study of Glycolysis of blood in vitro was completed. It was observed that the blood for sugar estimation should be examined as quickly as possible, owing to gradual loss of sugar or, if delayed, should be kept preferably in ice. The anticoagulant sodium fluoride should be used in preference to others. The rate of glycolysis in diabetic blood samples is very variable and in some way related to the severity of the diabetic condition. In normal blood samples the amount of glucose lost owing to glycolysis, is almost always proportionate to the amount of the lactic acid formed.

Anaemia.—A large number of cases have been investigated and the value of different liver preparations assessed; contrary to earlier indications, Anahaemin, a refined and concentrated liver extract, appears to be more potent than most other preparations.

Indigenous Drugs.—The chemical composition, pharmacological action and therapeutic properties of large number of indigenous drugs were investigated. The important amongst those are—

Hemidesmus indicus.
Solanum trilobatum.
Hyoscyamus niger.
Rauwolfia serpentina.
Trianthema portalacastrum (two varieties).
Boerhaavia diffusa.
Andrographis paniculata.
Chrysanthemum cinerariifolium.
Aconitum ludlowi.
Ephedra gerardiana.
Holanheha antidysenterica.
Balsamodendron mukul.
Bheum emodi.
Vinca rosea.

The toxic effects of the three alkaloids of Rauwolfia serpentina have been studied.

Attempts were made to separate neurotoxic factor from the coagulum of Russel Viper Venom; the work is in progress and the results achieved are encouraging. The different methods of sterilizing the snake venom solutions without affecting their efficacy were also being worked out.

Owing to the present international situation there is great difficulty in getting adequate supply of foreign insecticides at reasonable prices. Investigation into the possibility of the indigenous resources of insecticidal plants was therefore started during this period.

Drug addiction.—A number of cases were admitted in the hospital for the treatment of morphine habit and were treated successfully with Lecithin and glucose.

Miscellaneous.—The application of spectroscopy to Medical and Biochemical researches made good progress and this useful techinque is being made use of by various workers for a variety of research problems. The spectroscopic study of blood for methemoglobinæmia has helped considerably in controlling the administration of drugs of the Sulphonamide group for research purposes, as the symptoms of cyanosis often caused by the drug can be detected much earlier. Several interesting investigations particularly the protein of blood in anæmia, vitamin storage in human liver and detection of adulteration vitamin A containing products have all been carried out in very short time and deserve special mention.

The establishment of a Blood Bank in the Carmichael Hospital for Tropical Diseases provides to a certain extent the facility of storing properly grouped blood for issues in cases of emergency.

Publications.—During the period under review three books and 297 scientific papers written by the members of the staff were published in different journals. For further details of the work reference may be made to the Annual Reports of the School of Tropical Medicine for the years 1938, 1939 and 1940.
