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

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

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EXPLANATORY NOTES.

The accompanying Tables have been prepared in connection with the scheme of insurance against unemployment contained in Part II. of the National Insurance Bill and comprise:—

(1) An analysis of the financial rules of each Trade Union relating to unemployed

benefits :

(2) The expenditure in 1908 of each Trade Union on the various kinds of unem-

ployed benefit :

(3) The total expenditure and expenditure per head on unemployed benefits in each of the years 1900 to 1909 of each Trade Union in the Insured Trades.

To these Tables are prefixed certain Summary Tables based thereon.

(4) Earnings in the Insured Trades in an ordinary week of 1906, classified by

occupation and amount.

RULES AND EXPENDITURE OF TRADE UNIONS ON UNEMPLOYED BENEFITS.

(a) Rules.

The payments quoted in the Analysis of Rules relating to unemployment are for Ordinary Members only, but in cases where it has not been possible to ascertain definitely which of two or more classes represents the Ordinary Member an analysis has been given of the rules governing all these classes.

"Stationary Benefit" is the weekly or daily payment to which members are entitled when out of employment, such payment not being subject to the condition that members

must travel in search of work while in receipt of such benefit.

Members "on dispute," i.e., on strike or directly locked-out through a dispute with employers are not considered out of work for the purposes of unemployed benefit. Wherever in the Tables or Summaries the words "lock-out" or "locked-out" are used they are used in connection with members who are thrown out of work through a strike or lock-out in other trades or occupations, but who are not themselves on strike.

or lock-out in other trades or occupations, but who are not themselves on strike.

"Travelling Benefit" is the daily or other payment to which members are entitled when travelling in search of work. (Unless otherwise stated "Travelling Benefit" is in

lieu of and not in addition to "Stationary Benefit.")

In some unions the period of probation for members who join before or immediately on the completion of their apprenticeship is shorter than the period stated in the Analysis.

In many unions where dispute benefit is not stated in the Analysis to be among the other benefits covered by the contributions it is probable that, when unemployed benefit

is paid, members on dispute are paid according to the unemployed scale.

The columns headed "Disregarded" in the Summary Tables on pp. 5 and 11 give the number of members who, for one reason or another, are not entitled to unemployed benefit ordinarily payable by the unions to which they belong; e.g., superannuated members, members contributing only to funeral or other benefits (not unemployed benefit), apprentices, honorary members.

The rules analysed in the volume are principally the rules in operation in the year 1908, although later rules received in the Department up to the end of 1909 were utilised.

Changes subsequent to 1909 have not been embodied.

(b) EXPENDITURE.

The expenditure on unemployed benefits in 1908 is divided up as far as possible under the heads of (a) Stationary Benefit, (b) Travelling Benefit, and (c) Emigration Grants, Payments of Fares to situations. In many cases, however, it has not been possible to separate travelling from stationary benefit as many unions make no distinction in their accounts. The expenditure on unemployed benefit by unions in the insured trades

during the ten years 1900–1909 excludes the payments made by unions dissolved during the period. Such payments, so far as it is possible to estimate them, were inconsiderable, and would not amount to more than £5,000 during the whole period. The eligible membership, on which the amount of expenditure per head in any year has been calculated, has been arrived at by deducting, wherever possible, from the membership at the end of the previous year members not paying to the benefits, members superannuated, honorary members, foreign members and apprentices. Members joining in any year are not, as a rule, entitled to receive benefit until they have paid 12 months' contributions.

EARNINGS IN INSURED TRADES.

The details given in the Tables as to the earnings of men and lads and boys in the insured trades are based on information supplied by employers to the Board of Trade, in connection with a general enquiry instituted in 1906 into the earnings and hours of labour in all trades. The enquiry was not made under an Act of Parliament, and some of the employers did not see their way to furnish returns, but as will be seen from the Tables the number of workpeople included in the returns received was very large, and the average earnings deduced from the details furnished may be regarded as fairly representative of the whole. The earnings stated by the employers were the actual amounts paid to their individual workpeople in an ordinary week of 1906, whether such workpeople worked full time or less or more than full time. In summarising the details, the average earnings of full time workers have been shown separately from those for all workpeople.

The returns received included all classes of wage-earners in these branches of industry, whether such workpeople were directly engaged in the actual processes of production, or were employed in ancillary occupations, and the average earnings shown in the Tables also embrace such men and lads and boys. For example, the earnings of carters connected with the building trades are included, and so also are the earnings of lads and boys under 18 years of age. These classes, with others, are outside the compulsory clauses of Part II. of the National Insurance Bill, but it is not possible, from the information given in the returns, completely to eliminate them from the statistics. The number of women and girls employed in the insured trades is small, and their earnings have been excluded.

One Table shows the earnings in each industry classified by amount, irrespective of occupation, and the other gives the earnings in each of the principal occupations.
