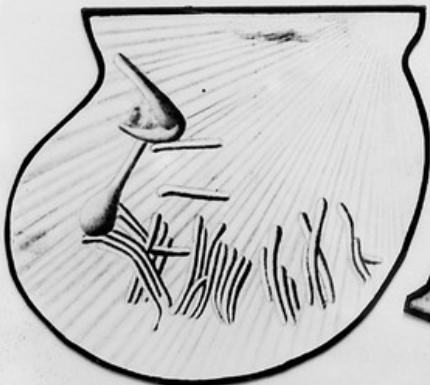

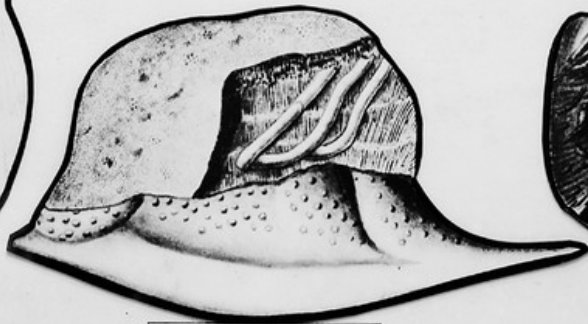
Spirifer exemplum Hall showing the tendency of the tube to expand in a lax spiral as soon as fixation is firmly established.



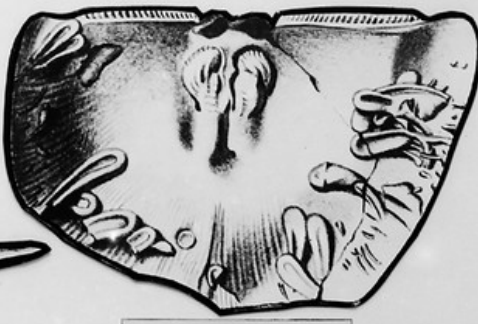
Heterostichus penetrating a polychaete and passing into another.

Climacolithus *tenax*. The margin of the bryozoan has been extended on all sides simultaneously by these borers forming loop-shaped tubes which are joined by a thin median cavity.
