# PREFACE

### OF THE SECOND EDITION

I N the preface to the first edition of "THE SPAS OF FRANCE" published in 1921, I set forth the general plan of the work and the practical advantages which French watering places offer to visitors.

I would now more especially address myself to the foreign and French medical men who may receive this album.

The conception of a hydromineral cure is far from being the same in different countries, and this is due not only to the mentality of the different peoples, but also to the geographical distribution of the essential element of the cure, the natural mineral water.

France is incontestably the most favoured nation from the point of view of richness in mineral water springs. Not that other countries may not possess a greater number of springs, but the latter present fewer varieties of types, suggesting comparatively limited therapeutical applications. The springs which abound in French soil possess a variety of physico-chemical composition which enable them to satisfy the most delicate indications of hydrological therapeutics.

Consequently two very different ways of regarding hydrotherapy result.

In many foreign spas, all the resources of physiotherapy are brought into use and complete clinical installations provided so that the most varied diseases can be treated. The mineral water itself plays but a secondary part and it matters little whether the patient takes his cure at one resort or another.

French hydrologists, on the other hand, convinced of the profound effect of mineral waters upon the organism, have always striven to allocate to the different spas, sufferers from diseases for which scientific experimentation and clinical experiences has shown them to be specially suited.

The hydromineral cure is in fact one of the most efficacious means of combatting chronic conditions occurring upon soil more or less predisposed by hereditary faults or acquired toxinfections.

At first directed by mere empiricism, the employment of the different cures has been regulated and confirmed by the progress of chemistry and physics. The activity of substances reduced to the molecular or colloidal state is now recognised and mineral waters represent extraordinary complex solutions in which a certain number of simple bodies are found in that state, such as sulphur and the rare metals, also radium emanations of which thermal springs are one of the most important sources.

This knowledge, recently acquired and daily increasing, enables the action of the waters to be more scientifically determined.

In my opinion, therefore, it is important that a patient should not be sent to a particular spa without a thorough knowledge of the special indications for the waters which are employed there, whatever physico-therapeutic or other measures may be available, as they play only a a secondary role in the cure. In spite of the elaborate presentation of this album and the attractive photographs which it contains, Doctors must note take a light view of the value of the text and consider it as a common-place reference work destined for the use of the general public. In addition to the indispensable practical information contained therein, there is much useful matter of a strictly medical nature. The principal indications of the hydromineral cures proper to the special nature of the local water are formulated as briefly as possible, in addition to the secondary indications which invariably follow on the first, and which, in most cases, are derived from the resources due to the technical installations of the resort.

In this album, the various spas are classified in different categories. The principal ones, that is to say those where the therapeutic equipment or the material organisation is perfect, and which are thus deserving of a detailed description, are allotted four pages each. Two pages suffice for the resorts where at present the installation is less complete, while the information on spas which, although possessing very active waters, have not yet been equiped with complete installations, only occupies one page.

In conclusion, I would reiterate the practical advice which I gave in the first edition and which is always pertinent.

In France, it is in July and August that the spas are most frequented, principally owing to the fact that the University vacations take place at this time. In my opinion, there are many advantages in taking a cure, when it is at all possible to do so, in the months of May, June or September. The patients are able to avoid the extreme of summer heat, the doctors have more time at their disposal and the hotels being less crowded are able to give better service and

more favourable terms to the visitors than during the height of the season.

I, therefore, strongly advise foreign invalids to take either a spring or autumnal cure in our spas. an additional advantage from their point of view being that they would then be free to pass the summer months at sea-side or Alpine resorts.

The fact that the French hydromineral resorts are nearly all situated in very good touring centres, does but serve to augment the attraction which is only equalled by their very special therapeutic value.

### AIX-LES-BAINS AS A SPA

S

ITUATION. — Aix-les-Bains is 581 kilometres from Paris upon the main line into Italy by the Mont Cenis. Its population is 9.000 and it is visited annually by about 40.000 persons for the sake of its waters and its amusements. Altitude: 846 ft.

CLIMATE. — Aix is situated upon Lake Bourget in a broad valley bounded by wooded heights. It is open to the north and south-west. The town is built in terraces upon the spurs of Mont Revard.

Owing to the geographical position the climate is soft and temperate. It is singularly dry, for fog is unknown. The heat at Aix is never excessive and the mornings, evenings and nights are always cool.

The bathing establishment is open all the year round, but thermal treatment is most efficacious from April to November. The spring and autumn are preferable; the spa is then less crowded, the service is better, prices are not so high.

PUBLIC HEALTH. — The drinking water is good; it is derived partly from springs brought from the mountains and partly from the lakes. Sanitation is by Calmette's system of bacterial purification. The streets are tarred and well watered.

THE SPRINGS AND THE BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — a) Two hot sulphur springs: Source de Source and Source d'Alun, yielding four million litres in twenty-four hours. Temperature: 112° F.

b) Three cold springs: Source des Reines, 46°4 F; Source Saint-Simon, 66°2 F.; and Source Massenat, 59° F. These waters possess strong diuretic properties. They are given by the mouth and are employed as adjuvans to external treatment.

The Bathing Establishment has been entirely restored and redecorated and has luxurious annex. The installation is modern and very comfortable. There are rooms for general and local douche-massage, vapour baths; baths with under-water douche; swimming baths; rooms for atomization, hydrotherapy; intestinal lavage, gargling and inhalation.

The bathing establishment at Marlioz, ten minutes from Aix, specializes in treatment of the respiratory passages. It has three springs, is situated in a public park.

### THE WATERS

CHEMICAI, COMPOSITION. — The water of the hot springs is clear and limpid, with a slightly sulphurous odour, alkaline reaction and a specific gravity of 1,024. By Dupasquier's sulpho-hydrometer, it contains 4 sulphur. It has a radio-activity of 0,68 milligrammes a minute and is the most radio-active water in France. It carries in suspension whitish flakes and filaments of barégine, an oily organic matter, the presence of which renders the waters peculiarly suitable to massage. The chemical composition of the springs is essentially the same, as shown by Willm's analysis in 1878. It is as well to point out that the Source d'Alun contains no trace of alum; it is due solely to a respect for tradition that the spring is allowed to retain its misleading appelation.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY. — The clinical results of treatment are due to the combined operation of several factors, namely the temperature, mineralization and radio-activity of the waters in combination with the effects of massage. The effect upon nutrition is considerable, as all the phenomena of the exchanges are affected. There is in particular an increase in the elimination of solid materials, urates, phosphates and uric acid.

The effect of douche-massage upon the circulation is very marked. It does not tend to increase blood-pressure, and for this reason may be safely employed in cardiac conditions of rheumatic and gouty origin with good compensation. The general diathesis becomes improved, while at the same time the cardiac conditions are ameliorated.

In so far as the nervous system is concerned, the Aix treatment may have either a sedative or stimulant effect, according to the method employed.


Finally, the mechanical effects of douche-massage tend to accelerate the passage of lymph in the lymphatics and thus to promote interstitial absorption.

METHODS OF EMPLOYMENT. — The hot waters of Aix are employed externally only. The treatment par excellence consists of a hot douche combined with massage, the method being termed "douche-massage". Natural vapour baths, general and local, are also given, as well as simple sulphur baths, with or without under-water douches.

Treatment is reinforced by mecano-electrotherapy at the Zander Institute, the best establishment of its kind in France.

External treatment is supplemented by water from the cold springs, taken by the mouth.


General view.

### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. - These are both medical and surgical.

- 1º Medical. a) The chief medical indication is undoubtedly chronic rheumatism in all its protean manifestations whether diathetic or gouty, hereditary or acquired. Articular rheumatism, periarticular thickening, rigidity, tendinous synovitis, spondylitis. Muscular rheumatism of the shoulder and loins, muscular lumbago. Neuralgic rheumatism, intercostal neuralgia, cervico-brachial neuralgia, sciatica, toxic neuritis.
- b) Articular gout, in the chronic and atonic forms and the forme fruste. The cold waters taken by the mouth provide a valuable adjuvans to external treatment. Arthritic diabetes in full-blooded subjects.
  - c) Polyarthritis deformans or osteo-arthritis deformans in the early stages,
- d) Sequelae of acute articular rheumatism or of infective pseudo-rheumatism, angina, blenorrhagia, and the rigidity and partial ankyloses which these provoke.
- e) Neuralgias, sciatica. Neuralgia, sciatica or neuritis is enormously benefitted by the Aix douche massage, as also intercostal and femoro-cutaneous neuralgias and the neuralgia of Morton.
- f) Peripheral neuritis of various origin including alcoholism, with amyotrophy; trophic cutaneous affections, pitting, fibro-tendinous reactions.
- g) Syphilis is treated at Aix by the methods employed at all sulphur spas. The vigorous medical treatment is reinforced by thermal measures.
  - h) Sequelae of hemiplegia without contracture or of polyomyelitis. Sequelae of phlebitis,
  - i) Dermatoses of arthritic origin.
- $2^9$  Surgical indications. All articular affections resulting from traumatism. Aix is, in a very special sense, the spa for joints.
  - a) Simple chronic arthritis, both dry and with hydrarthrosis.
  - b) Articular rigidity in all stages up to complete ankylosis (osteo-arthritis).
  - c) Tendinous synovitis, simple or with muscular atrophy.
  - d) Traumatic neuritis due to section or compression of a nerve.
  - e) Sequelae of war wounds.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Acute rheumatism and gout; all forms of tuberculosis (e. g. there is a form of rheumatism which, in its early stages, is sometimes mistaken for tuberculosis, this is not contra-indicated). Cardiac conditions with broken compensation; kidney disease with renal insufficiency; diseases of the liver; suppurative conditions of the urinary passages; the menopause when associated with menorrhagia.

### LIFE AT AIX-LES-BAINS

AMUSEMENTS. — Aix-les-Bains offers facilities for amusements and interests of the most varied description. There are numerous Roman remains: the Arch of Campanus, the Roman baths, the temple of Diana. The chief promenade is a park planted in the centre of the town; on the shores of Lake Bourget, immortalized by Lamartine, is another and newer park.

Aix boasts two luxurious casinos. The Grand Cercle, founded in 1824, is open from 1st April to 1st November. The building itself is a richly ornamented palace; its theatre, recently rebuilt, is justly celebrated for its luxury and comfort; the Villa des Fleurs is a beautiful building situated in a fine park with an open-air theatre.

The concerts and theatrical productions are celebrated the world over.

There are tennis and golf clubs; there is pigeon shooting and horse-racing; regattas are held on Lake Bourget and there is boating, sailing, fishing and a motor-boat service.

EXCURSIONS. — Aix-les-Bains is a centre for important climbs in the French Alps. In the immediate vicinity, within a radius of fifteen kilometres, there are numerous beautiful walks.

Principal excursions. — The Grande Chartreuse, La Chambotte, the drive round the lake, Hautecombe, the Col du Chat, the Val du Fier, etc.

Ascents. - Mont Revard, 5.068 ft.; the Dent du Nivolet; the Dent du Chat.

Carriages, cars, etc., are obtainable. Aix is a station on the P.-I.-M. Motor-service, Route des Alpes.

WINTER SPORTS AT MONT REVARD. — From December to 15th March, winter sports are held at Mont Revard, 5.068 ft., seventy minutes from Aix by the rack and pinion railway.

A magnificent view of Mont Blanc and the Alps is obtained from the Plateau of Revard and in winter this plateau offers a splendid field for ski-ing. There are bobsleigh and lugeing runs. There is an hotel and restaurant on the plateau itself.

ACCOMMODATION. — There are numerous first-class hotels which offer the acme of luxury, and hotels and pensions to suit every taste and purse abound. The majority is open during the winter season. There are furnished apartments and villas of every description.

GENERAL INFORMATION. — For information concerning the treatment, the tariffs of the bathing establishments, the export of the waters, excursions, motor-car tours, the time-table of the motor-boat service, and all details concerned with the comfort or convenience of visitors, application should be made to Le Comité d'Initiative, Place de l'Hôtel-de-Ville, Aix-les-Bains (Savoie).

### BIARRITZ AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Biarritz is situated on the Basque coast at the head of the gulf of Gascogne. It is built on hills descending to the sea and ending in more or less extensive beaches. It is 30 kilometres from the Spanish border.

The town has 17,000 inhabitants and over 40,000 visitors yearly.

CLIMATE. — Typical coast climate. Biarritz is under the influence of the oceanic currents, especially that of the Gulf Stream. The uniformity of the climate is due to this fact and also to the constant and particularly high hygrometric condition of the atmosphere: 70 to 80.%

The south wind prevails in winter, sea-winds in summer, and autumn.

Moderate temperature at all seasons: 60° to 73° F. in summer, 43° to 50° in winter.

For those reasons Biarritz, besides being a spa, is a much frequented winter resort.

DURATION OF SEASON. — The season lasts throughout the year.

Large numbers of visitors take the cure during the summer.

All those who love this charming place and those wishing to take the cure are strongly advised to visit Biarritz in May and June or in October, during which months the weather is exquisite. Besides this, the cost of living is very reasonable and the hotels less crowded during these months.

URBAN SANITATION. — The drinking water is drawn from subterranean sheets of water of remarkable purity. Drainage system, incinerators. Streets tarred and watered. Health office. Epidemics are unknown in Biarritz. Electric lighting.

### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL CONSTITUTION. — The temperature of the water 57°2 F : it has a high percentage of sodium chloride.

It contains 307 grm. 79 of mineral salts to the litre, composed of chloride of sodium, 295 grammes; chloride of potassium, 2 grammes; traces of chloride of lithium, iodide of sodium, sodium bromide, sulphate of lime, of magnesium and of soda.

This water is II times more salt than sea water.

The bath contains 75 kilos of mineral salts in solution.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION. - The Biarritz waters are tonic and discutient.

They increase the metabolism by facilitating absorption, improving the assimilation and causing rapid expulsion of the organic waste products. They have a selective action on the female genital organs.

Their action is effectively supported by the sea air and this quite unique combination of the two elements renders the saline cure complete.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — Yield one million litres per diem. The saline waters of Biarritz come from the Briscous springs situated a few miles from Bayonne.

The water is carried in pipes directly to Biarritz without undergoing any modification as has been proved by repeated analysis.

The Thermes Salins (salt baths) is a modern building 600 yards from the sea; it comprises about a hundred bath-rooms, douche-rooms, rooms for local douche, etc. It has besides a complete installation for hydrotherapy with fresh water, an installation for air-baths as well as arrangement for massage and under-water massage. The Establishment remains open throughout the year.

### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

THERAPEUTIC USES. — The treatment is exclusively external: baths more or less moderated by fresh water and graduated in this respect up to 24° by the Beaumé aerometer (the pure salt water as a bath). General local and filiform douches with the unadulterated salt water. Local compresses generally applied at the patients residence. Irrigation carried out either in special apartments or in the bath, has a decongestive and resolvent action on the female genital apparatus.

The compresses and irrigations are prepared with the mother-water, composed of the residue after heating the natural salt water, the major part of the salt being extracted. It contains per litre 260 grammes of chloride of magnesium; 10 grammes of bromide and 0 grm. 13 of alkaline iodides. This water is particularly sedative. It may be added to the salt baths in varying quantities making them tolerable to irritable subjects,

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC APPLICATIONS — Women's diseases: Metritis, salpingitis (once acute period is past), fibromata, sterility.

Children's diseases: All conditions benefitting by sea air are amenable to the cure: rickets, scrofula, early tuberculosis, tracheo-bronchial adenopathy.

Local tuberculosis: Bone, articular and ganglionic lesions.

Anaemia, neurasthenia, convalescence.




THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — Daily yield : one million litres. Two warm springs: Choussy and Perrière (140° F. at the springhead, 134°6 F. at the bathing establishment) and Croizat (116°6 F. at the springhead, 104° F. at the bathing establishment) Two cold springs: Fenestre and Clemence.

The chemical composition of the four springs, all containing arsenic, varies very little.

### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — Warm waters varying from 116% F. to 131% F. Slightly salt taste.

The Bourboule waters contain a larger percentage of arsenic than any of the warm waters known: 28 milligrammes of arsenate of soda to the litre; 3 grammes of chloride of sodium, 3 grammes of bicarbonate of soda; a fairly large proportion of silicum; the total mineralisation varies from 6 to 10 grammes.

The composition of the cold waters of the Fenestre and Clemence springs is similar to that of the warm springs, but the mineralisation is less and they are chalybeate and strongly aerated.

The Bourboule waters are the most radio-active in France: 1 milligr.-minute 78 after four days as regards the water and 11 milligr.-minute o2 as regards the gases,

PHYSIOI,OGICAL ACTION. — The warm mineral waters of La Bourboule owe their principal effects to the arsenic. Like it, the arsenical water of La Bourboule modifies and stimulates nutrition. It gives the necessary filip to the sluggish metabolism in lethargic and exhausted patients.

Like arsenic, it purifies the blood, aids the internal economy and renews the saline content of the plasma. It is more effectual than cacodylate or arrhenium, arsenates or arsenites, better in fact than any arsenical preparation in the pharmacopaeia whether organic or inorganic.

The patients quickly regain their appetite, increase in weight and in vigour.

The waters of La Bourboule, aided by the physiological action of the altitude, are of great value in restoring the general health and particularly in the reformation of red blood corpuscles. Anaemia, chlorosis, anaemia of doubtful causation and early tuberculosis improve and are cured. The Bourboule waters are a veritable specific in cases of malarial anaemia.


In short, the arsenical waters of La Bourboule regulate metabolism. They exercise a curbing action on all the cells of the body, which are the seat of a temporary excess of function, such action being due to the arsenic. It acts by maintaining the chemical changes at the correct-constant level.

THERAPEUTIC USES. — The assimilation of the arsenical water is the essential basis of the cure and the main form of treatment is by imbibition,

The rooms of inhalation through an atomiser, another mean of assimilating the water, are also much in vogue.

Baths supplemented by douches, atomisation, inhalation, radio-active gas douches, retronasal douches, vaginal irrigation, needle douches, under water massage, etc., make it possible, by graduating the intensity, frequency and duration of these applications, to obtain favourable results in all conditions amenable to the arsenical treatment.

### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — The indications for advising the waters of Bourboule are those for the administration of arsenic. One may say, then, that treatment at La Bourboule is indicated in all conditions where it is desired to prescribe arsenic with a view to renewing the salts of the blood, or to establish metabolism at a proper level; it is of especial value in cases of dermatosis, lymphatism, diseases of the respiratory system and the blood.

General conditions. — This spa has long been known for the efficacy of its arsenical and chloride waters in the treatment of all lymphatic and ganglionic conditions. Here arsenic plays the role which our ancestors termed stimulating. It regulates cellular metabolism, that is to say, it modifies it by stimulation and activation.

The waters of La Bourboule are of particular value in those lymphatic and ganglionic cases whose nervous condition does not admit of the bracing climate of the coast.

Finally, the arsenical waters of La Bourboule, being alkaline in addition have a favourable action in regulating the metabolism of diabetics; particularly in those cases which are becoming emaciated owing to over rapid oxidation and in those troubled by cutaneous complications which in themselves are often very intractible to ordinary forms of treatment.


Localised skin lesions. — Treatment at this spa acts on the cases of skin disease in two ways, there is a local action brought about by the use of baths of short or long duration (they may last several hours) various forms of applications (moist packs, fomentations and lavage), spray douches, fine jets under pressure (needle douches, etc.), they also act in a general way when they are taken internally in cases of eczema, acne, furonculosis, prurigo, lichen, psoriasis.

Affections of the naso-pharyngeal mucous membrane. — Of respiratory diseases, the La Bourboule treatment is particularly indicated in cases of lymphatism limited to the bronchi and the mediastinal ganglionic system, torpid bronchitis, passive congestion, tracheo-bronchial adenopathy, ganglionic cough and asthma. The finely divided water reaches even to the congested lymphatic nodes, removes their congestion and thus alleviates their irritating and compressing action.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Tuberculosis, open or with haemoptysis, non compensated heart lesion, serious disease of the liver, particularly atrophic cirrhosis, albuminuria is not a contra-indication.





### CAUTERETS AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Cauterets is a high-lying spa situated in the most magnificent part of the Hautes-Pyrénées. A railway terminus of the Paris-Pyrenées express. Population of 1.500. In summer it is visited by about 25.000 persons for the sake of its waters and the winter sports attract about 5.000. Mountain Touring Centre.

CI,IMATE. — Surrounded by wooded heights (9.842 ft.) the valley of Cauterets is sheltered from rough winds. The air is impregnated with ozone and is of a luminous and sparking quality. Though still, it is kept fresh by the activity of many cascades and torrents. The mean atmospheric pressure is 687 millimetres. These factors combine to produce a climate which is both sedative and tonic, which tends to enhance respiration, stimulate circulation and appetite and, by promoting sleep, to stabilize the nervous equilibrium.

Average summer temperature :  $50^{\circ}$  F. at 6 a. m.,  $62^{\circ}$  F. at 2 p. m.,  $50^{\circ}$  F. at 8 p. m. In winter : winter-sports (January-February) ; air treatment ; climato-therapy.

PUBLIC HEALTH. — The drinking water is sterile and is derived from granite formation. There is a system of main drainage and disinfecting rooms.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — There are twelve springs yielding two million litres daily. There are nine bathing establishments, situated at the emergence of the springs in order to assure clinical constancy. The hydrotherapeutic installation is very complete and entirely up-to-date (enritely rebuilt in 1922-1923).

