The fewententh figure fetteth foozth to be fene on the lide, the outlide of the layde cote of the eye, whole and naked without anye coucringe, and a great portio also of the fynow of fight, in the whia B che poztion a noteth the substaunce therof, and B the thritine pannicle wherewith it is compassed, , A a , the harde pannicle of the brayne, and & bap: nes and arteries keping companie with the linow of the lyghte, furthermore x and y lygnific the same here as they did in the fixtenth.

The enghtenth figure expressed on the lide, the epe delinered from the epelpodes, and taken out of his feate in the feul, and with him alfo the mufcles not pet taken awaye a funder. And ! fignis 3 fieth the fpnow of light, 343 the muscles mouting the eye, and the falleninge or cleaninge cote of e the eye, the greater circle of the eye lyke to a raine bowe, where the pannicle cleaning to thoofy ende and groweth moofte fafte to the hounte cote. * But " thall note the feate of place of the leffer circle, whiche is against the balle of the eye.

The mintenth figure expressed the former leate of the whole eye, onelys delyuered fro the eye lyds des, and a theweth here a little pece of fleathe, let in the greater angle or corner of the feate of the eye. But # 6 a afterwarde # thewe even the fame here as in the figure next afoze proceding. But if anie man thyncke it requilpte and good to make the declaratio of the eye fro his outwarde partes let him in bertinge the order of figures, take the nyntenth in the place of the ferode, and the eigh: tenth in place of the thirde, and fo foorth. De mape have more knowledge here in the first boke in the chapter of the eyes.
