CITY ROAD CEMETERY.

Rules and Regulations.

- 1.—Plans of the Burial Ground are open for inspection, without charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., at the Superintendent's Office, at the Cemetery, where a Register of Interments is also kept.
- 2.—All Notices of Interment must be given between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., at the office of the Superintendent, at the Cemetery, City Road, at least two, and, if in a bricked grave, three days (exclusive of Sundays) previous to any interment taking place, except in cases of urgent necessity, which must be certified by a medical attendant. The Notice must be in the form provided by the Corporation, and be properly filled up and attested. Any person making false representations, for the purpose of fraud, will be prosecuted according to law.
- 3.—Notice of interment cannot be received on Sundays, nor can any funeral take place on that day, except in cases of urgent sanitary necessity, when the interment shall take place not later than 9.30 in the morning.

On the Roman Catholic Portion, 4.0 p.m., Summer months

No interment can take place before ten o'clock in the morning, or after four in the afternoon. The time named for an interment is that at which the procession must be in the Cemetery, and as want of punctuality causes the interference of one funeral with another, and occasions general inconvenience, an extra fee of two shillings and sixpence will be charged if the funeral is more than fifteen minutes past the time fixed for the interment, and a further fee of five shillings for every thirty minutes. A special hour of interment can be arranged, if desired, upon making application to the Superintendent and paying the fees mentioned in the Extra and Optional Fees.

- 5.—The friends of the deceased can arrange for their own Minister to perform the Burial Service, or they may avail themselves of the services of the officiating Minister attending at the Cemetery, but notice of their intention to bring their own Minister must be given at the time of giving the notice of interment.
- 6.—All Burial and Ministers' Fees must be paid to the Superintendent, at his office at the Cemetery, at the time when notice of interment is given; and all other fees and charges must be paid before the work is begun in respect of which they are payable.
- 7.—The Registrar's certificate of the registry of the death, or in cases where an inquest has been held, the Coroner's warrant, must be given to the Superintendent when the funeral enters the Cemetery. In cases of children still-born, a certificate signed by a Registered Medical Practitioner who was in attendance at the Birth, or who has examined the body; or (2) a Declaration signed by a person qualified according to the Statute to give information of a Birth, stating that no Registered Medical Practitioner was present at the Birth, or that his Certificate cannot be obtained, and that the child was not born alive; or (3), if there has been an Inquest, an Order of the Coroner. [Any person acting in contravention of these provisions is liable to a Penalty of Ten Pounds.]
- 8.—Coffins of wood only are allowed in unpurchased graves, and no monument or gravestone is to be erected or laid upon or over such graves.
- 9.—When sites for graves or vaults are purchased with a view to interments at future periods, the same shall, within twenty-eight days from the date of purchase, be defined by the erection of good and substantial edgestones around such sites, at the cost of the purchaser, and on the upper surface thereof the number of the grave, corresponding with the Corporation's

plan, shall be legibly engraved. Within twelve months after the first interment in any purchased site or sites, the same must be enclosed by the erection of a set of good and substantial edge-stones, flat stone, tomb or monument, at the cost of the purchaser; and on the upper surface thereof the initials of the owner and the number and section, corresponding with the Corporation's plan, shall be legibly engraved: in default thereof, the said site or sites shall be levelled, unless an application for an extension of time to comply with this Rule has been made and granted.

- 10.—In all cases of interment the certificate of ownership must be produced, and no vault or grave in which the exclusive right of burial has been purchased will be opened for an interment without the owner's application or consent, in writing. Any person succeeding to such right will be furnished with a certificate of ownership, on production of satisfactory evidence of title, and the payment of 2s. 6d. for such certificate.
- 11.—All graves are to be excavated by persons appointed by the Corporation, but the masonry or brickwork of any grave shall be done by and at the cost of the purchaser, under the control of the Corporation, or their servants. Every coffin in a bricked grave or vault, must be covered by stone slabs, or brickwork, made airtight, and there must be at least eighteen inches of earth between the top of the vault or brick grave and the ordinary surface of the ground. The purchaser shall also fill up and level the ground, remove all refuse, and will be held responsible for any damage done to any adjacent vault, tombstone, or monument, or to any part of the Cemetery.
- 12.—Immediately after an interment in a purchased grave the surface of the grave shall be covered with fresh turf, planted with shrubs, or other suitable vegetation, or sown with seeds, subject to the approval of the Corporation, unless a monument or tomb stone is about to be erected.
- 13.—All gravestones, tombs, monuments, memorials, and inscriptions are subject to the approval of the Corporation. A duplicate copy of every inscription, and a drawing showing the dimensions of every gravestone, tomb, monument, or memorial proposed to be erected, must be left at the office of the Superintendent of the Cemetery at least fourteen days, for