A. — North Group (schists): 1. The Thermes de César, 118°4 F. and the Thermes des Espagnols, 118°76 F., are sulphurated waters; 2. The Neothermes de César and Le Rocher, 95°54 F., contain chloro-sulpho-silicates; Rieumiset, 60°8 F., contains bicarbonates and sulphates; 3. The Thermes de Pauze-Vieux, 91°4 F., are employed in affections of the skin.

B. — South Group (granite): 4. La Raillière, 99°52 F., is employed in diseases of the respiratory organs; 5. The Thermes du Petit-Saint-Sauveur, 100°4 F., contain hyposulphites and are sedative in their action; 6. Le Pré, 118°4 F., is beneficial in rheumatism; 7. Le Bois, 109°4 F., is indicated in gout; 8. La Buvette de Mauhourat, 122° F., is an alkaline sulphosilicated water largely employed in auto-intoxications; 9. The bathing establishment of the Thermes des Œufs, in the centre of the town, has a very complete hydrotherapeutic installation with a swimming bath of running sulphur water.

### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL CONSTITUTION. — Sulphur is present under the following conditions: 1° As unoxygenated but readily assimilable colloidal sulphur and as soluble sodium monosulphide (o grm. o23 to o grm. o13). These waters are stimulating and promote metabolism; 2° Waters from the fissure close to the spring contain sulphur which is partially oxygenated, alkaline sulphites and hyposulphites. These waters are sedative in their action; 3° In some springs the sulphur is completely oxygenated and is present in the form of sulphates.

Other chemical constituents are iodine, boron, fluorine, the chlorides, the carbonates and especially the alkaline silicates (o grm. o65 to o grm. oo8). The sulphurated nitrogenized organic matter is present, due to the sulpho-bacteria of oxydation.

Metals are present in the colloid state (metallic ferments); they are: silver, bismuth, copper, bronze, gallium, germanium, glucinium, mercury, lead, nickel, molybdenum, and tungsten (spectrographic analysis by the Institut d'Hydrologie).

Gases are: Nitrogen 21 to 30 cmc. per litre; emanations of radium, helium, neon and argono,11 to 1,48 to 100 litres of gas.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY. — Sulphur is a fundamental constituent; it is as essential as nitrogen and carbon to the vitality of the proteid molecule. The multiplicity of its chemical forms in the waters of Cauterets and their consequent diversity of reaction, explains the varied activity in promoting nutrition, whether organic or cellular, which these waters possess.

1° In those conditions of the skin, joints or respiratory organs which are characterised by a marked diminution of sulphur, the sulphur is restored to the economy in a slightly oxygenated and readily soluble form (soluble alkaline sulphides). For this reason it is easily assimilable and its clinical activity is pronounced.

2º In anaemia, lymphatic conditions and neurasthenia there is a species of sulphur starvation, due to constant loss of the sulphates and their congeners by way of the urine. Sulphur, taken by the mouth, promotes mineralisation and arrests the excessive calcium losses (Prof. Robin).

3° In the case of the auto-intoxications, the combination of sulphur with the phenols and other aromatic toxins tends to neutralize their toxic action. Taurin and bile contain 25 % of sulphur and it is a function of the liver to neutralize toxins. That this activity is heightened by the ingestion of sulphur, is shown by the increased percentage of urea formed in the liver and by the diminution of the proportion of uric acid.

4° The elimination of sulphur by way of the respiratory mucous membranes liquifies the bronchial secretions and destroys micro-organisms. The alkaline silicates of the Mauhourat waters are successful in liquifying the bile in hepatic catarrhal conditions, and they are able to effect a permanent reduction in the hyperacidity of chronic dyspepsia.

### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

GENERAL INDICATIONS. — Taken by the mouth, the waters of Cauterets are strongly indicated in the management of all chronic affections of the respiratory passages, whether associated with lymphatic or arthritic conditions, or whether arising from inflammation due to occupational abuse or strain (singers, barristers, stock-brokers, lecturers, etc.). The local application of sulphur waters has an aseptic action and reduces mucous congestion and these results are reinforced by the general application of the treatment.

Nose. — Purulent naso-pharyngial catarrh, atrophic rhinitis, the spasmodic rhinitis of arthrities, operative treatment of the sinuses (nasal douches, inhalations).

Ear. — Catarrh of the tubes, infiltration of the mucosa with accompanying deafness (tubo-tympanic vapourisation, inhalation by the nose).

Pharynz. — Recurring tonsillitis and pharyngitis, the hypertrophic angina of children, the sequelae of adenoid growths (gargles, sprays).

Larynv. — Occupational catarrhs and purulent conditions, complete or nodular hypertrophy of the vocal cords (inhalation, inhalation of the natural gases of the springs, mixed with vapourised water, throat douches).

Lungs. — Tracheal-bronchitis, both recurring and chronic, catarrhal asthma, emphysema, chronic pleurisy, sequelae of influenza, broncho-pneumonia, empyema, trachea-bronchial glandular disease, inert pretuberculosis, poison gases.

General nutrition. — Pathological fatigue, over-work, convalescence. Arthritic signs: articular (rheumatism), respiratory (asthma), cutaneous (eczema, acné, seborrhoea), nervous (debility, neurasthenia, the algias), digestive (loss of appetite, atonic dyspepsia), gynaecological (dysmenorrhoeae, metritis, growths). These conditions respond to baths, local and general douches and foot baths.

Wounds. — Old wounds, fistulae, sequestra, muscular atrophy, painful scars. These are treated by re-education and physical exercises.

Syphilis. — The cachexic stage which follows the active period of the trypanosome. The treatment aims at remineralisation and elimination of toxins.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Acute disease, febrile tuberculosis, haemoptysis, cardiac conditions with broken compensation, albuminuria.

### LIFE AT CAUTERETS

THE SEASON. — The season begins at the end of May, Immediately after the Paris Derby, society leaves the capital and Cauterets becomes crowded with jaded and debilitated members of the fashionable world. Simple excursions. — Mountain walks (there are numerous shelters put up by the T. C. F. and the C. A. F.), mountain climbing, botanising, camping out, excursions on horse-back or with mules, carriage driving, motor excursions. Cars on hire.

Sports. — Tennis and golf tournaments, pigeon-shooting competitions; shooting, trout-fishing in the lakes and torrents of the Hautes Vallées; dog-shows; gymkhanas; donkey-polo; battles of flowers, balls, fairs, etc., etc. 10 châlets-hotels and shelters in the mountain.

Musical and artistic attractions. — Two theatres, two casinos, popular concerts, classical concerts, cinema, conferences, exhibitions.

The "Nature Theatre". — Artistic performances are given by well-known actors from Paris in the magnificent setting where Marguerite de Valois, sister of Francis I., once held her famous Courts of Love.

Motor tours. — Cauterets is an excellent centre for mountain tours in the grandest part of the Hautes-Pyrénees. It is a halting station for the service of motor cars belonging to the company of the Grande Route des Pyrénées, which connects Biarritz on the Atlantic with the Mediterranean. Electric funicular railways facilitate excursions to the Gorges de Pierrefitte, to Luz-Saint-Sauveur, to the cirques of Gavarnie and Troumouse, to the Abbey of Saint-Savin and to Notre-Dame-de-Lourdes, the goal of pilgrims from all over the world.

Winter sports. — From Christmas onwards, the winter sports at Cauterets are in full swing. There are sleighing excursions, ski-ing competitions, bob-sleighing, luging and skating.

ACCOMMODATION. — There are 4 first-class hotels with hot and cold water, electric light, central heating, bath-rooms, etc. Between them they have 1.400 bed-rooms of which 300 have private bath-rooms.

There are 9 second-class hotels. These are comfortable and have 800 bed-rooms.

There are 10 third-class hotels, unpretentious in style and with 600 bed-rooms.

There are 50 furnished houses. Villas and apartments of every kind are available.

### CHATEL-GUYON AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Modern spa in a picturesque situation on the lower slopes of the Dômes. 2,000 inhabitants. 15,000 visitors.

CLIMATE. — Châtel-Guyon is a typical hill station. Its altitude is 1,300 feet, its soil granite and permeable. It lies in a valley open to the east and protected on its other aspects by vine clad hills and pine mountains. Its climate is mild and dry and at the same time stimulating and tonic, ideal for neuroarthritic subjects.

URBAN SANITATION. — Improved drainage system, electric light, clear spring water from the Volvic mountain. Municipal office of hygiene.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — Thirty intercepted springs yielding more than five million litres daily.

Five of these serve the drinking pavilions in the park (Yvonne, Deval, Germaine, Louise, Marguerite).

Two establishments for hydrotherapy. — The Grands Thermes recently built and comprising 134 rooms with carbonic acid gas baths of running mineral water at 93°2 F, and with installations for under-water abdominal douches (mineral water at 113° F, under pressure).

The Henry Establishment comprises baths at various temperatures and mineralisations, arrangements for intestinal irrigation and masso-lavage and all the latest appliances for hydrotherapy in all its forms.

Besides these, there are two pavilions, one devoted to electrotherapy and massage, the other to the local application of mud. These services are under medical supervision,

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The constituents of the different springs are more or less similar. They differ chiefly in their temperature which varies from 78°8 to 100°4 F.

Warm waters, gaseous, containing sodium and magnesium chlorides, mixed bicarbonates and iron.

Their total mineralisation is about 8 grm. 40; magnesium chloride (1 grm. 56); sodium chloride (1 grm. 63); bicarbonate of lime (2 grm. 17); bicarbonate of soda, of lithium and of iron.

There is 1 grm. 112 of carbonic acid per litre.

Their chief characteristic and peculiarity is their magnesium chloride content. This salt regulates the tonicity of the smooth muscular fibres of the digestive apparatus, stimulating the secretions of the stomach, the intestine and the adnexa, it is a powerful cytophylactic and aids cellular regeneration.

Contrary to a report too widely circulated, the Châtel-Guyon water is not purgative. It regulates the intestinal functions, whether it be a matter of constipation or diarrhoea, spasm or atony.

THERAPEUTIC USE. — Ingestion of the waters is the principal means of treatment.

Baths, different forms of hydrotherapy and various external applications are also of great service.

The Gubler spring, belonging to the Société des Eaux and a number of other springs with similar properties privately owned.

The Mathival, Miraton, Légère, Table, Saint-Coust springs are used exclusively for drinking and bottling—They are exported and patients are enabled to commence treatment at home and complete it on leaving the station.

As accessory to the cure: Climato-therapy: medium altitude. 1,300 feet. Sports grounds and park, 1,950 ft. Splendid view on the rich plain of Limagne.

Dietetic treatment: special diet tables in all the good hotels and villas under the supervision of the medical society.

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — a) Indications taken from the study of the digestive functions. All disorders characterised by functional insufficiency either motor or secretory of the intestine or its glands, whether permanently or at certain periods of the evolution of these disorders.

- Intestine. All forms of colitis emanating from constipation, atonic or spasmodic or from diarrhoea (false diarrhoea, diarrhoea due to gastric or hepato-pancreatic insufficiency, mucous colitis, sequelae of dysentry, toxi-alimentary enteritis). Intestinal lithiasis. Rectocolitis except during ulcerous or inflammatory periods.
- The stomach. Digestive atony, hyposthenic dyspepsia polyvisceral ptosis with autointoxication, emaciation and asthenia.
- Liver. Congestive conditions of the liver with intestinal disorders. Abdominal plethora, haemorrhoids. Torpid forms of biliary lithiasis with manifestations of colitis. Angiocholecystitis during period of rest.
- 4. Tropical disorders. Intestinal troubles (constipation or diarrhoea), Sequelae of dysentry and malaria with anaemia. Congestion of the liver.
- b) Indications taken from the general condition. Atonic conditions due to auto-intoxication, diminished nutrition anaemia and lack of salts. Asthenia following digestive infections. Obesity.
- c) Indications in children. The Châtel-Guyon waters in small doses and baths may be administered to very young children. It gives remarkably quick and enduring results. The indications are: Diarrhoea or constipation, digestive insufficiency, albuminous or muco-membraneous enteritis. Intestinal auto-intoxication, with attacks of fever or hepatic congestion. Acetonemic vomiting.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Ulcerative conditions of the alimentary canal with tendency to haemorrhage. Intestinal disorders secondary to an organic lesion of the nerve centres or with marked painful neuropathic reactions. Acute infectious conditions. Cancer wherever its site. Active tuberculosis. On the other hand, the cure may have a favourable influence on digestive disorders in subjects predisposed to tuberculosis and in cases of torpid tuberculosis (diarrhoea with enlarged liver due to forced alimentation, diarrhoea due to digestive insufficiency, digestive atony).

## CONTREXÉVILLE AS A SPA

S

ITUATION. - Spa situated 366 kilometres from Paris, in the heart of the Faucilles, near the watershed separating the basins of the Saône and the Meuse. Altitude: 1.148 ft. 950 inhabitants and 7.000 visitors.

CLIMATE. - Contrexéville is situated in a valley running north and souht. The climate is temperate with rather sharp variations in temperature; the air is pure, healthy and tonic.

URBAN SANITATION. - Irreproachable drinking water from sources protected from all contamination. The streams are almost entirely covered over. Drainage system. Electric light utilised for all services : the Park, the Hotels, the Town.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. - Five mineral springs in the Park of the bathing establishment : le Pavillon, la Souveraine, le Prince, le Quai, la Duchesse. Outside the Establishment there are further springs: Le Clerc, Thiéry, Mongeot, Great-Source, Châtillon-Lorraine.

Contrexéville owes its wide reputation to the Pavillon source. This spring, employed from time immemorial by people of the district for kidney troubles, only became really celebrated after Dr. Bagard, first physician to King Stanislas, had read a paper on the subject to the Royal Society of Science and Art at Nancy on January 10th 1760.

The hydropathic establishment as used to-day is divided into three sections : la Buvette, under the Coupole du Pavillon, the Galeries Promenoirs and the Thermes. The entire establishment was rebuilt in 1910 in an extremely effective Greco-Byzantine style. It is arranged on most modern lines; there are sixty model bath-rooms, swimming baths, apartments for douches, rooms for massage, both dry and under water, vapour baths, hot-air douches, etc. Rooms for turpentine steam and carbon-dioxide baths; an excellent electric apparatus perfectly installed, and completed by halls for gymnastics and mechanotherapy, also an apparaus for radiography and a laboratory of biology.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL CONSTITUENTS OF THE WATERS. — The Pavillon water, typical of the waters of Contrexeville, is cold (51° F.), clear, colourless and almost odourless, with an agreeable taste, radioactive (0,6 millimicrocurie per litre). Vield 200,000 litres per diem.

The total mineralisation per litre is 2 grm. 4, the most important elements of which are : sulphate of calcium (1 grm. 56); sulphate of magnesium (0 grm. 236); bicarbonate of calcium (0 grm. 40); sulphate of sodium (0 grm. 030); bicarbonate of lithium (0 grm. 004); bicarbonate of iron (0 grm. 007); silica (0 grm. 015).

Traces of fluorine and arsenic.

The composition of the other springs resembles more or less that of the Pavillon. The Prince contains more iron, the Quai more magnesium, the Souveraine is more laxative and has a special action on diseases of the liver.

THERAPEUTIC USE. — The Contrexéville cure is essentially a cure by ingestion. The water is drunk in glasses containing 100 to 333 grammes in progressive doses up to the maximum, and then in decreasing doses.

MINERAI, WATER EXPORTED. — Contrexéville-Pavillon

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION. — The ingested water passes very quickly from the stomach into the intestine; it is absorbed by the veins of the mesentery and passes through the liver increasing and liquifying its secretions, causing biliary and liquid stools; an excess of water not absorbed passes through the small intestine and flows directly into the large intestine, causing watery stools; the portion passing through the liver passes into the circulation, is carried by the blood which becomes more dilute and, after having washed all the tissues and cleared them of the uric acid, crystals, purins and all sorts of impurities, it passes out through the kidneys, causing polyuria and diuresis.

The water is diurctic; it increases the renal secretions both in quantity and quality and at the same time causes the expulsion of sediment; sand and calculi of the urinary and biliary passages, and drainage of the tissues; it is a disinfectant.

It is cholagogue, laxative and purgative.

It stimulates nutrition and renewal of mineral elements.

The diuretic effect is considerable, the urine is abundant, completely decolourised and the density is very low. In a short time a strong current of clear water is formed which passes through the system, washing the blood and the tissues and clearing the body of all its waste products.

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — The following conditions are treated with success at Contrexéville :

- Nephritis. The Contrexéville cure is indicated for all subjects suffering from or having suffered from renal colic, all cases renal disorders, acid gravel (uric acid, urate, calcium oxalate, cystitis) or alkaline gravel (phosphates) or pyelitis, pyelonephritis, nephroptosis. "Who says gravel, says Contrexéville".
- a) Uric gravel, or red gravel. Expulsion of urinary sand and gravel, decreased sensitivity or urinary passages. b) Oxalic gravel, crystals of oxalate of lime. c) Phosphatic gravel, primary or secondary or white gravel. The alkaline urine becomes acid by the cure. d) Pyelitis and pyelonephritis with or without calculus are particularly indicated, a small amount of albumin is not a contra-indication. e) Nephrectomies. Amelioration of troubles affecting remaining kidney. f) Nephroptosis. Movable of floating kidney.
- Urinary disorders. All cases of chronic cystitis improve under the treatment but the lower urinary passage must be clear so that there is no obstacle to micturition. Incontinence of urine due to vesical irritation in gouty children.
- 3. Gout. The treatment at Contrexéville is of service to all gouty subjects without exception, the attacks become less frequent, shorter and less painful and in some cases disappear entirely. White, atonic, chronic gout benefits by the Pavillon cure. Gout with visceral complications, ocular localisations; utero-ovarian gout, neuralgia and neuritis; diathesic dermatosis, gouty rheumatism.
- 4. Hepatic disorders. The Contrexéville cure is indicated in cases of congested or engorged liver in obese, gouty and arthritic subjects and in big eaters, in cases due to biliary lithiasis with gout and biliary gravel, when the patients are too weak to undergo the strenuous alkaline cure, also to plethora in cases of numb liver.
- Diabetes. The improvement is most marked in gouty or arthritic diabetes. The sugar diminishes and the uric acid increases.
- Albuminuria due to gout or lithiasis, or of hepatic origin associated with arterial hypertonicity.
- Arterial hypertonicity and early sclerosis. The cure at Contrexéville improves all the excretory functions, reduces the tension in cases of auto-intoxication, in over-wrought subjects and in hypertonicity due to nephritis.
  - 8. Obese-arthritic disorders with hepatic insufficiency.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Uncompensated cardiac disease aneurism, acute cardiovascular affections, cancerous and tuberculous lesions, apoplexy, recent cerebral congestion, marked albuminuria, marked urinary stricture.

## DAX AS A SPA

S

ITUATION. — Dax, watering place, chief town of the district, 12.000 inhabitants, 40 ft. on both banks of the Adour: 10.000 to 12.000 patients are treated every year.

CLIMATE. — Soft and temperate climate, tonic and sedative, temperature equable, atmosphere moist and balsamic due to the numerous warm springs and the neighbouring pine-woods. Average annual temperature 53° F. at 6 a. m. and 57° F. at 6 p. m. which means that the patients can remain in the fresh air all day without being exposed to dangerous variations of temperature. Average seasonal temperature, winter, 46° F.; spring, 57°3 F.; summer, 69° F.; autumn, 55° F. As shown by this the winter is remarkably mild.

Dax is sheltered from the north and especially the north-east by pine forests. The west is the prevailing wind but it is always broken by the forests. It is healthy and soft and charged with ozone. The south wind, elsewhere so irritating, is refreshed by the snows of the Pyrenees. Dax is a splendid type of winter resort for excitable patients in search of a sedative climate and especially for those in whom the susceptibility or disorders of the respiratory organs is accompanied with manifestations of rheumatism.

BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The Grands Thermes and the Baignots, first class.

Thermes Salins and Dax Thermal, first and second class.

The Saint-Pierre baths, third class. The prices vary according to the category of the establishment.

Besides the bathing establishments, a Zander Institute of Mechanotherapy is installed on the most modern lines.

Several private hospitals and houses for special diet under medical supervision: Surgical clinic. Clinics for electricity and radiology.

#### THE WATERS

THE SPRINGS. — Considerable yield: five million litres per diem—Innumerable springs, all on the lefts bank of the river; they are remarkable for their high temperature, 147° F.

The principal springs are:

- 1º The "Fontaine Chaude" or "La Nêhe", in the town itself (147º F., 24.000 hectolitres).
- $2^{\rm o}$  The Two Geysers in the "Baignots" bathing establishment (147° F.) which alone yield nearly two million litres of water per diem.
- 3° The "Grands Thermes", The "Bastion Sainte Marguerite" on the heads of which is built the bathing establishment (141°  $F_{**}$ , 600,000 litres).
  - 4º The "Rond Point des Baignots", which is the property of the city (147º F., 40,000 litres).
  - 5º The "Dax Thermal", recently used (13908 F., 25.000 litres).
  - 6º The "Roth" belonging to the Grands Thermes (139º8 F., 25.000 litres).

They are very hot waters with weak mineralisation (r gr. o24 of fixed residuum per litre); they belong to the class of mixed sulphates (sodium and magnesium). These waters are endowed with considerable electric energy and powerful radio-activity. They are among the first of the French radio-active waters, ranking after Plombières and Bains-les-Bains.

THE MUD. — The Dax mud, absolutely unique and highly complex, is the most complete and efficacious natural medicinal mud. It is remarkably oily. It is composed of: I. A mineral element: the soft fluvial mud of the Adour which, when the water rises, is deposited on the spring heads which rise on the banks of the river itself.

