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The fygures of the eye, which is the instrument of syght.

of a hoine, and is sene verpe cleare or shynnyng through, & the hoole of the balie of the eye doth answer to the place marked wyth y.

The seuententh fygure setteth forth to be sene on the syde, the outsyde of the sayde cote of the eye, whole and naked wythoute anye couerynge, and a great portion also of the synow of syght, in the white portion α noteth the substance therof, and β the thynne pannicle wherewith it is compassed, and γ the harde pannicle of the brayne, and δ baynes and arteyres kepynge compaigne with the synow of the syghte. Furthermoze ϵ and ζ signifye the same here as they dyd in the syxtenth.

The eyghthenth fygure expresseth on the syde, the eye delyuered from the eye lyddes, and taken oute of hys seate in the scull, and with him also the muscles not yet taken awaye a lunder. And α signifyeth the synowe of syghte, β and γ the muscles mouyng the eye, δ and ϵ the fastenynge or cleaynynge cote of the eye, ζ the greater circle of the eye lyke to a rayne bowe, where the pannicle cleaynynge to it doth ende and groweth mooste faste to the hounye cote. But κ shall note the seate or place of the lesser circle, whiche is agaynst the balie of the eye.

The nyntenth fygure expresseth the former seate of the whole eye, onelye delyuered from the eye lyddes, and α sheweth here a lytle pece of fleshe, set in the greater angle or corner of hys seate of the eye. But β and afterwarde κ shewe euen the same here as in the fygure next afoze procedyng. But yf anye man syncke it requyrite and good to make the declaraton of the eye from his outwarde partes let him in vertyng the order of fygures, take the nyntenth in the place of the seconde, and the eyghthenth in place of the thyrde, and so furth. Ye maye haue moze knowledge here in the fyrste boke in the chapter of the eyes.

Of the instrumentes belongynge to the cutters in their Anatomyes or cuttynges.

The declaration of the karacters of the figure of the instrumentes of Anatomye.



As in thys present fygure we haue deuyled a borde lunge vpon a table, whiche borde we vse conuenientlye in cuttyng open of lyuelye thynges. And mozeouer to thys borde we haue made all thynges fitte that can serue for anye man in cuttyng, yea,

and for al the whole course of Anatomye. And that you may with the lesse labour haue the knowledge of euerye thyng by it selfe, we haue sette to euerye thyng or instrument his seuerall karacters and the declaraton of the same.

- A A The table whereon are layde al the sayde tooles or instrumentes whiche are here to be declared.
- B, B The borde which is meete for the offyce and worke of cuttyng in lyuelye thynges.
- C, C Diuerse and sundrye hooles into the which hooles we doe put cordes and stringes to tye or holde the sayd lyuinge beastes, when we binde their thynges and armes.
- D D Suche rynges as you at the sydes of the borde may see, are ordeyned for the handes and fete of the sayd beastes.
- E To thys ryng we binde with a lytle chayne the upper or higher Jawe, & neathermoze beinge stil loose, that the heade maye be kepte stedfaste and not mouyng, and thus in the meane whyle neyther the voyce, nor the takynge breathe shoulde be lette or hindred by reason of the bandes.
- E, F Diuerse and sundrye kindes of rasours by the which rasours lyeth a sponge.
- G Small knyues fashioned lyke vnto penknyues.
- H A common knife, suche as we occupye at the table.
- I A greate or a stronge knyfe.
- K Knyues made of bore.
- L Hookes.
- M, Diuerse smal strayne and longe instrumentes, with also a pype, or holowe toole.
- N, N Croked needles with great threde, suche as we doe binde vpon the bonndels of letters withal.
- o Smaller needles whiche we doe vse in sewynge vpon of woundes.
- O A sawe.
- P A payre of cissors.
- Q A mallet of woode.
- R Reedes ordeyned to blowe into the lyghtes and lounyes and certayne other partes.
- S A threde or wire of latyne whiche serueth in byndynge the bones.
- T A bodkyn ordeyned to make holes in the bones.
- V Diuerse yron bodkyns.
- X A payre of pincers ordeyned to bolde, wythe or turne the endes of the thredes or latyne wyres.
- X Pincers wherewith we nyppe a sunder that whiche is lefte of the threde, whiche doeth solwe or bynde the bones together.
