This shield (together with a helmet, now in the possession of Sir Squire Bancroft) was presented by the Citizens of Edinburgh to John Philip Kemble on his retirement from the stage. It passed into the possession of Charles Kemble, and from him to Mrs. Sartoris; she gave it to Mr. Henry Kemble, who, in turn, presented it to Sir Henry Irving