The mud is entirely penetrated by the warm waters and ferments and becomes vitalised by their action.

A vegetable element, yielding a rich cryptogamic flora, including algae of the anabania and oscillaria species.

This mud shows an extreme natural radio-activity which emanates from the spring waters; its presence is proved by the presence of rare gases (helium).

THE SALT WATERS AND MOTHER WATERS. — Besides the warm springs and muds, Dax possesses salt waters and mother waters with sodium chloride and bromo-iodide coming from the Saint-Pandelon saltmines (the Dax Saltmine Company).

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — 1. General indications: Rheumatism and its diverse manifestations. The Dax mud is unrivalled for the thermal treatment of all disorders of the muscular system, of rheumatic, gouty and traumatic origin.

2. Special indications: Rheumatoid arthropathy in general. Simple chronic articular rheumatism, following acute polyarthritis; primary chronic rheumatism (chronic progressive articular, nodular and gouty rheumatism, deforming polyarthritis), partial chronic rheumatism, Heberden's nodes, hydrarthrosis (chronic or recurrent), gonorrhoeal talalgia, sciatic and intercostal neuralgia, etc., periarticular rheumatism (periarthritis, periarticular sclerosis); fibrous and muscular rheumatism, dry arthritis, myositis and tendinous synovitis, muscular and tendinous contractions, neuritis, writers cramp, sclerodermia, chronic rheumatic arthritis of the hip, rheumatic spondylitis

THERAPEUTIC USES. — The waters are utilised internally by ingestion. Externally for bath and swimming pond, douches, general and partial baths, etc., the natural vapour is used for complete and local vapour baths.

The salt waters and mother waters are administered as baths and douches at the Thermes Salins which has the monopoly of these waters.

They are most efficacious in diseases of children and of women (anemia, lymphatism, scrofulosis, rickets, metritis, fibroma, uterine disorders, neurosis, neurasthenia).

The simultaneous use of the saline and mother waters and the warm mineral waters produce special therapeutic effects which can only be found at Dax. The high mineralisation of the saline waters (293 grammes of chloride of sodium per litre) added to the mildness of the Dax climate, constitutes a great element of success.

#### EVIAN AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Evian is one of the principal towns of the Haute-Savoie and is picturesquely situated on the French side of the Lake of Geneva. In form it somewhat resembles an amphitheatre owing to its position on the slopes of the Savoie hills—It has 5.000 inhabitants and about 15.000 visitors yearly.

CLIMATE. — Evian owes its agreeably temperate climate to its moderate altitude, its general orientation towards the north and its position on the borders of the lake. It is sheltered from high winds by the mountains surrounding the Leman basin and is refreshed in summer by the atmospheric currents always moving between the mountains and the lake; the properties of the atmosphere are remarkably sedative, and merit special mention. This climate, tranquil without being relaxing, is in fact a characteristic trait of the medical aspect of the resort. It produces very beneficial effects; calming the various manifestations of nervous excitement.

URBAN SANITATION. — The hygienic arrangements are perfect. — Electric lighting. — Excellent drinking water. — Drainage system. — The sloping ground allows the natural flowing off of rain water.

BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — A model establishment, inaugurated in 1903 on the most modern lines, and constantly improved, admits the application of all forms of physiotherapy under medical supervision: balneotherapy, thermotherapy, phototherapy, massage, electrotherapy.

There is also a complete installation of X rays.

There are special grounds for physical re-education under the supervision of a specialist,

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The various natural mineral springs of Evian are divided into several groups, the principal one of which includes the celebrated Cachat spring.

The Cachat spring, known for the longest period, and the control gear of which is considered one of the most perfect extant, has made the therapeutic reputation of Evian.

It is a cold water (51° F.), non-gaseous but highly aerated and only weakly mineralised; the mineralisation consisting for the most part of alkaline carbonates and not exceeding o grm. 50 per litre

If the physico-chemical composition does little to commend the Evian waters, it is nevertheless the reason of its great digestibility and of its diuretic properties long since established by clinical observation.


The Evian water is a type of diuretic water extremely suitable for lavage and for disintoxication through the renal tract

PHYSIOLOGICAL, ACTION AND TREATMENT. — Whilst recognising the effects the waters have on the phenomena of nutrition, the Evian cure must primarily be considered a cure by diuresis, the object of which is to stimulate the renal function physiologically by the methodical use of the mineral water. It is for this reason that the Evian water is said to act more by what it carries away than by what it brings. Generally speaking, the cure consists in drinking the mineral water between meals, and for the most part, in the morning fasting.

Normally, following the morning draught, the water is not retained in the stomach; it is quickly absorbed by the intestine, passes through the liver, enters the general circulation and is soon expelled through the kidneys, causing a copious and shortlived polyuria; the volume of urine passed during the two hours following the drinking of the water exceeds, often to a remarkable degree, the volume of water ingested. The passage of this diuretic stream through the body and the urinary passages is the characteristic phenomenon of the cure. It explains its two principal actions: the general cleansing and disintoxicating action and the local action of lavage of the urinary passages.

Among the means employed to promote the polyuria, one of the most important consists in utilising the well known means of favouring diuresis, the horizontal position. All patients who can do so are advised to drink the water in the horizontal position and to remain thus for an hour and a half or two hours afterwards—The Cachat water is bottled, so that patients may continue the cure at home

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — 1. General indications: The Evian cure is especially indicated in the majority of those morbid conditions constituting neuro-arthritism.

Gout: Gout in all its forms, including gouty rheumatism, is amenable to the cure by diuresis, whether associated with gravel or not.

Neurasthenia: Besides the cure by imbibition, these patients benefit by the climate and the physio-therapic resources of the resort.

Diabetes: Arthritic diabetes, especially when associated with gout or when renal manifestations are present

Plethoric Gourmands: The cure by imbibition combined with supervision of their food and general health results in reducing their weight and arterial tension

Children and adolescents of neuro-arthritic parents in whom it is often advisable to combat uricemic tendencies by early treatment by diuresis.

 Local indications. The digestive system: nervous dyspepsia, hypersthenic dyspepsia, muco-membranous entero-colitis especially when accompanied by diarrhoea.

The liver: certain hepatic disorders especially cholemic conditions and biliary lithiasis with slight cirrhosis; hepatic lithiasis in cases of painful attacks or congestion when the more drastic cure of Vichy is not easily borne.

The cardio-vascular system: hypertonia, arterio-sclerosis. In cases of this kind, the cure must be very carefully regulated. The more permeable the kidneys, the better the effects produced by the diuresis cure.

The urinary system: albuminuria is relieved by the Evian cure in so far as is considered advisable either to free the kidneys of the abnormal products encumbering them or to alleviate the inconvenience to which chronic nephritics are subject, owing to inefficient excretion of urinary impurities.

Urinary lithiasis: in the early phases to prevent the formation of calculi; in the phase of gravel and calculi, in order to promote their expulsion; in the surgical phases, either preparatory to operation or after nephrolithotimy in order to wash the kidney.

Urinary suppuration: The diuresis cure is particularly recommended in pyelonephritis and pyelitis (without retention).

Cystilis and urethritis: Cases tending to chronicity and unable to tolerate local treatment and in which gouty diathesis is the main factor.

Prostatitis: In order to combat ascending infection so long as vesical evacuation is assured; in order to wash out the urinary passages after prostatectomy.

## LAMALOU AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Lamalou-les-Bains in the department of Hérault, 800 kilometres from Paris is situated in the valley of the Orb in the midst of the hilly country uniting the Cevennes with the Montagne Noire on the Montpellier and Montauban line. Altitude 650 ft.

CLIMATE. — Temperate Mediterranean climate; the climate of Lamalou is remarkable for the purity of the air and its mild temperature. The Mistral is unknown. Spring and Autumn are particularly favourable and the season commences at the very beginning of April and lasts until the end of November. In fact, it is a not uncommon thing for the last visitors to remain until Christmas eve. The best time of the year to visit this resort, however, is in May, June, July, the months of July and August being the most crowded. The best time for sufferers from nervous complaints is in Spring or Autumn, whilst the height of summer is best for rheumatic complaints. 48 days of rain a year.

URBAN SANITATION. — Spring drinking-water is brought from the Montagne Noire. Electric Lighting. Lifts. Modern hygienic installations. Drainage system with periodical flush of water, and all hygienic arrangements of the best.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The spa of Lamalou possesses three groups of springs and to each of these groups a hydrotherapeutic establishment is attached; — Lamalou-le-Bas or l'Ancien, Lamalou-le-Centre and Lamalou-le-Haut.

The warm waters rise from Silurian strata. The warmest (Lamalou-le-Bas) reach a temperature of 125% F. The least warm (Lamalou-le-Centre) have a temperature of 64% F. only.

The bathing establishments are furnished with every requisite apparatus for balneotherapy, and adjoin the hotels.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The main principles are bicarbonate of soda, of magnesium and of iron. Arsenates of soda and of copper, lithium, manganese, strontium and radium (M. et M<sup>me</sup> Curie) helium and argon (Moureu) are also found. These waters might be definited as warm, bicarbonated, plurimetallic and radio-active.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — The principal physiological effect is to greatly increase the activity of the circulation and to promote metabolism. The action of the waters is tonic and sedative; tonic to the nerve elements and sedative to pain. They restore the general condition (Prof. Landouzy).

The therapeutic measures vary in the different establishments. There are several institutes for re-education.

The principal mode of treatment is by bathes in swimming-baths. Internal administration is accessory to the external treatment.

Many patients prefer, instead of one season, two cures during the year, one in spring and one in autumn.

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Disorders of the nervous system especially chronic disorders of the spinal cord. The action of the Lamalou waters on the "pain" is remarkable and for this reason Lamalou is the spa for spinal and nervous affections.

The best known specialisation of the cure relates to Tabes. In fact, the name of Lamalou has become inseparable from Tabes in the mid of the physician.

Medullary disorders of diverse origin, arthritism, disorders following fatigue, overstrain and infectious diseases.

The effect of the cure at Lamalou is particularly remarkable on toxinfection paralysis; paralysis ocurring during the course of or consequent on diphteria, typhoid fever, measles, scarlatina and paludism; paralysis following poisoning contracted by trade-workers, or medicinal poisoning (by arsenic and mercury). These forms of paralysis have been known to disappear rapidly during, or a short time after, treatment at Lamalou.


In medullary and all nervous affections of specific origin, the Lamalou cure forms a useful adjunct and complement to the routine treatment. Large medicinal doses of the waters may be employed without inconvenience.

The efficacy of the Lamalou waters is the greater, the more recent the lesion of the nerve centres.

Painful symptoms, lightning pains, visceral crises, paresis of the sphincters, trophic disorders, general weakness.

Further indications. Rheumatic affections (sciatica and neuralgia). Chlorosis, anaemia, (neuralgia due to anaemia). Neurosis, various neurasthenic conditions, paralysis and hysterical contractures.

Rotureau, the eminent hydrologist, expresses his opinion as follows "The waters of Lamalou, particularly taken internally, have been recommended for gravel of the liver and kidneys, albuminuria and diabetes, in certain splenic and hepatic congestions, in accidents following syphilis and metal poisoning, for Tabes and in traumatic paralysis consecutive to the deposit of an interior exudate".

Professor Landouzy also says:


"The living organised medical active principle represented by the Lamalou springs are available in swimming-baths at Lamalou-le-Bas and le-Haut, in baths at Lamalou-le-Centre and for internal administration, without taking into account the therapeutic effect of the natual hot-air baths, footbaths, douches, massage and Oertel's treatment, all of which remedies are of the greatest value to the legions of invalids, who, although coming here primarily for impotencies of the members, often suffer in an equal degree from troubles of the general nutrition, such as gastro-intestinal disorders, more or less immediately due to medullar sclerosis"

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Tuberculosis, suppurative skin-diseases, all congestive conditions and all acute stages.

#### LIFE AT LAMALOU

AMUSEMENTS. — Casino, theatre, concert, cinematographs, and symphony concerts daily in the public promenades.

EXCURSIONS. — Excursions into the mountains are very numerous both for the pedestrian and the motorist. The roads are very good and l'Espinouze, Lacaune and other heights where the air is always delightfully fresh are easily accessible.

In the immediate neighbourhood of Lamalou, the *Pedestrian* can enjoy shady walks beneath the pines of the *Usclade*, the chestnut trees of *Villecelle* and *le Frausse* and the olive trees of Bardéjean. There is also the pilgrimage of Capimont with its beautiful dolomotic rocks; the ascent of Saint-Micher girdled by a triple line of ruins — a silent reminder of the passing of Simon de Montfort; the excursion to the Caroux, a plateau 3,470 ft. above sea-level where a superb view extending to the Mediterranean can be obtained of the Ventoux plain (Alps) and of the neighbouring plateau of the Plô de Brus (Old Roman Camp) — the Canigou (Pyrénées).

For Cyclists and Motorists, there are the Gorges d'Heric; Colombier with its castle and Saracen tower; le Pont du Diable; Saint-Gervais; Mourèze; Lacaune, la Montagne Noire; Carcassonne; the Gorges du Tarn and the Aigoual.

For the archaeologist, there is the delight of exploring Saint-Pierre-de-Rhedes — a romance in stones of the 9th century; Villemagne (Abbey of the 8th and church of the 15th and 16th century, Mint); Boussagues — a veritable architectural museum (Castle of the 12th century, manor and church of the 14th century, Maison du Bailli (bijou renaissance of the 16th).

SPORTS. — Beautiful national and departmental roads for motor-cars. Good wild boar hunting, hare and partridge shooting. The Orb and its tributaries supply an abundant quantity of fish (troat and other river fish).

Each year, tennis tournaments take place at Lamalou.

<code>ITUATION.</code> — In the heart of the Pyrenees at an altitude of 1.930 ft. on the site of the old Roman baths. Chief town of canton of Haute-Garonne. —  $_{4.000}$  inhabitants. — Capable of receiving 15.000 visitors at a time.

The bathing establishments are open throughout the year.

The busy season is from May to October.

CLIMATE. — Average hill climate. The valley of Luchon was already celebrated in the time of the Romans. Running north-east and south-west, it is sheltered by high peaks and the wooded hills surrounding it. The air is dry and pure; its action is both sedative and tonic.

Average summer temperature is 67° F.

URBAN SANITATION. — Carefully superintended. Excellent drinking water (the Lys spring): more than 1.000 litres per head per day. Service of street cleaning. Inspection of slaughter house and markets by special agents. Electric light. Municipal office of sanitation in the hands of a doctor.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — Total yield 600,000 litres per diem.

Luchon possesses about sixty springs, forty of which are in use. They rise from granite or at the contact of granite and slate quartz strata and vary in temperature from  $71^{\circ}$  to  $150^{\circ}50$  F. The sulphur element is from 1 to 9 centigrammes per litre.


The best known are: Bayen, 150°50 F.; Pré, 146°86 F.; Grotte Supérieure, 136° F.; Reine, 130°75 F.; Romains, 120° F.; Enceinte, 120° F.; Bordeu, 120° F.; Etigny, 118°15 F.; Blanche, 116°50 F.; Bosquet, 109° F.; Pré II, 107°55 F.; Sengez, 105°45 F.; Ferras, 103°30 F., Lepape (radio-active).

The bathing establishment is built at the base of Superbagneres, in the midst of the town and quite close to the springs; it is erected on the site of the Pompei in baths and is furnished with every appliance of balneotherapy; 130 bath-rooms, large and small swimming baths, douches, apparatus for atomization, makes it one of the most up-to date establishments.

The Ravi spring (silicated, alkaline, sulphurated) is used with success as a drink in cases of renal and vesical disorders.

The Pavilion Charles Moureu is utilised solely for treatment by radio-active waters.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — These waters, clear at the source oily to the touch, acquire in contact with the air a more or less pronounced yellowish-green tinge according to the quantity of sulphide contained. A few of these waters (Pré II, Ferras and Blanche) become milky by the precipitation of sulphur; this is a special phenomenon of Luchon called whitening or blanchiment.

The dominant principle of mineralisation is the sulpho-hydrate of sulphur and sodium. Carbonates, silicates, metals revealed by the spectroscope (Bardet) and sulfuraire are also found. The sulphur takes several forms. It comes off in the form of sulphuretted hydrogen and sulphur vapour; it is found in complex sulphur compounds also alone in the natural state. Finally it combines to form hyposulphites. According to these transformations, the springs have been classed as fixed springs (stimulating), whitening springs (cutaneous affections), hyposulphite springs (more sedative).

They contain rare gases, argon, nitrogen, emanations of neon.

Their radio-activity, examined for the first time in 1908 by Professor Moureu and his assistant, M. A. Lepape, has lately been the object of very important communications to the Académie des Sciences (October 1920 and June 1923).

As a result of the new researches carried out at the research laboratory of the Luchon bathing establishment, M. Lepape has found in one of the springs, which will hence-forward bear his name, an emanation of radium of 41,5 millimicrocuries per litre in the water where it leaves the rock. « This latest asset raises the station to the first rank of French radio-active stations, because five of its springs already employed have a higher tenor of emanation than the Bourboule spring, which, until this discovery, held the highest rank in France ».

The waters with such a high radio-active power have been utilised at once in a special pavillon called the "Pavillon Ch. Moureu".

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION. — These waters owe their tonic action to the sulphur; they modify the atony of the tissues by an improved circulation visible on the skin and mucosa, the secretion and excretion of which return to the normal. They are drying, keratinising (as in weeping eczema) or exudative according to the dose.

The sixty springs of Luchon offer an absolutely unique scale of variations in temperature 71° to 150°50 F. and of ascending sulphuration from 1 or 2 centigrammes to 9 centigrammes. It must be noted that the most radio-active are *eminently sedative*, a characteristic which has not hitherto been sufficiently emphasised, for is often said sulphuration is a synonim for excitation. More or less marked increase of peristalsis, improved appetite, more copious urine with discharge of urates and excremental products, habitual return of strength and mental activity are so many signs of the striking activity imparted to the various cellular elements: the satisfactory modifications of the arterial tension have been the object of recent research (Source Lepape).

Sulphur is an integral part of the human cell; it is found in considerable quantity in the haemoglobin which explains the role of the waters of Luchon in general nutrition. Wounds and ulcerations heal more quickly, thanks to the stimulation of the movement of phagocytes.

The sulphur vapour allays coughs, modifying the secretions of the respiratory tract and assists intra-cellular oxidisation; it has a general tonic action being especially suited for renewing the minerals of the body (A. Robin).

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — The following diseases may be cured by the Luchon treatment :

1. Chronic herpetic arthritic disorders of the respiratory tract: Moist Catarrh, "the more moist the catarrh, the more efficacious is the action of the sulphur" (Rathery). Chronic coryza with hypertrophic strinitis, coryza in lymphatic children with spread adenoids not in protruding tumour; chronic angina, granular pharyngitis with hypertrophic tonsils; chronic arthritic or professional laryngitis, chronic bronchitis (catarrh) humid asthma without cardiac complications. Convalescence after influenza. *Tubotympanic catarrh* and the deafness which accompanies it. "Luchon is the spa for deafness" (Landouzy).

For these various affections of the respiratory tract, the baths, douches and the ingestion of the waters aim at the cause, whilst the gargling, atomisation and steam inhalation are directed against the local condition. The inhalation of sulphur vapours protect the mucous membrane against further winter attacks.

2. Skin troubles: seborrhoeic conditions, eczema (especially humid forms), arthritic acne, rosacea acne of the menopause, polymorphous acne of the lymphatics, alopecia, psoriasis.

3. Syphilitic manifestations, in the secondary and tertiary periods of the disease; the

tolerance of mercury is acquired through the sulphur and the patients obtain relief by the effect of the sulphur waters and the mountain air.

4. Chronic rheumatism, muscular atrophy: Massage completes the cure.

 The sedative climate and the absence of wind make Luchon specially adapted for nervous asthenics and psychasthenics who find sleep there and refreshing quiet.

All forms of hydrotherapy are employed at Luchon.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. - Diseases of liver and kidneys, diseases of the heart badly compensated with arterial tension, marked obesity, haemoptysis, cancer.

But the radio-active waters of the Lepape spring make the cure of Luchon adaptable for

rheumatic subjects suffering from heart disease.

TREATMENT. — Luchon spa is adapted in a strinking degree to the furthering of puericulture. The altitude, the tonic waters, expedients of every kind.

Luchon is a spa for children.

Although varied in its application, the treatment is primarily external. Baths of various types, large baths of strong and stimulating water, hygienic swimming baths. General and local douches, and all their modifications, local and general natural vapour baths, atomization, etc.

Services for gargling and nasal douches. Lastly, inhalation and massages room in spontaneous vapour which constitutes the great speciality of the Luchon treatment. Since 1920, a physiotherapic institute makes possible the application of electricity and mechanotherapy speciality is made of the treatment of scoliosis in early life). Oertel's treatment is the object of a special organisation.

#### LIFE AT LUCHON

AMUSEMENTS. — 70.000 tourists and holiday makers visit Luchon annually, apart from the usual clientele of patients. There is a magnificent casino in the centre of the town, furnished with all the amusements of a first class spa: theatre, concerts, balls, guignol, card and gaming rooms. Battles of flowers, riding, tennis, line-fishing, izard hunting. Race-week. Golf.

