# What is Greenwich Association of Disabled People GAD-CIL Ltd?

Constituted and run by disabled people, GAD-CIL aims to co-ordinate and provide key services which secure independence and integrated living opportunities for disabled people in order to promote their full participation in the mainstream of economic, social and political life.

GAD-CIL was formed in 1974, and has operated as a C.I.L. (Centre for Independent Living) for the past 8 years. GAD-CIL actively campaigns on issues affecting disabled people locally.

Nationally, GAD-CIL, as a member of B.C.O.D.P. (British Council of Organisations of Disabled People), is involved in pressing for anti-discrimination legislation, an adequate benefit system, and independent living issues.

# GREENWICH ASSOCIATION OF DISABLED PEOPLE MISSION STATEMENT

The Mission of GAD is to be a major force for positive change in Society's perception of Disabled People; to support Human Rights for all Disabled People; and to be a source of empowerment for Disabled People living in the London Borough of Greenwich.

# WHY DOES IT MATTER WHAT WORDS WE USE TO TALK ABOUT DISABILITY?

### It matters because:

- how we talk about things affects how we understand them
- as disabled people our understanding of "disability" affects how we behave, how we see ourselves and what we expect from life
- our understanding affects the way we act about disability issues
- · it also affects how we treat each other

### **TALKING ABOUT DISABILITY**

Disabled people claim the right to define disability. We use something called The Social Model. This says something like:

"Disabled people have a difference in the way part of our body or mind works, (some of us call this an impairment). We are all individuals, different from each other. What unites us is that we experience discrimination in all areas of life.

'Talking About Disability' cont'd......

### It can be:

- physical barriers (eg steps)
- attitudes ("a Deaf person could not do that job")
- or regular exclusion from mainstream provision (providing "special" schools for disabled children instead of making ordinary schools adjust to their needs)

We sometimes call this discrimination "institutional discrimination".

This discrimination makes it impossible for us to participate in society as equals.

The solution to our "problems" is to remove all of the discrimination. This is why disabled people are campaigning for Civil Rights legislation.



### IN GAD WE VALUE:

Being an agent of change by Campaigning,
Lobbying and Educating in order to promote
Equality of Opportunity, full Civic Rights

Training and Consultancy over any issue concerning disability is one of the key services offered by GAD.

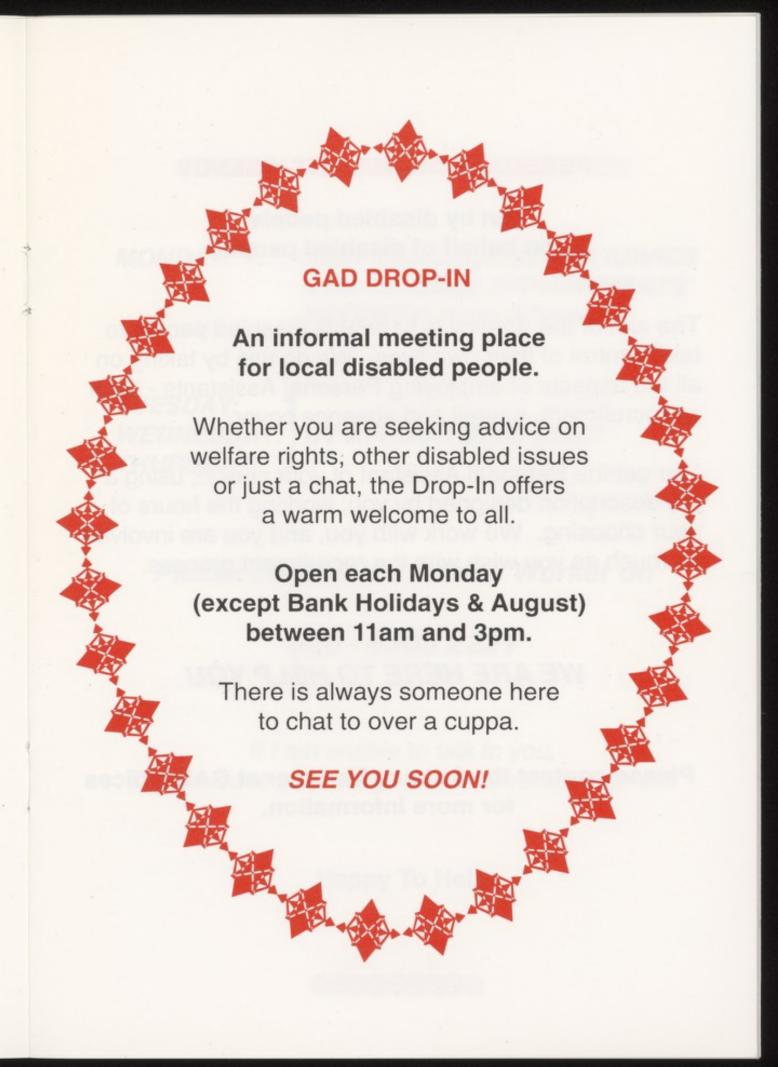
The list of topics covered by the service is large and ever-growing. Some of our standard services include:

