A licence to practice
Surgery granted to
Dr John Beane

To all Christian people to whome these
presente shall come. John by Gods prouident Archibishop of Canterbury & Primate and
Metropolitane of all England sende greeting in our Lord God our Ladye & the Holy Ghoste. Where-
as for the auydinge of many accydente daily happeninge to many of his Ma-
iesties louage subiecte by the unskillfull practiceris of surgerie. It was prouidently
provided by a speciall acte of Parliament made for the reformation therof in
the thridre yere of the reigne of our late souerayne Lord of famous memorie
Kynge Henrie the eightt. That it shalbe lawfull for any person within
this Realme of England to use or exercize the science or facultie of surgerie, except
he were firste examined approued and admitted accordinge to the tenor of the said
Statute. And whereas we haue recyd sufficiente testimonye from John Leycete,
John Burges Thomas Thorne and Robert Johnson masters or academis of the
misterie and Communitie of Barbers and Surgeones of the Citty of London of the
due examination of Christopher Beane of Gressam in the Comtie of Norffolke within
the Diocesse of Norwich and our Province of Canterbury a free brother of the said
misterie and Communitie by Richard Wood, William Gayle, John Fynd and John
Porte hertfor approued and admitted to use and exercize the said facultie. And
whereto also we Edward Stanhope Doctor of the Quicke Lawe our Chamberlaine
callinge to him the foresaid Richard Wood, William Gayle, John Fynd and
John Porte accordinge to the direction of the foresaid Statute, and therupon
examininge the said Christopher Beane touchinge his skill and practice in the
said misterie, and findinge by the opinion of the said Richard Wood, William Gayle,
John Fynd and John Porte, that the said Christopher Beane is a skillfull
and verie sufficiente Surgeon and a meete man to use and exercize that misterie.
Knowe ye therefore that we John Archibishop of Canterbury aforeside, do nowe
by these presents approue the said Christopher Beane to be an habble and suffi-
cient Surgeon: And further in Consideracion of the premises, and that the said
Christopher Beane is firste solemnly seene before the said we Edward Stan-
hope our Chamberlaine to the supremacie of the Queenes most excellent Majestie
do by these presents admitt and licenc the said Christopher Beane to use
and exercize the said misterie of Surgerie, so farr forth as by the lawes and
Statutes of this Realme we may lawfullie admitt any, in any place in and tho-
rough the Diocesse of Norwich, Eli, Lincoln and Peterborowgh: And also we will
this our Licence to endur his god behavour and our pleasure and not otherwise. In
witness whereof we haue caused this our Seal of our Office of principall Registry
to bee sett to these presents. Seale the sixtth day of October in the yere of our Lord
K. i. and Chrysostomus fide humana, regnante; And in the Sixteentith yere of our
Reignacion.