EXCURSIONS. — Luchon deserves its universal fame as a centre for all excursions in the Pyrenees. From drives into the numerous adjoining valleys, to mountain excursions conducted by guides on horseback, in picturesque costumes. All ones desires as a climber can be satisfied even to the ascension of the principal glaciers accompanied by guides on foot, mountaineers with muscles of iron. The ascension of the Maladetta, 11.063 ft., and its glaciers can easily be undertaken from Luchon; it is the highest point of the Pyrenees. Luchon is the centre of the "Pyrenees road" and a halting place of the motor-car service organised by the Midi Railways Company: from Luchon to Biarritz and Luchon to the Côte Vermeille. Before leaving Luchon, the valley du Lys, the Cascade d'Enfer, the road of the port of Venasque and the Hospice de France, 4.420 ft., should be visited; also Superbagnères, 5.906 ft., the lake of Oo, 4.875 ft., its famous waterfall and the remarkable Roman Cathedral at Saint-Bertrand de Comminges (XIth century).

WINTER SPORTS. — In August 1912, the Midi Railway Company inaugurated an electric railway which runs from the Springs to the plateau of Superbagnères, 5,906 ft., in 45 minutes. A luxurious hotel for fresh air treatment at the top of the mountain from which a superb panorama can be seen, assures comfort for tourists. Winter visitors find excellent conditions for winter sports.

## MONT-DORE AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Mont-Dore is a terminus on the Paris-Orleans line. It is a high-lying spa situated in the heart of the mountains at the foot of the Sancy, 6.175 ft. It lies in a beautiful valley not far from the source of the Dordogne among beech and pine-woods.

The population of the town is 2.000; about 20.000 persons visit it in the course of the summer.

CLIMATE. — The valley of Mont-Dore is enclosed by mountains, the altitude of which varies from 4.265 to 6.175 ft. They are easy of ascent and offer facilities for a graduated open-air treatment.

The climate is magnificent. The brilliance of the sky, the intensity of the sunshine, the purity of the air, strongly impregnated with ozone, and the marked radio-active quality due to the release of rare gases at the sources of the springs, all combine to render the climate of Mont-Dore unique. Although primarily its effects are slightly stimulating, it exercises a secondary sedative action upon the nervous system.

Hay fever cases do best in May and June.

PUBLIC HEALTH. — There is an office of public health and Mont-Dore is a departmental disinfecting station. The drinking-water is abundant and absolutely pure. Sanitation is on the sewer system. Street and house refuse is removed in covered carts. Slaughter-house with inspection of meat by a veterinary.

Thermal and Military hospital.


THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The springs are twelve in number and the bathing establishment is built directly over the trachite fissures in which they take their rise. Thus the waters are employed at the source, with no loss of their gaseous contents or of their electric and radio-active properties; they are in fact "living waters". The springs are further protected against possible atmospheric contamination by glass enclosures. The yield is 900,000 litres in twenty-four hours.

The favourite springs for internal employment are: The Madeleine, 113° F.; the Des Chanteurs or Bardon, 115°7 F.; the César, 113° F. and the Ramon, 107°6 F. which contains a considerable proportion of iron.

In different category to the true Mont-Dore springs but associated with them for the sake of convenience, is the Source Félix, about 3 kilometres from Mont-Dore. It contains chlorides and lithia and has a considerable success in the management of urinary gravel,

The balneo-therapeutic installation is housed in two large modern buildings. In addition to two inhalation rooms, which occupy 2.400 square metres and are unique in character, there are hot immersion baths in running water (100°4 to 113° F.) which are a speciality of Mont-Dore, and an armamentarium of appliances for general hydrotherapeutic purposes.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION. — The Mont-Dore waters are primarily aerated waters; they contain mixed bicarbonates, iron, arsenic and a large proportion of silica. The total mineralization varies from 2 to 3 grammes, according to the spring.

The gases given off by the waters are carbonic acid, 99,50 %; nitrogen, 0,49 %; argon and helium, 0,01 %.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY AND METHODS OF TREATMENT. — The physiological activity of the Mont-Dore waters is best appreciated by consideration of the different methods of application. There are three principal methods:

1. By the mouth. — The internal method is one of great importance and is able in many instances to afford relief without other treatment. By increasing the secretion of hydrocaloric acid it has a favourable action upon the alimentary canal. It is slightly diuretic and promotes the regular discharge of large quantities of urates. It is diaphoretic and, by calming asthmatic dyspnoea, it exercises a sedative effect upon the central nervous system.

Even more marked are the effects upon the respiratory organs. It liquifies and diminishes the secretions in the same manner as the balsams. In diabetes it has a very definite and constant action in reducing the percentage of sugar in the urine. Speaking broadly, the method may be classed as a specific in gout of the respiratory organs.

- 2. Thermal Hip-baths. This method is practically unknown at other spas. The body, from the waist downwards, is bathed in the running water at the actual source, before the spring has lost its native properties, thermal, radio-active, electric, etc. The effect is that of a vast cupping-glass applied to the lower half of the body. It has a derivative action upon the respiratory organs and it actively reduces the local congestion. The most marked effect, however, is the powerful modification which it brings about in the nutritional exchanges.
- 3. Inhalation. The medicinal vapours are inhaled in large halls at a temperature of 82°4 to 86° F., while the patients are walking about and are in full employment of their organic functions. In addition to a large proportion of the thermal gases, these vapours contain perceptible and even measurable quantities of silica, iron and arsenic. The effects are actively resolvent and sedative; congestion is reduced.


These methods, specific to Mont-Dore, are reinforced by other secondary measures. Such are: temperate baths, aerated baths, gargles, gaseous nasal douches. In the latter, the gases set free from the thermal waters at their source are employed. The method is anaesthetic and constrictive in its effects and is particularly successful in spasmodic and vaso-motor affections of the pituitary membrane.

Besides the strictly thermal treatment obtainable, courses of respiratory gymnastics and training are given in the Establishment itself.

From the fore-going, it is evident that the treatment at Mont-Dore is strongly indicated in gout of the respiratory organs. And it should be borne in mind that the altitude, that important climatic factor, tends not only to stimulate the general nutrition, but that it has a direct and permanent action in improving the respiratory function.

EXPORT OF WATERS. — Waters from the Madeleine, César, des Chanteurs and Ramon springs are exported, as well as the pectoral paste prepared with the Madeleine water

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. — The most important of the indications is undoubtedly asthma, both dry and with oedema. In either case the condition is either very much improved or definitely cured, and it is this fact which has earned for the spa the name of "The asthmatics Providence".

Emphysema yields to treatment, the bronchial attacks gradually becoming weaker.

The sequelae of infectious pneumonia or broncho-pneumonia, whether pneumo-coccal origin or as complications of influenza, whooping-cough or measles, with or without symptoms of tracheo-bronchial glandular disease. Pleural adulterations resulting from infectious processes, with or without adhesions.

Tracheo-bronchitis, both catarrhal and the congestive form so frequently observed in neuroarthritic patients; dry catarrh complicated with erratic or relapsing pulmonary congestion.

Rhino-pharyngitis, the spasmodic coryza known as "hay-fever" which may be periodic or aperiodic in character and invariably makes its appearance in the spring.

Adenoid growths, affections of the larynx, simple laryngitis, relapsing or chronic, relaxed laryngeal conditions so common in professors, clergymen, orators, singers, actors, nervous affections of the larynx, especially spasmodic cough.

Mont-Dore is peculiarly a children's spa. The treatment is particularly indicated in the case, even of infants, where tracheo-bronchitis, intermittent tracheo-bronchial, glandular disease, broncho-pneumonia following influenza, measles, or whooping-cough are present. It is equally efficient in asthma.

The Mont-Dore method is singularly successful in the management of respiratory troubles resulting from the use of poison gases.

SECONDARY INDICATIONS. — Rheumatic affections of the joints, certain algias (sciatic, intercostal), eczema, diabetes. These are all indicated and particularly so where they alternate or coincide with respiratory manifestations.

The chief indications for treatment at Mont-Dore may be briefly summarised as follows: Congestive and spasmodic affections of the respiratory tract as accompaniments of neuro-arthritic conditions.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Cardiac conditions with broken compensation, arterial lesions, affections of the liver and kidneys, declared and threatening phthisis.

A moderate arterial hypertension is not a contra-indication to the Mont-Dore cure,

The season at Mont-Dore begins about the third week in May. Visitors, including children arrive in crowds, artists, orators, lawyers, members of every profession which depends upon the use of the voice, many of them of European reputation.

The morning is generally devoted to treatment, inhalation, baths, douches, etc.

The afternoon has many distractions to offer. There are charming walks in the environs of Mont-Dore. A quarter-of-an-hour in the funicular railways takes one to the Salon du Capucin situated at an altitude of 4.220 ft, in a clearing by the pine forest. It has a restaurant, a dairy and various amusements (tennis, croquet, bowls, skating), and is an ideal spot for rest in the open air. At five o'clock patients resort to the bathing establishment for the evening glass of water and for secondary treatment (gas inhalation, foot-baths, etc.).

MOUNTAIN EXCURSIONS. - Excursions may be made on foot by good paths through the forests, or with mules, on horse-back by carriage or car. There are numerous cascades, mountain lakes, etc. in the neighbourhood. The ruined Château de Murols is remarkably picturesque and offers a magnificent view.

The mountains surrounding Mont-Doré are easy for ascent and free from danger. Mules or horses may be used. From the summit of the Pic du Sancy, 6.175 ft., the Alps are seen.

Numerous more important climbs may be taken among the Monts d'Auvergne.

SPORTING ATTRACTIONS. — The Parc des Sports des Pradets is fully equipped for all branches of physical training and culture with competent instructors and under the supervision of the doctors of the resort. The Tennis Club is a admirably situated with regulation courts for matches.

Pigeon-shooting. Trout-fishing in the many rivers and lakes. Golf at the foot of the Sancy at an altitude of 4.429 ft. Fox-hunting, etc.
From December to February Mont-Dore offers every facility for winter sports

MUSIC, etc. — The centre of social life is undoubtedly the casino. It has large glasscovered lounges giving on to the park, drawing-rooms, lecture, writing and card-rooms. is a theatre where comedies and operettas are given alternately with cinema performances. The band plays in the park of the Casino twice daily.

ACCOMMODATION. — There are 4 first-class hotels with hot and cold water, electric lighting, lifts, central heating, bath-rooms, etc. These have 1.000 bed-rooms of which 200 have bath-rooms attached.

There are 14 comfortable second-class hotels with 1,200 bed-rooms; 28 more modest thirdclass hotels with 1,900 bed-rooms.

160 furnished houses, villas and apartments are obtainable, all perfectly hygienic and to suit all conditions.

## PLOMBIÈRES AS A SPA

ITUATION. — Plombières is situated in the south of the department of Vosges, in the pleasant valley of Eaugronne at an altitude of 2.330 ft.

CLIMATE. — The climate is healthy and temperate and particularly sedative; at the same time, on account of the topography and altitude, it is often chilly in the morning and evening especially at the beginning and the end of the season so that patients are obliged to take certain precautions.

URBAN SANITATION. — Complete canalisation of excellent drinking water protected from all possible contamination. Drainage system.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — 27 springs yield 750.000 litres of water per diem. Their temperature varies from 55°4 to 165°2 F. The waters are clear, odourless and tasteless

The springs of Plombières are divided into two categories: 1. The hot springs 104° to 165°2 F.;
2. The temperate or saponaceous springs, 55°4 to 104° F. This wide variation in the temperature of the springs is one of the advantages of the resort.

The wells supply seven establishments:

Three first-class: Les Nouveaux Thermes, Le Bain Stanislas and Le Bain Romain.

Two second-class: Le Bain des Dames and Le Bain National.

Two third-class : Le Bain tempéré and Le Bain des Capucins.

The fees for treatment vary according to the class of the establishment.

Treatment by ingestion is carried out at the following springs: Les Dames, 125°6 F.; Le Crucifix, 109°4 F.; Savonneuse, 77° F. and Alliot, 55°4 F.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAI, COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The mineralisation of the waters is dil, o grm. 13 to o grm. 30 of the principal mineral salts per litre. The Crucifix spring, for example contains: bicarbonate of soda (o grm. 020); of potash (o grm. 002); of lime (o grm. 036) of magnesium, sulfate of soda (o grm. 106); silicate of soda (o grm. 106); traces of arsenic free carbonic acid, oxygen and nitrogen. In the main, the waters contain alkaline, sulphusodium silicate and arsenic. But their chief characteristic is their radio-activity prove by Curie and Laborde, and later by Brochet. Plombières is in the front rank of French mineral waters.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — The action of the waters of Plombières may be summed up in this formula: Sedative to the nervous system, anti-arthritic and regulating the gastro-intestinal functions.

The cure consists for the most part in the application of sedative measures, and the sedation of the entire system, procured by the Plombières waters, is the most important asset. They allay phenomena of pain and crethism and ameliorate nervous breakdowns.

These soothing and calming properties are especially marked in their action on disorders of the digestive system, intestines and stomach. The baths cause a diminution of the total acidity of the gastric secretion both of free and combined hydrochloric acid.

The waters of Plombières have anti-rheumatismal properties; a discharge of uric acid is generally observed during the treatment. The gastrointestinal functions, the nutrition and neuro-arthritic conditions seem to be due to an action of the waters on the sympathetic nervous system and on the abdominal sympathetic in particular.

The waters are chiefly used for ingestion and as baths, douches, intestinal and vaginal douches, vapour baths and inhalations. Tepid baths, 91°4 to 96°8 F. form the typical medication of Plombières.

All varieties of under-water douches may be prescribed.

The abdominal under-water douche is one of the specialities of Plombières.

The high temperature vapour baths are fed by the vapours escaping from the hot springs. They may either be general or local. The intestinal douche is also one of the important therapeutic resources of the resort.

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — The following diseases are treated at Plombières :

1. Intestinal conditions. The Plombières waters have an elective action on the intestine.

First, Muco-membraneous entero-colitis. The symptoms described by this name appear, to be associated with a functional disorder of the abdominal sympathetic and are eminently amenable to the Plombières cure: forms with constipation or spasmodic or painful diarrhoea, intestinal lithiasis, all forms of spasmodic constipation, tropical diarrhoea and dysentry.

- 2. Dyspepsia. The waters are especially suitable in dyspepsia of a hypersthenic type (hyperchlorhydria and hyperpepsia), painful dyspepsia accompanied by intestinal disorders-
- 3. Rheumatismal conditions. The high temperature of the Plombières springs and their special therapeutic properties make them very suitable for the treatment of rheumatism in all its forms: subacute, simple, chronic, fibrous, nodular, post-infectious, abarticular. Generally peaking, the neuropathic element is the determining factor in sending a rheumatic patient to Plombières.
- Women's diseases. Especially painful forms: dysmenorrhoea, pelvic neuralgia, chronic metritis, ovaro-salpingitis.
- Diseases of the nervous system. The sedative action is exercised in paralysis, neuralgia sciatic and intercostal), progressive muscular atrophy, polyneuritis, neurosis, hysteria, chorea, xophthalmic goitre, neurasthenia.
- Various conditions. Pruriginous dermatitis, malaria (thanks to the arsenical principles in the waters), phlebitis, disorders of the respiratory passages.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Acute diseases, cachexia, cancer.

The cure is contra-indicated for subjects requiring tonic treatment and all subjects who must avoid all cause of depression.

## ROYAT AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Royat is situated in the Auvergne at a distance of 2 1/2 kilometres from Clermont-Ferrand above which it lies.

The Royat Spa, quite distinct from the village of Royat, is placed at the commencement of the valley which runs down from the Dôme range and opens on the Limagne. Altitude: 1.460 to 1.545 ft.

CLIMATE: — The climate is temperate and the air laden with ozone, very pure and bracing. The temperature is always freshened in summer by the north wind blowing from the Monts Dômes. In the vicinity are vineyards, forests, chestnut and pine. The soil is volcanic, very permeable and always dry. The place is free from moisture and fog.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The springs are five in number, four of them are warm, having a temperature from 68° to 95° F. and one, weakly mineralised, cold and not aerated, being a true type of lavage water.

Total yield: 2 million litres in 24 hours.

Gas evolved: more than 2 million litres of carbonic acid gas, this representing 99/100 of the total yield of gas.

There are three bathing establishments:

The Grand Establishment is supplied by the Source Eugenie (94° F.), yielding; 1.500.000 litres. Besides having complete warm water installations, it is furnished with carbonic acid gas baths of running water at its natural temperature. There are also installations for gargarism, inhalation, atomisation, douches and irrigations of all sorts, hydro-electric baths, hot air, light and vapour baths as well as massage.

The Saint-Mart Establishment, entirely rebuilt in 1912, is supplied by the Saint-Mart source (86° F.). The waters enter the baths straight from the spring. This source is well known as "La Fontaine des Goutteux". The bathing establishment specialises in running water baths for the lower extremities and cold baths. Extremely rich in gas.

The César Establishment has apartments for carbonic acid gas baths, also very rich in gas. The prices of treatment vary according to the Establishment.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The waters of Royat are strongly impregnated with carbonic acid gas, they contain mixed carbonates, arsenic, chlorides, iron, calcium and lithium.

The principal spring, the Eugénie (95° F.) is typical. The strength of the dissolved salts is cuch that it could be directly injected into the veins.

The Saint-Marc spring (86° F.) contains 0,035 grm. of lithium per litre.

The Saint-Victor spring (68° F.) is a very similar composition to the blood plasma; it contains calcium and iron and 0,0045 grm. of arsenate of soda per litre.

The Cesar spring (82°4 F) is less mineralised and is especially suitable as a table water for dyspeptics.

The Velléda spring is cold, non carbonic, very weakly mineralised (o gr. 127 per litre), of crystal clearness; it is an ideal water for lavage, highly radioactiol.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — The action of the Royat waters varies according to their application.

1. Baths. — They act through the free carbonic acid gas; they modify the arterial pressure and definitely reduce tension, tone up the heart, slow the pulse, augment the amplitude of the beat and diminish the size of the heart when it is dilated.

These different actions are obtained according to the manner, the duration, temperature and nature of the baths and the condition of the patient, the cold baths, highly aerated, increase the blood pressure.

The carbonic acid gas bath is the speciality of the Royat treatment; it may be administered in various ways.

- Imbibition. The waters are stimulating, diuretic, dissolvent, strengthening, increase
  the calcium content of the blood and renew its salts, according to the spring.
- Inhalation. They have a favourable action on the respiratory system; reduce congestion and always alleviate and cure catarrh, bronchitis, asthma, emphysema, etc

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Essential indications: 1. All diseases and disorders of the heart and the circulation and notably arterio-sclerosis are specially amenable to the Royat treatment.

In regard to this, Royat is unique and has very specialised installations, as well as physicians skilled in the treatment of diseases of the circulatory system by means of carbon-dioxide baths.

#### LIFE AT ROYAT

The attractions of Royat are in no way inferior to the treatment. The pa, situated 2 1/2 kilometres above Clermont-Ferrand, has a remarkable topographical situation from the tourist's point of view. A new excursion can be made daily for 25 days, either in the immediat vicinity of Royat or within a radius of 50 kilometres.

These vary from short walks around the resort, the old village, its peculiarly situated fortified church, the surrounding heights with their wide views over the Puy-de-Dome and the mountains or over the Limagne plain: the Bargoin park, with its century old trees, is only 12 minutes walk from the spa and can be reached in five minutes in public motors. The air is delicious at an altitude of 1.625 feet and the view is magnificent.

The district is rich in points of historical and natural interest: the extinct volcanoes of Auvergne, ancient castles, woods and lakes.

Excavations made during the 19th century have brought to light a number of archeological remains of great interest, forming the annals of Royat. There are three pools, one of which is restored; vases, statues, a marble colonnade, sarcophagi, etc., proved to be authentic by the references to Vercingetorix and Gergovia, and the remains of the temples of Vasso and Mercury at the top of the Puy-de-Dome.

The park of the spa is a delightful spot for those invalids who wish to avoid long walks. It is shady and beautified by the torrent of Tiretaine which divides it into two parts. It is here that are situated the Casino and the theatre (which accommodates 800 persons) where various entertainments are produced. There is an orchestra, carnivals of all kinds and gaming tables.

The tennis courts are laid out along the banks of the Tiretaine.

## SAINT-NECTAIRE AS A SPA

S

ITUATION. — The charming verdant spa, Saint-Nectaire, lies on the bordesof the fertile Limagne country, on the wooded slopes of the mountains forming the eastern extremity of the Monts Dore, and is washed by the Courancon, a tributary of the Couze-Chambon.

Owing to its altitude 2.340 ft., Saint-Nectaire is an ideal hill station where its admirers can remain from early spring till autumn.

1.200 inhabitants. 3.000 visitors.

CLIMATE. — The valley in which Saint-Nectaire lies runs north and south and is protected from the north and south winds by the Mont Cornadore and the Puy d'Eraigne. The climate is temperate, the air dry, pure, the permeability of the soil assures the quick absorption of rain and makes the town particularly healthy and pleasant. It is necessary to have warm clothing for early morning. Mean temperature in summer: 60° F.

LENGTH OF SEASON. — The season opens on May 15th and closes on October 15th Patients who are able to take their cure during June or September would do well to avoid the July and August crowds. They will have greater care and more advantageous conditions.

URBAN SANITATION. — Perfect. The drinking water comes from one of the purest and most copious springs in the district and has marked alimentary qualities. Complete drainage system. Street cleaning and watering superintended by the Syndicat d'Initiative. Electric lighting.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL, COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The temperature of the mineral springs varies from 53° to 130°8 F, the mineralisation from 4 to 8 grammes per litre. The Saint-Nectaire waters present, according to the celebrated Gubler, a type of "mineral lymph". As a matter of fact, they contain, per litre, the same mineral principles as a litre of serum.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — About 40 springs, 18 of which are prescribed daily, their temperature varies from 47°5 to 132°4 F. Their yield is about 7,000 cubic metres.

