FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE: With reference to General Order No. 42., dated 16th October, 1933; the following extracts from an Order (No.78) made by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, dated 28th October, 1933, are published for the information and attention of the Force:-" Contraction of the Isle of Ely Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Area. 2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1933 (No.75) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order. Commencement. 3. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-three. Short Title. 4. This Order may be cited as the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1933 (No.78). IN WITNESS whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this twenty-eighth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-three. D.A.E. The parishes of Downham, Littleport, Coveney, Ely Holy Trinity with St. Mary, Ely College, Witchford, Wilburton, Stretham and Thetford, and so much of the parishes of Wentworth and Haddenham as lies to the east of the road from Coveney via Wentworth, Haddenham and Aldreth to the River Ouse at High Bridge Farm.