approval, and a certificate of such approval must be obtained before the gravestone, tomb, monument or memorial can be admitted within the Cemetery. One copy of every such drawing and inscription will be filed at the Superintendent's office. Every memorial must contain the number and section of the grave or vault over which it is erected.

14.—Monuments will not be allowed upon graves which have not been bricked to the surface.

15.—Shrubs, plants, or flowers may, subject to the approval of the Corporation, be planted over any purchased grave, but must not be cut or carried away without the consent of the Superintendent;* and the Corporation reserves the right to prune, cut down, or dig up and remove any of the shrubs, plants, or flowers, whenever, in their opinion, the same have become unsightly or overgrown. The Corporation will undertake to provide flowers and shrubs, and keep in order grave spaces, on payment of the charges stated in the Table of Extra and Optional Fees.

16.—The Cemetery is open to the public—

On Weekdays: January, February, November, and December, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.; May, June, July, and August, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.; March, April, September, and October, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

On Sundays: January, February, November, and December, from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.; May, June, July, and August, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.; March, April, September, and October, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

17.—Children under ten years of age are not allowed within the Cemetery, except under the care of a responsible person; and visitors are expected to keep on the roads and walks, and to refrain from touching the shrubs or flowers.

18.—No smoking is allowed within the Cemetery, and no dogs are allowed therein.

19.— No extraordinary funeral procession is allowed to enter the Cemetery without the express permission, previously obtained of the Superintendent, and no military funeral, or any funeral attended in procession by the police force, or by any association, sick club, or other society, shall take place in the Cemetery on Sundays.

^{*}The precaution is taken to prevent the removal of flowers from graves by unauthorised persons.

- 20.—The Register of Burials, kept at the office of the Superintendent, may be searched between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., and certified extracts obtained, except on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday.
- 21.—During the hours named for interments, the roads adjacent to the Chapels shall not be used as promenades.
- 22.—Carriages and horses accompanying funerals are admitted into the Cemetery as far as the Chapels and the open spaces around them. Other vehicles are not admitted, except by the special consent of the Superintendent.
- 23.— On application, printed copies of the Rules, Regulations, and Fees will be delivered to Clergymen, Ministers of every denomination, Churchwardens, Overseers, Clerks, and Sextons of the City, free of charge, and to other persons at 3d. each copy.
- 24.—The receipt or demand of any gratuity, fee, or unauthorised charge by any officer or servant of the Corporation, will subject such officer or servant to immediate dismissal.
- 25.— The Corporation reserves the right to make any alterations in the foregoing Rules and Regulations consistent with the Burial Acts; and all grave-spaces will be sold subject to these Rules and Regulations, and any others that may be made by the Corporation; and subject also to the present or any future Regulations issued or to be issued with regard to Burial Grounds and Cemeteries by His Majesty's Secretary of State, or other authorised person.

REGULATIONS FOR MASONS AND OTHERS ERECTING MEMORIALS IN THE CEMETERIES.

- 1.—All monuments and headstones, with bases, are required to be supported with such brick foundations as the Superintendent may deem necessary.
- 2.—Copper cramps and dowels only are allowed in fixing memorials.
- 3.—No foundation will be inserted in, nor will the fixing of any memorial be allowed upon any grave or vault without the personal or written instructions of the owner.
- 4.—A truck, planks, boards for protecting the turf, &c., will be furnished for the use of masons bringing memorials into the

Cemetery, for the loan of which a minimum charge of 2s. 6d. will be made.