Principal groups: 1. Those of Mont Cornadore, including Mont-Cornadore, Parc, Rocher, Morange; 2. Those of Saint-Cézaire, Saint-Éézaire, Boette, Rouge, André, Sainte-Marie, Dames; 3. Those of the Gros Bouillon, the Gros-Bouillon, Coquille.

Each of the groups has a bathing establishment: The Mont-Cornadore establishment (first and second-class). The Thermes (first and second-class), and the Roman Baths (first class).

They three all supply the famous Saint-Nectaire lumbar affusions. Prices vary according to the class and the season.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — They vary according to the means employed. In a general way, the ingested waters stimulate the digestive secretions, the circulation (reabsorption of extravasations and oedemas), renew the activity of the blood corpuscles, the nitrogenous changes, also the activity of the renal functions and in this way they diminish or suppress albuminuria.

Bathing relaxes the circulation and relieves vascular spasm.

The lumbar affusions and hot hip baths are powerfully decongestive for the kidneys and relieve lumbago and sciatica.

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — 1. All forms of albuminuria whatever the origin, infectious or toxic: scarlatinal influenza and rubeolic albuminuria, etc.

- 2. Albuminuria of pregnancy.
- 3. Albuminuria of adolescence (orthrostatic, intermittent).
- 4. Constitutional albuminuria (associated with indigestion, anaemia, phosphaturia, diabetes, arthritis, etc.).
  - 5. Cardio-renal intoxication (uraemia with or without hypertension).

The indication becomes even more exact when these different renal manifestations are accompanied by digestive insufficiency, anaemia, general weakness, nervous depression, troubles of adolescence.

The cure has excellent effects in cases of residual or superficial nephritis and in all cases of mixed and diffuse nephritis.

Certain diseases of women are also treated, like leucorrhoea, torpid metritis, inflammation of the uterus and adnexa.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — These are express contra-indications to the cure at Saint-Nectaire: marked arterial tension, advanced cardio-sclerosis, myocarditis, advanced nephritis and all forms of pulmonary tuberculosis.

THERAPEUTIC APPI,ICATIONS. — The waters are used for drinking and also for carbondioxide baths with running water, 93°8 to 100° F., underwater douches, lumbar affusions or Saint-Nectaire douches, 94°7 to 121°8 F., vaginal douches in the bath, atomisation, shower baths, etc.

### URIAGE AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Uriage is situated in the Dauphiny, in the department of Isère; it occupies one of the most beautiful sites in the French Alps. The spa has grown up round the sulphur spring and there is practically no urban population. It is the resort of between eight and ten thousand visitors annually.

CI,IMATE. — The Valley, which is exceptionally charming, faces the southwest. It is surrounded by wooded heights which protect it from winds and render the atmosphere calm and peaceful. Owing to its forest surroundings and the alluvial nature of the soil, the climate, even in the height of the summer, is always temperate and its sedative properties are remarkable.

The beginning and the end of the season (June and September) are particularly favourable in the case of delicate and exhausted patients who require a reposeful environment. Moreover, the bathing establishment is less crowded at those periods and the hotel prices are more moderate.

PUBLIC HEALTH. — The drinking water is obtained from springs in the mountains and is exceptionally abundant. It contains very little lime which renders it soft to use and of an agreeable flavour.

Sanitation is conducted upon the sewer system and also by bacterial tanks,

The highways and house-refuse services are particularly efficient. There is adequate provision during the whole of the season for the removal and destruction of house-refuse and the sweeping and watering of roads. There are disinfecting rooms, an office of public health, a thermal hospital and baths for the poor. Lighting, both public and private, is by electricity.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The most important of the Uriage springs has a regular yield of 4.000 hectolitres per day. It contains sulphur and sodium chloride and is highly tonic in character.

A second spring containing iron constitutes a valuable adjuvant to treatment.

The bathing establishment is modern and occupies 2,600 square metres. It is equipped with every modern hydrotherapeutic appliance and the service is excellent.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL, COMPOSITION. — 1. The principal chemical constituents of the iron spring are the bicarbonates of iron and calcium and the sulphates of calcium and magnesia.

2. The water of the sulphur spring has a constant temperature of 73°14 F. at the source. Its mineralization is 10 grm. 50, and is described as follows: sodium chloride, 6 grm.; calcium, magnesium and sodium sulphates, 3 grm. 31. The natural tonic property of the water is its most salient feature and forms the basis of a large proportion of its therapeutic applications.

The second important characteristic of the Uriage water is its sulphur contents. Sulphur is present in the form of hydro-sulphuric acid (7 cc. 4) and it is possible that there is also a small proportion of sodium monosulphide.

The waters are extremely radio-active and the gases which are set free from them are radioactive to an even higher degree,

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY. — The water is taken internally. Owing to the large amount of sodium chloride and alkaline sulphates which it contains, the water has an apperient action when taken in small doses. In large doses it is strongly purgative but does not provoke colic.

It stimulates the organic changes and is active in promoting diuresis. By reason of its saline and sulphur contents it is a powerful mineralizing agent and detoxicator.


Used externally it has a general tonic effect, while at the same time it has a specific stimulant action upon the skin and mucous membranes. The clinical results correspond with the methods of application.

METHODS OF EMPLOYMENT. — The water is taken by the mouth, it is used in baths and douches, especially douche-massage, sprays, needle and shower baths, nasal and retronasal douches, local baths and local douches, etc.

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. — The indications depend upon the sodium and sulphur contents of the waters. The clinical activity of these agents is reinforced by varied and efficient thermal methods.

1º General. — Debility in all its forms, whether congenital or acquired, is wonderfully influenced by the tonic properties of the waters. Particularly amenable are the debilitated and anaemic manifestations which accompany nervous disease; neurasthenia; overstrain of every description; and convalescence.

2º Diseases of children. — Uriage is the spa par excellence for scrofulous children; rickets, congenital syphilis, and glandular disease are all enormously benefitted by the treatment.

Those tracheo-bronchial glandular conditions, such as infantile asthma and recurring bronchitis, which are so common and so tenacious in lymphatic children, are particularly indicated.

Concurrently with the hydro-mineral cure children greatly benefit by the course of open-air gymnastics organised under the control of the thermal establishment.

3º Skin diseases. — Owing to the nature of their constituents, the internal and external exhibition of the Uriage waters is attended by marked results in the majority of skin diseases of constitutional origin. Such are eczema, impetigo, lichen, psoriasis, varieties of acné, urticaria, relapsing herpes, etc.

Syphilis in all its forms and at all stages is successfully managed by a mixed mercury and sulphur treatment.

A service of dermatological physiotherapy (radiotherapy, electrotherapy) attached to the thermal establishment renders the cure particularly effective.

4º Affections of the naso-pharyngeal mucosa. — The tonic, antiseptic and non-irritant properties of the Uriage waters render them peculiarly suited to the management of these conditions. Ozina and purulent rhinitis, naso-pharyngeal catarrh, enlarged tonsils, chronic pharyngitis, simple chronic coryza, asthma of nasal origin, adenoid growths, true asthma, hay fever are some of the conditions indicated.

#### LIFE AT URIAGE

AMUSEMENTS. — There is an attractive casino with theatre and cinema; ball-rooms, card-rooms, concerts, etc.

Attached to the bathing establishment is an extensive park, where patients who are undergoing certain forms of treatment can take their walks without wandering too far from their hotel.

In this park there is a tennis club with numerous courts, and there is a golf links in the park belonging to the Hotel des Alberges.

### VICHY AS A SPA



ITUATION. — Vichy lies in the Bourbonnais on the right bank of the Allier, in a valley bounded on the east by the foot hills of the Madeleine mountains and on the west by the Auvergne mountains. It has 17,000 inhabitants. 108,963 visitors during the official season in 1913.

CLIMATE. — Mild and temperate, somewhat similar to the climate of Paris and that district.

Altitude: 850 ft. above sea level. The climate is preeminently sedative; nervous subject find it restful and sleep-giving. Average temperature: 59° to 60°8 F. during June, July and August; 48°2 F. and 52° F. in Spetember.



Several spa buildings, the largest and finest of which covers more than 7 acres of ground, and is considered to be the most perfectly arranged and most complete bathing establishment in the world. Besides large numbers of bath-rooms, there are most modern installations for physiotherapy so that all varieties of baths and douches can be given; there is also complete apparatus for general and local application of the mineral waters, and the gases of these waters, also vapour baths, hot air baths, electricity mechanotherapy, X rays, etc.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The principal element in the Vichy waters is sodium bicarbonate. Their total mineralisation is 7 grm. 50 to 8 grm. 50 and according to the old chemical notation, 4 grammes to 5 grm. 50 of this is sodium bicarbonate. New methods of analysis describe the composition as sodium and carbonic acid free or combined; other minerals are found in smaller proportions: calcium, lithium, magnesium, lime, sulphur, phosphorus, potassium, iron, and arsenic, besides iodine, boron, rubidium and strontium; gases: nitrogen, argon, crypton, xenon, helium, neon, and traces, dicovered by spectroscopic analysis, of aluminium, germanium, tungsten, etc.

This complex solution is at a high degree of ionisation; it contains electro-negative colloids and has a moderate radio-activity. It is isotonic with blood serum and sterile at the springhead so that it may be employed when necessary as a hypodermic injection.

PHYSIOLOGICAL AND THERAPEUTIC ACTION. — Taken fasting, the water washes the surface of the oesophagus and stomach, carries away the mucus and residues, it excites the gastric secretion; its temperature and the anesthetic properties of the carbonic acid gas, act on the nerve endings and alleviate pyrosis and the pyloric spasm, and at the same time, its alkalinity partially neutralizes the acids of the gastric juice. Generally speaking, the intestinal functions are regulated after a few days of treatment, both in diarrhoea and constipation; but the choice of spring is of importance in obtaining the result in different patients. The Vichy water has a very marked action on the liver; under the influence of the treatment, the secretion of bile becomes more abundant and fluid (as can easily be proved in patients with biliary fistulae); at the same time, it removes any infectious germs which it may contain. The ureopoietic power of the liver is increased and the glycogen restored.

Enlarged congested liver diminishes in size. This, so to speak, specific action on the hepatic function explains the gratifying effects of Vichy water in numbers of local and especially general morbid conditions the origin of which is found to be a defective hepatic function, as in arthritism, gout, diabetes.

The diuresis increases with the cure and there is a discharge of uric acid. There is an increased activity in the reduction of the oxyhaemoglobin and a higher percentage of heamoglobin and red blood corpuscles. These actions have a favourable effect on the general nutrition increasing or decreasing the organic activity according as the previous condition was inferior or superior to the normal.

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — The diseases amenable to the Vichy cure are many and varied owing to the action of the treatment not only on the organs, especially the digestive organs, but also on organic and functional conditions bound together by circumstances common to both, by diathesis or vitiated nutrition, whether these conditions are hereditary or acquired.

The disorders most generally treated at Vichy are: Gastric disorders: various forms of dyspepsia, atonic and spasmodic, hyper and hypochlorhydria, gastritis, gastric dilatation, pyloric spasm, dyspepsia due to diathesic, nervous and toxinfectious conditions, or following hygienic errors, overeating or alcoholism.

Intestinal disorders, entero-colitis, constipation or diarrhoea, especially when they are as a ciated with analogous diathesis or toxinfectious conditions.

Diseases of the liver. From congestion due to over-eating or drinking, or following infections like malaria, various forms of jaundice and cholangitis, to biliary, lithiasis in all stages, except during acute manifestations.

Visceral ptosis, enteroptosis, floating kidney.

Renal lithiasia in the early stages and certain forms of albuminuria.

Disorders of nutrition. Gouty diabetes, obesity, chronic rheumatism, migrainc.

Sequelae of malaria, except acute attack and convalescence after various infections.

Certain forms of dermatosis associated with disorders of nutrition. Certain organic congestions, secondary and general conditions, cardiac troubles of gastro-hepatic origin.

Utero-ovarian congestion of the menopause, sterility associated with permanent acidity of the vaginal secretion.

Children with hereditary arthritic or hepatic conditions, cannot come to Vichy too early, especially when they are subject to periodical vomiting with acetonaemia.

Old people without cachexia benefit by the cure, if their condition of health indicates it, on condition that the treatment is under medical supervision and adapted to their degree of resistance.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Confirmed tuberculosis, febrile conditions and neoplasm chronic diseases in acute stages, non-compensated cardiac conditions, hemiplegia.

CLIMATE. — The air is light, pure and fresh and, thanks to the aspect of the valley, the temperature is always moderate.

These conditions of situation and climate form a typical fresh air resort for arthritic subjects; added to the effects of the disintoxication cure, they contribute to the physical stimulus resulting from the accelerated combustion (metabolism).

URBAN SANITATION. — Complete system of drainage, water extremely pure and widely distributed. The latest sanitary improvements have been employed in this important spa.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — There are numerous springs, three of which are in use: the Grande Source, the Source Marie and the Source Hépar,

Grande Source: Temperature  $51^{\circ}$  F.; yield: 129.000 litres per diem. It is colourless and odourless and has a fresh, agreeable and slightly chalybeate taste.

Source Hépar: Temperature 51° F.; yield: 100.000 litres, has a fresh and mellow taste, not in any way salt, in spite of its old name; it is slightly alkaline.

Source Marie: Yields 72,000 litres. Generally employed as an accessory water, it acts more particularly on painful disorders of the urinary and biliary passages.

PHYSIOTHERAPIC INSTITUTE. — This consists of two Establishments. One of them, the second-class establishment, is used exclusively for baths and douches. Its installation is simple out perfect.

The other, the first-class establishment, built in 1909, is at present considered one of the most perfect and complete installations for physiotherapy. In addition to the luxurious bathrooms, the commodious rooms for douches and the varied hydrotherapic applications, it includes installations for mechanotherapy, diathermy, radiotherapy and electrotherapy.

#### THE WATERS

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The total mineralisation of the *Grande Source* is 1 grm. 202 per litre and contains: sulphate of lime, 0 grm. 618; of magnesia, 0 grm. 192; of lithium, 0 grm. 004; carbonate of lime, 0 grm. 294; of magnesia, 0 grm. 039; of iron, 0 grm. 003; chloride of sodium and of potassium, 0 grm. 008; sodium silicate, 0 grm. 015; free and combined carbonic acid, 0 grm. 354; traces of fluorine alumina, magnesium phosphoric-acid.

The *Hépar spring* has a total mineralisation of 2 grm. 726 per litre. It is composed of sulphate of lime, 1 grm. 617; of magnesia, 0 grm. 580; of lithium, 0 grm. 0007; carbonate of lime, 0 grm. 323; of magnesia, 0 grm. 129; of iron, 0 grm. 0003; chloride of sodium and of potassium, 0 grm. 013; free and combined carbonic acid, 0 grm. 478. Traces of phosphoric acid, alumina, lithia and manganese. The principal constituents of this water are sulphur, calcium and magnesium.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION. — The action of the Vittel water is eupeptic, diuretic and laxative.

The water appears to have a tonic action on the muscular walls of the stomach which, far from favouring gastric dilatation, tends to decrease it. It only remains a short time in the stomach and increases its contractility and the hydrochloric acid secretion; this improves the appetite and the digestion. The diuresis generally manifests iself when the doses have exceeded 500 to 600 grammes and varies according to the quantities ingested, the mode of administration and the degree of permeability of the kidneys.

The urine passed after the absorption of the water is clear, almost colourless and of weak density: 1.002. This and the urea increase later to a quantity exceeding the normal. The uric acid, having first greatly increased by reason of the increased elimination of urine, diminishes rapidly and permanently, consequent on the action of the waters on the nutrition. The elimination of chlorides is also accelerated by the treatment.


The laxative action is produced principally by the Hépar spring which stimulates both the biliary and intestinal secretions, as well as the intestinal contractions, hence the distinctly bile-laden and free motion.

The action of the water on the bladder is at first slightly excitant and later sedative. The sensitivity of the bladder diminishes and its contractions become more energetic.

#### CLINICAL INDICATIONS

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — The following diseases may be cured by the treatment at Vittel :

- I. Gout. All gouty subjects especially of the florid type and the torpid type with more or less prolonged attacks benefit by the cure. Besides the regular forms of gout, the treatment is prescribed for all its articular and other manifestations. Hepato-biliary disorders, congestion of the liver, migraine, neuralgia, phlebitis and periphlebitis, bronchial, pharyngea and ocular manifestations, and cases of gout with manifestations of early sclerosis hypertension and gouty albuminuria.
- Renal, urinary, oxalic and phosphatic gravel. The water acts by facilitating the movement of the gravel and by preventing its reproduction through local and general action. The cure is also prescribed with advantage in cases of gout with renal colic or attacks of lumbago.

In cases of renal calculi, the treatment can only be recommended when they are not large.

- Albuminuria, Especially albuminuria indicating renal irritation; albuminuria due to gravel; slight mechanical and residual albuminuria, Functional albuminuria, Chronic albuminous nephritis.
- 4. Inflammatory affections of the urinary sustem : pyelitis, pyelonephritis, subacute or chronic cystitis.
- Biliary lithiasis with or without hepatic colic; hepatic colic due to gall stones; hepatic colic caused by increased consistency of bile, catarrh of the biliary ducts; gouty hepatic colic, habitual constipation allied with biliary insufficiency.
  - 6. Gastric disorders. Dyspepsia of gouty subjects; secretory dyspepsia, atonic dyspepsia
- 7. Intestinal disorders. Constipation due to insufficiency of the biliary secretion, or of a diathesic or atonic order.
- Arterial hypertonicity. Especially during the period of pre-sclerosis when there is only functional disorder present, due to the intoxication. Arterio-sclerosis with oliguria, retention of urine and uroemia.
- The various manifestations of arthritis: Arthritic glycosuria, certain forms of dermatosis certain migraines and all manifestations caused by urinary and oxalic intoxication.
- 10. Infantine arthritis, in particular for children and adolescents of gouty parents, the cure is indicated in cases of urinary disorders and troubles of micturition, incontinence, vesical spasm, biliary troubles (cyclic vomitting); affections of the digestive system associated with biliary insufficiency; gastro-enteritis with constipation, certain forms of dermatosis, migraines.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Aix, once the ancient capital of Provence is now in the department of Bouches-du-Rhône (30,000 inhabitants).

It is situated at the juncture of the roads from Avignon, from the Coast, from Italy and the Alps, to the north of the large district of Marseilles (29 kilometres distant) and to the East of the Rhône Valley. It is sheltered from the North winds (mistral) and from East winds by the neighbouring high woods. The

climate is mild and particularly dry, only 87 days of rain per year, average rain-fall 550 mm., the weather is mostly clear and bright, fog and snow being almost unknown.

URBAN SANITATION. — Very complete drainage system and water-supply arrangements. Wide, airy and shady avenues.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENTS. — The springs employed most are the Sextius springs, yielding 8.000 hectolitres daily, which supply the Sextius establishment, the drinking pavilion and the swimming-bath.

The old "Thermes Sextius" have just been entirely reorganised and now contain every comfort, being clean, airy and well-lighted with every modern hydrotherapeutic appliance and containing a large swimming-bath with running water naturally warmed to a pleasant temperature, hydro-electric bath-rooms, light baths, vapour and hot-air baths, rooms for atomisation and inhalations of mineral water.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — Thermal water (temperature 93°2 F.), containing calcium-bicarbonate, weakly mineralised, clear, limpid and crystalline with neither odour nor flavour. Its density, superficial tension and cryoscopic point closely approximates to that of distilled water. It is decidedly hypotonic which enables it to pass rapidly through the system.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — The Sextius waters are given principally by the mouth and in running water baths.

By the mouth, taken fasting and between meals, these waters have a marked depurative and

By the mouth, taken fasting and between meals, these waters have a marked depurative and diuretic effect without any disagreeable severity. (Biliary and renal lithiasis, congestion of the liver or other viscera).

The temperature of the Sextius waters does not affect their taste or digestive qualities; they are for this reason particularly appreciated for autumnal or winter cures.

Employed in running water baths, the Sextius waters are toni-sedative and are beneficial both in neuropathis conditions associated with excitement and persistent neuralgias and in those of a depressant type.

Two other classes of cases are specially suitable for Aix-en-Provence; 1. Convalescents from phlebitis who still have insufficient venous circulation with persistent oedma and painful swelling of the lower limbs; 2. Sufferers from various forms of vascular congestion, whether visceral or secondary to acute or chronic visceral conditions, also obstinate and pruriginous dermatoses.

### ALLEVARD

WARM WATERS CONTAINING HYDROGEN SULPHIDE, SODIUM AND CALCIUM CHLORIDE

Season 1st June to 30th September.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Alleward is situated in one of the most beautiful valleys of the Dauphine at an altitude of 1.558 ft. It is sheltered from winds by the surrounding mountains and its climate is temperate. The mean summer temperature is 64°4 F., the relative humidity is 60 %, and the atmospheric pressure is 718 millimetres.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — Without entering into a detailed analysis, the main characteristics of the waters may be described as follows: the waters are cold, temperature 60°8 F., they contain a very large quantity of hydrogen sulphide, 24 cc. 75 per litre; carbonic acid, 97 cc. per litre; nitrogen, 41 cc. per litre

PUBLIC HEALTH. — The drinking-water is brought from Veyton in the mountains, five kilometres from any habitation. Sanitation is on the sewer system. The streets are watered. There are disinfecting rooms and a department of public health.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — Allevard possesses a single spring whose yield is 130,000 litres in 24 hours. The bathing establishment contains seven rooms for cold and four for hot inhalations. Each room is reached by way of transitional rooms and there are numerous private dressing-rooms. There are separate rooms for men and women where spray and jet throat douches are given. A new building containing the drinking fountain has been erected upon the actual site of the spring.

