5. FOOT & MOUTH DISEASE.

Reference General Orders Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 of 1933, the following further Order, made by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries on 23rd instant, is forwarded for the information and attention of the Force.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE & FISHERIES.

Dated 23rd January, 1933.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (REGULATION OF MOVEMENT) ORDER OF 1933 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows : -

Further contraction of the Controlled Area.

1. The Controlled Area to which the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1933, as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1933 (Nos. 2 and 3) applies is hereby further reduced so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule hereto, and the Area so described shall, as from the commencement of this Order be the Controlled Area referred to in the first-mentioned Order.

Saving for Existing Orders.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of any Order declaring an Area to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty three.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1933 (No.4).

IN WITNESS whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this twenty-third day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-three.

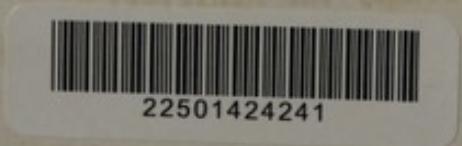