- In the construction of vaults, all outer walls shall not be less than nine inches in thickness.
- 6.—All materials, gravestones, and monuments must be conveyed into the Cemetery by hand, or on carts or trucks with wheels of not less than four inches flat tyre.
- 7.—Gravestones and monuments will be allowed to be brought into the Cemetery between the hours of 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. only; the workmen employed in their erection must leave the Cemetery at 5.30 p.m.
- 8.—No bath, caen, or other soft stone must be used in the construction of memorials to be erected in the Cemetery, and no borders for enclosing graves, or monuments, tombs, slabs, mouldings, &c., made of concrete, cement, imitation-stone or slate, or anything of a like nature or material liable to perish and become unsightly are allowed to be erected in the Cemetery.
- 9.—The fixing of memorials is not allowed on Saturdays, and masons are requested to arrange for the bringing in of headstones, &c., so that the work may be completed early on the Friday.
- 10.—Any flat stone laid upon, or edge stones set around any single grave, must not exceed in dimensions 6 feet by 3 feet by 6 inches thick. The base of any monument erected over any single grave must not exceed 3 feet 3 inches by 6 feet 6 inches. Head stones must not exceed 3 feet in breadth by 5 feet in height, nor be less than 2 feet 6 inches in breadth by 4 feet 6 inches in height.
- 11.—All edge stones shall not be less than 9 inches in depth, and 3 inches in thickness, and all such stones shall be sunk not less than 3 inches in the ground, and fixed according to the rake or formation of the ground.
- 12.—In the construction of a bricked grave, other than a vault, the brickwork shall not be less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches in thickness.
- 13.—Slabs for the covering of coffins shall not be less than 3 inches in thickness, and in vaults shall be grouted or plastered with cement half inch in thickness on the top of the flags.

14.—Flags for the covering of vaults, pending the erection of a monument, shall not be less than 4 inches in thickness, and shall be of a sufficient size to allow of a lap of 4½ inches all round. These flags, with the exception of the one over the foot of the vault, may be removed on the erection of a monument, provided the design of such monument admit of their removal.

15.—All memorials must be completely worked before they are admitted to the Cemetery, and no labour of any kind, beyond that of fixing, will be allowed upon them therein.

16.—No person is allowed to solicit orders within the Cemetery.

The Cemetery is laid out as follows, viz. :-

The marginal grave spaces are laid out 8 feet by 4 feet for public graves only.

All other grave spaces (with the exception of Vault spaces) are 9 feet by 4 feet.

The margin adjoining the walks around every plot, save in Plots L, M, N, O, D, D¹, E, P, Q, R, S, and HH, that portion of Plot T facing Plot O and the main walk, and that portion of Plot K facing Plot L and main walk, also every tenth grave space, or such less number as the Corporation may deem desirable, will be used as common graves.

The margin adjoining the walks of Plots L, M, N, O, D, E, P, Q, R, and S, and those portions of Plots T and K which face main walk and Plots O and L, will be 18 inches in width.

The margin of Plot HH (facing Main Walk and Circle) will be 18 inches in width.

The front row of Plots D, E, P, Q, R, and S, which face the main walk and circle, are reserved for Vaults, 9 feet by 12 feet.

The corner spaces of Plots T and K, nearest the Chapels, are reserved for Vaults, 9 feet by 12 feet; and those parts of Plots T and K facing main walk, and Plots O and L, are laid out in grave spaces, 9 feet by 4 feet, with a margin of 18 inches.

If planted with a mixture of Herbaceous

If it is desired that Half-hardy Plants, Shrubs, or Green-house Plants should be planted upon the graves, the Corporation are prepared to enter into a special agreement for this purpose on payment of a reasonable sum for the same, according to the class of plants, &c., required, and the Superintendent is authorised to enter into such an agreement.

The Corporation have not fixed any fees for permission to place a mural tablet in any of the Chapels, but they are prepared to enter into an agreement with any person desiring to erect such a tablet, and the Superintendent is also authorised to enter into such an agreement.

On payment of the Fees set forth in the Table "for the exclusive right of burial for a period of years," the exclusive right of interring any other member of the same family in the grave is reserved for—if an adult is interred in the first instance—14 years; if a child under 12 years of age is interred, 8 years.

If desired, the Corporation are prepared to enter into an agreement with persons acquiring the right to inter in a Grave, giving them the option of purchasing the exclusive right of burial in the grave, on payment of 5s. as a fee for the exercise of this option, and the difference between the sum paid for the right to inter as set out in the Table of Fees and the price of the grave also set out therein, any time within five years from the date of the first interment or previous to the next interment if within that period The site of all Common and Deferred Purchase Graves is to be determined by the Superintendent of the Cemetery.

The surface rights over all Common Graves is reserved, and also over all Deferred Purchase Graves until the exclusive right of burial in such grave has been acquired.