The characteristic feature of the Allevard treatment is inhalation, both hot and cold. The efficacy of the method depends upon the relase into the atmosphere of the inhalation rooms, by the impact of the water against an obstacle, of the hydrosulphuric acid which is so largely present in a free state in the Allevard waters. The atmosphere of the cold rooms is kept at an ordinary temperature and contains this gas. The atmosphere of the hot rooms contains in addition a large proportion of vapourized thermal water. The water is artificially heated and its vapour is diffused through the hot inhalation rooms by means of cracks in the flooring. The temperature of the hot rooms varies from 82°4 to 89°6 F.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY AND METHODS OF TREATMENT. — Although the general therapeutic activity of the Allevard water corresponds to that of all sulphur waters, there is one detail in the Allevard method which demands special consideration, namely,

the hot and cold inhalations. Both methods tend to reduce the hyper-secretion of the respiratory mucosa; it is however in the general reaction to treatment that a difference is observed, The hot inhalation reduces congestion and is sedative in its action, the cold inhalation is stimulant. It is obvious then that the methods correspond to two very different classes of patient and that the indications depend upon age, temperament and the nature of the malady.

The water is also employed in the form of gargles and sprays and it is given by the mouth. Baths, foot-baths and douches of plain or thermal water are given and these again may be reinforced by massage.

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. — Nose: Chronic coryza, hypertrophic and atrophic rhinitis. rhino and pharyngo-salpingitis. — Pharynx: Enlarged tousils, chronic angina, sequelae of diptheria, granular pharyngitis, adenoid growths, recurrent follicular sore throat, stomatitis. Larynx: Chronic simple laryngitis, recurrent laryngitis, stridulous laryngitis, spasm of the glottis. — Bronchi and lungs: Chronic trachaeitis, bronchial susceptibility, recurrent bronchitis, bronchial catarrh and emphysema, dry bronchitis, asthma with bronchitis, hay fever, sequelae of measles, whooping cough, influenza, trachaeo-bronchial glandular, disease sequelae of pneumonia and pleurisy. — Skin: eczema, acné, etc. — Ear: External and medial otitis. - Vagina and uterus : Leucorrhoea, chronic metritis, cervical metritis.

MEDICAL MEN. - Drs. Chataing senior, Boel, Chataing junior, Mr. and Mrs. Liacre de Saint-Firmin.

AMUSEMENTS. — There is a casino with writing, lecture and card rooms, a park, tennis courts, concert hall. 

### AMÉLIE-LES-BAINS

HYPER-THERMAL, SULPHUROUS WATERS CONTAINING SODIUM

Season throughout the year.



ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Nestling in a hollow of the valley at the Eastern extremity of the Pyrenean chain (35 kilometres from the sea), Amélieles-Bains is sheltered on all sides from the winds by the mountains, between which flow two torrential rivers, the Tech and the Mondoni. At an altitude of 230 metres, the climate is warm without excess (mean annual temperature 58° F.), dry and temperate with an average of 71 days of rain only per year. The purity of the air and intense luminosity of the sky are favourable for sun-

cures. Population: 1.600 inhabitants.

URBAN SANITATION. — The wide and numerous avenues, spacious squares and extensive gardens assure an exceptional salubrity.

The abundant yield of the springs permits of the public distribution of water at 122° F by double-spouted fountains, from which pure cold drinking water gushes at the same time.

A municipal bureau d'hygiene has just been established and will function continuously.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENTS. — Among the 39 recognised springs, more than 30 of which are utilised, the most important are: the Grand Escaldadou, the Petit Escaldadou and the Source du Bassin de Réfrigération (Thermes Romains), the Sources Arago, Anglada, Amélie (Thermes Pujade).

There are a great number of drinking pavilions, the most famous being those of the Source du Manjolet, the Source Pascalone and the Source Chomel.

The temperature of these waters is very high; 88°40 to 143°6 F.


Two Thermal Establishments:

 Les Thermes Romains (Antique Remains). Perfect installations for balneotherapy, bath-rooms, rooms for douches, large Roman swimming-bath, Promenade Gallery 100 metres long, special quarters for treatment by spray and vapour inhalations and three rooms for taking the waters.

2. Les Thermes Pujade are built at the actual point of emergence of the spring from the rock, which prevents any alteration taking place by contact with the air when bringing the thermal water from the rock to the bath-rooms. The Establishment contains two swimming-baths with running water, light and airy bath-rooms, rooms for hydrotherapy warmed during the winter, cabinet vapour baths, rooms for treatment by spray and vapour inhalations; 5 rooms for taking the waters.

CHEMICAI, COMPOSITION OF THE WATER. — The total mineralisation reaches 0,317 and consists, in addition to a slight sulphuration, of alkaline salts with a strong proportion of silicates and organic matters.

## AMÉLIE-LES-BAINS (Pyrénées-Orientales)

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — Their chemical composition confers on the Amélie waters a remarkable combination of excitant properties (the characteristic of thermal sulphurous waters) and sedative properties due to their pronounced alkalinity and their large proportion of silicates and organic matters.

These properties are accentuated by sulphite decomposition (transformation by contact with the air from mono-sulphur of sodium into sulphite and hyposulphite and finally into sulphate and carbonate of soda). This variability represents a valuable quality since it substitutes for the excitant qualities of the sulphurous water the sedative qualities which render it suitable for new applications.

The waters are employed in baths, swimming-baths, general and local douches, Scotch douches, under-water douches, treatment by inhalation, gargling and internal administration,

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Very acute and chronic rheumatism, articular and muscular; rheumatic neuralgia and especially sciatica, St. Vitus Dance, articular disorders, muscular atrophy and sequela of war-wounds.

2º Chronic disorders of the respiratory tracts; rhinitis, pharyngitis, laryngitis and chronic bronchitis treated by nasal douches and inhalations. Excellent results have been obtained by sufferers from gas-poisoning.

3º As a consequence of sulphite decomposition, the waters are very rich in sulphites and hypo-sulphites and possess a solvent action on mercurial salts thus permitting of an intensive treatment of syphilis without fear of poisoning.

Among the secondary indications, the following must be noted; lymphatism, scrofule, certain affections of the genito-urinary organs, certain dermatoses, and lastly most of the affections to which Colonials are subject.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Those of sulphurous waters in general; cardiac insufficiency, uremia, arterial hypertension and active pulmonary tuberculosis.

AMUSEMENTS. — Among the local curiosities, the following are deserving of mention; the swimming-bath of the Thermes Romains (historical monument); the Church and Cloister of Arles-s-Tech (4 kilometres distant from Amélie), the Chapelle de Santa Engracia and the Fort built by Louis XIV now used as a private residence.

There are numerous walks and excursions in the neighbourhood including that to the *Gorge du Mondoni*, a gigantic waterfall with a perpendicular drop of 100 metres between high mountains and rocks, the torrential volume of water escaping by the *Cascade d'Annibal*; Pilon de Belmatx; Montalba l'Eglise with its cascade; Mas Pagris; Cascade du Therme; Roc Saint-Sauveur; Palalda; Calvaire de Montbolo; Reynes and the Vallon de l'Ample.

Service of auto-cars of the Route des Pyrénées (Amélie being the halting place for lunch). Automobiles and horse-drawn vehicles for hire, guides for the excursions ans ascents.

The Grand Casino where theatrical representations are given and dancing can be obtained is open from the 20th June to the 20th April. Cinemas, concert, good wild-boar and other hunting, trout-fishing.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Ax-les-Thermes is situated in the South of the district of Foix at an altitude of z,450 ft. on the borders of Ariege, Aude, Pyrénées-Orientales and Andorre, at the confluence of three Pyrenean streams in a valley open to the East and West. In the immediate neighbourhood of the watershed between the Mediterranean and Atlantic slopes, the country partakes of the characteristics of both these regions, being entirely free from fogs and with infrequent winds.

URBAN SANITATION. — Drinking water carried in pipes from the forest head-springs, a distance of 3 kilometres from the town. Drainage system under construction. Strictly supervised municipal street-sweeping and watering. Electric lighting.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENTS. — The 80 springs of Ax have a total yield of more than 2.500.000 litres. Several of the springs flow through the streets and supply in particular a pool called the Bassin des Ladres constructed in 1260 by Louis IX for the treatment of Crusaders bringing back leprosy from Palestine.


The others feed four thermal establishments, namely Le Coloubret, le Teich, le Breilh and le Modèle, where there are complete hydrotherapeutic installations including 15 separate sections of baths with 134 bath-rooms, 25 douches with strong and medium pressure, 2 rooms for inhalations and four hot vapour bath-rooms supplied by the vapours from springs at a temperature of 158° to 167° F., two rooms for local douches, four rooms where the waters from 18 springs are taken, and a "Vaporigene" constructed by Dr. Bousquet which enables vapours and hyperthermal gases to be insufflated under pressure into the upper respiratory tracts and the Eustachian tube.

There still exists a thermal hospital built by Louis IX in the year 1260.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The waters, of which the temperature varies between 72° and 173°3 F. contain sulphides, hypo-sulphites, precipitated sulphur (washed), alkaline carbonates and silicates, lithia, certain metals and metalloids (Garrigou), organic matters (barégine). That the radio-activity is very high is shown by the large quantities of nitrogen and rare gases (helium, argon, etc.) which are liberated from the waters (Garrigou, Moureu, etc.).

The establishments are built on the exact points of emergence of the springs from the rock and this coupled with the fact that some of the waters are warmed or cooled by being passed through hyperthermal or cold water (protected meanwhile from contact with the air), renders the cure at Ax extremely efficacious.

## AX-LES-THERM'ES (Ariège)

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — The general or local improvement anatomical or functional is explained by the increased functional activity effected by the hydromineral cure on the various organs and systems and the soothing of painful phenomena. The treatment consists of baths, general, local and under-water, douches, douche-massage, sprays, inhalations, massage and hot vapour baths. The waters are also given by the mouth.

There is good hunting and shooting (bears, Pyrenean chamois, grouse and partridge) and also trout fishing, etc. Tennis can be obtained.

The Casino to which is attached an orchestra and a theatrical troupe contains card-rooms, etc.

The snow at Ax lasts a long time and at an altitude of 4.265 and 6.233 ft., are large plateaux, eminently suitable for winter sports.

"It is a typical sedative station of medium altitude" (Professeur Rathery). Average temperature for the year 52°47 F.

HYGIEN. — Abundant supply of cold drinking-water (3.000 litres per inhabitant). Complete drainage system. Street watering by means of a motor pump. Electric lighting. Model disinfection service.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENTS. - 39 Springs with a daily yield of million litres which can be divided into three groups

 The thermal water group containing calcium-sulphate, includes the majority of the springs, with a scale of temperature varying between 77°F, and 123°8 F. (Salies), and a total mineralisation of 2,6 grammes; bicarbonates of calcium, iron and manganese 0,299; sulphate of calcium, magnesium, sodium and lithia: 2,102 grammes; chlorides of sodium and potassium: 0,182 grammes; sodium arseniate: 0,001 grammes; copper, fluorine, etc.

Cold waters containing iron : Angoulème, Grand Pré.

A cold sulphurous water, Labassère, contains 0,046 grammes sodium-sulphide. This spring emerges in the Commune of Labassere, is exceptionnally stable which renders it particularly suitable for exportation. After having been bottled for several months, sulphur in the colloidal state is found in the water.

The principal Establishments are : les Thermes (Anciens Thermes Marie-Therese) which contain six rooms for taking the water, some thirty bath-rooms, large and small douches, massage rooms, vapour baths, rooms for spray and vapour inhalations.

Les Thermes de Salut, pump-room, bath, douches.



In baths, the hyperthermal springs possess an excitant action but the most famous springs, such as le Foulon and le Salut have a manifest sedative action upon the skin as well as on the circulation and on the nervous system, particularly in invalids suffering from hypertension, whose arterial pressure is lowered by several centimetres.

The principal indication of Bagnères-de-Bigorre, and which constitutes the chief attribute of the resort is the treatment of nervous subjects, functional rather than organic.. "Bagnères-de-Bigorre more than any other spa in the world possesses all that is indispensable for this very distinctive type of invalid" (Rathery).

The climate and the waters combine admirably to produce this sedative effect.

In addition, as the same author rightly points out, the appropriate treatment of conditions of spinal irritation (the cause of neuroses) can be obtained at Baguères better than anywhere else. Whether the manifestations are of a digestive, respiratory, cardio-vascular, genital, cutaneous or renal character, the doctor can choose from the numerous thermal and hydrotherapic resources of Baguères, the particular treatment which the case demands. For those suffering from constipation, he will prescribe the waters of the Rampe or of the Labassère; for sufferers from gastralgia, the water of the Salut; for asthmatical subjects, the arsenical water of Salies; for women suffering from metritis, injections of Salies water, or if there is hyperesthesia, baths in Salut or Foulon water, etc., which latter is also prescribed together with Platane for sufferers from eczema with persistent pruritis, arthritis, etc.

Children, especially irritable children, derive great benefit from the atmosphere and the waters of this resort.

To summarise, the spa of Bagnères-de-Bigorre is suitable for all neuropaths, sufferers from neuro-arthritis, and invalids with whom nervous troubles predominate, with or without concomitant lesion compatible with a thermal cure.

There is no special contra-indication at Bagnère. It is sufficient to point out the chief contra-indications which are common to all the resorts; neoplasm, advanced cardiopathy, feverish complaints, cachectic conditions, etc.

ACCOMMODATION. — Numerous comfortable hotels, with running water. Pensions de famille where the cuisine is exquisite also diet hotels. Well furnished villas in the outskirts of the resort situated in shady locations. Furnished apartments and accommodation suitable for all classes of visitors

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — The spa of Bagnoles-de-l'Orne is an association of the village of Tessé-la-Madeleine and the commune of Bagnoles-de-l'Orne. It is 248 kilometres from Paris on a branch of the Paris-Granville line. The climate of Bagnoles is that of the west coast of France and, by reason of its situation on the borders of the forests, it also enjoys a woodland climate. Average altitude: 730 ft.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — There are two springs: La Source des Fées, 53° F. and La Grande Source, 78°60 F. Modern bathing establishment containing a complete outfit for balneotherapy.

CHEMICAL, COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — 1. La Source des Fées : Chalybeate water, not acrated, leaving an iron deposit, is used for drinking.

2. La Grande Source: Plutonian origin 78°60 F.: issues from a granite rock and throws off large lubbles of gas; it yields 38.000 litres per hour. Density: 1.006. Cryoscopic point: 0,000 Electrical resistance: 15,775 w. 70. At the Source the reaction is slightly acid. It contains o grm. 0540 of solid extract, per litre at 387°75 F. It contains: electro-negative elements: calcium, iron, lithium, magnesium, potassium, sodium, strontium. Electro-positive elements: antimony, arsenic, chlorine, phoaphorus, silicon, sulphur; gases: nitrogen, 90 %; carbonic acid, 5 %; argon, 4,5 %; helium, traces. Radio-activity of the gases: N = 0,36. Radio-active salts in suspension in the water.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — The basis of the treatment is baths All the devices of hydrotherapy, ingestion of the water, mobilisation, light massage, massage often given in the bath, air treatment, walks, gymnastics and diet constitute the treatment at Bagnoles.

The baths produce ischemia of the superficial blood vessels; the tissues are flushed. Improvement of general and local circulation. Greater permeability of the veins. Diuresis and elimination of uric acid. The arterial tension approaches the normal. All the functions of nutrition are awakened. The sympathetic nervous system is stimulated and especially the secretory and vaso-motor fibres.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Mouillère is situated near the town of Besançon being separated from it only by the river Doubs and the Micaud road; its altitude is 850 ft. The climate offers the tonic and stimulative influences of mountain air during the summer, but is not bracing.

La Mouillère is six hours from Paris, four from Lyons and only two hours from Alsace and Switzerland.

THE SPRING AND THE BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The saline source is intercepted at Miserey three miles from Besançon, and brought to the bathing establishment by special piping.

There are seventy-four apartments of three classes in the establishment; six for sulphur and sulphur-saline baths; two large halls for hydrotherapy, vapour baths and aerotherapy rooms for remedial exercices and orthopedics, mechanotherapy, massage, douches and sitz baths, ascending douches; apartments for the application of Fango de Battaglia (mineral volcanic mud)

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — This natural mineral saline water contains 298 grammes of saline elements (Sp. Gr. 1.024) to the litre; 291 grammes of this are chlorides (283 grammes of sodium chloride), marked traces of sodium iodide and 0 grm. 108 of potassium bromide. In short, there is a high percentage of chlorine salts and a valuable one of bromides.

The natural water contains per litre 323 grammes of saline elements, 308 of which are chlorides (235 grammes of sodium chloride) and 2 grm. 250 of potassium bromide.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION. — Under the influence of strong saline treatment by a reflex physico-chemical action and not by absorption, the sensitivity of the skin increases rapidly, the skin becomes supple; the peripheral circulation of the blood and lymph is distinctly accelerated, the swellings disappear both in the region of the injured members and, in cases of pelvic cellulitis, from the vicinity of the uterus.

The number of red corpuscles is increased as well as the haemoglobin, the phagocytosis becomes more active and the respiratory quotient is reduced; the amount of urine increases, together with the uric acid, urea and co-efficient of nitrogen.

On the other hand, the phosphoric acid and extractive nitrogenous matters decrease. In a general way the functional activities are greatly stimulated and the patient experiences a feeling of health and euphoria.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Small town in the Saone and Loire, in the vicinity of the Nièvre and Allier with a suburb known as Saint-Léger, which constitutes the spa. Altitude: 780 ft. 4.500 inhabitants. Temperate, healthy climate, permeable soil, rich vegetation. The town lies on the lower slopes of the Morvan which drops gradually to the Loire. 337 kilometres from Paris.

THE SPRINGS AND THE BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The Lymbe, Reine, Descures, Valois and Marguerite springs. Daily yield: 400 cubic metres. Bright emerald mosses around the wells.

Thirty-four apartments with baths and underwater douche installations. Four rooms fitted with natural vapour baths both general and local. Massage shower. Steam shower, Special apartments for treating gynecological conditions. Atomisation. Inhalation of the natural steam of the Lymbe spring evolving radio-active emanations. CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — Sodium chloride: I grm. 35. Alkaline bicarbonates, traces of arsenic, manganese and fluorine. Total mineralisation: I grm. 70. Warm springs (136°4 F. to 118°4 F.) according to the springs, which are of deep or plutonian origin.

Important liberation of gas composed of nitrogen, emanations of radium and rare gases (helium).

URBAN SANITATION. - Purest drinking water from the Mont mountain.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — Sedation of nervous and painful manifestations, regulation of the peripheric circulation and the heart. Stimulation of nutrition. Disintoxication by expulsion of urates and uric acid.

The treatment consists in the imbibition of the Reine and Descures waters, in external treatment (baths with under-water douches, vapour baths, inhalations, various douches) and in massage and the methodical movements of mechanotherapy.

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — 1. Functional disorders of the heart, precordial pain, simple tachycardia, paroxysmal tachycardia, exophtalmic goitre, neuralgic or vaso-motor angina pectoris, pseudohypertrophy of the heart in adolescence.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Capvern-les-Bains, about three kilometres from the village of that name, is situated at the foot of the central Pyrenees, below the Plateau of Lannemezan. Its altitude is 1.558 ft. and the climate, intermediate between that of the mountains and that of the plains, is salubrious and pleasant. It is tonic without being stimulating. By its position, Capvern is sheltered from winds and from extremes of temperature, and for this reason its climate is peculiarly sedative and anti-spasmodic in character.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENTS. - There are two principal springs: La Hount-Caoute which yields 20.700 hectolitres per day and Le Bouridé, whose daily yield is 16 416 hectolitres

There are two bathing establishments, La Hount-Caoute has a drinking-fountain and installation for baths and douches. Le Bouridé is equally well equipped:

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The Hount-Caoute spring has a temperature of 75°2 F.; that of Le Bouridé 66°2 F. Both contain calcium and magnesium bicarbonates and sulphates, with traces of arsenic, copper and lithia. The most important constituent is, however, calcium sulphate: 1 grm. 123

In addition to these mineral constituents, Le Bouridé contains an oily organic matter known as glairine or barégine, due to the presence in the water of nitrogenized substances, vegetable elements and magnesium silicates. Owing to its carbonic acid, potassium, sodium and silica contents, this water possesses marked sedative, antiphlogistic and antispasmodic properties.


In common with all mineral waters, these springs have a certain radio-activity, due to the presence of an emanation of radium,

PHYSIOLOGICAL, ACTIVITY AND METHODS OF TREATMENT. - Taken by the mouth, the water of Hount-Caoute has a strong diuretic action. Owing to its osmotic activity and the modifications which it brings about in various organs, it effects when taken fasting, a perfect irrigation of the entire system, cellular, intestinal, hepatic and urinary. The urine is enabled to carry off the major proportion of the waste products of intracellular combustion, and abnormal nitrogenized products are dissolved and eliminated.

Hence there is a marked improvement in the emonctory activity of the liver and kidneys and an increased excretion of bile and urine.