### GAD COUNSELLING SERVICE

(for Disabled People by Disabled Counsellors)

The service aims to: support, enable and empower disabled people.

GAD's counsellors share the experience of disability and focus upon clients' real concerns which may, in fact, have little or nothing to do with their being disabled. They are qualified, (or nearly qualified) Counsellors, members of the British Association of Counselling (BAC) and follow the BAC code of ethics and conduct for counsellors.

We can provide "one off" crisis appointments or weekly meetings for up to eighteen months.

We also have limited places for local advanced counselling disabled students who need to work with clients in order to qualify.

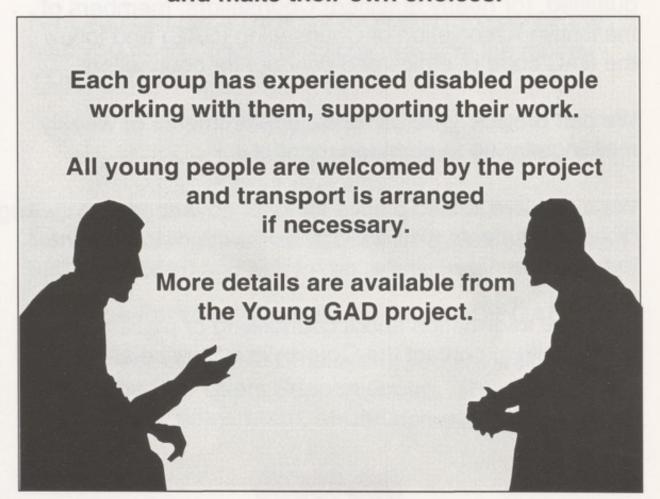

### YOUNG GAD PROJECT

The Young GAD Project currently runs two groups for Young Disabled People between 18 and 25 years. Both groups are based in Christchurch Forum, and one group is open specifically to black disabled young people.

We aim to empower young people and enable them to learn the skills they need to live independently and make their own choices.



### **ACCESS FORUM**

Our newly formed Access Forum meets weekly with the Access Officer of the London Borough of Greenwich to discuss planning applications and to represent the interests of disabled people in the borough. We promote "Good Practice" in all aspects of building.

Advice is given by our Access Advisors to callers and postal enquiries on all matters pertaining to access in the borough and beyond.

### **VOLUNTEERING IN GAD**

Many of GAD services could not function without the support and commitment of our volunteers. All of GAD volunteers are disabled people who work from two hours a day to two or three days each week, whatever suits them.

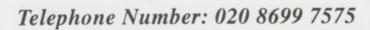

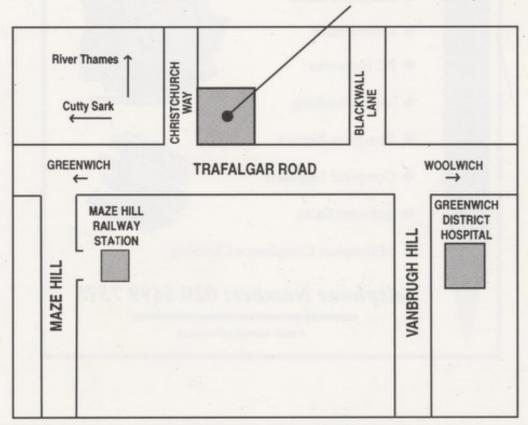