Employed externally, the water of Hount-Caoute has a stimulant action, it is slightly exci-

The water of Le Bouridé may also be taken by the mouth. It has pronounced diurctic properties. When employed externally in the form of baths, it is singularly sedative in its action, it relieves congestion and tends to regulate the potentiality of the nerve-cells. "The efficacy of the Bouridé waters is so striking" writes an English physician Dr. Farr, "that it may be justly described as marvellous'

It is the combined clinical activities of the two waters, Le Hount-Caoute and Le Bouridé, which constitute the "treatment" of Capvern.

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. - Specific to Captern: Lithiasis, especially of the kidneys and bladder; hepatic and intestinal lithiasis; affections of the kidneys and bladder, cystitis, pyelitis and pyelo-nephritis.



ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Altitude 2.493 ft. Mean temperature from 20th June to 20th September: 65°48 F. The Spanish frontier runs between Biarritz, Lourdes and Pau. Eaux-Bonnes lies in a richly wooded valley at the foot of the Pic-du-Ger, 8.569 ft. The drinking water is good, very abundant and of remarkable purity. Sanitation of freeholds is on the sewer system.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENTS. — There are seven springs of similar composition, the most important of which are the *Orteig* and the *Vieille* springs. The waters of these contain both sodium and calcium.

There are two bathing establishments: I. The Grands Thermes, supplied by the Vieille spring, has rooms for gargling, for atomized throat douches, for nasal and aural irrigation and for inhalation. It has four sections fitted with immersion baths, a room for douches of various kinds with cubicles for friction and massage, and two special sections, ladies' and gentlemen's, with foot-baths.

2. The Neo-Thermes, supplied by the Orteig spring, is used chiefly in the management of children's diseases and is provided with a special playing park. It has immersion baths in separate sections for boys and girls and a room for douches and massage. The mecanotherapeutic installation is very complete.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The seven springs, of which one is cold, are very similar in composition. — La Vieille differs in that it contains sodium and calcium (Gold Medal, London 1908). The analysis is as follows: Temperature 90°86 F.; sodium sulphide 0,0214; calcium sulphide 0,017; sodium chloride 0,2640; sodium sulphate 0,0277; calcium sulphate 0,1644; silica 0,0500; ammonia 0,0005; organic matters 0,0480 (Prof. Filhel); nitrogen 98,2; silver and helium 1,8. There are traces of copper, tin, gold, lead, platinum, zinc, cobalt, nickel, iron, manganese, bismuth, antimony, arsenic. The metal contents are extremely rich and varied (Prof. Garrigou) and the radio-activity is very marked (Prof. Moureu).

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY AND METHODS OF TREATMENT. — The waters constitute a sovereign remedy in all cases where, owing to accidental or constitutional causes,

the system is in need of energetic stimulus, a touch of the whip, so to speak. They are indicated in affections of the throat and the mucosa of the respiratory passages, as well as in maladies of all those mucous membranes to which the waters can be given direct access.

The waters are administered by the mouth; they are also employed externally in the form of irrigations, inhalations and atomized douches. These measures are reinforced by open air treatment and graduated walks in the forest, which is exceptionally fine.

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. — Anaemia, lymphatic conditions, neurasthenia, chronic inflammatory conditions of the mucosa of the respiratory passages (affections of the nose and throat), pulmonary emphysema, asthma, bronchial catarrh, pneumonia, pleurisy, early cicatrization of wounds.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Febrile pulmonary tuberculosis and acute disease.

MEDICAL MEN. — Drs. Beigber, Creignoux, Fournier, Rigoulet (speaks English and has English and French medical degrees), Vidaut de Pomerait (speaks Spanish).

AMUSEMENTS. — There is a casino and a theatre; in January and February there are winter-sports. The walks are many and beautiful, and excursions into Spain are easily arranged. Eaux-Bonnes is a halting place of the motor-car service which runs from Biarritz to Luchon. Motor-cars and horse-carriages may be had for long or short excursions; horses, mules, etc., are obtainable.

ACCOMMODATION. — There is one first-class hotel with every modern convenience, hot and cold water, central heating, electric-lighting, bath-rooms. It has 85 bed-rooms, of which 10 have private bath-rooms.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Luxeuil, 6.000 inhabitants, is the chief town of the department of Haute-Saône and is situated as the base of the southern slopes of the Vosges. Altitude: 1.148 ft. It is 406 kilometres from Paris, on the Paris-Belfort line via Port d'Atelier and Aillevillers (journey of 7 1/2 hours). Temperate Vosges climate, salubrious air. Luxeuil is surrounded by forests.

URBAN SANITATION. - Drinking water, drainage system, electric lighting.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — Luxeuil possesses 18 warm springs, with a daily yield of 600.000 litres, forming two principal groups: Salines, very warm, 96° to 125°35 F.; ferro-manganese, 69° to 84° F. These latter constitute, through their temperature a group unique in Europe. All these waters contain fairly large quantities of nitrogen and fluorine and are very rich in radio-active properties.

The bathing establishment, the property of the State, is built in a magnificent park. It contains bath-rooms, and rooms for irrigation, swimming baths with running water, hot air baths (emanatorium), rooms for inhalation, for douches, for massage. The baths and swimming baths are made of sandstone which has the property of becoming saturated with radioactive emanations. The establishment is open all the year round.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The saline springs have the highest mineralisation, averaging 1 to 2 grammes. The Grand Bain-spring, 1 grm. 113. They have been found to contain about 1 grm. of chloride, 0 grm. 035 of carbonate of soda, 0 grm. 085 of lime, 0 grm. 010 of lithium, 0 grm. 146 of sulphate of soda, traces of arsenic, iron and manganese.

The Iron yielding springs, are less mineralised and less warm, 60°60 to 64° F. They are remarkable for their iron contents, 0 grm. 012; and manganese, 0 grm. 09. This latter content is not found in any other warm spring. These waters issue from granite and are of plutonian origin. They cool less quickly than ordinary water heated to the same temperature. They are slightly aerated.

TREATMENT. — Balneo-therapy predominates at Luxeuil (baths in a bath or swimming pond, vaginal irrigation carried out in the bath, douches, intestinal lavage, massage). But it is the vaginal irrigation undertaken in the bath which is the triumph of this spa, because it is administered in conditions which can be realised at Luxeuil only, thanks to the high

temperature of the different springs, 103°75 to 125°20 F, and to the position of the baths By a clever system of canalisation the water is caught as it leaves the rock and is carried directly into the bath without coming into contact with the air. This is therefore a virgin water in possession of its full dynamia, a veritable living water having undergone neither heating nor cooling. It comes into direct contact with the neck of the uterus with the pressure reduced to a minimum in order to constitute a real local bath.

These facts explain the marvellous action of the Luxeuil irrigation in all forms of gyne-copathy.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION. — The physiological action is sedative, decongestive and tonic. The sedation of the nervous system with a special bearing on the pelvic organs is observed in cases of painful uterine erithism with constant congestive condition. The radicactive emanations possess a remarkably sedative action from this point of view.

The decongestive action is due especially to the unusual heat of the water. This action is accompanied by a very marked haemostatic action. The tonic and restorative action is mostly due to the ferro-manganese springs.

PRINCIPAL, THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Luxeuil is preeminently a spa for women. The majority of patients are those with uterine and genital disorders. Every variety of severe genital phlegmasia, cellulitis and sclerosis of the uterus and its appendages are also treated. Luxeuil has the effect of combatting congestion, causing the reabsorption of exudates, regulating local circulation and allaying pain and spasms, at the same time toning up the general condition. Chronic subacute inflammatory conditions of the uterus and its appendages and of the peritoneum. Arthritic congestion of the genital organ. Pelvic neuralgia. Disorders of the ovulation. Sterility. These are the major indications for the cure at Luxeuil. We must also mention all uterine fibromata in which pain is present. In all these cases, the manifest sedative action of the waters of Luxeuil is especially indicated.

The Lithinée spring is typical. Mineralisation: 2 grm. 344 per litre. Sulphate of lime: 1 grm. 774. Sulphate of magnesium: 0 grm. 129. Bicarbonate of lithium: 0 grm. 030. Silicates of soda and of lime

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The three springs utilised to day are situated in an enclosed park of 40 acres: The Lithinée, Dames and Savonneuse springs-

The bathing establishment comprises: two apartments for douches, complete hydrotherapy, jet, shower, circular, lumbar, perineal and horizontal douches. Four bath-rooms de luxe, 10 simple bath-rooms, rooms with baths of resinous vapour or dry vapour baths, two rooms for sulphur baths, six rooms with under-water douches, two rooms for ascending douches, one room for under-water massage, four for dry massage.

Modern comfort, airing and lighting, etc

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — The action of the water causes an intestinal or urinary flushing every morning according to the temperament of the patient. The water is used chiefly for imbibition, doses of 300 to 2,000 grammes, according to the disorders and condition of the patient. The posology varies according to the individuality and age of the patient. Custom has decreed a cure of three weeks but it may be longer, shorter, or divided according to the opinion of the doctor.



ITUATION AND CLIMATE. - This attractive little town is in the department of Allier and has 3.500 inhabitants. It is situated upon the side of a hill upon the high road between Clermont and Tours and is divided into two distinct quarters. The town itself, or *Bourg*, is grouped round an old Roman church and its altitude is 1.246 ft. THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The springs are caught in six wells and yield over 1.500 000 litres in twenty-four hours. Their temperature is 127% F. There are two bathing establishments, the property of the State

The Grand Establishment has a very complete hydrotherapeutic installation. There are bath-rooms de luxe, numerous first-class bath-rooms, vapour baths and rooms for douchemassage.

The Patit bathing establishment is reserved for poorer clients. It is open all the year round. The Thermal hospital has recently been rebuilt and is furnished with every modern contrivance for hygien and for comfort. During the season, indigent patients or those sent under certain conditions by communes or departments, are received at a very low price for a period not exceeding twenty days

Application for such patients should be made to the Director of the Hospital

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. - The waters are only slightly mineralized (1 grm. 26 per litre). They contain carbonates of baryta, lead and copper; and alkaline fluosilicates and fluoborates associated with lithia.

The waters are radio-active. When exposed to the air, conferva in great abundance are

deposited, a veritable submarine flora.

PUBLIC HEALTH - The drinking water is conveyed in conduits. A very complete sewer system is in course of construction. The streets are watered and the town is lighted by electricity. Covered Market.

PHYSIOLOGICAL, ACTIVITY AND THERAPEUTIC EMPLOYMENT. first few baths have a somewhat stimulant effect; there is general muscular pain, the urine becomes scanty and red and the pulse is fluttering. After about twelve or fourteen baths, these symptoms decrease in severity and disappear, giving place to a gradual and steadily increasing amelioration of all the general and specific phenomena. This sedative action is characteristic of the Néris waters

All forms of hydrotherapy are practised at Néris; there are baths, swimming-baths, douches, douche-massage, irrigations and vapour-baths. The conferva are sometimes employed for local application.

The steam from the waters is employed in the form of vapour-baths and douches,

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. — Diseases of the nervous system: In affections of the central nervous system the action of the water is limited. It is, however, efficacious in the painful stages of locomotor ataxia; and in diffuse myelitis, a frigore or of traumatic origin.

Among peripheral nervous affections, neuralgia (facial, intercostal, sciatic, cutaneous, visceral, etc.) is absolutely amenable to treatment.

Neuritis and neurasthenia of every description are immensely benefitted. Such conditions are: neuritis of zonal or traumatic origin, writers' and pianists' cramp; neuroses, hysteria, traumatic neuroses, convulsions, chorea, tics of all kinds and the multitudinous phenomena classed as nervousness. Neurasthenia, chronic headache, insomnia, Graves' disease, Parkinson's disease.

Rheumalic conditions, diseases of women and neuro-arthrific dermatoses are all satisfactorily treated at Neris.

MEDICAL MEN. - Drs Bernard, Decloux, Delarrat, Dercure, Ducros, Macé de Lépinay.

AMUSEMENTS. — Regarded socially, Neris is a quiet spa. The daily life is calm and free from excitement. There are two large and shady parks, the Parc des Arènes and the park belonging to the bathing establishment.

There is a Casino with reading-rooms, lounges, gaming-rooms, concert hall and theatre. The Rickotter museum contains Roman antiquities and a fine collection of Roman coins excavated at Neris and in the surrounding country. Neris is the "Neriomagnus" of the Romans and its existence dates from the first century after Christ.

The hall of the bathing establishment contains interesting Roman sculptures excavated in the neighbourhood. The casino orchestra plays two or three times daily in the park.

Entertainments are organised by the Comité des Fêtes and there is an open-air theatre in the Parc des Arènes.

There are many charming walks and excursions may be made by carriage or car.

The country is hilly and the valley of the Cher has interesting ravines and other picturesque features.

ACCOMMODATION. — There are 12 comfortable second-class hotels, with 450 bedrooms. There are 8 more modest third-class hotels with 115 bed-rooms.

There are about 50 furnished houses, villas and apartments to suit all conditions and tastes.

#### SAINT-GERVAIS

THERMAL WATERS CONTAINING CHLORIDES, SULPHATES, HYDROGEN SULDPHIDE, SILICATES AND LITHIA

Season 25th May to 30th September.

S

ITUATION. — The commune of Saint-Gervais, the territory of which extends to the summit of Mont Blanc, is situated upon both banks of the river Bonnant, at the foot of a spur of Mont Blanc. The spa, Saint-Gervais-les-Bains-le-Fayet, has a population of 2,000 inhabitants and is visited annually for the sake of its waters by about 8,000 persons. It is at 591 kilometres from Paris.

CI,IMATE. — The altitude of Saint-Gervais is 1 968 to 2 788 ft; it has a mountain climate and is sheltered from winds. The condensation of aqueous vapour by the glaciers renders the air exceptionally dry; their presence tends, moreover, to purify the atmosphere. The temperature during the day is moderate, 53,6 to 68° F, and the nights are cool and fresh. At the beginning and end of the season the climate is extremely pleasant and open-air treatment is possible even in winter.

PUBLIC HEALTH. — The department of public health is extremely well managed. The drinking-water is excellent; it is derived from springs of an absolute purity and the system of conduits is excellent. Sanitation is on the sewer system. The streets are watered and the town is lighted by electricity. There is a municipal office of public health and a disinfection service.

THE SPRINGS AND THE BATHING ESTABLISHMENTS. — There are three springs, the Gontard, the de Mey which have a combined output of 332 ooo litres in 24 hours, and the Guéridaud spring which yields 43 ooo litres in 24 hours. The springs and the bathing establishments are at Le Fayet.

There are two bathing establishments. The Ancien Etablissement is constructed over the Gontard and Guéridaud springs; the waters of the latter contain sulphur. The Nouvel Etablissement is fed by the saline spring Gontard; its hydrotherapeutic installation is singularly complete.

CHEMICAI, COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The waters are hot: 100°4 to 104° F, and contain 5 grammes of salts to the litre. These consist chiefly of calcium sulphate, sodium sulphate and bromides. The proportion of lithia (sulphate of lithia: 0 grm, 1020 to the litre) is very high; indeed the waters of Saint-Gervais are probably the most highly lithiated in Europe. They also contain 0 grm. 0837 sodium silicate, which renders them soft to the touch. The spring Guéridaud also contains small quantities of hydrogen sulphide and of glairine.

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. — General: The Saint-Gervais waters are particularly indicated in the management of nervous arthritism, more especially in those cases which are associated with hepatic, renal, gouty, lithiasic, asthmatic and cutaneous manifestations. Their influence is sedative and tends to reduce congestion.

## SAINT-GERVAIS-LES-BAINS (Haute-Savoie)

Specific. — Diseases of the skin, particularly those which demand a sedative treatment and are associated with an imperfect function of the liver, kidneys or intestines. Such are: urticaria, pruritus; general and local prurigo, strophulus, Hebra's prurigo, Wilson's pruriginous lichen planus during eruption, lichen, acné, eczema, including both irritating seborrhoeic eczema during eruption and acute true arthritic eczema during eruption. As a general rule baths are strongly contra-indicated in these conditions, the treatment of Saint-Gervais, however is able not only to afford relief but in many instances to effect a cure. The low sulphur contents of the Torrent spring permit of its employment in the treatment of chronic skin diseases where a more highly sulphurated water would be injurious.

Rhino-pharyngilis, especially the congestive and arthritic forms.

Nervous diseases and neurasthenia are benefitted by the climate which is both sedative and tonic. There are facilities for appropriate hydrotherapy and dietary regimes as well as for reasoned exercise and rest.

Delicate and degenerative conditions in children.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — The tonic dermatoses of lymphatics, scrofula, tuberculosis, cardiac conditions with broken compensation, general arterio-sclerosis, diabetes maigre, melancholia.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY. — The baths are soothing in their effect. They exercise a direct sedative action upon the glandular elements and the nerve terminals. Taken by the mouth, the waters are diuretic, they counteract the effects of auto-intoxication and reduce congestion of the liver.

The methods of treatment include baths, atomizing douches, douche-massage, nasal-douches, vapour baths, etc. The waters are also given by the mouth.

Medical Men. — Drs. Bleicher, Gimbert, Mallein, Mélaret, Musso, Paillet, Roux.

AMUSEMENTS. — There is a splendid park of about twenty-five acres. Various mountain excursions may be undertaken. There is a railway to Chamonix and Martigny (Switzerland) and a rack and pinion railway to Mont Blanc. Guides and mules are obtainable.

ACCOMMODATION. — There are 5 first-class hotels with hot and cold water, electric lighting, central heating, bath-rooms, etc. There are 600 bed-rooms of which 200 have private bath-rooms.

There are 8 comfortable second-class hotels with 350 bed-rooms, 9 third-class hotels with 150 bed-rooms.

There are 180 furnished houses, villas and apartments to suit all conditions,

MEANS OF ACCESS. — Saint-Gervais-les-Bains le-Fayet is the terminus of the main Paris line. It is also the starting point of the Chamonix-Martigny railway and of the rack and pinion Chemin de fer du Mont-Blanc. It is a halting place of the Route des Alpes service of motor-cars from Evian to Nice. It is twelve hours from Paris, seven from Lyons, two from Geneva, fourteen from Marseilles, four from Lausanne and twenty hours from London.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — On the western slopes of the Morvan near Nevers, Autun, I.e Creusot. Altitude: 984 ft. Climate of the plains modified by the vicinity of the mountains and forests; fall of temperature at night 302 kilometres from Paris.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — Utilised springs: La Crevasse; L'Acacia; La Marquise; Les Romains. Yield: 900 cubic metres per diem. Completely renovated in 1906, the bathing establishment is extremely modern and attractive. It comprises inhalation and atomisation apartments, rooms of gargling and doucheing and a swimming bath (with running water) 250 metres in extent, 82°4 F.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — The springs utilised: La Crevasse, L'Acacia, 78°8 F., Marquise and Romains, 87°8 F., grouped into two sets of varying degrees and very similar mineralisation.

When they come into contact with the air, these waters give off sulphurated hydrogen, nitrogen, carbonic acid and very rare gases (neon and helium). They contain bicarbonate of lime, magnesium, sodium and potassium (o grm. 299), alkaline sulphates (o grm. 003), arsenate of soda (o grm. 002), chlorides, iodides, bromides, borates, azotates, phosphates, iron and manganese.

The total residue is o grm. 50 per litre for the first group and o grm. 39 for the second group.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — The treatment at Saint-Honoré is middly tonic and restorative and is perfectly suited to children. The waters owe their properties to the association of sulphur and arsenic. They have a selective action on the mucous membranes.

The action of the Saint-Honoré waters varies according to the dose; sedative in small doses, it is stimulating and increases the splenetonic blood supply in large — In suitable doses, the waters are sedative to the nervous system, regulate nutrition and circulation and sti-

mulate the gastric functions. The arterial pressure is nearly always reduced, the atabolism retarded, the weight increased and the blood enriched. The action is profound and permanent.

The waters are used for drinking, inhalation, gargling, for atomisation, nasal and vaginal irrigation, baths and douches and for the swimming bath.

Air: The Morvan Mountains do not rise higher than 2,800 ft, and are covered with beautiful forests.

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — 1. Chronic disorders of the respiratory passages of arthritics and of children: This is the main indication of this resort. Rhinitis, pharyngitis, laryngitis (smokers, singers, speakers), tracheitis, bronchitis, susceptibility of the respiratory system, asthma (which is much mitigated and often cured), hay fever (the moderate altitude is most favourable), inactive, slow and localised tuberculosis of the lungs without fever, intractable cases and convalescence from diseases of the respiratory organs.

- 2. Secondarily eczema, impetigo, endometritis, phlebitis.
- In children, the same indications as above and small or operated adenoid growths, tracheo-bronchial adenopathy, infantile asthma and lymphatism.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Diseases of the liver, the kidneys, the bladder, uncompensated cardiopathy.

Medical Men. — Drs, Breuillard, Comoy, Comte, du Pasquier, Segard, Sylvestre.

AMUSEMENTS. — Casino, theatre, concerts, magnificent park, riding, shooting, various picturesque excursions: the roads are excellent for walking, cycling, driving, riding or motoring.

ACCOMMODATION. — One first-class hotel; hot and cold water, electricity; bath-rooms. 80 bed-rooms.



COLD WATERS STRONGLY IMPREGNATED WITH SODIUM CHLORIDE AND CONTAINING BROMINE IODIDE

Season all the year round, especially from March 1st to November 30th



ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Salies-de-Béarn is a little town with 6.000 inhabitants, equidistant (60 kilometres) from Pau and Biarritz. It is 770 kilometres from Paris and is situated upon a branch line seven kilometres from Puyoo, the junction with the Paris-Pau-Pierrefitte main line (Pyrenees Express). The climate is calm, temperate and sedative, with little or no wind. The average winter temperature is 46°4 F.

PUBLIC HEALTH. — The drinking water is good and there is a system of main drainage. The town is lighted by electricity.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — There are two saline springs, le Bayâa which yields 45 cubic metres per day and le Griffon.

The bathing establishment is situated in the public park, in the centre of the modern quarter of Salies and in the neighbourhood of the best hotels. It comprises fifty first-class bath-rooms, twenty-five of the second class and fifty of the third class. There are several rooms where general and local douches are given. Besides, it is provided with bath-rooms de luxe. The establishment is open all the year round and in the winter the first-class bath-rooms are heated.

CHEMICAI, COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS — The temperature of the water is 59° F.; its reaction is alkaline and its specific density is very high, 15 to 20 by Baume's areometer. The contents per litre are: sodium chloride, 250 grm., magnesium bromide, 0 grm. 470; iodide 0 grm. 053. It contains, moreover, certain organic matters which render it soft and oily to the touch. By boiling, the mother-water may be brought to a concentration of 25, 28, 33. It then contains bromide, 10 grammes, and iodide, 1 gramme, to the litre.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY. — The waters of Salies tend to accelerate the nutritive exchanges and to increase the urinary output. There is a marked stimulation of the nitrogen exchanges and an increase in the oxydation of the waste products resulting from imperfect assimilation of albumenoids. The waters have a general tonic action; they promote nutrition and they exercise a stimulating effect upon the central nervous system.

The mother-waters, containing bromium iodide, have a sedative effect upon the nervous system. They also promote absorption and are indicated in all chronic inflammations with plastic exudation.

## SALIES-DE-BÉARN (Basses-Pyrénées)

PRINCIPAL INDICATIONS. — Salies-de-Béarn is essentially a spa for women and children. The conditions treated with advantage are:

Lymphatic conditions; scrofula, surgical tuberculosis, suppurating or otherwise; cold abscess; strumous ulcers; suppuration of the ganglia and bones; epididymic tuberculosis

Adenoid growths; cervical, trachaeo-bronchial and mesenteris adenitis; tuberculosis of the male and female genital and urinary organs; tendinous synovitis; tubercular osteo-arthritis, white swelling; coxalgia; Pott's disease; tubercular rheumatism; Poncet's tubercular inflammation; rickets; various arthritic conditions.

Primary anaemia (chlorisis) and secondary anaemia (convalescence after infectious disease or haemorrhage).

Amenorrhae, dysmenorrhoea, metritis, uterine catarrh, uterine atony, various factors tending to cause sterility or abortion, perimetritis, parametritis, chronic salpingo-ovaritis, uterine prolapse, misplacement, uterine fibroma.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Asthma, acute exacerbations, febrile or otherwise, cardiac lesions with broken compensation, malaria during the attack, avowed pulmonary tuber-culosis, cancer.

Medical Men. — Drs. Belot, Collard-Huard, Coustère, David, Dufourcq, Laclau, Felix Lafont, Matton, Ortal, Raynaud.

AMUSEMENTS. — Salies is a typical little old Béarnais town. Henri IV of France and his mother Jeanne d'Albret stayed there.

There is a casino, theatre, orchestra, tennis court.

The walks and excursions are numerous and varied. The best known are those to: Sanveterre, Bellocq, Escos, Bidache (formerly the seat of the dukes de Grammont), Peyrehorade, Orthez, Five good roads run from Salies into the Basque country, to Mauleon, Saint-Palais, Tardets, Hendaye, Fontarabie, Saint-Sebastian, Pau, Lourdes, the valleys of the torrents Lavedan and Ossau.

ACCOMMODATION. — There are 3 first-class hotels comprising 300 bed-rooms, of which 40 have private bath-rooms. These hotels have electric lighting and hot and cold water.

There are 6 comfortable second-class hotels with 300 bed-rooms.

There are 5 third-class hotels, modest in character, with 150 bed-rooms.

And there are 50 furnished villas and apartments.

MEANS OF ACCESS. — Salies-de-Béarn is a railway station on the Chemin de fer du Midi. There are through carriages to and from Paris,

Season: 15th May to 1st October.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Altitude 820 ft.; situated in the midst of the wonderful Vivarais district. Temperate climate. 4.500 inhabitants.

SANITATION. — Municipal office of sanitation, drains, electric light. Work is at present being carried out to assure the purity of the water supply.

THE SPRINGS. — Vals is one of the few spas which is characterised by a group of springs containing sodium-bicarbonate in varied proportions from a very weak mineralisation to a very strong one (from 1 to 9 grammes of sodium-bicarbonate per litre).

Alkaline and arsenical treatment can also be combined by the employeent of the waters of the Dominique spring.

The Bathing Establishment contains forty apartments, two douche-rooms and a room for naso-pharyngeal atomization, irrigation and carbonic-acid inhalations.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — A first group consists of : 1. Waters containing bicarbonate of soda slightly ruineralised, from 1 to 3 grammes (Vals Saint-Jean).

2. Waters containing bicarbonate of soda strongly mineralised, from 4 to 9 grammes (Vals Précieuse).

Besides the bicarbonate of soda (the predominating element) these waters contain other very interesting bodies: bicarbonate of lithium, bicarbonate of iron, sulphate of soda, magnesium, arsenic, free carbonic acid varying in quantity from 1 to 4 grammes.

These waters are distinctly radio-active. The Dominique waters constitute an essentially different group, they are alkaline, contain no gas and are characterised by the presence of an alkali-metal combination of ferrous-arsenic at a strength of 20 milligrammes to the litre (approximately 1 1/2 grains to the gallon).

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION AND TREATMENT. — 1. On the stomach: stimulate and regulate the gastric secretion, increase the tonicity of the muscular coats, and stimulate their contractibility.

2. On the liver: Cholagogues, they modify the contents of the liver, and by this mean combat catarrh of the biliary ducts.

## VALS-LES-BAINS (Ardèche)

3. General action on nutrition : in the sense of accelerating and regulating the metabolism.

The treatment consists in the drinking of the mineral waters, mineral water baths, mud baths of ferrous arsenic mud from the Dominique spring, various douches, vapour baths, treatment with the carbonic acid gas by inhalation, mineral enteroclysims.

PRINCIPAL THERAPEUTIC APPLICATIONS. — Gastric disorders. Various forms of dyspepsia both hypo and hyper-secretion, dilatation, gastro-enteritis.

Disorders of the liver. Congestion, dyspeptic or malarial in origin, early cirrhosis, lithiasis

General disorders of nutrition. Gout, gravel, diabetes, functional albuminuria without nephritis, chlorosis, malarial anaemia.

CONTRA-INDICATIONS. — Cancer or ulcers of the stomach, advanced cirrhosis, febrile pulmonary tuberculosis.

ITUATION AND CLIMATE. — Vernet-les-Bains is situated at an altitude of 2.080 ft. at the foot of the Canigou, at the eastern extremity of the Pyrenees and 17 hours from Paris. It is encercled by mountains and sheltered from winds.

The mean winter temperature is 46% F.; summer, 64% F.

The characteristics of the climate are the dryness of the air and the purity of the atmosphere.

The climate is tonic and sedative.

URBAN SANITATION. - Drinking water. Drainage system. Electric lighting.

THE SPRINGS AND BATHING ESTABLISHMENTS. — There are ten springs, varying in temperature from  $59^{\circ}$  to  $176^{\circ}$  F.

Two bathing establishments, supplied with the latest apparatus for hydrotherapy. These buildings communicate with the hotels by corridors which have central heating. This is a great advantage to winter visitors.

The Bains des Commandants include a large swimming pond at a temperature of 93°2 F., beautiful baths, douche rooms, under-water massage, rooms for vapour baths, enteroclysis, under water douches, and for atomisation, inhalation and nebulisation.

The Thermes Mercader are tiled throughout which ensures a perfect cleanliness difficult to maintain in sulphur baths. There are baths of all kinds, including douches, under-water massage rooms, hip-baths, and foot baths, radio-active baths. A mechanotherapic room adjoins the establishment.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — All the springs contain sodium sulphide. They are divided into two groups:

Group on the right bank of the Cady (the Mercader baths);
 Group on the left bank (The Commandants baths). Their sulphur content varies from 9 to 19 milligrammes to the litre; they also contain sodium, alkalines, silicates and are rich in glairine.

The waters of the Thermes Mercader are remarkable for their high radio-activity, one spring reaching as much as 15°5 units, thus making Vernet one of the foremost radio-active resorts of France.





CHEMICAL, COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — A single cold spring, 50° F. yielding 6.500 litres per day. Strongly impregnated with sulphur (monosulphide, o grm. 53 to the litre) containing small quantities of iodides and bromides. The alkaline contents are high (sodium bicarbonate, 1 grm. to the litre), this renders the water extremely easy of digestion, even in large doses.

PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY. — The treatment is a drastic one and demands careful watching and gradation. In the case of lymphatics and lethargics it has a stimulant and tonic action. In arthritic cases, where the nutritional processes are slow, it speeds up intraorganic combustion and reduces auto-intoxication. Where the respiratory passages are affected, the action is antiseptic, due to the freeing of hydrogen sulphide, and the mucosa of the air-passages become less sensitive.



Situated in the midst of the woods dominating the valley of the Tech. Very mild climate. Seasonable throughout the year.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS.—
Bicarbonate of soda, alkaline bicarbonates and earth alkalines, sulphates, chlorides, arsenates, etc. Temperature: 60°8 F. to 66°2 F. Total mineralisation: 4 grm. 50 per litre.

CHEMICAI, COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAI, ACTION OF THE WATERS.— Free carbonic acid, calcium, magnesium and ferrous carbonates, manganese, arsenate of iron, silicon, aluminium, sodium, potassium and lithium carbonates, sulphate of sodium, chloride of sodium. THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Disorders of the respiratory tract in arthritism. Dermatosis. Chronic rheumatism. Climate suitable for tuberculosis in nervous subjects, either in the initial or acute stage (Sanatoria).

### CHAUDESAIGUES (Cantal)

#### VERY WARM WATERS CONTAINING BICARBONATES AND SODIUM

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS.— Temperature: 179% F. Weak mineralisation. Carbonate of soda and of lime; sodium chloride. Total mineralisation: o grm. 811 per litre. Carbonic acid. The warmest mineral water in France.

Utilised for baths, douches and inhalation.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — All forms of rheumatism; ankylosis; neurosis.

### EAUX-CHAUDES (Basses-Pyrénées)

# WARM SULPHUR WATERS CONTAINING SODIUM, CALCIUM, SILICATES

Situated in the valley of Ossau. Altitude: 2.194 feet. Tonic climate without sudden

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Temperature: 75°2 F. to 96°8 F. Seven springs, in use sodium sulphide, calcium salts, alkaline silicates.

External and internal treatment.

Sedative effects of great therapeutic value.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Gynecological conditions: metritis, troubles of the menopause, sterility. Disorders of the respiratory system: non-infective bronchial catarrh.

### LES FUMADES (Gard)

# COLD HYDROSULPHIDE WATERS CONTAINING SULPHATES, CALCIUM, BITUMEN

Resort sheltered by mountains; no sharp atmospheric changes.

Mildly stimulant, definitely sedative, diuretic and resolvent.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Chronic rheumatism. Arthritism and its manifestations; traumatic lesions of the bones and joints. Non-infective conditions of the throat and bronchi.

### HAMMAM MESKOUTINE (Algeria)

VERY WARM WATERS CONTAINING BICARBONATES, SULPHATES, AND SODIUM CHLORIDE

25 kilometres from Guelma in the province of Constantine.

Season: 15th December to 15th June.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Temperature: 105°8 F. to 204°8 F.; great yield.

Containing bicarbonates, sodium sulphate and chloride with iron and arsenic.

External treatment : baths, douches.

These waters are sedative,

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Gynecological conditions, Chronic rheumatism, Dermatosis, Sciatica, Paralysis, Malaria,

# LONS-LE-SAUNIER (Jura) COLD SODIUM CHLORIDE WATERS

Chief town of the department of Jura.

CHEMICAI, COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Cold sodium chloride waters. Mineralisation: 17 grm. 50 per litre, Sodium chloride: 10 grammes.

Mother waters, mineralisation: 313 grammes.

External use.

Restorative action.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Lymphatism. Tuberculosis of the bones. Gynecological conditions.

### MIERS (Lot)

#### COLD WATERS CONTAINING SULPHATES AND SODIUM

Three kilometres from Alvignac. Altitude: 1.350 feet. Air pure and very dry. Temperate climate.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Bicarbonates of calcium and iron, silicate of magnesium, sulphate of sodium, of magnesium and of potassium, sodium chloride. Temperature: 59° F.

The water is diuretic, laxative or purgative according to the dose.

Treatment by imbibition.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Intestine: habitual constipation, chronic enteritis and appendicitis, haemorrhoids. Congestion of the liver, biliary lithiasis. Renal gravel.

# MOLITG (Pyrénées-Orien:ales) WATERS CONTAINING SULPHUR AND SODIUM

In the eastern Pyrenees. 7 kilometres from Prades.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Ten springs. Temperature:  $68^{\circ}$  F. to  $100^{\circ}4$  F. Sodium sulphide, sodium carbonate, sodium chloride, soda, silicon, lime, magnesium, sulphate of lime.

Treatment by baths and douches and by imbibition.

Regulates the general circulation and the functions of the skin.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Diseases of the skin: eczema, impetigo, psoriasis, various forms of dermitis. Specific action on the mucosa.

### LA MOTTE-LES-BAINS (Isère)

#### VERY WARM WATERS CONTAINING SODIUM CHLORIDE AND CALCIUM SULPHIDE

On the La Mure line. Altitude: 1.950 feet. Equable temperate climate; dampness almost unknown; very little wind.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF THE WATERS. — Two springs. Vield: 400.000 litres per diem. Temperature: 141°8 F. at the spring. Total mineralisation: 5 grnn. 60 per litre. (3 grm. 07 chloride of sodium, 0 grm. 16 chloride of magnesium, 1 grm. 67 sulphate of calcium).

External treatment.

Local action: alleviates congestion and favours resolution.

General action : sedative and tonic.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — 1. Gynecological conditions, chronic metritis, uterine fibroma. — 2. Chronic arthropathy. — 3. Lymphatism, bony and articular tuberculosis of a scrofulous type.

## OREZZA (Corse)

# CHALYBEATE WATERS CONTAINING MAGNESIUM, ACIDULATED AND AERATED

Situated at the foot of Mont San-Pedrone, 50 kilometres from Bastia, at an altitude of 1.140 feet.

CHEMICAL, COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Free carbonic acid; carbonates of protoxide of iron, of manganese, lime, lithium and magnesium; sulphate of lime; chloride of potassium and of sodium; silicic acid. Temperature: 51°8 F. to 59° F. Slightly sour, piquant taste.

Treatment by imbibition.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Chlorosis, anaemia, malaria.

# LA PRESTE (Pyrénées-Orientales) WARM SODIUM SULPHIDE WATERS

Situated below Amélie-les-Bains in the valley of the Tech. Mediterranean climate, temperate and very uniform.

CHEMICAL, COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Temperature: 111°2 F. Three springs the total yield of which reaches 1,700.000 litres per diem.

Water rich in sulphur, slightly alkaline.

External treatment and internal administration.

Anti-toxic, diuretic and purifying.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — The urogenital organs. Uric diathesis, gravel, nephritic colic, pyelo-nephritis, bacteriuria, cystitis, prostatitis, urethritis, urinary neurosis, vaginitis, metritis, salpingitis.

### SAIL-LES-BAINS (Loire)

WATERS CONTAINING SILICATES, ALKALINE SALTS, IODIDE, LITHIUM, IMPREGNATED WITH NITROGEN, VERY STRONGLY RADIO-ACTIVE

40 kilometres from Vichy, on the Saint-Germain-des-Fossés-Lyons line.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. -Temperature: 34° F. Treatment by baths or prolonged local douches.

The waters, owing to the alkaline silicates which they contain, are anti-septic, anti-fermemtescible, anti-parasitical.

Soothing, cicatrizing and desintoxicating action.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Used in the cases of dermatosis, eczema, arthritism and diseases due to reduced nutrition.

### SAINT-AMAND (Nord)

#### SULPHUROUS MINERAL MUD, OLIGOMETALLIC WATERS CONTAINING MIXED SULPHATES AND BICARBONATES

240 kilometres from Paris, the temperate and sedative climate of wide plains, rendered tonic by near lying forests.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. Weak mineralisation, high radio-activity. Sulphates of lime and of magnesium, bicarbonates. Cold and tepid waters (78°8 F.).

The vegeto-mineral mud of Saint-Amand contains sulphur, iron, calcium sulphate and

magnesium.

They have a general action on the respiration, the circulation, the nervous system, muscles

and bones and a local emollient, tonic, soothing and carminative action.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS — For the waters: gravel and gastropathy, hypersthe-

For the mud: atonic gout, chronic rheumatism, various forms of arthritis, arthritis deformans; perimetritis and chronic metritis; sciatic neuritis and neuralgia, palsy; certain diseases of the skin; eczema.

THE BATHING ESTABLISHMENT. — The bathing establishment, entirely destroyed by the German Army, has been completely rebuilt: it comprises several apartments for mud baths, baths and douches, douche-massage, complete installation of cold hydrotherapy.

### SAINT-CHRISTAU (Basses-Pyrénées) WATERS CONTAINING IRON AND COPPER

Saint-Christau is situated at the entrance of the Aspe valley at the foot of Mount Binet. Altitude: 1.040 feet. 40 kilometres from Pau. Very temperate climate.

CHEMICAI, COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — 5 springs. Temperature: 57°2 F. to 78°8 F. Sulphate of copper and colloidal copper.

External treatment and internal administration. The waters have a stimulating action on the urinary tract. Their general action is stimulating, resolvent and healing.

Diseases of the skin and the mucous membrane: Tongue and buccal mucosa; nose and throat; skin, eyes, matrix.

## SALIES-DU-SALAT (Haute-Garonne)

WATERS CONTAINING A HIGH PERCENTAGE OF SODIUM CHLORIDE ALSO BROMIDE AND IODIDE

Spa situated at an altitude of 975 feet, a few kilometres from the Pyrenees. CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Cold clear waters, rich in sodium chloride.

Treatment principally external. THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. - Torpid gynecological conditions; local articular tuberculosis; lymphatism, rickets, anaemia.



### SAN-SALVADOUR (Var)

#### WATERS CONTAINING LITHIUM, BICARBONATES, SODA AND CALCIUM

Situated close of the Gulf of Giens, a few kilometres from Hyeres. Average winter temperature : about 59° F.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS.—
The San-Salvadour spring contains 0 grm. 065 of lithium per litre. Constant temperature '62°6 F. It contains also sulphate of lime, bicarbonate of lime, sodium and potassium. Total mineralisation: 1 grm. 035 per litre.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS — 1. As a winter resort it is especially suitable for convalescents and the run-down. — 2. As a spa, it is indicated in gout, rheumatism, and arteriosclerosis.

### SERMAIZE-LES-BAINS (Marne)

# MIXED ALKALINE WATERS, CONTAINING CALCIUM BICARBONATE, MAGNESIUM SULPHIDE AND IRON

On the Paris-Strasbourg line between Vitry-le-François and Bar-le-Duc;  $3\ \text{r}/2$  hours from Paris (230 kilomètres).

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. — Temperature 53° F, agreeable taste, although impregnated with iron. Total mineralisation: 1 grm. 70: bicarbonates of calcium and magnesium; sulphates of magnesium, sodium and calcium; magnesium and calcium chlorides; potassium salts.

Utilised as baths, douches and by imbibition, they are toni-digestive, diuretic and laxative.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Liver: lithiasis, sequelae of hepatic colic. The stomach: Heavy or nervous dyspepsias. Intestinal disorders: Constipation and entero-colitis. Kidneys and Bladder; all manifestations of arthritism, diabetes, gout, obesity, skin affections, etc. Malaria.

## SOULTZMATT (Haut-Rhin)

#### COLD SODIUM BICARBONATE WATERS

22 kilometres from Colmar. Altitude: 884 feet.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS.—
Total mineralisation: 4 grm. 04. Sodium bicarbonate waters evolving gas: 11 grm. 94 of
carbonic acid.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. — Stomach: dyspepsia, gastralgia.

## THONON (Haute-Savoie)



13 kilometres from Villefranche and 19 kilometres from Prades. Altitude: 2,440 feet.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. Very plentiful waters. Temperature: 64°4 F. to 176° F. Three groups: 1, Sulphur waters with varying sulphuration, very warm; 2. Slightly alkaline or sulphur degenerated waters, temperate or cold; 3. Sulphur silicate waters.

Sedative action; stimulating tonic and restorative action; decongestive and resolvent.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. - Gout and its manifestations. Chronic articular rheumatism.

### USSAT (Ariège)

#### WATERS CONTAINING CALCIUM SULPHATE AND BICARBONATE MAGNESIUM

Small village situated in charming hill country.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION AND PHYSIOLOGICAL ACTION OF THE WATERS. -Total yield: 1.400 cubic metres daily. Simple warm alkaline waters with weak mineralisation but with a high radio-activity. Temperature: 95°5 F, to 108° F. Remarkably soothing to the nervous system.

THERAPEUTIC INDICATIONS. - Nervous diseases, chorea, exophtalmic goitre, hysteria, neurasthenia, neuralgia, tachycardia, painful gynecological conditions.
